Emergency Rules

Missouri Register

Bules appearing under this heading are filed under the authority granted by section 536.025, RSMo 2000. An emergency rule may be adopted by an agency if the agency finds that an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare, or a compelling governmental interest requires emergency action; follows procedures best calculated to assure fairness to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances; follows procedures which comply with the protections extended by the Missouri and the United States Constitutions; limits the scope of such rule to the circumstances creating an emergency and requiring emergency procedure, and at the time of or prior to the adoption of such rule files with the secretary of state the text of the rule together with the specific facts, reasons, and findings which support its conclusion that there is an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare which can be met only through the adoption of such rule and its reasons for concluding that the procedure employed is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances.

Rules filed as emergency rules may be effective not less than ten (10) days after filing or at such later date as may be specified in the rule and may be terminated at any time by the state agency by filing an order with the secretary of state fixing the date of such termination, which order shall be published by the secretary of state in the *Missouri Register* as soon as practicable.

A ll emergency rules must state the period during which they are in effect, and in no case can they be in effect more than one hundred eighty (180) calendar days or thirty (30) legislative days, whichever period is longer. Emergency rules are not renewable, although an agency may at any time adopt an identical rule under the normal rulemaking procedures.

EMERGENCY AMENDMENT

12 CSR 10-26.020 License Requirements for Auctions, Dealers, *Franchisors*, and Manufacturers. The director proposes to amend the title and purpose and add a new section (9).

PURPOSE: This amendment specifies the requirements for the issuance of a motor vehicle manufacturer's license to a franchisor who must comply with the Motor Vehicle Franchise Practices Act (2010) in order to maintain franchised motor vehicle dealerships in the state of Missouri.

EMERGENCY STATEMENT: This emergency amendment prescribes the requirements for issuance of a motor vehicle manufacturer's license to a franchisor, as defined in sections 407.810 to 407.835, RSMo, under section 301.553, RSMo. This amendment is necessary for the Department of Revenue (department) to implement House Bill 2198, passed by the Second Regular Session of the Ninety-fifth General Assembly, 2010. This legislation becomes effective August 28, 2010. With such a limited amount of time to implement the franchisor licensing requirements necessary to fulfill the department's responsibilities and to mitigate a negative economic climate to Missouri auto dealers, the department finds a compelling governmental interest for this emergency action. Failure to enact the

requirements of this amendment in a timely manner will preclude motor vehicle franchise dealers from continuing operation past December 31, 2010, because, effective August 28, 2010, as a condition of their motor vehicle franchise license, the franchisor must obtain the necessary franchisor license prescribed in this rulemaking. The department has discussed the general details of this amendment with the Missouri Automobile Dealers Association (MADA). There are approximately four hundred (400) motor vehicle franchise dealers licensed in Missouri. These dealers generate millions of dollars in state tax revenue and employ several thousand Missourians. The economic viability of these small businesses would be jeopardized should their dealer licenses not be issued. Because the legislation requiring the franchisor licenses did not contain specific details regarding the requirements for issuance of such licenses, the department is utilizing its rulemaking authority granted under section 301.553, RSMo, to prescribe the aforementioned licensing requirements. A proposed amendment that covers the same material is published in this issue of the Missouri Register. The scope of this emergency amendment is limited to the circumstances creating the emergency and complies with the protections extended in the Missouri and United States Constitutions. The Department of Revenue believes this emergency amendment is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances. This emergency amendment was filed August 18, 2010, becomes effective August 28, 2010, and expires February 24, 2011.

PURPOSE: The department must determine whether applicants who apply for a license as a boat dealer, boat manufacturer, trailer dealer, trailer manufacturer, motor vehicle dealer, motor vehicle manufacturer, public motor vehicle auction, or wholesale motor vehicle auction [pursuant to] under sections 301.550 to 301.562, RSMo, have met the requirements outlined in the law. This rule clarifies these requirements. This rule also establishes the requirements for issuance of a manufacturer's license under section 301.553, RSMo, and to implement franchisor license requirements under sections 407.810 to 407.835, RSMo, otherwise known as the Motor Vehicle Franchise Practices (MVFP) Act.

(9) A "franchisor," as defined in the Motor Vehicle Franchise Practices (MVFP) Act, may meet the licensing requirements of the MVFP Act by obtaining a manufacturer's license under this rule.

