The agency then groups its rules into general subject matter areas called chapters and specific areas called rules. Within a rule, the first breakdown is called a section and is designated as (1). ### **Emergency Rules**

ules appearing under this heading are filed under the authority granted by section 536.025, RSMo 2000. An emergency rule may be adopted by an agency if the agency finds that an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare, or a compelling governmental interest requires emergency action; follows procedures best calculated to assure fairness to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances; follows procedures which comply with the protections extended by the Missouri and the United States Constitutions; limits the scope of such rule to the circumstances creating an emergency and requiring emergency procedure, and at the time of or prior to the adoption of such rule files with the secretary of state the text of the rule together with the specific facts, reasons, and findings which support its conclusion that there is an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare which can be met only through the adoption of such rule and its reasons for concluding that the procedure employed is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances.

Rules filed as emergency rules may be effective not less than ten (10) days after filing or at such later date as may be specified in the rule and may be terminated at any time by the state agency by filing an order with the secretary of state fixing the date of such termination, which order shall be published by the secretary of state in the *Missouri Register* as soon as practicable.

All emergency rules must state the period during which they are in effect, and in no case can they be in effect more than one hundred eighty (180) calendar days or thirty (30) legislative days, whichever period is longer. Emergency rules are not renewable, although an agency may at any time adopt an identical rule under the normal rulemaking procedures.

#### Title 20—DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE, FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND PROFESSIONAL REGISTRATION Division 2150—State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts Chapter 3—Licensing of Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants

#### **EMERGENCY AMENDMENT**

**20 CSR 2150-3.010 Applicants for Licensure as Professional Physical Therapists**. The board is amending section (8).

PURPOSE: This amendment specifies which applicants are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) examination.

EMERGENCY STATEMENT: The Missouri State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts (board) finds that this emergency amendment is necessary to preserve a compelling governmental interest by ensuring that the board requires only applicants who have not previously demonstrated a proficiency in the English language by attending a physical therapy program in the United States or a foreign program where the instruction was done in English to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) examination. The board's goal is to license only competent and qualified physical therapists that are proficient in the English language, so that both the Missouri physical therapist and patient are able to clearly and effectively communicate during the rehabilitation process, ensuring safe and effective treatment. An early effective date is required because this amendment will modify the requirements by specifying who must take the TOEFL examination. Currently, the rule states that if an applicant is "from a country in which the predominate language is not English" the applicant must take the TOEFL examination. This means that someone who moved to the United States as a child and attended school here would have to take the TOEFL examination, which is not the intent of the rule. It is also sometimes difficult for the board to determine the "predominate language" of a country. The change clarifies and narrows the group of applicants required to take the TOEFL examination. It does not require the TOEFL examination of anyone who graduated from a physical therapy program in the United States nor of anyone who can prove that the language of instruction in their foreign program was English. As the licensure examination is only taken two (2) times a year-on July 21 and again on October 28—some applicants are waiting to take the licensure examination until after they have passed the TOEFL examination, thus unnecessarily prolonging the period of time before an applicant can be licensed and begin providing physical therapy services in the state of Missouri. The normal rulemaking process would require these applicants to wait six (6) months for the rule change to go through the process, delaying their ability to obtain employment and provide much needed physical therapy treatment to Missouri patients. Furthermore, as there is, on average, a one-hundred-ninety-dollar (\$190) fee associated with taking the TOEFL examination, this amendment would remove such a cost for applicants for whom TOEFL examination is unnecessary. Additionally, the recent decision of the United States Supreme Court in North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners v. FTC, 574 U.S. , 135 S. Ct. 1101 (February 25, 2015), may impact the board by requiring board licensure decisions that negatively impact trade to be based on clearly articulated state policies authorizing such conduct which are supervised by the state. The current rule is not narrowly tailored as to who is required to take the TOEFL examination, and may arguably create a barrier to licensure for certain applicants. As there is a need for physical therapists in Missouri, the current rule may negatively impact trade contrary to the above referenced decision of the United States Supreme Court. Following the above decision, the board has seen an increased trend in legal challenges to the rules of other state licensing boards resulting in injunctions and litigation effectively eliminating those boards' ability to effectively regulate their professions. Most recently the state of Texas had its telemedicine rules invalidated by court injunction because its rules and rulemaking authority were not based on clearly articulated policy. This amendment will avoid such a result without the need for costly litigation by more clearly stating which applicants are required to take the TOEFL examination related to their education and training. Therefore, an emergency regulation is necessary. This emergency amendment limits its scope to the circumstances creating the emergency and complies with the protections extended by the Missouri and United States **Constitutions**. The board believes this emergency amendment to be fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances. This emergency amendment was filed July 27, 2015, becomes effective August 6, 2015, and expires February 25, 2016.

