## **Orders of Rulemaking**

The order of rulemaking is required to contain a citation to the legal authority upon which the order or rulemaking is based; reference to the date and page or pages where the notice of proposed rulemaking was published in the *Missouri Register*, an explanation of any change between the text of the rule as contained in the notice of proposed rulemaking and the text of the rule as finally adopted, together with the reason for any such change; and the full text of any section or subsection of the rule as adopted which has been changed from that contained in the notice of proposed rulemaking. The effective date of the rule shall be not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication of the revision to the *Code of State Regulations*.

he agency is also required to make a brief summary of the general nature and extent of comments submitted in support of or opposition to the proposed rule and a concise summary of the testimony presented at the hearing, if any, held in connection with the rulemaking, together with a concise summary of the agency's findings with respect to the merits of any such testimony or comments which are opposed in whole or in part to the proposed rule. The ninety-(90-) day period during which an agency shall file its order of rulemaking for publication in the Missouri Register begins either: 1) after the hearing on the proposed rulemaking is held; or 2) at the end of the time for submission of comments to the agency. During this period, the agency shall file with the secretary of state the order of rulemaking, either putting the proposed rule into effect, with or without further changes, or withdrawing the proposed rule.

#### ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Public Service Commission under section 386.250, RSMo 2000, the commission withdraws a proposed amendment as follows:

4 CSR 240-3.105 Filing Requirements for Electric Utility Applications for Certificates of Convenience and Necessity is withdrawn.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on March 1, 2016 (41 MoReg 305–307). This proposed amendment is withdrawn.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The public comment period ended April 29, 2016, and the commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendment on May 12, 2016. The commission received timely written comments from Wind on the Wires; The Office of the Public Counsel; Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri; Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCP&L) and KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO); Dogwood Energy, LLC; Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC; GridLiance Heartland, LLC; The Empire District Electric Company; and the staff of the commission. In addition, the following people offered comments at the hearing: James Lowery, Tom Byrne, and Matt Michels, on behalf of Ameren Missouri; James Fischer, Burton Crawford, and Tim Rush, on behalf of KCP&L and GMO; Paul Boudreau, and Todd Tarter, on behalf of Empire; Carl Lumley, on behalf of Dogwood; Andy Knott, on behalf of the Sierra Club; Tim Opitz, on behalf of Public Counsel; Joshua Harden, on behalf of Clean Line; and Nathan Williams, Steve Dottheim, and Natelle Dietrich, on behalf of the staff. The comments raised many serious questions and concerns about the proposed amendment.

RESPONSE: After reviewing the comments, the commission concludes that the proposed amendment does not accomplish its intended purpose and could create more uncertainty for affected utilities and the public. Rather than attempt to substantially rewrite the amendment at this stage of the process, the commission will withdraw this amendment.

#### Background

The individuals listed in this notice have recently filed applications requesting MoDOT to issue SPE Certificates to exempt them from the physical qualification requirements relating to vision in 49 CFR 391.41(b)(10), or to diabetes in 49 CFR 391.41(b)(3), which otherwise apply to drivers of CMVs in Missouri intrastate commerce.

Under section 622.555, RSMo, MoDOT may issue an SPE Certificate, for not more than a two- (2-) year period, if it finds that the applicant has the ability, while operating CMVs, to maintain a level of safety that is equivalent to or greater than the driver qualification standards of 49 CFR 391.41. Upon application, MoDOT may renew an exemption upon expiration.

Accordingly, the agency will evaluate the qualifications of each applicant to determine whether issuing an SPE Certificate will comply with the statutory requirements and will achieve the required level of safety. If granted, the SPE Certificate is only applicable to intrastate transportation wholly within Missouri.

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
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
