 the State of Missouri being of ~~Sound~~ Sound mind memory
 and understanding, although diseased in body, do in view
 of the uncertainty of human life, make, ordain and
 publish this, my last will and Testament, hereby revoking
 annulling and setting aside all former wills by me at
 any time heretofore made. It is my last will, and
 I do hereby direct and provide, that all my property and
 Estate real, personal and mixed, wheresoever situate,
 and of whatever kind and description, shall be
 disposed of, in manner and form as is hereinafter
 directed and provided in the following Ten subdivisions
~~And First: I direct that my~~
 of this my last will and Testament.

And First: I direct that my body
 shall be interred in the family burial ground, in a
 manner adapted to my position in life, upon the farm
 whereon I now reside.

Second: I direct that my Executors
 herein after named shall pay and discharge all my
 Just debts and liabilities, including the costs, fees and
 expenses, attending the Administration of my Estate as
 soon after my decease as sufficient assets, for that
 purpose may come to their hands.

Third: I Give and bequeath to my beloved
 wife Sarah Camron whatsoever parts of household and
 kitchen furniture and utensils beds bedding and bed
 clothing table linen and furniture cupboard ware
 and any other articles necessary for house keeping
 that she may select not exceeding in value the
 sum of Two hundred dollars, and also such quantity
 of Groceries and provisions on hand and provided as
 may be necessary for the Subsistence of her self and
 family for one year.

I further Give and bequeath to my said wife a Side Saddle, and any one of my Stock of horses she may select. I do further Give and bequeath to my said wife for and during the period of her natural life any one of my female Slaves for life that my said wife may select, I further Direct that my Executors shall place at interest the sum of one thousand dollars for the maintenance and Support of my said wife paying her at the end of each year the interest arising therefrom with further power and authority in my said Executors to apply the whole or any part of the principal sum to the comfortable Support of my said wife whenever she may require it Provided always that said female Slave herein before referred to, and any residue of said sum of one thousand dollars shall revert to my Estate at the death of my said wife. - The foregoing to be in lieu of Decease

Fourth: I do hereby Give and bequeath to my beloved Grand son Elisha Camron Culp (son of my deceased daughter Elizabeth) ~~the~~ sum of Five hundred dollars I direct that said sum shall be placed at interest by his father or Guardian, and that the annual interest (and if necessary the principal or any part thereof) shall be applied to his maintenance and education, and if the said Elisha Camron Culp shall Decease before he arrives at the age of twenty one years the residue of the aforesaid sum of five hundred dollars and interest if any shall revert to my Estate

Fifth: It is my will, and I do hereby Expressly provide, that none of my children shall be charged, with any advancements, made to them in my life time

Sixth: I do hereby direct and provide that my Executors herein after named shall as soon as practicable after my Decease sell and dispose of all my Slaves ^{with the} Stock ^{Exception of mella I give her the right to live with which one of the family she pleases} and personal property of every description (

(With the Exception of the Slave and other articles of ~~personal~~ personal property herein before specifically bequeathed) at public sale to the highest bidder upon such terms and credits as they may deem best for the interest of my Estate, and that they shall further collect all monies due me from every source whatsoever. And I do hereby further direct and provide that when ever in the opinion of my said Executors they may be able to sell the whole or any part of my Real Estate for what they may deem the value thereof (provided that my Executors may agree that they are hereby authorized and directed to sell the same where-soever situate, at either public or private sale in such parcels for such prices and upon such credits as they may think most advantageous to the interest of my Estate with full and ample authority to receive said purchase money and to seal, execute, acknowledge, and deliver good and sufficient conveyances to the purchaser or purchasers of any part thereof. With further authority to rent said Real Estate until the period of such sale.