(A) Notwithstanding any other provision of this rule, an applicant for a manufacturer's license, in order to comply with the franchisor licensing requirements of the MVFP Act, shall provide—

1. The street address for the franchisor location;

2. The telephone number for the franchisor location in paragraph (9)(A)1.;

3. A list of the names of the principal officers of the corporation;

4. A list of all other names it is doing business as, if applicable;

5. A list of all vehicle makes which the corporation authorizes franchise dealers to sell;

6. The state or province and the country of the franchisor's location in paragraph (9)(A)1.;

7. A list of mediators as prescribed in section 407.822, RSMo;

8. The motor vehicle or trailer manufacturer's license fee as authorized by 12 CSR 10-26.040; and

9. A certified statement attesting that-

A. The franchisor's place of business identified in paragraph (9)(A)1. is occupied and is used, in part, to facilitate the franchising of motor vehicle dealers who operate within the state of Missouri; B. The franchisor maintains regular business hours during which the department is able to contact the franchisor; and

C. The franchisor will notify the department not less than ten (10) days prior to moving its place of business or changing its telephone number.

(B) All franchisor manufacturer licenses shall expire July 31 of each year. The license fee referenced in paragraph (9)(A)8. shall not be prorated.

(C) The franchisor shall be issued a license in the manufacturer's range of distinctive license numbers: DM-0 through DM-999.

(D) Dealer license plates shall not be issued to franchisors.

EMERGENCY AMENDMENT

20 CSR **2263-2.031** Acceptable Supervisors and Supervisor Responsibilities. The committee is proposing to amend subsection (1)(B) and section (7).

PURPOSE: This amendment allows a licensed master social worker, under supervision, to submit reimbursement requests to MO HealthNet.

EMERGENCY STATEMENT: During the Second Regular Session of the Ninety-fifth General Assembly, Conference Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for House Bill 2226, House Bill 1824, House Bill 1832, and House Bill 1990, herein referred to as House Bill 2226, was passed. In part, this legislation removed all statutory references for provisionally licensed clinical social workers.

Prior to the effective date of HB 2226 (2010), three (3) different classifications of social worker licensure included a clinical practice component—

- Licensed master social workers provide services in a broader spectrum of areas and are not solely focused on clinical social work. These areas may include education, research, mediation, community organization and development, and implementation and administration of policies as authorized by sections 337.600(11) and (12), RSMo. Some licensed master social workers choose the path toward clinical licensure and are able to provide clinical services under the proper supervision of a licensed clinical social worker while they work toward the required hours of clinical experience.
- Provisional licensed clinical social workers' scope of practice is focused on providing services in a clinical setting and must be done so under proper supervision. These individuals have graduated from an accredited school of social work, have taken the clinical examination, and are in the process of obtaining the two (2) years of supervised clinical social work experience. Their scope of practice encompasses the licensed master social worker scope of practice; however, the major focus for their practice is in the clinical setting. Upon completion of the super-

vised clinical experience, the provisional licensed clinical social worker becomes a licensed clinical social worker.

• Clinical licensed social workers' scope of practice is focused on providing services in a clinical setting and do not require supervision. This scope of practice encompasses all practice components of social work.

HB 2226 (2010) eliminates the provisional licensed clinical social worker classification. As a result of the emergency amendment to 20 CSR 2263-2.045, individuals currently licensed as provisional licensed clinical social workers will be transferred to a licensed master social worker license classification to accommodate the statutory framework set up by HB 2226 (2010).

Currently, pursuant to section 337.600, RSMo, provisional licensed clinical social workers and licensed master social workers are authorized to provide services under the supervision of a person who is qualified to practice clinical social work. When HB 2226 becomes effective on August 28, 2010, all statutory references for provisional licensed clinical social workers will be removed from the statutes, which in turn will prohibit Missouri citizens from continuing to receive services from provisional licensed clinical social workers. Some Missouri citizens currently seek such services from provisional licensed clinical social workers that are reimbursable under Title XIX (Medicaid) through the Missouri Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division. Elimination of this classification of licensure with no replacement of providers will affect some citizens' ability to receive clinical social worker services. The State Committee for Social Workers is authorized by sections 337.612 and 337.627, RSMo, to establish characteristics of supervised experience for clinical supervised experience and supervised master experience. The committee believes immediate adoption of this rule will assure Missouri citizens continue to receive such services. Adoption of these rules only through the ordinary rulemaking process will leave the people of the state of Missouri who currently receive services from provisional licensed clinical social workers without providers and without coverage of such services.

