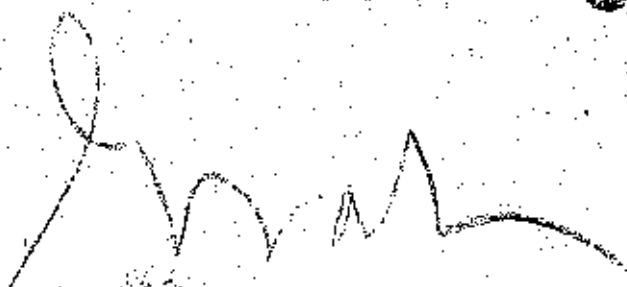



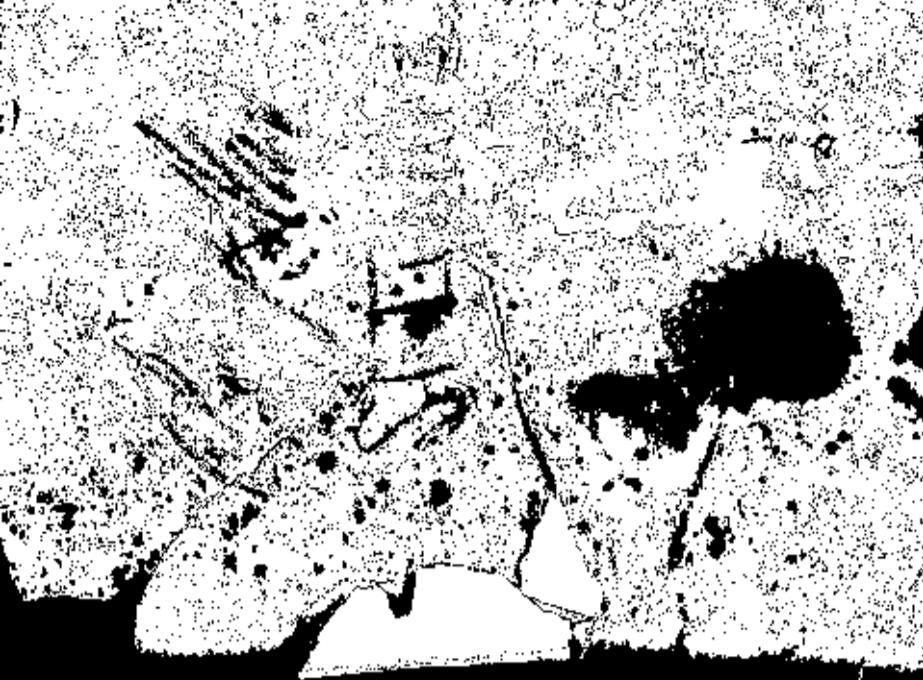

After her being thus safe I stationed my Companies as guard, and commenced investigating matters, found two secessionists, one by the name of Jacobs and one by the name of J R Shaler, the latter is said to be a Col. of secession Regiment. ^{of Col. Shaler} By order, I delivered them safely at Jeffersons Barrer. Kept my men on guard, during the night, & this morning, commenced a thorough search of every part of said vessel, and found as follows, Two Colts Revolvers in possession of J R Shaler, and two Colts Revolvers in the possession of J Wild of Kentucky also One Hundred & fifty feet Fuse, also One Suit Uniform said to belong to Lieut Col. Phelps St James of, Mo Sta; Volunteers & One Artillery Short sword, & several letters which may be of use to union forces; which I delivered to Capt Insard for the U S District Atty.

Phillips is a man of little
influence & less courage, but

as well as bond, which

sufficient security for \$300,
and has a wife who has 5
children at home.

He also left on the first
of September.

If you will excuse a volunteer
opinion, I will assure you nothing
has so much tended to restore
quiet & good order, and given
confidence to the federal cause
as the discharge of Mrs. E.
Williams by Gen. Halleck, and
the return of some others
under a discharge of J. M.
Ault Parrott Marshall of
Franklin Co. as they see there
is no disposition to a relentless
pursuit of those who acknowledge
they were deceived &
misguided, and show a desire
to be again considered loyal
citizens.

him the night before last, had im-

but little change in the past week,

think. He is still confined to his bed,
and, when I saw him this morning,
he had some fever as usual.