(8) [If the applicant is from a country in which the predominant language is not English, the applicant must provide the board with documentation of the following directly from the Educational Testing Service (ETS):] Any applicant who has graduated from a physical therapy program outside the United States shall provide—

#### (A) Documentation that the primary language of instruction in the physical therapy program was English;

[(A)](B) A current Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) [C]certificate in which the applicant has obtained, on the TOEFL paper-based, a minimum score of 55 in each section and a total score of 560 and a current Test of Spoken English (TSE) *[C]*certificate in which the applicant has obtained a minimum score of 50; or

[(B) A current TOEFL computer-based testing certificate in which the applicant has obtained a total score of 220 and a current Test of Spoken English (TSE) Certificate in which the applicant has obtained a minimum score of 50; or]

ntirely new rules are printed without any special symbology under the heading of proposed rule. If an existing rule is to be amended or rescinded, it will have a heading of proposed amendment or proposed rescission. Rules which are proposed to be amended will have new matter printed in boldface type and matter to be deleted placed in brackets.

An important function of the *Missouri Register* is to solicit and encourage public participation in the rulemaking process. The law provides that for every proposed rule, amendment, or rescission there must be a notice that anyone may comment on the proposed action. This comment may take different forms.

f an agency is required by statute to hold a public hearing before making any new rules, then a Notice of Public Hearing will appear following the text of the rule. Hearing dates must be at least thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*. If no hearing is planned or required, the agency must give a Notice to Submit Comments. This allows anyone to file statements in support of or in opposition to the proposed action with the agency within a specified time, no less than thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*.

An agency may hold a public hearing on a rule even though not required by law to hold one. If an agency allows comments to be received following the hearing date, the close of comments date will be used as the beginning day in the ninety- (90-) day-count necessary for the filing of the order of rulemaking.

f an agency decides to hold a public hearing after planning not to, it must withdraw the earlier notice and file a new notice of proposed rulemaking and schedule a hearing for a date not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of the new notice.

Title 2—DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE Division 100—Missouri Agricultural and Small Business Development Authority Chapter 2—Beginning Farmer Loan Program

#### **PROPOSED AMENDMENT**

**2 CSR 100-2.020 Applicant Eligibility Requirements**. The authority is amending sections (1) and (2) of the rule.

*PURPOSE:* The purpose of the amendment is to clarify borrower eligibility requirements for the program.

(1) The following criteria must be met before making application for a loan through this authority:

(A) [If an individual, the applicant must be a citizen of the United States or a person who has been legally admitted for permanent residence in the United States and is a resident of Missouri at the time of the loan application; and] The applicant must be an individual and must be able to provide proof of citizenship, identity, certify the intent to become a Missouri resident, and must be a resident of Missouri at the time of bond issuance. If the applicant employs laborers, he or she must provide proof of enrollment and participation in the federal work authorization program.

[(B) If a partnership, the principal partners or applicant must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States and residents of Missouri.]