As a result, the State Committee of Social Workers finds that there is an immediate danger to the public health, safety, and/or welfare and a compelling governmental interest that requires this emergency action. A proposed amendment, which covers the same material, is published in this issue of the **Missouri Register**. The scope of this emergency amendment is limited to the circumstances creating the emergency and complies with the protections extended in the **Missouri** and **United States Constitutions**. The Missouri State Committee of Social Workers believes this emergency amendment is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances. This emergency amendment was filed August 18, 2010, becomes effective August 28, 2010, and expires February 24, 2011.

(1) Acceptable Supervisors[:]-

(B) A licensed clinical social worker (LCSW) may supervise LCSW, licensed advanced macro social worker (LAMSW), or licensed baccalaureate social worker [(LBSW)] independent practice (LBSW) registrants and may supervise a licensed master social worker (LMSW) who is under registered supervision pursuant to section (7) of this rule;

(7) [A licensed social worker assuming the role of supervisor may employ the supervisee in the supervisor's private practice setting. In those instances, the supervisor may bill clients for services rendered by the supervisee but under no circumstances shall the supervisee bill the clients directly for services rendered by the supervisee. The professional setting shall not include private practice in which the supervisee operates, manages, or has an ownership interest in the private practice.] A licensed master social worker under registered supervision may be employed in the supervisor's private practice setting or in the private practice of another. In those instances, the supervisor may bill clients for services rendered by the licensed master social worker but under no circumstances shall the licensed master social worker bill the clients directly for services rendered. The only exception to this section shall be when reimbursement for services is provided under Title XIX (Medicaid) through the Missouri Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division. A licensed master social worker under registered supervision may accept a Medicaid reimbursement number and services may be billed through that number, provided such reimbursement is administered through the professional setting employing the licensed master social worker, and not directly paid to the licensed master social worker. The professional setting shall not include private practice in which the licensed master social worker operates, manages, or has an ownership interest in the private practice.

PURPOSE: This rule is being amended to allow the committee to allow current provisional licensed clinical social workers to continue to work with those in need and allow individuals that hold a provisional social worker license in the state of Missouri to complete the licensure process under the same requirements that were in effect when the individual applied for this classification of licensure and would allow them to qualify for the licensed master social worker license and would reclassify them with a licensed master social worker license.

EMERGENCY STATEMENT: During the Second Regular Session of the Ninety-fifth General Assembly, Conference Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for House Bill 2226, House Bill 1824, House Bill 1832, and House Bill 1990, herein referred to as House Bill 2226, was passed. In part, this legislation removed all statutory references for provisionally licensed clinical social workers.

Prior to the effective date of HB 2226 (2010), three (3) different classifications of social worker licensure included a clinical practice component—

By transferring provisional licensed clinical social workers as licensed master social workers, citizens of the state of Missouri will continue to receive clinical social worker services and providers will continue to receive reimbursement under Title XIX (Medicaid) through the Missouri Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division; therefore, an immediate adoption of this rule is necessary.

As a result, the State Committee of Social Workers finds that there is an immediate danger to the public health, safety, and/or welfare and a compelling governmental interest that requires this emergency action. A proposed amendment, which covers the same material, is published in this issue of the **Missouri Register**. The scope of this emergency amendment is limited to the circumstances creating the emergency and complies with the protections extended in the

Missouri and *United States Constitutions*. The Missouri State Committee of Social Workers believes this emergency amendment is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances. (3) The following documents must be on file for an application for provisional social work licensure to be considered complete and officially filed:

(D) Verification of a passing score on the examination administered by the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB). Verification of score(s) must be sent directly to the committee office by the ASWB.

1. The examination for a provisional licensed clinical social worker is the clinical examination; and

[2. The examination for a baccalaureate social worker is the bachelors examination, or higher; and]

(9) Effective August 28, 2010, all provisional licensed clinical social workers will be subject to the same rules and requirements as those of licensed master social workers and will be issued a licensed master social worker license by the committee with no fee. Those provisional licensed clinical social workers that are issued a licensed master social worker license by the committee are exempt from continuing education requirements through the first renewal of their licensed master social worker license but are not exempt thereafter. Effective August 28, 2010, the committee will issue no further provisional licensed clinical social worker licenses.