Dr. Holcombe was doing very well
up to the night before last, when he
took fresh cold, probably from the
change in the weather that then occurred.

I find him with more cough than
he has had for several days pre-

violated our parole in the least degree and
we have been so unfortunate as to be pris-
oners of war, & insist that if charges to the
contrary have been preferred against us we
should have had an opportunity of defending
ourselves before being arrested in the streets
confined in prison, baggage searched and
letters mutilated; from your high character
we have no idea that such outrages would

sanctioned by you & feel satisfied that our note
addressed to you and Col Marsh could not
have reached you. We must conclude this
note by saying that we regret very much that
we could not have an interview with you
before we leave

She is also authorized to buy and receipt for the same, such means of conveyance as may be necessary to further the object for which this Commission is given; and to receive such pay for said services from the govt of the U.S. as is customary for such services. 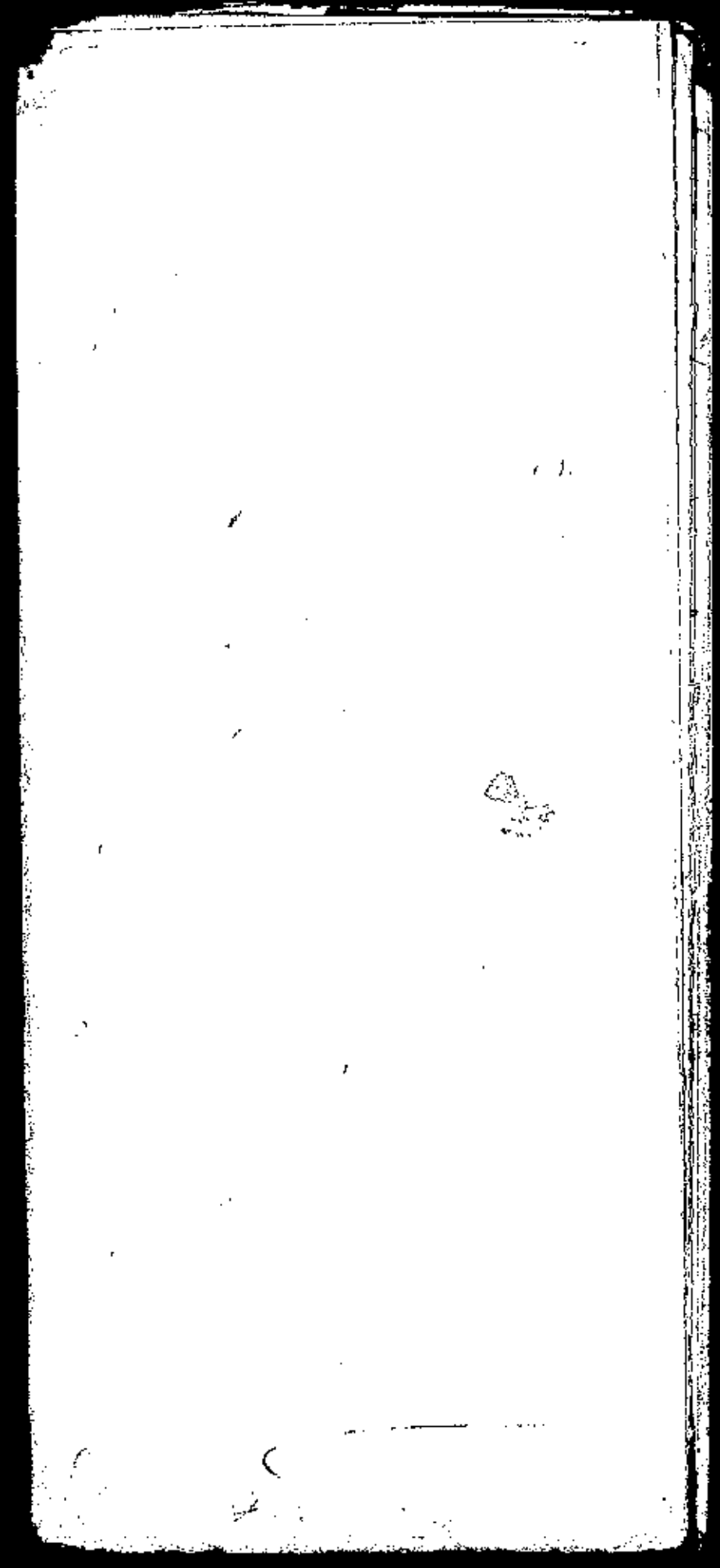

