Constitutional Amendment 1

[Proposed by the 94th General Assembly (First Regular Session) HJR 7]

Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to add a statement that English shall be the language of all governmental meetings at which any public business is discussed, decided, or public policy is formulated whether conducted in person or by communication equipment including conference calls, video conferences, or Internet chat or message board?

It is estimated this proposal will have no costs or savings to state or local governmental entities.

Constitutional Amendment 4

[Proposed by the 94th General Assembly (Second Regular Session) SJR 45]

Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to change provisions relating to the financing of stormwater control projects by:

- limiting availability of grants and loans to public water and sewer districts only;
- removing the cap on available funding and existing restrictions on disbursements;
- requiring loan repayments to be used only for stormwater control projects?

It is estimated the cost to state governmental entities is \$0 to \$236,000 annually. It is estimated state governmental entities will save approximately \$7,500 for each bond issuance. It is estimated local governmental entities participating in this program may experience savings, however the amount is unknown.

Proposition A

[Proposed by Initiative Petition]

Shall Missouri law be amended to:

- repeal the current individual maximum loss limit for gambling;
- prohibit any future loss limits;
- require identification to enter the gambling area only if necessary to establish that an individual is at least 21 years old;
- restrict the number of casinos to those already built or being built;
- increase the casino gambling tax from 20% to 21%;
- create a new specific education fund from gambling tax proceeds generated as a result of this measure called the "Schools First Elementary and Secondary Education Improvement Fund"; and
- require annual audits of this new fund?

State governmental entities will receive an estimated \$105.1 to \$130.0 million annually for elementary and secondary education, and \$5.0 to \$7.0 million annually for higher education, early childhood development, veterans, and other programs. Local governmental entities receiving gambling boat tax and fee revenues will receive an estimated \$18.1 to \$19.0 million annually.

Proposition B

[Proposed by Initiative Petition]

Shall Missouri law be amended to enable the elderly and Missourians with disabilities to continue living independently in their homes by creating the Missouri Quality Homecare Council to ensure the availability of quality home care services under the Medicaid program by recruiting, training, and stabilizing the home care workforce?

The exact cost of this proposal to state governmental entities is unknown, but is estimated to exceed \$510,560 annually. Additional costs for training are possible. Matching federal funds, if available, could reduce state costs. It is estimated there would be no costs or savings to local governmental entities.

Proposition C

[Proposed by Initiative Petition]

Shall Missouri law be amended to require investor-owned electric utilities to generate or purchase electricity from renewable energy sources such as solar, wind, biomass and hydropower with the renewable energy sources equaling at least 2% of retail sales by 2011 increasing incrementally to at least 15% by 2021, including at least 2% from solar energy; and restricting to no more than 1% any rate increase to consumers for this renewable energy?

The estimated direct cost to state governmental entities is \$395,183. It is estimated there are no direct costs or savings to local governmental entities. However, indirect costs may be incurred by state and local governmental entities if the proposal results in increased electricity retail rates.

Missouri Voting and Elections

Who registers to vote in Missouri?

Citizens living in Missouri must register in order to vote. Any U.S. citizen 17 years and 6 months of age or older, if a Missouri resident, may register and vote except:

- A person who is adjudged incapacitated
- A person who is confined under sentence of imprisonment
- A person who is on probation or parole after conviction of a felony until finally discharged
- A person who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor connected with the right of suffrage (RSMo 115.133)

How do Missourians register?

Qualified citizens may register in person at the office of their local election authority, by mail, at the driver's license fee office or at participating state agencies. Registration in person is accomplished by filling out registration forms with information on identity, residence and qualifications which are signed and sworn to, then witnessed by the election authority or a designee. (RSMo 115.155)

Registration by mail, at the driver's license fee office or at the participating state agencies requires submission of an application stating qualifications. A verification or rejection of registration is sent by the election authority within seven working days. (RSMo 115.159)

When do Missourians register?

An unregistered citizen may register to vote whenever local election officials' places of business are open, by requesting an application by mail from the election authority, when renewing a Missouri driver's license or when receiving services from a participating state agency. Special registration sites and dates may be utilized prior to major elections.

The deadline for registration is the fourth Wednesday prior to an election. New Missouri residents may register immediately.

When do Missourians vote?

In addition to certain special and emergency dates, there are six official election dates in Missouri:

The statutes require that all public elections be held on the general election day, the primary election day, the general municipal election day, the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February or November, or on another day expressly provided by city or county charter, the first Tuesday after the first Monday in June and in nonprimary years on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in August. (RSMo 115.123.1)

The general election day is the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years. The primary election day is the first Tuesday after the first Monday in August in

even-numbered years. (RSMo 115.121 (1 & 2))

Elections for cities, towns, villages, school boards and special district officers are held the first Tuesday after first Monday in April each year, known as "general municipal election day." (RSMo 115.121.3)

A statewide presidential preference primary shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February of each presidential election year. (RSMo 115.755)

Who conducts registration and elections?

Voter registration and the conduct of elections are the responsibilities of boards of election commissioners in the counties of Clay, Jackson, Platte and St. Louis and in the cities of Kansas City and St. Louis. The county clerk serves as the election authority in all other counties of the state.

Special voting provisions

Disabled voters and persons prevented from voting at the polls because of absence or illness may vote absentee. Persons with permanent disabilities may apply for permanent absentee ballot status by making application with the local election authority and providing a physician's statement as required by law. (RSMo 115.284) Curbside voting is permitted in Missouri, or voters may be transferred to more accessible precincts. Local election officials should be contacted about absentee federal service balloting or "new resident" ballots for residents who arrive after the registration deadline.

When voting, Missourians must show an approved form of identification. (RSMo 115.427)

Elections and political parties

Missourians do not register under party affiliation. Hence, at primary elections, voters may choose which "established party" they vote within. Party nominees—and independent candidates—are then listed on the general election ballot.

There are presently four "established political parties" statewide—the Democratic, Republican, Constitution and Libertarian parties. Persons may seek the nomination of these parties for any elective office from the county level and above. In order to become "established," a party must have received more than two percent of the votes cast statewide for at least one of its candidates. New parties are formed by petition and may exist on the county, district or state level. They must meet the same standard as any other party to remain "established."

At the time of primary elections, voters select county committee members of established parties in Missouri. Those committee people, thus elected, have certain duties and responsibilities. They serve, as appropriate, as members of legislative, senatorial, judicial, and

congressional district committees. County, district, or state committee members may be called on to fill candidate vacancies on party ballots or to select nominees for special elections from time to time. The state committees are selected, indirectly, by local committee persons. The state committees become especially important when delegates to presidential nominating (national) conventions are being selected.
