A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on December 3, 2012 (37 MoReg 1762–1765). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Department of Agriculture received two (2) comments on the proposed amendment.

COMMENT #1: The Conservation Federation of Missouri considers the proposed amendment to be an important step to enhance the health of deer in Missouri and will improve surveillance in the state and requests the department to consider Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) testing requirements for hunting preserves.

RESPONSE: The Missouri Department of Agriculture (MDA) appreciates the suggestion for mandatory CWD testing for hunting preserves. Currently the hunting preserves in Missouri have signed a voluntary agreement to test all imported cervids for CWD.

COMMENT #2: The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) supports the proposed amendment to ensure the health and sustainability of captive and free-ranging deer across the state. The Department of Conservation would like to see MDA to consider the language in subsections (6)(B) and (6)(C) and clarify how MDA intends to oversee and provide enforcement on this issue. Also in subsection (6)(E) MDC suggests that MDA place similar restrictions on breeding facilities and making a level of testing mandatory for hunting preserves.

RESPONSE: The Department of Agriculture has regulations in place to address these concerns and will continue to adhere to the current regulations and standards to control and contain disease (9 CFR Chapter 1, Subpart B, Parts 50, 51, and 55, USDA Uniform Methods and Rules (UM&R), the "Missouri Livestock Disease Control and Eradication Law," and the "Missouri Livestock Marketing Law") in the livestock markets. These standards will be followed in the event of a disease incident.

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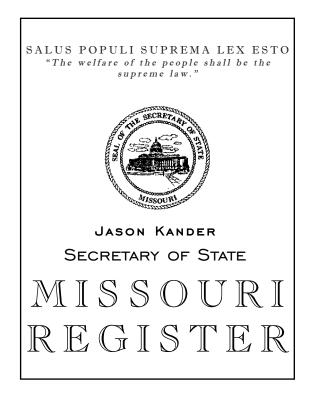
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CERTIFICATION LETTER

Due to the passage of House Bill 45 in the 2011 legislative session, the requirement regarding small businesses in section 1.310, RSMo, was extended to small businesses with **fifty or less** employees.

The third paragraph of the certification letter for proposed rulemakings will need to be reworded to reflect this change in statute. The paragraph should be changed from "fewer than twenty-five full- or part-time employees" to "fewer than fifty full- or part-time employees" in two instances.
