are held and firmly Bound unto Michael Amoureux Judge of pro-
bate of the said District District and his Successors in office in trust
to and for all persons concerned and having interest therein, in
the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars lawful money of
the United States to be paid to the said Michael Amoureux
and his Successors as before said, for which
payment well and truly to be made we bind our selves
heirs, executors, and administrators, jointly By these presents
Done at New Madrid sealed with our respective seals this
Sixth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
hundred and eight and of the Independence of the United
States the thirty second

The conditions of the present obligation is such that if the
within Bounden Eleonor Clements widow of James Clements deceased
administratrix of all and singular the goods chattels, rights
and credits of James Clements deceased, do make or cause to be
made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the said
goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said James Clements
which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge
of her the said Eleonor Clements, or into the hands, and possession
of any other person or persons for her and the same, to make
do exhibit it, or cause to be exhibited in the office of the
Judge of probate for the District of New Madrid at or
before the eighteenth day of the present month, and
the same goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased
which at any time after shall come to the hand or
possession of the said Eleonor Clements, or in the hand
or possession of any other person or persons for her do
well and truly administer, according to law, and
further do make or cause to be made a true and full
account of the said administration, at or before the
first day of November next, and all the rest and residue
of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be
found remaining upon the said administration account

the same being first examined by the judge of probate
 and allowed by the orphans courts of the District of New-
 Madrid shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons
 respectively as the said orphans courts by their Decree
 and sentence pursuant to the true intent and meaning
 of the act of the Legislature of Louisiana passed on
 the subject shall limit and appoint; and if it shall
 hereafter appear that any law will and to the contrary
 made by the said Decree then the same shall be void and
 of no effect.

The said judge of probate, making request to have it
 allowed and approved accordingly, and if the said
 Eleanor Fleming within bounds, being there required,
 do render and deliver her said Letters of administration,
 approbation of such testaments being first had & made,
 in the office of the said judge of probate, then this
 obligation to be void and of no effect, or else to remain
 in full force and virtue.

We the heirs of James Clement deceased having agreed to make a final settlement of the estate of the said deceased have made the same as follows: - Every one of us acknowledges to have received his or her full share of the personal property belonging to the said estate, to wit: Joseph Jacobs, as the husband of Anna Clement, one share, James Clement one share, Isabella Clement, one share, Rachel Clement, one share, Thomas Dethworth Clement, one share, and the widow Eleanor Clement, one share; and with regard to the real and mixed property, to wit: one negro man, called Charly, one negro woman, called Jull, and one negro girl called Dilby, and the land or plantation of four hundred acres, on which the said widow Eleanor Clement now lives, with all the increase of the said negroes, and all the appurtenances whatsoever belonging to the said plantation & tract of land, shall be enjoyed in full possession by the said widow Eleanor Clement, during her life time, to be, at her death, divided among the remaining heirs according to law: thus agreed and covenanted at New Madrid this third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight - in witness whereof we have here unto set our hands and seals to this presents