In October last, the Military Prisons of this city being in danger from the rebel forces under Maj. Gen. Sterling Price, it was deemed prudent by Gen. Rosecrans, then in command of this Department, to transfer the occupants to the Alton Prison. While this transfer was in progress, one of the prisoners - Robert Loudan, alias, Charles Veal, - made his escape from the guards, by cutting his irons, & jumping from the boat into the river.

He was then under sentence of death, for being a spy & a Boat-burner.

Loudan was lately heard from, at New Orleans, where it was reported he was in the custody of the Military authorities, by whom he was subsequently released for the want of sufficient evidence to hold him. It is possible

He has gone beyond our lines, but if not, he would be likely to make for some of the large cities of the loyal states.

Loudan is a native of Philadelphia, where his wife now resides; height, about 5ft 8 in; fair complexion; large blue eyes, constantly rolling & displaying a great deal of white; hair & whiskers fair; usually wears a false mustache; wears his hat on the back of his head; square shoulders.

This office is charged with his execution, & will incur any amount of trouble to recapture him. If he is found within the limits of our jurisdiction, please secure him & forward to me, or notify me of his arrest & I will send for him.



GENERAL ORDERS,

No. 19.

I. Before the Military Commission which convened at Warrensburg, Missouri, pursuant to Special Orders No. 34, current series, from these headquarters, and of which Lieutenant Colonel B. F. LAZEAR, 1st Regiment M. S. M. Cavalry, is President, were arraigned and tried:

1st: ELISHA ELLIS, a citizen.

CHARGE:

"Attempting to vote in contravention of law and military orders."

SPECIFICATION: "In this, that *Elisha Ellis*, of Miller county, State of Mo., having, during the year one thousand, eight hundred and sixty two, taken up arms in rebellion against the government of the United States, did, at Mount Pleasant, in the county of Miller, and State of Mo., on the 8th day of November, 1864, attempt to vote in violation and contravention of the laws of the State of Mo., made and provided in like cases, and also in contravention of General Orders No. 195, Series of 1864, from Head Quarters Department of the Mo., said orders being in words as follows:

I. Those, and only those, who have the qualifications, and who take the oath, prescribed by the laws of the State, copies of which are hereto annexed, shall vote. From the terms of the oath, it is manifest that it was the intention of the Missouri State Convention that no person should vote, who, since the 17th day of December, 1861, has wilfully taken up arms or levied war against the United States, or against the Provisional Government of the State of Missouri. This excludes from the right of voting all who, since that date, have been in the rebel army or navy anywhere, and all who, since that date, have been anywhere engaged in guerrilla marauding or bushwhacking. Voting, or attempting to vote, in contravention of law or orders, is declared a military offense, subjecting the offender to arrest, trial, and punishment, if convicted."

To which charge and specification the prisoner pleaded "Guilty."

FINDING AND SENTENCE:

The Commission finds the prisoner "Guilty" as charged, and does therefore sentence him, ELISHA ELLIS, a citizen, "to pay the sum of five hundred dollars to the Government of the United States, and be imprisoned at hard labor at such place as the commanding General may direct until the fine shall be paid, but not to be kept so imprisoned for a period exceeding one year."

The proceedings, findings and sentence in the foregoing case of **ELISHA ELLIS**, are approved and confirmed; but on account of the prisoner's ignorance of civil and military law, and the helpless condition of his family, the sentence is remitted. The prisoner will be released from custody and allowed to go at large.

