In accordance with Special Order No. 4, from Department Head Quarters dated July 19th 1862, Capt. C. Ewing and ~~Adjutant John Wood~~ of the 13th Regt of Infantry in connection with Thomas Mitchell Deputy Provost Marshal are appointed to constitute an examining Board for the purpose of arrangement for the release of prisoners of war at this post giving bond and taking the oath of Allegiance, and also of deciding what prisoners shall be so released.

The Board will assemble at the Allouez Penitentiary at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning without fail.

IV The Commanding Officer 1st Battalion 13th Infantry will detail an orderly for the Board.

Sir:

I herewith enclose a
List of Prisoners who escaped from the
Prison at this place during the night of
the 25th inst. - also copy of my letter to Col.
Hoffman, Com. Gen. of Prisoners.

One of the escaped prisoners returned on the
morning of the 26th and delivered himself up
at the Prison. The parties sent out in
pursuit have retaken some of them, and
also captured two who say they escaped
from Camp Butler on the 16th inst. Their
names are George J. Bidelle & John J. Herring.

It is thought that the Magoffins have gone to
a Doct. Magoffin, a brother of the Col, at or near
Saint Louis. I am told that suspicious persons
are sometimes admitted to the Hospital, by the
"Sisters", and taken care of by them, thus escaping

The authorities. I know nothing of the truth
of such statement, but speak of it as I have
heard of it. One of the "Doctors" in Hospital
on 4th Street once asked a gentleman who hap-
pened to be there, a resident of this place, to take a
message to Col. Magoffin, and said she would
send for his brother, who was in the City, to have some
conversation with him, if he would deliver the
message to the prisoner, he declined having
anything to do with the affair, telling her he
was a Union man, and then the matter stopped.
I mention this as being rather suspicious, though
it may be of no importance - you can best judge.
Col. Magoffin and one of his sons were in no
condition to travel for whom they escaped.
I have learned from one of the returned pris-
oners that the digging of the trench has been
going on since about the middle of May.

There appears to be a serious discrepancy between your roll of sentenced prisoners sent up here on the 7th inst. and the same names in General Order No 81. (Proceedings of a Military Commission, dated St. Louis April 27th 63. received the same day which I would be glad if you will have explained.

No 16. On the roll sent up on the 7th is the name of James L. Wilson reported as a private of Porter's regiment, captured in Monroe Co. Mo. on the 14th of Oct. 1862. No 17. In order No 81. is James L. Wilson, listed as a citizen, and is reported as having been captured about the 21st of January 1863. Now it is very uncertain whether either of these men, if there be

two of them, has been sent here from St. Louis.

A prisoner who calls himself James Stone Wilson, or James S. Wilson, was received here on the 8th inst, who I am told by Capt. Drought in his letter of the 8th, is the James S. Wilson No. 16. on the roll before referred. But this James S. Wilson claims to have been a captain in Thompson's regiment of confederate troops when he was captured, & that he was captured in January, 1863, and not in October, 1862.

The frequent errors and discrepancies in the rolls of prisoners sent here from time to time, gives us a great deal of trouble, which I think might be remedied, by care in making them out.

Charged with the murder of William Pickles

Pellie Richards being duly sworn deposes, and says: I am thirty two years old, reside in Leaverton, Iron County Mo, I knew Wm Pickles who was killed at his house in St Genevieve Co. Mo. on, or about the 11th day of August 1861. I had, ^{then} been living in Mr Pickles family about 3 weeks. On or about the 11th day of August 1861, John Highley, Mat Sweeney, and his ^{two} brothers; James Crowder, Wm Randolph & his brother, William Evans and Stephen Evans, Washington McFarland

came to the ^{yard} house of Wm Pickles, I was then in the front yard of Mr Pickles house, Mr. Pickles, his wife & three children were also in the yard, this was about 5 P. M; when Pickles saw them coming he ran into the house, his wife stood in the doorway, I remained where I was, the oldest boy, John Pickles, started to run out of the lane when Mat. Sweeney shot at him but did not hit him, the boy fell and I saw no more of him until after Mr Pickles was killed.

Highley and his party then surrounded the house. Highley encountered Mrs. Pickles in the doorway and in endeavoring to effect

an entrance ^{into the house}, which Mrs Pickles opposed
he, Highley, assaulted her, tore off a
portion of her dress, calling her by
many indecent names & having suc-
ceeded in forcing an entrance, he, Highley,
Mat Sweeney and Ellvellyn Evans
began to search the house, they
could not find Pickles when they
threatened to fire the house, unless they
found him, Highley and his party
then left the house and going to the
Store House they ordered an old negro
man named Harrison (the property of
Pickles) to break open the store house
door, he not obeying promptly, Highley
shot at him, the ball striking the
door jamb just above "Harrison's" head,
the negro then forced the door when
Highley and his party entered the store
and took what goods they pleased
and packed them on their horses,
among other articles, they took a can
of Turpentine with which they returned
to the house, entered the negro quarters,
adjoining the house, sprinkled Turpentine
over some bed clothing and set it on
fire; Mrs Pickles seeing that the house
would be burned persuaded her hus-
band to come from his hiding place,
which he did and delivered himself
to Highley and his party as a prisoner of
war.

