Orders of Rulemaking

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This section will contain the final text of the rules proposed by agencies. The order of rulemaking is required to contain a citation to the legal authority upon which the order of rulemaking is based; reference to the date and page or pages where the notice of proposed rulemaking was published in the *Missouri Register*; an explanation of any change between the text of the rule as contained in the notice of proposed rulemaking and the text of the rule as finally adopted, together with the reason for any such change; and the full text of any section or subsection of the rule as adopted which has been changed from that contained in the notice of proposed rulemaking. The effective date of the rule shall be not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication of the revision to the *Code of State Regulations*.

he agency is also required to make a brief summary of the general nature and extent of comments submitted in support of or opposition to the proposed rule and a concise summary of the testimony presented at the hearing, if any, held in connection with the rulemaking, together with a concise summary of the agency's findings with respect to the merits of any such testimony or comments which are opposed in whole or in part to the proposed rule. The ninety (90)-day period during which an agency shall file its order of rulemaking for publication in the *Missouri Register* begins either: 1) after the hearing on the proposed rulemaking is held; or 2) at the end of the time for submission of comments to the agency. During this period, the agency shall file with the secretary of state the order of rulemaking, either putting the proposed rule into effect, with or without further changes, or withdrawing the proposed rule.

Title 9—DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH Division 25—Fiscal Management Chapter 3—Miscellaneous Rules

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Department of Mental Health under sections 610.010, RSMo Supp. 2004 and 610.030 and 630.050, RSMo 2000, the department amends a rule as follows:

9 CSR 25-3.030 Access for Inspection of Public Records and Fees for Copying of Public Records is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on March 1, 2005 (30 MoReg 441–443). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The department received one (1) comment.

COMMENT: One (1) person objected that implementation of the amendment will cost her agency more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate, citing the medical records requested by private agencies from the department's state hospitals.

RESPONSE: The department disagrees and has not revised the amendment in response to this comment for two (2) reasons. First, the amendment projects no additional cost to private entities because it reduces the amount of the fees. The new fee schedule implements a revision to section 610.026, RSMo, which became effective in

2004. Secondly, the comment relates to medical records which are not public records and are not subject to section 610.026, RSMo. Medical records are subject to section 191.227, RSMo, which has different fee requirements.

Title 9—DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH Division 30—Certification Standards Chapter 3—Alcohol and Drug Abuse Programs

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the director of the Department of Mental Health under sections 630.655 and 631.102, RSMo 2000, the director amends a rule as follows:

9 CSR 30-3.132 Opioid Treatment Program is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on March 1, 2005 (30 MoReg 444). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: No comments were received.

Title 11—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY Division 45—Missouri Gaming Commission Chapter 30—Bingo

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Missouri Gaming Commission (commission) under section 313.065, RSMo 2000, the commission amends a rule as follows:

11 CSR 45-30.040 Occasion is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on January 3, 2005 (30 MoReg 68). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: A public hearing on this proposed amendment was held on February 4, 2005, and the public comment period ended February 3, 2005. The commission received written comments from Michael D. Myers, Bingo Chairman for the Heart of the Ozarks Sertoma Club; Ray Bryant for the Hannibal Regional Hospital Auxiliary; Matt Stowers for Goodtime Bingo; the Association of Charitable Games Missouri (ACGM); Larry Loos, Bingo Chairman for the Friday Optimist of Cape Girardeau; Chet Doile, Bingo Chairman for the Lake Lotawana VFW Post. At the public hearing, the Missouri Gaming Commission staff explained the changes and four (4) comments were made by W.T. Dawson, Legislative Consultant for ACGM; David Tackett of the Warrensburg American Legion 131; Linda Bennet, Bingo Chairman for the VFW Post 280 Auxiliary and Vice President of ACGM; and Larry Loos. During a public meeting of the commission on February 23, 2005, the commission allowed additional comments on this proposed amendment to be received from members of the public in attendance at the meeting. The commission received one (1) additional comment from Larry Loos.

COMMENT: Chet Doile questioned the reasoning behind an organization wanting to hold a regular bingo occasion and a special bingo occasion on the same day.

