No. 1 Action for Selling Intoxicating Liquors to
George Probstine Deft

Sept 29th 1873 Came John A. Pickler County Attorney
and filed Complaint herein and a Warrant issued against
defendant. Warrant was delivered to Park Court
L. W. Link J^r

Sept 29th 1873 Warrant returned by Park Court with
the defendant. Came John A. Pickler County
Attorney. The defendant plead not guilty to the
charge as set forth in the Complaint. The evidence
on the part of the State was introduced, reduced to
writing by the Justice and under his direction and
Case closed as to the State. The defendant then made
his statement & the Evidence was closed. The
Justice finds from the Evidence that the defendant
did aid and abet in procuring a sale of intoxicating
liquors in a quantity less than one Gallon on the 27th
day of Sept 1873 and Orders that the defendant
George Probstine enter in to recognizance in the
sum of ~~two hundred~~ fifty dollars with good
security for his personal appearance at the
next Term of the Circuit Court to answer acc-
ording to law; and on a failure ^{to do} to stand com-
mitted. The Justice further Orders that J. D. Hughes
Stanley Thompson & T. A. Finch ^{be recognized personally} appear at the
Circuit Court for St. Clair County to give Evidence in this
Case, recognizance in the sum of fifty dollars