PURPOSE: The department must determine whether applicants who apply for a license as a boat dealer, boat manufacturer, trailer dealer, trailer manufacturer, motor vehicle dealer, motor vehicle manufacturer, public motor vehicle auction, or wholesale motor vehicle auction [pursuant to] under sections 301.550 to 301.562, RSMo, have met the requirements outlined in the law. This rule clarifies these requirements. This rule also establishes the requirements for issuance of a manufacturer's license under section 301.553, RSMo, and to implement franchisor license requirements under sections 407.810 to 407.835, RSMo, otherwise known as the Motor Vehicle Franchise Practices (MVFP) Act.

(9) A "franchisor," as defined in the Motor Vehicle Franchise Practices (MVFP) Act, may meet the licensing requirements of the MVFP Act by obtaining a manufacturer's license under this rule.

(A) Notwithstanding any other provision of this rule, an applicant for a manufacturer's license, in order to comply with the franchisor licensing requirements of the MVFP Act, shall provide—

1. The street address for the franchisor location;

2. The telephone number for the franchisor location in paragraph (9)(A)1.;

3. A list of the names of the principal officers of the corporation;

4. A list of all other names it is doing business as, if applicable;

5. A list of all vehicle makes which the corporation authorizes franchise dealers to sell;

6. The state or province and the country of the franchisor's location in paragraph (9)(A)1.;

7. A list of mediators as prescribed in section 407.822, RSMo;

8. The motor vehicle or trailer manufacturer's license fee as authorized by 12 CSR 10-26.040; and

9. A certified statement attesting that-

A. The franchisor's place of business identified in paragraph (9)(A)1. is occupied and is used, in part, to facilitate the franchising of motor vehicle dealers who operate within the state of Missouri;

B. The franchisor maintains regular business hours during which the department is able to contact the franchisor; and

C. The franchisor will notify the department not less than ten (10) days prior to moving its place of business or changing its telephone number.

(B) All franchisor manufacturer licenses shall expire July 31 of each year. The license fee referenced in paragraph (9)(A)8. shall not be prorated.

(C) The franchisor shall be issued a license in the manufacturer's range of distinctive license numbers: DM-0 through DM-999.

(D) Dealer license plates shall not be issued to franchisors.

20 CSR **2263-2.031** Acceptable Supervisors and Supervisor Responsibilities. The committee is proposing to amend subsection (1)(B) and section (7).

PURPOSE: During the Second Regular Session of the Ninety-fifth General Assembly, Conference Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for House Bill 2226, House Bill 1824, House Bill 1832, and House Bill 1990, herein referred to as House Bill 2226, was passed. In part, this legislation removed all statutory references for provisional licensed clinical social workers. This rule is being amended to allow licensed clinical social workers to supervise licensed master social workers under registered supervision; allow master's level social workers to be reimbursed for their services under Title XIX (Medicaid) through the Missouri Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division; and establish the parameters for reimbursement and practice settings.

(1) Acceptable Supervisors[:]-

(B) A licensed clinical social worker (LCSW) may supervise LCSW, licensed advanced macro social worker (LAMSW), or licensed baccalaureate social worker [(LBSW)] independent practice (LBSW) registrants and may supervise a licensed master social worker (LMSW) who is under registered supervision pursuant to section (7) of this rule;

(7) [A licensed social worker assuming the role of supervisor may employ the supervisee in the supervisor's private practice setting. In those instances, the supervisor may bill clients for services rendered by the supervisee but under no circumstances shall the supervisee bill the clients directly for services rendered by the supervisee. The professional setting shall not include private practice in which the supervisee operates, manages, or has an ownership interest in the private practice.] A licensed master social worker under registered supervision may be employed in the supervisor's private practice setting or in the private practice of another. In those instances, the supervisor may bill clients for services rendered by the licensed master social worker but under no circumstances shall the licensed master social worker bill the clients directly for services rendered. The only exception to this section shall be when reimbursement for services is provided under Title XIX (Medicaid) through the Missouri Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division. A licensed master social worker under registered supervision may accept a Medicaid reimbursement number and services may be billed through that number, provided such reimbursement is administered through the professional setting employing the licensed master social worker, and not directly paid to the licensed master social worker. The professional setting shall not include private practice in which the licensed master social worker operates, manages, or has an ownership interest in the private practice.