RESPONSE: The commission received comments from organizations wanting to conduct a regular bingo occasion and a special bingo occasion on the same day as a way of promoting more creative gaming opportunities for the public and generating more revenue for the organizations.

COMMENT: Ray Bryant and Michael D. Myers opposed the amendment, due to the fact that it would place a new restriction on bingo organizations.

RESPONSE: It has always been the policy of the commission not to allow the holder of a regular bingo license to conduct a bingo occasion under a special bingo license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular bingo license; the amendment seeks to publicly codify this policy in 11 CSR 45-30.040.

COMMENT: ACGM and Matt Stowers opposed the amendment because the amendment would restrict bingo organizations from offering creative gaming opportunities to the public.

RESPONSE: The amendment places no new restrictions or impairments on the ability of bingo organizations to offer creative games to the public, as section 313.015.2, RSMo 2000, currently prohibits an organization from being the holder of more than one (1) license.

COMMENT: David Tackett and Linda Bennett opposed the amendment, due to the fact that it would prohibit bingo organizations from doubling their revenues by offering more games and prize money to the public by holding two (2) bingo occasions on the same day.

RESPONSE: Regardless of the number of occasions bingo organizations are allowed to conduct during a day, organizations are bound by the restrictions imposed by section 313.040(4) and (5), RSMo 2000, restrictions that limit the aggregate retail value of all prizes or merchandise awarded by an organization on any single day to three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600), excluding prizes for pull-tab games and progressive bingo games, and limit the number of bingo games allowed in any one day to sixty-two (62). Consequently, even if the commission was to allow the holder of a regular bingo license to conduct a bingo occasion under a special bingo license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular bingo license, the licensee would still only be permitted to award a combined total of three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) in prizes, excluding prizes for pull-tab games and progressive bingo games, and play no more than a combined total of sixty-two (62) games of bingo for the two (2) bingo occasions.

Restrictions, penalties.

313.040. The conducting of bingo is subject to the following restrictions:

- (4) The aggregate retail value of all prizes or merchandise awarded, except prizes or merchandise awarded by pull-tab cards and progressive bingo games, in any single day of bingo may not exceed three thousand six hundred dollars and the prize awarded for any one game, other than progressive bingo games authorized pursuant to section 313.013, may not exceed five hundred dollars cash or its equivalent. No more than one five-hundred-dollar prize, other than prizes in progressive bingo games, shall be awarded on any single day of bingo;
- (5) The number of games may not exceed sixty-two in any one day, including regular and special games. For purposes of this subdivision, the use of a pull-tab card and progressive bingo games shall not count as one of the sixty-two games per day, as limited by this subdivision, but no pull-tab card may be used except in conjunction with one of such sixty-two games;

COMMENT: Larry Loos opposed the amendment because it would impose a new restriction on bingo organizations by not allowing the holder of a regular bingo license to conduct a bingo occasion under a special bingo license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular bingo license. Mr. Loos favors the present version of the rule that only restricts bingo organizations to sixty-two (62) bingo games during a single day. Mr. Loos also commented that many smaller bingo organizations do not exceed the sixty-two (62) games or three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) prize limits and holding two (2) occasions during a single day would help such organizations to generate more revenue. In his written comments, Mr. Loos stated he believes that section 313.040(4) and (5), RSMo 2000, allows a bingo organization to conduct two (2) separate bingo occasions on the same day under the organization's regular and special bingo licenses and award three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) in prizes or merchandise during each occasion, as well as play up to sixty-two (62) games during each occasion, "But there is reason to believe that the legislature did not intend to make this limitation either. 313.040(5) RSMo says, 'The number of games may not exceed sixty-two in any one day, including regular and special games.' However the second clause that combines regular and special games is missing from section (4) with regard to \$3,600. But most of all, section (5) clearly assumes that a group could hold a regular license and special license on the same day or the restriction of 62 games would not be necessary."

RESPONSE: The issuing of regular and special bingo licenses is governed by section 313.015, RSMo 2000, and not by section 313.040(4) and (5), RSMo 2000:

License—fee—expiration—special license, fairs, celebrations, requirements, fee, annual report, when.

