# **Orders of Rulemaking**

August 1, 2003 Vol. 28, No. 15

This section will contain the final text of the rules proposed by agencies. The order of rulemaking is required to contain a citation to the legal authority upon which the order of rulemaking is based; reference to the date and page or pages where the notice of proposed rulemaking was published in the *Missouri Register*; an explanation of any change between the text of the rule as contained in the notice of proposed rulemaking and the text of the rule as finally adopted, together with the reason for any such change; and the full text of any section or subsection of the rule as adopted which has been changed from that contained in the notice of proposed rulemaking. The effective date of the rule shall be not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication of the revision to the *Code of State Regulations*.

■he agency is also required to make a brief summary of the general nature and extent of comments submitted in support of or opposition to the proposed rule and a concise summary of the testimony presented at the hearing, if any, held in connection with the rulemaking, together with a concise summary of the agency's findings with respect to the merits of any such testimony or comments which are opposed in whole or in part to the proposed rule. The ninety (90)-day period during which an agency shall file its order of rulemaking for publication in the *Missouri Register* begins either: 1) after the hearing on the proposed rulemaking is held; or 2) at the end of the time for submission of comments to the agency. During this period, the agency shall file with the secretary of state the order of rulemaking, either putting the proposed rule into effect, with or without further changes, or withdrawing the proposed rule.

# Title 5—DEPARTMENT OF ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION Division 50—Division of School Improvement Chapter 350—State Programs

#### ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education under sections 160.545 and 161.092, RSMo Supp. 2002, the board amends a rule as follows:

#### 5 CSR 50-350.040 A+ Schools Program is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on April 1, 2003 (28 MoReg 640–644). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The board received sixteen (16) letters of comments on the proposed amendment.

COMMENT: Nine (9) comments supported the amendment reducing the book reimbursement percentage rate with three (3) comments suggesting a fixed dollar amount for reimbursement and one (1) comment suggesting that the reduced rate begin with freshmen entering the program.

RESPONSE: The state board carefully considered these comments and decided to make no changes at this time.

COMMENT: Seven (7) comments opposed the amendment to reducing the book reimbursement percentage rate with one (1) comment preferring that the tuition rate be reduced.

RESPONSE: The state board carefully considered these comments and decided to make no changes at this time.

#### Title 12—DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE Division 10—Director of Revenue Chapter 24—Drivers License Bureau Rules

#### ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the director of revenue under sections 136.055, RSMo Supp. 2002, 302.181 and 302.185, RSMo 2000, the director amends a rule as follows:

#### 12 CSR 10-24.140 is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on March 3, 2003 (28 MoReg 404–405). Changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, and they are reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: One (1) written comment was received on the above amendment.

COMMENT: The commenter, Herbert Wheeler, Resource Management Director, Missouri Department of Transportation, commented that the fee stated in subsection (2)(E) of the proposed rule-making is contrary to state statute, section 302.181.7, RSMo. According to the comment received, the said fee for such transaction shall be six dollars (\$6). The proposed amendment stated that said fee would be three dollars (\$3).

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The department concurs with the commenter and has amended subsection (2)(E) accordingly.

#### 12 CSR 10-24.140 Procedures for Reissuance of a Missouri Driver License, Nondriver License, or Instruction Permit Not Received After Mailing by the Department

- (2) If the applicant requests any changes on the duplicate driver license, nondriver license, or instruction permit, the applicant shall pay the appropriate fee as follows:
- (E) For a duplicate photo nondriver license, the fee shall be six dollars (\$6).

#### Title 13—DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES Division 70—Division of Medical Services Chapter 1—Organization

#### ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Division of Medical Services under section 208.201, RSMo 2000, the director adopts a rule as follows:

13 CSR 70-1.020 is adopted.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on March 3, 2003 (28 MoReg 405–409). Those sections with changes are reprinted here.

This proposed rule becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Division of Medical Services received comments from the Missouri Department of Mental Health, National Association of Social Workers-Missouri Chapter, and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

COMMENT: The Department of Mental Health (DMH) commented that the way the rule is currently drafted does not appear to cause implementation issues for DMH. Under section (3), Disclosures of Health Information Required or Allowed by Law, subsection (G) assures an exchange of information between DMH and the Department of Social Services (DSS) to determine eligibility and enrollment.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: Section (1) has been changed to add the *Code of Federal Regulations* citation. Section (3) has been changed to make it clear that the rule is addressing recipients of programs of DSS.

COMMENT: DMH staff pointed out that the sentence, "The Department of Social Services, Division of Medical Services must get the applicant's or recipient's or their representative's consent to use and share private health information for other purposes," did not belong in section (5). It was also suggested by two (2) commenters that section (5) needed a more thorough description of privacy with regards to records of mental health professionals.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The sentence regarding consent has been removed from section (5) since the same material is covered in section (4), Other Uses and Disclosures Require the Applicant's or Recipient's Written Authorization. The description of psychotherapy notes has been amended so that the DSS and DMH definition matches the federal definition at 45 CFR 164.501.