Those provisional licensed clinical social workers that are issued a licensed master social worker license by the committee are exempt from continuing education requirements through the first renewal of their licensed master social worker license but are not exempt thereafter. Effective August 28, 2010, the committee will issue no further provisional licensed clinical social worker licenses.

- 1. Employee's salaries were calculated using the annual salary multiplied by 48.75% for fringe benefits and then divided by 2080 hours per year to determine the hourly salary. 1. Licensed baccalaureate social worker—bachelors examination;

2. Licensed baccalaureate social worker independent practice—bachelors examination;

3. Licensed master social worker-masters examination.

A. A clinical examination taken by a person who has registered supervision before April 30, 2010, and has not been issued a provisional licensed clinical social worker license is acceptable;

4. Licensed advanced macro social worker—advanced generalist examination.

he agency is also required to make a brief summary of the general nature and extent of comments submitted in support of or opposition to the proposed rule and a concise summary of the testimony presented at the hearing, if any, held in connection with the rulemaking, together with a concise summary of the agency's findings with respect to the merits of any such testimony or comments which are opposed in whole or in part to the proposed rule. Title 4—DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT **Division 240—Public Service Commission Chapter 2—Practice and Procedure**

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Public Service Commission under section 386.410, RSMo 2000, the commission amends a rule as follows:

4 CSR 240-2.070 is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the Missouri Register on May 3, 2010 (35 MoReg 682-684). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the Code of State Regulations.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The public comment period ended June 2, 2010, and on June 3, 2010, the commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendment. Timely written comments were received from the staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, the Office of the Public Counsel, and in a joint comment filing submitted by the Missouri Telecommunications Industry Association (MTIA) and the Missouri Energy Development Association (MEDA). In addition, the commission's staff, Public Counsel, and MTIA/MEDA offered comments at the hearing. The comments generally supported the concept of a simplified process to handle small consumer complaints but proposed several modifications to that process.

COMMENT #1: Change "Judgment" to "Order." Section (13)

requires the presiding regulatory law judge to notify the parties of their procedural rights after the commission has rendered a "judgment" disposing of the case. The commission's staff points out that the commission issues orders, not judgments, and suggests that the references to "judgment" should be changed to "order." RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commis-

sion will modify the amendment in the manner suggested by staff.

COMMENT #2: Three-Thousand-Dollar (\$3,000) Threshold. Staff, Public Counsel, and MTIA/MEDA are concerned that the threethousand-dollar (\$3,000) threshold for application of the new process might create some ambiguities. Some pro se complaints may not allege a specific dollar amount at issue, but may raise important customer service issues. Furthermore, the amount in dispute may not be clear on the face of the complaint, leading to uncertainty about which procedure the commission will follow. Staff suggests the rule be expanded to allow application of the new procedures whenever the applicant, the company, and the commission agree that they should apply. Public Counsel asks that the rule not apply to any complaint it might bring, regardless of the amount in dispute. MTIA/MEDA suggests the rule should afford both the complainant and the utility a means to object to proceeding under the small complaint process.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The comments raise valid concerns about the ambiguity of the threshold for application of this new procedure. The commission will modify the amendment to reduce that ambiguity by directing the regulatory law judge to notify the parties at the start of the hearing that the simplified procedures set forth in this section will be used. The commission will also change the amendment to clarify that the new procedures will apply only to complaints brought by utility customers. Additionally, the commission will establish a procedure by which any party may ask the commission to decide whether the small complaint process will be used.

COMMENT #3: Inadvertent Elimination of the Informal Complaint Process. Public Counsel and MTIA/MEDA expressed concern that section (14) may inadvertently eliminate the informal complaint process found in section (2) of the existing rule. They ask that the new rule specifically reaffirm the continued applicability of that informal process.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The informal complaint process that exists under the current rule is a valuable means to quickly resolve many consumer complaints without the necessity for expensive and time-consuming formal procedures. The commission certainly does not want to eliminate that informal process. The commission will modify the amendment to make it clear that the informal complaint process is still available under the new small complaint process.

COMMENT #4: Restrictions on Rate Complaints. MTIA/MEDA is concerned that the existing rule's restrictions on the bringing of rate complaints also apply to the new small complaint process. The restriction in question is found in section (3) of the existing rule and states that no complaint about the reasonableness of a utility's rates is allowed unless it is brought by twenty-five (25) or more consumers.