313.015.1. The commission shall issue a license for the conducting of bingo to any bona fide religious, charitable, fraternal, veteran or service organization or to any combination of eligible organizations, not to exceed five, which submits an application on a form prescribed by the director and which satisfies the director that such organization meets all the requirements of sections 313.005 to 313.080. The burden of proof is at all times on the applicant to demonstrate by clear and convincing evidence its suitability to be licensed. Each license so issued shall expire at midnight one year from its date of issuance. The commission, in its sole discretion, may reopen licensure hearings for any licensee at any time.

- 2. An applicant may hold only one license and that license may not be transferred or assigned to any other organization other than the organization named in the license. Each licensed organization shall pay to the director an annual, nonrefundable license fee of fifty dollars; provided, however, each licensed organization which awards to winners of bingo games prizes or merchandise having an aggregate retail value of five thousand dollars or less annually and less than one hundred dollars in any single day shall pay to the director an annual fee of ten dollars to be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the gaming commission bingo fund. The director may, upon application made by a county fair organization or by any organization qualified to receive a regular license, issue a special license authorizing such organization to conduct bingo for the period of any fair, picnic, festival or celebration conducted by such qualified organization not exceeding one week and which is held not more than once annually, and a special license shall be exempt from the provisions of subdivisions (7) and (11) of section 313.040. Each organization receiving a special license shall pay to the director a fee of twenty-five dollars, to be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the gaming com-
- 3. Any organization that obtains more than three special bingo licenses during any calendar year shall be required to file an annual report as required by section 313.045.

Unlike the issuing of a regular bingo license, the issuing of a special bingo license is solely within the discretion of the commission, as is evidenced by the phrase, "The director may..." in section 313.015.2. In an effort to assist regular bingo licensees wishing to conduct bingo during fairs, picnics, festivals, and celebrations, the commission adopted a liberal interpretation of the one (1) license restriction imposed by section 313.015.2, in that the commission allows the holder of a regular bingo license to also be the holder of a special bingo license, as long as the license is for a bona fide special event such as a fair, picnic, festival, etc., and the license is not used on the same day the licensee uses its regular license, as such simultaneous use would make the licensee the active holder of two (2) licenses on the same day, in violation of section 313.015.2.

With regard to the restrictions found in section 313.040(4) and (5), concerning the total amount of bingo games played and prizes or merchandise awarded by a bingo organization in a single day, these restrictions are some of the many restrictions that were placed on bingo organizations by the Missouri Legislature (Legislature) to ensure that charitable bingo in the state does not serve to promote gambling but remains a purely charitable endeavor in accords with the wishes of the citizens of Missouri as expressed in Article III, Section 39(a) of the *Missouri Constitution*. Consequently, any changes to the restrictions imposed by section 313.040(4) and (5), may only be accomplished by an act of the Legislature and not the commission.

COMMENT: At the February 23, 2005, public meeting of the commission, Larry Loos spoke on behalf of ACGM in opposition of the amendment because it would impose a new restriction on bingo organizations by not allowing the holder of a regular bingo license to conduct a bingo occasion under a special bingo license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular bingo license. Mr. Loos favors the present version of the rule that only restricts bingo organizations to sixty-two (62) bingo games during a single day. Mr. Loos also commented that many smaller bingo organizations do not exceed the sixty-two (62) games or three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) prize limits and holding two (2) occasions during a single day would help such organizations to generate more revenue, however, Mr. Loos did concede that his earlier comments concerning the sixty-two (62) games and three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) prize limits were incorrect and that any regular licensee conducting a bingo occasion under a special license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular license would be limited to a combined total of sixty-two (62) games and three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) in prizes, excluding prizes for pull-tab games and progressive bingo games, during the two (2) occasions.