COMMENT: DMH staff were concerned that the federal regulation does not allow the covered entity to charge for the time spent gathering material to be copied, only the time spent copying. DMH also noted that section 191.227, RSMo allows a payment of fifteen dollars (\$15) plus a fee of thirty-five cents ( $35\phi$ ) per page for copies of documents made on a standard photocopy machine.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The federal regulation at 45 CFR 164.524(4) says, in part, "Copying, including the cost of supplies for and labor of copying." Changes have been made to subsection (5)(D) to reflect the costs of the labor of copying.

COMMENT: Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) staff was concerned that the rule language regarding disclosures of health information required or allowed by law was too limited regarding contagious diseases, elder abuse and neglect reports, and reports of Medicaid eligibility to local public hearing agencies for determining eligibility for local programs.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: Subsection (3)(A) has been amended as requested. Subsection (3)(K) has been added to address elder abuse and neglect reports. Subsection (3)(L) has been added to address governmental functions.

COMMENT: After the proposed rule was filed the Office of Administration made available an "Authorization for Disclosure of Consumer Medical/Health Information" for use by members of the Missouri General Assembly.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The disclosure forms originally filed with the proposed rules are replaced by the statewide authorization form Mo 650-2616N(1-03). The form is available for reference and use at http://www.oa.mo.gov/gs/form/fm indiv.htm#dhss.

COMMENT: DSS staff was concerned that authority to request a restriction was limited to the individual and did not extend to the individual's representative.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: Sections (4) and (5) are amended to extend the right of written authorization to the applicant's or recipient's representative.

# 13 CSR 70-1.020 Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information

- (1) General Authority. There are many state and federal laws and regulations that safeguard applicants' and recipients' protected health information. Section 1902(a)(7) of the federal Social Security Act requires that a state plan for medical assistance must provide safeguards which restrict the use or disclosure of information concerning applicants and recipients to purposes directly connected with the administration of the plan. The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) represents the first comprehensive federal protection of patient privacy (45 Code of Federal Regulations, parts 160–164). Passed by the United States Congress in 1996, HIPAA sets national standards to protect personal health information, reduces health care fraud, and makes health coverage more portable. The entire health care industry must implement HIPAA, including state governments.
- (3) Disclosures of Health Information Required or Allowed by Law. The Department of Social Services, the single state Medicaid agency, may use an applicant's or recipient's individually identifiable health information for treatment, payment, or health care operations. For example, individually identifiable health information may be used to determine disability for a public assistance program; when reviewing a request from the treating physician for a Medicaid service that requires a prior approval; and when processing claims and other requests for medical care payments. The Department of Social Services, Division of Medical Services may also report information for research purposes and matters concerning organ donations. The research must be for helping the Medicaid program. The Department of Social Services, Division of Medical Services shall report:
- (A) Contagious and reportable diseases, including, but not limited to, those defined by 19 CSR 20-20.020, birth defects, cancer, or other information for public health purposes;
  - (E) When the court orders the Department of Social Services to;
- (F) To the government to review how Department of Social Services programs are working;
- (G) To a provider or other insurance company who needs to know if a recipient is enrolled in one of the Department of Social Services programs;
  - (I) Birth, death, and immunization information;
- (J) To the federal government when they are looking into something important to protect our country, the President, and other government workers;
- (K) Information about victims of abuse, neglect, or domestic violence to a government authority to the extent the disclosure is required by law; and
- (L) Medical eligibility when that information is used for a governmental function, such as local public health agency using eligibility information to determine eligibility for local health programs.
- (4) Other Uses and Disclosures Require the Applicant's or Recipient's Written Authorization. For other situations, the Department of Social Services will ask for the applicant's or recipient's or their representative's written authorization before using or disclosing information. The applicant or recipient or their representative may cancel this authorization at any time in writing. The Department of Social Services cannot take back any uses or disclosures already made with the applicant's or recipient's or their representative's authorization.

- (5) Applicant or Recipient Rights to Restrict or Request Protected Health Information. An applicant or recipient or their representative has the right to:
- (B) Have their doctor see their health information, unless it is psychotherapy notes taken by a mental health provider that are kept separate from the rest of the individual's medical record;
- (D) Request a list of medical information the Department of Social Services shared that was not for treatment, payment, or health care operations or as required by federal law. Beginning in April 2003 an applicant or recipient or their representative can get a list of where their health information has been sent, unless it was sent for treatment, payment, checking to make sure they received quality care, or to make sure the laws are being followed, on forms prepared by the Department of Social Services.
- 1. If the individual requests a copy of the protected health information or agrees to a summary or explanation of such information, the covered entity may impose a reasonable, cost-based fee, provided that the fee includes only the cost of:
- A. Copying, including the cost of supplies for and labor of copying, the protected health information requested by the individual;
- B. Postage, when the individual has requested the copy, or summary or explanation, be mailed;
- C. Preparing an explanation or summary of the protected health information; and
- D. Requests for information in other formats such as diskettes, audio/video tapes, slides, will be invoiced at the rate the agency actually paid for the format used.

This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: No comments were received.