(2) The applicant must be a bona fide farmer or rancher-

(A) Doing business *[in Missouri either]* as an individual *[or partnership,]* who is recognized *[in the community]* as one whose chief occupation is farming or ranching; and

*PURPOSE:* The purpose of the amendment is to clarify the fee structure for the program.

(1) The authority will receive a nonrefundable [three hundred dollar (\$300)] application fee submitted with the application in an amount set by the authority on forms provided by the authority.

(2) The authority will receive a program participation fee [equal to one and fifty-five hundredths percent (1.55%) of the amount of the loan] in an amount set by the authority, but not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) upon [loan closing] bond issuance.

(3) The lender shall collect the participation fee and remit it to the authority at the time of the *[loan closing]* bond issuance.

#### **PROPOSED RULE**

## 13 CSR 5-1.030 Access for Inspection of Public Records and Fees for Copying of Public Records

PURPOSE: This rule supplements the requirements of Chapter 610 RSMo and prescribes requirements for individuals and organizations to gain access to public records of the department and the fees for copying of those public records.

(1) In this section the following words shall mean:

(A) The "department" shall mean the Missouri Department of Social Services including any division, subdivision, center, unit, or part thereof; and

(B) The remainder of the terms used in this rule shall have the same meaning as that set forth in Chapter 610, RSMo.

(2) For requests for public records made under Chapter 610, RSMo, the Communications Director of the Department of Social Services shall be the custodian of records. All requests for access to, or copying of, public records made to the department under Chapter 610, RSMo, shall be directed to the Communications Director. Such requests may be made in person, by telephone, electronic mail, facsimile, internet, postal mail, or by any other convenient means to the department's Custodian of Records at the following address: Communications Director, Department of Social Services, P.O. Box 1527, Jefferson City, MO 65102.

(3) Copies of public records shall be provided by the department and shall be subject to the collection of search and copy fees and shipping charges as set forth herein. Requesters may avoid shipping charges by picking up their requested documents at the Office of the Director, Missouri Department of Social Services, 221 W. High, Room 240, Jefferson City, MO 65101. Requesters shall request to pick up their requested records at the time of their initial request. Copies of public records will be provided by the department subject to the copy and search fees set forth in section 610.026, RSMo.

(4) Fees for duplicating other types of records and other formats including electronic data shall be based on the actual cost of search and duplication, or as otherwise provided by section 610.026, RSMo.

(5) In accordance with section 610.026, RSMo, the department may furnish copies without charge or at a reduced charge when the department determines that waiver or reduction of the fee is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the department and is

not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester.

#### Title 13—DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES Division [40—Family Support Division] 35—Children's Division Chapter 31—Child Abuse

#### **PROPOSED AMENDMENT**

[13 CSR 40-31.011] 13 CSR 35-31.015 Investigations Involving a Conflict of Interest. The department is moving the rule, amending the purpose, adding a new section (1), amending sections (2) and (3), and renumbering as needed.

PURPOSE: This amendment updates the name of the division assigned to investigate allegations of child abuse and neglect, and updates the entities responsible for conducting a child abuse or neglect investigation if there is a conflict of interest.

PURPOSE: This rule defines the investigation procedure used when the relationship of the subject of a report of child abuse or neglect to the [Division of Family Services] Children's Division is such that a conflict of interest may occur.

#### (1) Definitions.

(A) Out-of-Home Investigation Unit-The unit of investigators responsible for investigating child abuse and neglect when the child is in an out-of-home setting.

[(1)](2) The following categories of persons, when reported as either the victim or alleged perpetrator of child abuse or neglect, may be considered to have such a relationship to the [Division of Family Services] Children's Division that a thorough investigation might be hindered by a conflict of interest:

(A) An employee of the *[Division of Family Services]* Children's Division, the Department of Social Services central office or other Department of Social Services employees located in a *[Division of Family Services]* Children's Division office;

(B) The immediate family or household member of that employee; or

(C) Children placed in foster care and in the custody of the *[Division of Family Services]* Children's Division when the alleged perpetrator is a *[Division of Family Services]* licensed foster parent. These calls will be investigated by the Out-of-Home Investigation Unit.