RESPONSE: In 2003 and 2004, the commission received less than five (5) requests from the holder of a regular bingo license seeking permission to conduct a bingo occasion under a special bingo license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular bingo license. All such requests were denied according to the commission's longstanding policy of not allowing the holder of a regular license to conduct a bingo occasion under a special license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular license, in order to prevent the requesting licensees from being the holders of two (2) licenses in violation of section 313.015.2. The commission did, and does, routinely work with the holders of regular licenses seeking to conduct a bingo occasion under a special license on the same day the licensee conducts a bingo occasion under its regular license to explore alternative, lawful methods of holding two (2) bingo occasions on the same day, such as having an organization's auxiliary apply for a special bingo license. If granted a special license by the commission, an organization's auxiliary may conduct a bingo occasion under said license on the same day the organization conducts a bingo occasion under its regular license. Commission bingo records also indicate that the majority of the commission's regular licensees are paying out the maximum of three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) in prizes during their regularly scheduled bingo occasions. Consequently, allowing regular licensees to conduct a bingo occasion under a special license on the same day the licensees conduct a bingo occasion under their regular licenses would only be of benefit to a very small number of licensees, while placing licensees in violation of section 313.015.2 and creating an environment in which the likelihood of disciplinary actions being imposed on licensees by the commission for record keeping errors involving the combined total of games played and prize money awarded for the two (2) occasions is greatly increased to the detriment of smaller bingo organizations.

Title 11—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY Division 45—Missouri Gaming Commission Chapter 30—Bingo

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Missouri Gaming Commission (commission) under section 313.065, RSMo 2000, the commission adopts a rule as follows:

11 CSR 45-30.135 is adopted.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on January 3, 2005 (30 MoReg 70). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: A public hearing on this proposed rule was held on February 4, 2005, and the public comment period ended February 3, 2005. The commission received written comments from Marguerite M. Morrissey of St. Michael's Catholic Church; Constance Marshall, Bingo Chairman for the Richmond Heights-Crestwood Ladies Auxiliary to VFW Post 3500; Al Brown, Bingo Chairman for the Kol Am Congregation; Chet Doile, Bingo Chairman for the Lake Lotawana VFW Post; Ray Bryant for the Hannibal Regional Hospital Auxiliary; Karen Leach; Paul Corner, Bingo Chairman for VFW Post 3944; R. Lee James for American Legion Post 117; Larry Loos, Bingo Chairman for the Friday Optimist of Cape Girardeau; Association of Charitable Games Missouri (ACGM); Matt Stowers for Goodtime Bingo; and Michael D. Myers, Bingo Chairman for the Heart of the Ozarks Sertoma Club. At the public hearing, the commission staff explained the changes and three (3) comments were made by W.T. Dawson, Legislative Consultant for ACGM; David Tackett for Warrensburg American Legion Post 131; and Larry Loos. During a public meeting of the commission on February 23, 2005, the commission allowed additional comments on this proposed amendment to be received from members of the public in attendance at the meeting. The commission received one (1) additional comment from Larry

COMMENT: At the February 23, 2005, public meeting of the commission, Larry Loos spoke on behalf of ACGM in opposition of the amendment as being too restrictive in its definition of a "bingo worker" and requested a more relaxed definition. Specifically, Mr. Loos requested a definition of "bingo worker" that would permit bingo organizations to have guest or celebrity callers, as well as a definition that would permit organizations to use non-bingo workers to prepare and sell bingo paper and pull-tabs.

RESPONSE: Modern day bingo involves patterns that are far more complicated than the simple horizontal, vertical, and diagonal patterns of traditional bingo, and therefore, the caller plays a pivotal role in the management, conduct, and operation of the game of bingo by assuring that each game is conducted and called in accordance with the corresponding pattern rules. The allowing of a guest or celebri-

ty caller who is not an approved bingo worker of the organization conducting the game of bingo would violate the restrictions imposed on persons involved in the management, conduct, or operation of the game of bingo by Article III, section 39(a)(3) of the Missouri Constitution and section 313.040(2), RSMo 2000, as well as create a situation in which a non-member of an organization would be involved in resolving disputes centered around the calling of bingo numbers or symbols. Bingo organizations wishing to use guest or celebrity callers may do so if such callers are simply used as secondary callers who only repeat the bingo numbers or symbols originally called by an approved bingo worker and are not involved in resolving any disputes centered around the calling of those numbers or symbols. With regard to the preparing and selling of bingo paper and pull-tabs, the commission deems such activities to be ones that involve the management, conduct, and operation of the game of bingo and any person performing such activities must be an approved bingo worker in accordance with the provisions of Article III, section 39(a)(3) of the Missouri Constitution and section 313.040(2).