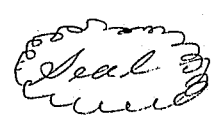

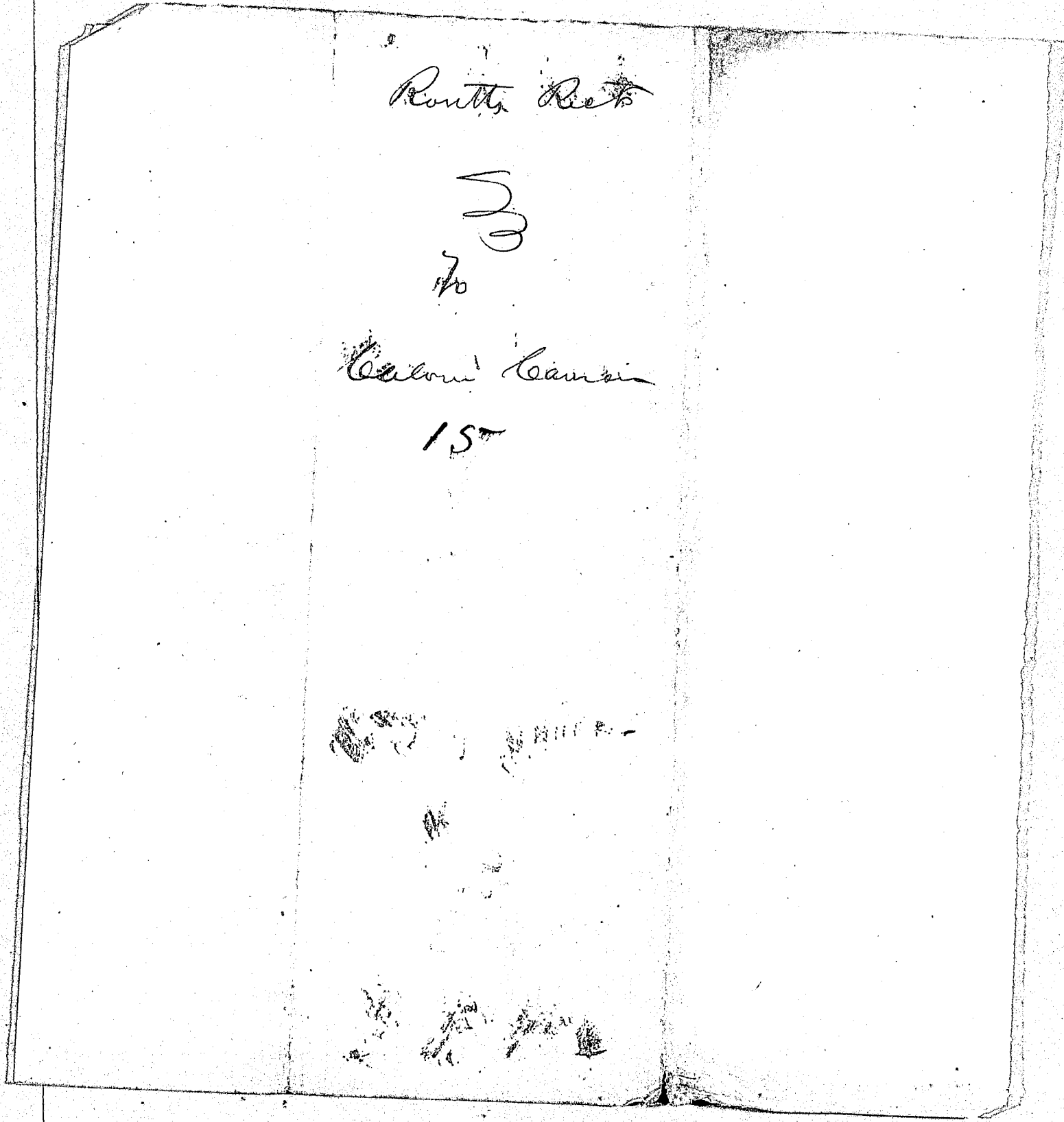

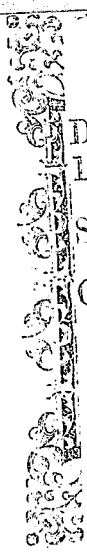