[(2)](3) Reports of abuse or neglect involving those persons, either as victims or perpetrators, [should] shall be made to the Child

Abuse and Neglect Unit in the central office of the [Division of Family Services] Children's Division. The Child Abuse and Neglect Unit will [request the juvenile officers of the county or judicial circuit in which the victim resides, or in which s/he is located if the location is different from residence,] assign the report to the Children's Division county/circuit staff selected by the regional office to initiate and conduct the investigation. [The juvenile officer will be requested to report the findings and disposition of the investigation in the following manner:

(A) For investigations involving persons in subsections (1)(A) and (B), findings and disposition should be reported back to the Child Abuse and Neglect Unit; and

(B) For investigations involving persons in subsection (1)(C), findings and dispositions should be reported to the county office.

(3) If the juvenile officer does not accept the report for investigation, the division will arrange to conduct the investigation itself in a way as to minimize the possibility of conflicting interest hindering that investigation.]

#### **PROPOSED RESCISSION**

**13 CSR 40-31.012 Definition of Sexual Exploitation**. This rule defined the term sexual exploitation as described in P.L. 95-266 and 45 CFR Part 1340.

PURPOSE: This rule is being rescinded so that it will not conflict with definitions in proposed rule 13 CSR 35-31.010, which is within the code division for regulations of the Children's Division.

#### Title 13—DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES Division 70—MO HealthNet Division Chapter 20—Pharmacy Program

#### **PROPOSED RULE**

## 13 CSR 70-20.330 Medication Therapy Management (MTM) Program

PURPOSE: This rule establishes the regulatory basis for the administration of the MO HealthNet Medication Therapy Management (MTM) program, including designation of professional persons who may perform medication therapy management services and defined covered services within the program.

PUBLISHER'S NOTE: The secretary of state has determined that the publication of the entire text of the material which is incorporated by reference as a portion of this rule would be unduly cumbersome or expensive. This material as incorporated by reference in this rule shall be maintained by the agency at its headquarters and shall be made available to the public for inspection and copying at no more than the actual cost of reproduction. This note applies only to the reference material. The entire text of the rule is printed here.

(1) Administration. The Medication Therapy Management (MTM) program shall be administered by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division. The MTM services covered, the program limitations, and the maximum allowable fees for all covered services shall be determined by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division and shall be included in the pharmacy provider manual and provider bulletins, which are incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, 615 Howerton Court, Jefferson City, MO 65109, at its website at dss.mo.gov/mhd/index.htm, September 1, 2015. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendment or additions.

(2) Persons Eligible. A person who is eligible for Title XIX (Medicaid) or Title XXI (State Children's Health Insurance Program) or Blind Pension and who meets certain disease-based criteria included in their health profile.

(3) Provider Participation. To be eligible for participation in the MO HealthNet MTM program, a provider must be a qualified Missouri licensed pharmacist and have an active MO HealthNet provider status, and must have successfully completed two (2) hours of ACPE (Accreditation Counsel for Pharmacy Education) accredited continuing education focused on the administration of MTM approved by the MO HealthNet Division.

(4) Medication Therapy Management Services. MTM Services are available to any currently eligible non-managed care MO HealthNet participant for whom the qualifying pharmacist receives a MO HealthNet directed electronic drug utilization review (DUR) message through a Point-of-Sale transaction. MO HealthNet uses a clinically based rules engine that juries which participants require MTM interventions based on nationally accepted evidence-based guidelines. Pharmacists are then messaged about only those participants who are identified for one (1) or more issues pertinent to the evidence-based criteria. The rules engine uses current nationally accepted evidencebased guidelines for clinically appropriate drug therapy, and applies this criteria to thirty-six (36) months of paid participant claims data which includes drugs, diagnoses, and procedures. When an eligible or

participant meets certain disease-based criteria a pharmacist may perform a wide variety of MTM services directed by MO HealthNet to address specific treatment needs, such as:

(A) Counseling participants on the importance of medication adherence (alerting participants to missed dosages and refills);

(B) Providing medication education;

(C) Providing self-care education for specific chronic conditions;

(D) Contacting physicians to schedule diagnostic testing;

(E) Contacting physicians to make drug therapy recommendations;

(F) Connecting participants with other community-based resources as needed.