COMMENT: All comments received by the commission prior to the public meeting on February 23, 2005, opposed the rule as being too restrictive in its definition of a "bingo worker" and requested a more relaxed definition. The majority of comments sought to limit the definition of a "bingo worker" to persons involved in the actual conducting of the game of bingo, as opposed to persons "involved in player contact" as set forth in the proposed amendment.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission is changing section (1) of the rule to reflect the definition of a "bingo worker" found in Article III, section 39(a)(3) of the *Missouri Constitution* and section 313.040(2), that limits said definition to persons involved in the management, conduct, or operation of the game of bingo. The commission is also adding section (2) in an effort to clarify for bingo organizations the activities that do not have to be performed by a bingo worker.

Article III, Section 39(a) of the *Missouri Constitution*. Bingo may be authorized—requirements

- (3) No person shall participate in the management, conduct, or operation of any game unless that person:
- (a) Has been a bona fide member of the licensed organization for two years immediately preceding such participation, and volunteers the time and service necessary to conduct the game;
 - (b) Is not a paid staff person for the licensed organization;
- (c) Is not and has never been a professional gambler or gambling promoter;
- (d) Has never purchased a tax stamp for wagering or gambling activity;
 - (e) Has never been convicted of any felony;
- (f) Has never been convicted or pleaded nolo contendre to any illegal gambling activity;
 - (g) Is of good moral character;

Restrictions, penalties.

- 313.040. The conducting of bingo is subject to the following restrictions:
- (2) No person shall participate in conducting or managing the game of bingo except a person who has been a bona fide member of the licensed organization for at least two years immediately preceding such participation, who is not a paid staff person of the licensed organization employed and compensated specifically for conducting or managing the game of bingo and who volunteers the time and service necessary to conduct the game. . . .

11 CSR 45-30.135 Bingo Workers

- (1) A bingo worker is any person participating in the operation of the game of bingo. This includes the bingo chairperson or member in charge, callers and any person that helps to verify or pay bingo winners. It includes any person that sells bingo paper or pull-tabs, as well as any person involved in the management, conduct, or operation of the actual games, including those who help prepare bingo paper, count winning pull-tabs, or otherwise handle the bingo supplies, bingo equipment, or receipts.
- (2) For the purposes of this rule, the term "bingo worker" shall not include any person whose sole duty or responsibility is to prepare or sell concessions, provide janitorial or security services, sell raffle or sweepstakes tickets for a lawfully conducted raffle or sweepstakes, or sell markers, cushions, bags, and other incidentals, as well as any authorized representative of a licensed supplier whose sole duty or responsibility is to maintain Electronic Bingo Card Monitoring Devices (EBCMDs).

Title 11—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY Division 45—Missouri Gaming Commission Chapter 30—Bingo

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Missouri Gaming Commission (Commission) under section 313.065, RSMo 2000, the commission amends a rule as follows:

11 CSR 45-30.355 is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on January 3, 2005 (30 MoReg 77–78). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: A public hearing on this proposed amendment was held on February 4, 2005, and the public comment period ended February 3, 2005. The commission received written comments from Larry Loos, Bingo Chairman for the Friday Optimist of Cape Girardeau; Michael D. Myers, Bingo Chairman for the Heart of the Ozarks Sertoma Club; and Matt Stowers for Goodtime Bingo. At the public hearing, the commission staff explained the changes and two (2) comments were made by W.T. Dawson, Legislative Consultant for ACGM; and Larry Loos. During a public meeting of the commission on February 23, 2005, the commission allowed additional comments on this proposed amendment to be received from members of the public in attendance at the meeting. The commission received one (1) additional comment from Larry Loos.