RESPONSE: Section (3)'s restriction on the rate complaints is not inconsistent with the new small complaint process and would still apply to those complaints. Furthermore, that restriction is also statutory, being found in section 386.390(1), RSMo. Therefore, it is not necessary to restate that restriction in the amended section of the rule.

COMMENT #5: Participation by Telephone. MTIA/MEDA and Public Counsel suggest the commission make the small formal complaint process more accessible by allowing any party to participate by telephone if they wish to do so.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission agrees that in appropriate circumstances, participation in the hearing by telephone is appropriate. However, in some circumstances a party or witness may need to appear at the hearing in person if the due process rights of the parties are to be protected. Therefore, the commission will modify the amendment to allow the regulatory law judge discretion to allow any party, witness, or attorney to participate in the hearing or other proceeding by telephone.

COMMENT #6: Concerns about Unlawful Delegation of Authority. Staff, Public Counsel, and MTIA/MEDA all express concern that the proposed amendment would unlawfully delegate the commission's decision-making responsibility to the regulatory law judge. They suggest that instead, the rule authorize the regulatory law judge to issue a recommended report and order, allow the parties time to comment, and then require the commission to either approve or reject the recommended report and order.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The proposed amendment would create a procedure that would allow the presiding regulatory law judge to issue a final report and order, subject to review by the commission if any party requests rehearing. The commission proposed to delegate that authority to the judge so that a final decision could be reached more quickly. However, the commission recognizes the concern that delegating its final decision-making authority to the judge might be unlawful. The commission will modify the procedure to authorize the judge to issue a recommended report and order that the commission will either approve or reject. That procedure should be as fast as the proposed delegation of authority without risking any legal infirmities. Subsection (14)(I) of the proposed amendment, which purports to make the regulatory law judge's report and order the final order of the commission for purposes of judicial review will be removed in its entirety.

COMMENT #7: The Proper Role for the Commission's Staff. Subsection (14)(D) of the proposed amendment directs the commission's staff to investigate a submitted complaint and report its findings within forty-five (45) days after the complaint is filed. The proposed amendment also indicates that staff is to serve as an advisor to the judge rather than as an advocate. Staff, Public Counsel, and MTIA/MEDA are concerned that staff not be placed in both an investigative and judicial role.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The staff member who completes an investigation and files a report about that investigation must be available as a witness to any party who wishes to test the reasonableness of staff's investigation and recommendation through cross-examination. If that staff member also serves as an advisor to the judge, it would be inappropriate for the staff member to take the stand as a witness. The commission wants to have the benefit of staff's investigations, but does not need advice from staff, except as staff's recommendation is offered through the hearing process. Therefore, the commission will revise the amendment to direct staff to investigate the small complaint. Staff will not be a party to the complaint, but the staff member or members who investigate the complaint shall be available as a witness if the regulatory law judge or any party wishes to call them to testify. The amendment will not designate the staff member or members as advisors to the judge.

COMMENT #8: The Amount of Time Allowed Commission's Staff to Complete its Investigation. The commission's staff is concerned about the provision in subsection (14)(D) that requires staff to complete its investigation and file its report within forty-five (45) days of the filing of the complaint. Staff asks that it be allowed to request additional time to file its report if it cannot complete its investigation within the allotted forty-five (45) days.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission agrees with staff's concern and will modify that subsection to allow staff to receive additional time upon a showing of good cause. COMMENT #9: Informal Hearing Procedures. Subsection (14)(F) provides that the regulatory law judge is to conduct the small formal complaint proceedings in an informal manner to the extent possible without affecting the procedural rights of the parties. Staff is concerned that the commission not sanction the waiver of the basic procedural rights set out in section 536.070, RSMo, and suggests that the commission add a reference to that section to the language of the amendment. Staff also suggests a change to paragraph (14)(F)1. to make the language of that section track the provision of section 386.410, RSMo, which indicates the commission is not bound by "the technical rules of evidence."

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission does not intend to sanction the waiver of any basic procedural rights, including those set out in section 536.070, RSMo. However, as staff points out, the commission cannot do away with the basic procedural rights established by statute no matter what it puts in its regulation. There is, therefore, no reason to specifically reference section 386.410, RSMo, in the regulation. The commission does agree with staff's suggestion about paragraph (14)(F)1. and will make the suggested change.

COMMENT #10: Extension of Time to Issue Recommended Report and Order. Subsection (14)(G) requires the regulatory law judge to issue a recommended report and order within one hundred (100) days of the filing of the complaint unless the judge finds that due process requires additional time. Staff suggests that the due process language be changed to reference a good cause shown standard.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission agrees with staff's suggestion and will make the suggested change.