(5) The service is comprised of the following components:

(A) Assessing a participant's health status;

(B) Developing a medication treatment plan;

(C) Monitoring and evaluating a participant's response to therapy;

(D) Providing a comprehensive medication review to identify, resolve, and prevent medication-related problems;

(E) Documenting the care provided and communicating essential information to a participant's primary care providers;

(F) Providing oral education and training to enhance participant understanding and appropriate use of medications;

(G) Providing information, support services, and resources to enhance participant adherence to therapeutic regimens; and

(H) Coordinating and integrating MTM services within the broader health care services provided to a participant.

(6) Reimbursement. Pharmacists will receive the payment for participating in MTM. The payment is contingent upon the provider logging on to the electronic web tool to view, reserve, and complete interventions. Once an intervention is complete, providers will submit an electronic medical claim to MO HealthNet. The payment status of these claims will be reflected on the provider's remittance advice. The fee schedule is available at dss.mo.gov/mhd/providers/pages/cptagree.htm.

AUTHORITY: section 208.201, RSMo Supp 2013. Original rule filed July 30, 2015.

PUBLIC COST: This proposed rule will cost state agencies or political subdivisions \$4.1 million annually.

#### Title 5—DEPARTMENT OF ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION Division 100—Missouri Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Chapter 200—Board for Certification of Interpreters

#### **ORDER OF RULEMAKING**

By the authority vested in the Missouri Commission for the Deaf and

Hard of Hearing under section 209.292, RSMo Supp. 2013, and section 209.295, RSMo 2000, the commission amends a rule as follows:

5 CSR 100-200.130 is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on April 1, 2015 (40 MoReg 395). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The commission received twelve (12) comments on the proposed amendment.

COMMENT #1: Lisa Bolding Ballenger, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, NIC Advanced, requested clarification on whether the only way to submit comments was to send a written letter through the postal service to the MCDHH Office.

RESPONSE: The commission responded that anyone may file a statement in support of or in opposition to this proposed amendment with Missouri Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at 1500 Southridge Dr., Suite 201, Jefferson City, MO 65109. For convenience, they can also email comments to mcdhh@mcdhh.mo.gov. This information was published in the MCDHH Newsletter, Facebook, and on our website. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #2: John T. Adams, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, Master, pointed out that in the MCDHH newsletter – E-News, in paragraph (3) it states that interpreters must earn "three-tenths" of their CEUs with a focus on Ethics. However, the number is written as (0.03).

RESPONSE: The commission agrees. While this number was incorrectly shown in the E-News, it is correct, (0.3), in the actual amendment. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #3: Dr. Barbara Garrett, Program Director and Professor of the ASL & Interpreting Program at William Woods University, asked if this change would affect students completing internships in any way.

RESPONSE: This change will not affect students completing internship. Internship counts toward their graduation requirements whereas the mentorship program in question will count towards the CEUs required to renew or maintain their certificates. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #4: Lisa Bolding Ballenger, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, NIC Advanced, questions the rationale of valuing mentorships at half the CEUs as other forms of continuing education and for capping mentoring hours to half the total hours earned in a cycle. Participating as a mentee in a mentoring relationship can be a career-transforming experience due to the focused attention that is often impossible to obtain through traditional workshops.