COMMENT: ACGM, Matt Stowers, and Michael D. Myers requested that section (4) be amended to allow the sale of pull-tab cards before 10:00 a.m. but prohibit the redemption of pull-tab cards before 10:00 a.m.

RESPONSE: Section 313.040(14), RSMo 2000, prohibits a bingo organization from conducting a bingo session between the hours of midnight and 10:00 a.m. To assist bingo organizations holding 10:00 a.m. sessions, the commission permits organizations to sell bingo cards and bingo sheets up to two (2) hours prior to the beginning of a session, due to the fact that bingo cards and bingo sheets are not instant winner devices and winning bingo cards and bingo sheets cannot be determined until after a bingo session begins. Consequently,

the commission has adopted the position that the sale of bingo cards and bingo sheets before 10:00 a.m. does not violate section 313.040(14). Pull-tab cards by definition, as crafted by the Missouri Legislature (Legislature) in section 313.005(10), RSMo 2000, are instant winner devices that if sold before 10:00 a.m. would allow a winner to be determined during a time in which it is prohibited to conduct a bingo session, and therefore, the commission views the sale of pull-tab cards before 10:00 a.m. to be a violation of section 313.040(14).

Definitions

313.005. As used in sections 313.005 to 313.080, the follow terms shall mean:

(10) "Pull-tab card", any disposable card or ticket which accords a person an opportunity to win something of value by opening, pulling, detaching, or otherwise removing tabs from the card or ticket to reveal a set of numbers, letters, symbols, or configurations, or any combination thereof. The term "pull-tab card" shall include any card known as a pickle ticket, pickle, break-open, or pull-tab card.

Restrictions, penalties

313.040. The conducting of bingo is subject to the following restrictions:

(14) No licensee shall conduct a bingo session at any time during the ten-hour period between midnight and 10:00 a.m.;

COMMENT: Larry Loos requested the commission to approve the sale of event tickets as pull-tab cards. An event ticket informs the player when the player opens the ticket whether or not the player has won something of value, however, after being informed that he or she is a winner the player is then required to wait a period of time before the player learns exactly what he or she has won.

RESPONSE: With the ratification of Article III, section 39(a) of the Missouri Constitution, the citizens of Missouri approved only the conducting of charitable bingo by qualified organizations. The Missouri Legislature (Legislature) in section 313.040(5), RSMo 2000, approved the use of pull-tab cards in conjunction with charitable bingo and provided a definition for pull-tab cards in section 313.005(10), RSMo 2000. As it is the Legislature that has authorized the use of pull-tab cards and defined the same, the commission will not approve the sale of any pull-tab card that goes beyond the definition provided by the Legislature by requiring a player to do more than simply opening, pulling, detaching, or otherwise removing tabs from the cards to win something of value. The use of a ticket that requires a player to wait a period of time before the player learns exactly what he or she has won does not fall within the statutory definition of a pull-tab card but more accurately resembles the use of tickets in a traditional raffle or sweepstakes. Article III, section 39(f) of the Missouri Constitution permits charitable or religious organizations to conduct raffles and sweepstakes in the state and Missouri law does not prohibit such organizations from producing and using their own raffle and sweepstakes tickets or conducting a lawful raffle and sweepstakes during a bingo occasion.

Article III, Section 39(a) of the *Missouri Constitution*. Bingo may be authorized—requirements

The game commonly known as bingo when conducted by religious, charitable, fraternal, veteran or service organizations is not a lottery or gift enterprise within the meaning of subdivision (9) of section 39 of this article if the general assembly authorizes by law that religious, charitable, fraternal, service, or veteran organizations may conduct the game commonly known as bingo, upon the payment of the license fee and the issuance of the license as provided by law. . . .

Article III, Section 39(f) of the *Missouri Constitution*. Raffles and sweepstakes, charitable or religious organizations may sponsor, standards and conditions

Any organization recognized as charitable or religious pursuant to federal law may sponsor raffles and sweepstakes in which a person risks something of value for a prize. The general assembly may, by law, provide standards and conditions to regulate or guarantee the awarding of prizes provided for in such raffles or sweepstakes.

