



This morning a part of the Regiment under my command arrested two suspicious looking characters while preparing to cross the Missouri River near Howell ferry. They gave their names as Elisha R. Bell and Benj. G. Ball and make in substance the following statement: That they constituted a part of Bragg's force and were taken prisoners near Chattanooga and sent to Rock Island as prisoners that they escaped on the 17th day of September 1864 out of the hospital that they ^{came} down the Mississippi partly afoot partly in skiff & crossed at the mouth of Illinois over into St Charles County that they have passed around St Charles and went about 16 miles above St Charles to the ferry mentioned that during the 8 or 10 days they were in St Charles they lived on parched corn nuts & apples except one night on which they stayed with a farmer in Greens bottom (whom they so describe as to enable me to arrest him) that they were trying to get to Alabama their homes. Their appearance at once indicated their character their clothes being utterly worn out and being nearly barefoot other clothing has been given them. The above are the leading features of their statement which I have written out in full & will send as soon as I have arrested the individual who kept them over night.


Statement of John Pope who being by me
duly sworn deposes and says

I live 2 miles north of Rochester
Andrew County Mo. On or about the 2nd of
November 1864 some Militia from Stewartsville
came to my fathers house and said they were
pursuing six men from Stewartsville through
DeKalb into Andrew County. The men they
were pursuing had separated and the Militia
lost track of two of them. The Militia then
left and took after the other four. I accompany-
ing I went with them until Joe Hart
Brother, who was with the men we were pursuing,
was wounded. I then returned home. when
my father informed me that two men had
passed the house two hours previously enquiring
the way to Albany. Myself and two others
got on our horses and followed them. we
pursued them all night and found that they
enquired at nearly every house how far it
was to Albany. Conceiving the impression
that they were from Albany and going to
Rochester. we pursued them until day-
light when they left the main road
and took through the timber. getting
breakfast we tracked them to squirrel

Days From there they went to Smithton
and then took to the brush. we lost
track of them went to Allansville and
stayed all night. We started after them
next morning. about a mile from Allansville
a woman told me they had passed her house
enquiring the way to Sun Allens
I went back to Allansville got some help
and pursued them. They had passed
Allens house and gone to a mans house
named Clark. Sun Allen told me
that the two men were not at Clarks
I threatened to set the house on fire and
burn both of them. at which he told me
one of them was at the house. I found
him up in a loft when he came down
he said he was a Confederate Soldier
that he belonged to the 2nd Mo Cav Lt Col
I told him if he would find the other man
I would not kill him. I found the
other one at Mr. Allens. They had no papers
to show that they were Confederate Soldiers
and I brought them immediately to St. Joseph
Missouri. Their names are William Follen
and Daniel Minniss