RESPONSE: The commission agrees that mentoring is beneficial for both mentors and mentees. We have followed the standard set by Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) that mentoring is a nontraditional activity and earns CEUs at a ratio of 1:1/2. The commission is not placing a limit on the amount of mentoring a person may receive or give, only on the amount of CEUs that can be applied to the yearly CEU cycle. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #5: Lisa Bolding Ballenger, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, NIC Advanced, and Peggy Belt, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, MICS Master, both questioned

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the limitation of mentors to those with a Missouri license at an equal or higher level than the mentee. As long as the mentorship has been approved for Missouri or RID CEUs, the requirement for the mentor to hold a Missouri license is an unnecessary barrier to educational opportunities and should be waived.

This language seems to assume a mentoring relationship can only happen between licensed interpreters who want to mentor in live situations. There have been many valuable mentoring relationships between interpreters of differing levels, including those by mentors with a lower level of certification, as well as those between interpreters and deaf mentors who hold no interpreting license. Mentorships can be done remotely through the use of technology, in person through the use of recorded video/audio, or by simulation, all of which would not require the mentor be a licensed interpreter. This wording eliminates a number of potential mentors who may have a great deal of experience in interpreting and/or language mentoring. This could discourage interpreters who are truly seeking a customized learning opportunity they may not be able to receive through participation in workshops. Qualified mentors are very scarce in our profession. With the advent of internet technology, distance mentorships are now possible. Presenters at the MCDHH conference are not required to hold Missouri license - in fact, getting a perspective on the profession from someone in a different geographical area often provides an increased benefit compared to only mentoring with a local pool. The proposed rule, as written, would also prohibit deaf individuals serving as language mentors unless they are CDIs and hold a Missouri license.

RESPONSE: The commission feels it is important to verify the credentials of mentors. At this time, the most efficient way to do that is by requiring the mentor to hold a Missouri interpreting license. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #6: Peggy Belt, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, MICS Master, Lisa Bolding Ballenger, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, NIC Advanced, and David R. Bates, Sign Language Interpreter, MICS Master, all commented in support of adding a requirement of 0.3 hours of Ethics for CEU maintenance. The recently adopted BEI test does not contain an ethical component. An interpreter's ethics is hard to assess on a multiple choice test and would only demonstrate a person's knowledge once during their career. Understanding ethics and how it applies to the interpreting profession is an ongoing process. The ethical CEU requirement will allow interpreters to continue to learn different perspectives on ethics and dialogue with other professionals about the ever-changing challenges they must face.

RESPONSE: The commission appreciates the confidence placed in us with our decision to add an ethical requirement to certification. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #7: Peggy Belt, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, MICS Master, Lynette A. Domerese, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, Advanced, and David R. Bates, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter Master, all expressed concern about the effective dates for the CEU cycle.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission agrees. The published dates are incorrect. The effective dates will be changed to beginning November 3, 2015 and ending November 2, 2016.

COMMENT #8: Peggy Belt, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, MICS Master, is happy to see the term mentoring is a little more clearly defined than it was previously. It should help clarify the difference between a mentorship and other ways in which interpreters may learn from each other and get experience.

**RESPONSE:** As this comment is in support of the proposed rule, no changes have been made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #9: Peggy Belt, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, MICS Master, commends the MCDHH and BCI for their continuous efforts to improve the standards of interpreter certification and certification maintenance. She is proud to see Missouri leading the nation in its standards to protect the health, welfare, and safety of consumers.

RESPONSE: The commission appreciates the confidence placed in us. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #10: Roy Miller and Shirley Fackler, Deaf Educator and Interpreter, Apprentice, both noticed an error in the language of our proposed rulemaking. It stated that in the case of mentoring, whether as a mentor or a mentee, one (1) contact hour earns five hundredths MICS CEU. The number should read 0.05.

RESPONSE: While this number was incorrectly shown in the E-News, it is correct in the actual amendment. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #11: Laura T. Gimmy, Missouri Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, Advanced, and resident of Illinois, prefers not to have 0.3 CEU's focused solely on ethics. She expressed concern at being able to find an ethics workshop.