Definitions

313.005. As used in sections 313.005 to 313.080, the follow terms shall mean:

(10) "Pull-tab card", any disposable card or ticket which accords a person an opportunity to win something of value by opening, pulling, detaching, or otherwise removing tabs from the card or ticket to reveal a set of numbers, letters, symbols, or configurations, or any combination thereof. The term "pull-tab card" shall include any card known as a pickle ticket, pickle, break-open, or pull-tab cards.

Restrictions, penalties

313.040. The conducting of bingo is subject to the following restrictions:

(5) The number of games may not exceed sixty-two in any one day, including regular and special games. For purposes of this subdivision, the use of a pull-tab card and progressive bingo games shall not count as one of the sixty-two games per day, as limited by this subdivision, but no pull-tab card may be used except in conjunction with one of such sixty-two games;

COMMENT: At the February 23, 2005, public meeting of the commission, Larry Loos spoke on behalf of ACGM and requested the commission to approve the sale of event tickets as pull-tab cards. An event ticket informs the player when the player opens the ticket whether or not the player has won something of value, however, after being informed that he or she is a winner the player is then required to wait a period of time before the player learns exactly what he or she has won.

RESPONSE: Pull-tab cards are disposable cards or tickets whose sale was authorized by the Legislature under section 313.040(5), but only in conjunction with one of the sixty-two (62) permissible bingo games during a single bingo occasion. The commission considers any card or ticket, such as an event ticket, that is not an instant winner device but requires a player to wait to claim his or her prize to be outside the definition of "pull-tab cards" provided by the Legislature under section 313.005(10), and illegal in Missouri. The instant winner characteristics of pull-tab cards in Missouri helps to assure that such cards are redeemed during the bingo occasion in which they are sold and that no card is used in conjunction with the bingo games of two (2) or more occasions. Authorizing the sale of event tickets would violate the restrictions of section 313.005(10), as well as grant larger bingo organizations an unfair advantage over smaller bingo organizations in that all event tickets in a game draw must be sold and all prizes awarded during the single occasion in which the tickets are offered for sale or else all monies paid for the tickets by players during the occasion must be returned to those players. Consequently, larger bingo organizations that are assured of easily selling all event tickets in a game draw during a single occasion and do not face the possibility of having to return players' money paid for tickets if all the tickets are not sold in a single occasion would be placed in an unfairly advantageous position by the commission of being able to use the sale of event tickets to attract players away from the bingo occasions of smaller organizations, much to the demise of such organizations. And, halting the demise of bingo organizations throughout Missouri is something that Mr. Loos and ACGM has repeatedly expressed to the commission as being one (1) of their main goals, if not their most important goal.

COMMENT: Larry Loos requested that bingo organizations be allowed to sell pull-tab cards throughout the organizations' premises. RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission is changing section (4) of the amendment to allow for the sale of pull-tab cards throughout a bingo organization's premises. The commission is also changing sections (4) and (5) of the amendment to clarify the types of licenses covered by the two (2) sections.

11 CSR 45-30.355 Sale of Pull-Tab Cards by Bingo Licensees

- (4) Licensees possessing a type A or B license, as identified in 11 CSR 45-30.065(1)(A) and (B) must comply with the following:
- (A) On each occasion, pull-tab cards may be sold no more than two (2) hours prior to the start of the first game of bingo, except that no bingo pull-tab cards may be sold prior to 10:00 a.m.;
- (B) The sale of pull-tab cards must be discontinued immediately at the conclusion of the last bingo game of an occasion; and
- (C) Pull-tab cards shall only be sold during the time of a scheduled occasion and only on the stated premises as identified in the license application of the organization.
- (5) Licensees possessing a type C license, as identified in 11 CSR 45-30.065(1)(C), must comply with the following:
- (A) An organization may conduct no more than four (4) occasions per calendar year at which only pull-tabs cards are sold;
- (B) Pull-tab cards may only be sold during a scheduled occasion and on the stated premises as identified in the license application of the organization; and
 - (C) No bingo games may be conducted.

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
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