Highley told Pickles that he was going to take him to Capt. Patterson at Valley Forge, immediately. Mrs. Pickles started for her husband's horse, while she was gone Highley procured a rope and making a noose in it approached Pickles and attempted to throw the noose over Pickles head, but Pickles by throwing up both hands prevented him. Mat. Sweeney then said, Highley! dont do that, let us take him to Capt. Patterson ~~and then to Sweeney~~ ~~draw Pickles on before him,~~ Pickles ^{Pickles said} ~~constantly saying,~~ wait until "Ann" comes with the horse, Sweeney then began to drive him saying go on, or I will blow your g-d - n brains out, when Pickles started before him and after proceeding about 100 yds he turned to Sweeney saying, Mat. I can't walk, when Sweeney drew his Revolver and fired at him, Pickles immediately fell backward ~~and~~ ^{but} almost immediately rose to a sitting position, when Sweeney said "get up, take that road and travel" when Pickles answered "I cannot for I am a dying man", Sweeney immediately renewed his firing calling to the rest of the party to come up for he had him (Pickles) down; ~~the rest of the party, excepting two, then came up and fired at Pickles~~

Highley then said come on boys,
and they, hanging back, Highley
cried "you always are behind like
an old cow" and if you dont come
and shoot him (Pickles) I will shoot
you; the whole party, excepting Evans,
and (who had gone with Mrs
Pickles to catch the horse and who had
not yet returned) then advanced and
each of them shot at Pickles including
Highley shot at Pickles who still
remained upon the ground, killing
him instantly. As soon as Mrs Pickles
heard the first shot, she started
toward me; when she had reached
me she said "Kellie have they killed
him? when I answered "Yes" if you
had as many shots in you as they
have fired at him you would be
dead too! Mrs. Pickles and myself then
started and went to where Mr Pickles
was lying dead, Highley and his
party were starting away, when they
were passing where Pickles lay Mrs.
Pickles said help us carry him into
the house, when Highley answered
"dont say that to me or I will kill
you also" put you by his side".

As soon as the party had stopped
firing, ^{some of them} they turned the body over, as I
^{saying, let us} supposed to see if he was dead, while others
commenced loading their guns &c

At the time of his death Pickles had upon his person a Gold watch and a pocket Book, containing a sum of money; when myself and Mrs Pickles reached the body Highley and his party were just leaving it: Llewellyn Evans said to Mrs. Pickles, "you know that I would not have hurt a hair of his head and I tried to keep the others from doing it" he also said, John Highley has taken his pocket Book, and I wanted him to give it to his (Pickles) children, that they (the children) would make men some time. Evans then left us and rejoined the party. Mrs Pickles then said, "how will we get him to the house" I answered, "I do not know, we cannot carry him" she answered, "Yes we can" I will go and get a quilt" she (Mrs Pickles) then went to the house, and ~~got~~ staying with the body; she returned in a few moments with a quilt when we placed the body upon the quilt and carried it to the house, placed it upon the bed where it remained until 1 P. M. next day when Odd Fellows from Farmington came & prepared it ^{for} burial.

Mrs Pickles and myself remained in the house, alone, with the exception of the negro Harrison, until the coming of the Odd Fellows on the next day.

The negro "Harrison" is at present living with Peter Haynes at Valley Forge, he "Harrison" was present during the whole time and saw the whole matter. Mrs. Pickle has since deceased and I believe that the negro Harrison and myself are the only living witnesses of the murder.

When living with Mr. Pickles my name was Green, I was a widow, since that time I married again one Langston Richards.

On the 24th of May I was conveyed from Alton Prison to this Prison and on arriving here was informed that a Mil. Com. had sentenced me to death, in the afternoon of the same day I was examined by one of the Officers attached to your Office and informed that a mistake had been made and was subsequently officially informed by the Capt. commanding this prison that it had been discovered I was not the man who had been tried, and that an order to that effect would be issued.

I am however still detained in close confinement and allowed no liberty whatever, as a prisoner of war recognized as such and not held to answer any charges, I respectfully request to be returned to my former quarters at Alton and restored to the list of prisoners for exchange, in the meantime to be transferred to the quarters assigned to prisoners of war in this prison and granted the same liberty allowed them.

In the matter of John Highly, whose sentence of death, as promulgated in Genl Orders, No. 93, War Dept., Adg. Genl. Office Washington, D. C., May 13th 1864, which has been confirmed by Special Orders No. 138 War Dept. of the Mo. of date May 23rd 1864, is hereby ordered to be carried into effect, under the direction of the Pro. Mar Genl., at St Louis Mo. on the 24th day of June next, the following report is respectfully submitted:

On receipt of the order of Execution, I telegraphed the Commanding Officer, at Alton, to be informed if John Highly was there in custody; on being informed that he was, I directed that he be sent to this office, where he was received on the 24th day of May. On arriving at this office,

the prisoner was recognized, by Lt. Geo. M. Richardson, Aft. Pro. Mar. Genl., as having been examined by him in Feby 1864, and placed on the list for exchange, a further personal examination of the Prisoner by Lieut Richardson fully established the fact that he is the John Nighly, who was captured in Saline Co, Mo, in Oct. 1863, examined at this Office Feby 25th 1864, and sent to Alton to await exchange, April 11th 1864, and not the John Nighly whose execution is directed by Genl. Orders No 93, before referred to.