RESPONSE: While this requirement may be new, we believe there are available workshops to meet this requirement. There are also multiple distance learning opportunities for ethics, and MCDHH will continue to make reasonable effort to offer ethics workshops at the Missouri Interpreter Conference. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT # 12: Lynette A. Domerese, Certified and Licensed Sign Language Interpreter, Advanced, has concerns about how the Ethics CEU documentation will be differentiated from other CEUs. She worries they will have to be submitted separately.

RESPONSE: All CEUs will be submitted together. MCDHH staff will be responsible for developing administrative procedures to differentiate Ethics CEUs and document them. No changes were made to this rule as a result of this comment.

#### 5 CSR 100-200.130 Certification Maintenance

(3) An interpreter shall be required to earn two (2.0) CEUs annually for certification maintenance in the MICS, with three-tenths (0.3) specifically focused on Ethics. An interpreter may earn up to one (1.0) MICS CEU per year through mentoring, whether as a mentor or as a mentee. Contact hours earned in another state will be accepted by the BCI provided that the hours acquired can be documented. The twelve- (12-) month period for annually earning CEUs will end ninety (90) days prior to the licensing deadline. This section will become effective for the CEU cycle beginning November 3, 2015 and ending November 2, 2016.

#### **ORDER OF RULEMAKING**

By the authority vested in the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services under section 192.006, RSMo 2000, and sections 167.181 and 192.020, RSMo Supp. 2013, the department amends a rule as follows:

## **19 CSR 20-28.010** Immunization Requirements for School Children is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on May 1, 2015 (40 MoReg 578–584). No changes have been made in the text of the

proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) received two (2) letters with a total of three (3) comments regarding the proposed amendment. One letter was received from Jill Kliethermes, MSN, RN, FNP-BC, and Rebecca McClanahan, MSN, RN, representing the Missouri Nurses Association (hereinafter "MONA"). One letter was received from Drue Duncan representing Pfizer, Inc. (hereinafter "Pfizer").

COMMENT #1: MONA suggests that physician only language be amended to include advanced practice registered nurses with regards to who can certify a medical exemption in subsection (1)(C) and in reference to records providing evidence of satisfactory immunization in subsection (3)(A).

RESPONSE: Section 167.181.3, RSMo, requires a statement from a duly licensed physician in cases where an objection is made for reasons of medical contraindication. DHSS does not have authority to make changes to the rule that supersedes statute. No changes have been made to the rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #2: Pfizer suggests the rule should clarify that Missouri's school entry requirements for immunization against meningococcal disease are aligned with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC's) recommendation for immunization against meningococcal disease.

RESPONSE: The proposed immunization schedule does reflect CDC recommendations for immunization against meningococcal disease. No changes have been made to the rule as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #3: Pfizer suggests the rule amendment should clarify that Missouri's meningococcal immunization requirements for school entry shall be updated as the CDC updates its recommendations.

RESPONSE: Section 167.181.1, RSMo gives DHSS authority to promulgate rules governing immunization requirements that conform to recognized standards of medical practice. Any updates to the required immunization requirements can only be made through the rulemaking process as section 536.031.4, RSMo, provides that materials incorporated by reference in a rule do not include any later amendments or additions. No changes have been made to the rule as a result of this comment.

No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) received one (1) letter with one (1) comment regarding the proposed amendment. The letter was received from Jill Kliethermes, MSN, RN, FNP-BC, and Rebecca McClanahan, MSN, RN, representing the Missouri Nurses Association (hereinafter "MONA").

COMMENT #1: MONA suggests that physician only language in paragraph (3)(B)1. of the rule be amended to include advanced practice registered nurses with regards to who can certify a medical exemption from immunization requirements.

RESPONSE: Section 210.003.2(2)(a), RSMo, allows a medical exemption from the immunization requirements upon certification by a licensed physician that such immunization would seriously endanger the child's health or life. DHSS does not have authority to make changes to the rule that supersedes statute. No changes have been made to the rule as a result of this comment.