II. 2d: **WILLIAM HALLOWAY**, a citizen.

CHARGE:

"Harboring, aiding and abetting guerrillas."

SPECIFICATION: "In this, that *William Halloway*, a citizen of the county of Lafayette, State of Missouri, did harbor certain rebel guerrillas whose names are unknown. The said guerrillas being discovered by soldiers of the 7th Cavalry, M. S. M., in the service of the United States, in and about the premises of the said *William Halloway*, and the said *Halloway* did aid and abet the said guerrillas in making their escape from the said United States troops, by warning the said guerrillas of the approach of said troops, and by neglecting and refusing to assist the said troops to overtake the said guerrillas. All this at the county of Lafayette, State of Missouri, on or about the 15th day of February, 1865."

To which charge and specification the prisoner pleaded "*Not Guilty.*"

FINDING AND SENTENCE:

The Commission finds the prisoner "*Guilty*" of the charge and specification, and does therefore sentence him, **WILLIAM HALLOWAY**, a citizen, "*to be imprisoned in the Missouri State Prison for the period of ten years.*"

The proceedings, finding and sentence in the foregoing case of **WILLIAM HALLOWAY** are approved and confirmed. The prisoner will be sent to the State Penitentiary, at Jefferson City, Missouri, for confinement therein during the time specified in the sentence, under the direction of the District Provost Marshal.

III. 3d: **MCDONALD LEWIS:**

CHARGE FIRST:

"Violation of the oath of allegiance to the Government of the United States."

SPECIFICATION: "In this, that *McDonald Lewis*, a citizen of the county of Cooper, State of Missouri, did, on the 31st day of May, 1862, at the town of Boonville, county of Cooper, State of Mo., take and subscribe an oath of allegiance to the Government of the United States before an officer duly authorized and empowered to administer the same, by the terms of which said oath he, the said *McDonald Lewis*,

bound and obligated himself to support, protect, and defend the Constitution and Government of the United States against all enemies, whether domestic or foreign, and to bear true faith and allegiance and loyalty to the same, and afterwards, to-wit: on or about the 10th day of October, 1864, at the county of Cooper, State of Missouri, he, the said *McDonald Lewis*, did violate his said oath of allegiance by enlisting in and belonging to, the army of the so-called Confederate States of America; the said army being in rebellion against the Government of the United States."

CHARGE SECOND:

"*Violation of the laws of war.*"

SPECIFICATION: "In this, that *McDonald Lewis*, a private of the army of the so-called Confederate States of America, being in armed rebellion against the Government of the United States, did come within the lines of occupation of the army of the United States, and did lurk and travel about within said lines, and did fail to report to the military authorities of the United States, as required by orders made out and provided in like cases. This in the counties of Cooper and Pettis, State of Missouri, during the months of October, November, December, 1864, and January, 1865."

To which charges and specifications the prisoner pleaded "*Not Guilty.*"

FINDING AND SENTENCE:

The Commission finds the prisoner "*Guilty*" of the charges and specifications, and does therefore sentence him, *MCDONALD LEWIS*, "*to be imprisoned in the Missouri State Prison for the period of five years.*"

The proceedings, finding and sentence in the foregoing case of *MCDONALD LEWIS* are approved and confirmed. The prisoner will be sent to the State Penitentiary, at Jefferson City, Missouri, for confinement therein during the time specified in the sentence, under the direction of the District Provost Marshal.

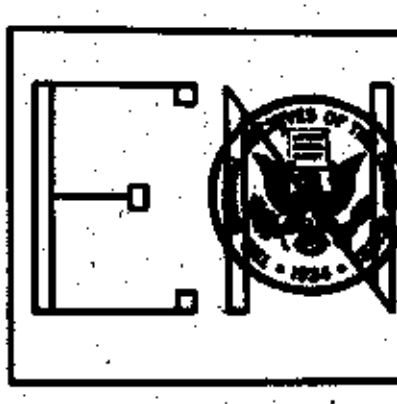