4 CSR 240-2.070 Complaints

(13) When an order is rendered disposing of a case, the regulatory law judge shall cause the parties to be notified that the order will be final unless an application for rehearing is filed within the allotted number of days and provide information regarding the rehearing and appeal process.

(14) Small Formal Complaint Case. If, after complying with the informal complaint process established by section (2) of this rule, a customer of a utility files a formal complaint regarding any dispute involving less than three thousand dollars (\$3,000), the process set forth in this section shall be followed for such complaints. The provisions of sections (1)–(13) of this rule shall also apply to such complaints unless they directly conflict with the provisions of this section, in which case the provisions of this section shall apply.

(A) When a complaint is filed that qualifies for handling as a small formal complaint, the assigned regulatory law judge shall direct the secretary of the commission to serve, by certified mail, postage prepaid, a copy of the complaint upon the person, corporation, or public utility against whom the complaint has been filed. At the same time, the regulatory law judge shall notify all parties that the complaint will proceed under the small formal complaint process. The person, corporation, or public utility against whom the complaint has been filed is allowed thirty (30) days after the date of notice to satisfy the complaint or file an answer. If the person, corporation, or public utility does not satisfy the complaint or file an answer within thirty (30) days, the regulatory law judge may issue an order granting default and deeming the allegations of the complaint to have been admitted by the respondent. A party in default has seven (7) days from the issue date of the order granting default to file a motion to set aside the order of default. The regulatory law judge may grant the motion to set aside the order of default and allow the respondent additional time to answer upon a showing of good cause.

(B) If any party believes that a complaint should or should not be handled as a small formal complaint, that party may file a motion with the commission requesting that the status of the complaint be changed. In response to such motion, or acting on its own motion, the commission shall, at its discretion, decide how the complaint shall be handled.

(C) Upon the filing of a complaint that qualifies under this section, the chief regulatory law judge shall assign the case to a regulatory law judge. To process small complaint cases in the timeliest manner and in the most convenient location for the customers, the commission hereby delegates the commission's authority to hear the case, make rulings, and issue a recommended report and order or other appropriate order disposing of the case to such regulatory law judge.

(D) The commission's staff shall, within forty-five (45) days after the complaint is filed, investigate the complaint and file a report detailing staff's findings and recommendations. The regulatory law judge may allow staff additional time to complete its investigation for good cause shown. The member or members of the commission's staff who investigate the complaint shall be available as a witness at the hearing if the regulatory law judge or any party wishes to call them to testify. Staff shall not advocate a position beyond reporting the results of its investigation. If staff believes it should advocate a position, it may file a motion to change the status of the complaint under subsection (B) of this section.

(E) Any hearing, unless otherwise agreed to by the parties, shall be held in the county, or a city not within a county, where the subject utility service was rendered or within thirty (30) miles of where the service was rendered. The regulatory law judge may allow any party, witness, or attorney to participate in the hearing by telephone.

(F) Small formal complaint case hearings shall be conducted in an informal summary manner whenever possible, without affecting the rights of the parties—

1. The technical rules of evidence shall not apply;

2. The regulatory law judge shall have the authority to dispense with pre-filed written testimony; and

3. The regulatory law judge shall assume an affirmative duty to determine the merits of the claims and defenses of the parties and may question parties and witnesses.

(G) The regulatory law judge, after affording the parties reasonable opportunity for discovery and a fair hearing, shall issue a recommended report and order within one hundred (100) days following the filing of the complaint, unless the regulatory law judge finds good cause to extend that time or the extension is otherwise agreed to by the parties.

(H) Any party subject to a recommended order disposing of the case or a recommended report and order issued by a regulatory law judge under this section may file with the commission, within ten (10) days of the issuance of the recommended order, comments supporting or opposing the recommended order. Any comments opposing the recommended order shall contain specific detailed grounds upon which it claims the order is unlawful, unjust, or unreasonable. The commission may approve or reject the recommended order based on the existing record without further hearing. If the commission rejects the recommended order, the commission shall issue its own order based on the evidence previously submitted, or upon such additional evidence, as the commission shall choose to receive.

A claim against the LLC will be barred unless a proceeding to enforce the claim is commenced within three (3) years after publication hereof.