It is found, on further investigation of the Prison Records of the Office, that the John Nighly whose execution is directed by Special Order, No 135, C. S., was, after his trial, in St Louis, before a Military Commission, on the 8th day of May, A. D. 1863, sent to Alton, Ills, for safe keeping, and to await

promulgation of Sentences - a course ^{as} I am
informed then generally pursued on account
of the crowded State and supposed insecurity
of the St. Louis prisons: and whilst so at
Alton, by some mistake of the then Comman-
ding Officer of the Prison, was, on the 12th day
of June following, sent forward to City
Point, Va, for exchange as a prisoner of War
Herewith find the record in both cases
referred to. That of John Nighly, now in
Custody, marked A, and that of John Nighly
exchanged marked B.

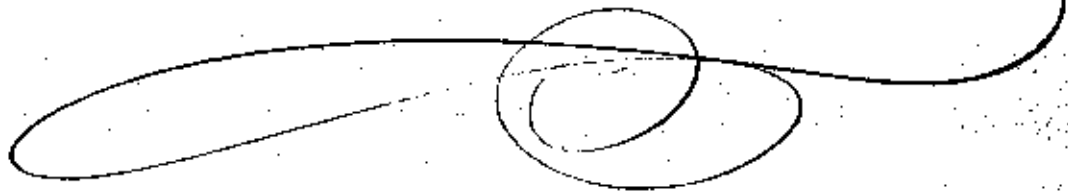

Dear Sir

I submit the following statement of
the case to you for your perusal. Knowing in advance that your object
is to promote the interest & welfare of the government at all times
& that you are fully competent to judge or decide as to the merits
or demerits of all cases pertaining to military matters I submit the
same to your inspection. On or about the tenth day of May eighteenth
hundred & sixty three, I was in the employ of a Mr. Wright as hack-
driver about one o'clock. I was driving up Front-street Memphis Tenn
I was halted by two men & one woman & asked me if I was engaged.
I told them not they then engaged my hack for no length of time but
kept me as long as they wanted I drove them to every part of the
city they directed me to go in the city. After about two hours riding they
left the hack but the two men continued to ride they engaged
me about half past one & rode until half past six that evening
I then told them that it was time for me to go & change teams & they
then requested me to drive them to Duwhee's hall, which I did I then
left my team standing & went up stairs to get my pay they then request-
ed to do so saying I had received it - I told them I had not when
one of them struck me a blow from which I fell then the two of
them jumped on me, punching & striking me I kicked one of them
in the breast & then arose they then commenced throwing timbers
at me. I then drew a small pen knife from my pocket & advanced
on them when I came in reach I cut one of them on the arm the
other in the thigh none of which was dangerous after being arrested
I was abused in a shameful manner by the wounded man rela-
tion the remark was made to me did you cut him I replied yes
& inquired of the wounded man was that all they said no I then said
I hoped he would die as I had been treated meanly & I should

not have made that expression but I was under the influence of liquor & being
so irritated by remarks made by his friends, I don't recall more than
I then was should. I was in prison about five weeks before having
my trial, or trial. The only witnesses against me was Mrs. Dunder's
wife who was convinced to this man Eagan that I cut. I could
not find my witness Sam Sullivan & they swore they swore to
quit themselves my witness being gone to his regiment at Vicksburg
Miss. The man swore that we were both down upon the floor
& that he could not tell positively which struck first. But his
wife swore that she was holding me & that her husband
was holding the man James Eagan. When a man by the name
of Knox run up & struck me & there their testimony did
not agree. Then ask the witness or prosecutor if I drank any
liquor that day they said yes that I drank every time they
did which was about seven times during the day. This is
a true statement of my case & I appeal to your generosity
for my release from this prison as to my loyalty their can be
nothing said against it I have not belonged to the Service
I belonged to the twenty-third Illinois Commanded by Col. Wall
gam but was discharged. About October 1861 at Camp Benton
Mo. & before & afterwards have been a true & loyal man to my
Country & not to save my Country from the ruthless hands of
traitors I would sacrifice every thing even my life. When you
were here you told Lieut. Smolly that if he would recommend
me as to my behavior since I have been here you would
release me I then made a statement & handed it to the Lieut
for him to sign but I have not heard from it since I suppose
he did not attend to it I can refer you to the present prison in
pector Capt. Downforth as to my behavior hoping you will
think favorably of this by so doing you will confer a favor
on me not to be forgotten.

Dear Sir,

In accordance with your suggestion I have endorsed upon the affidavits of John H. Russell & James A. Carson, Prisoners now at Alton, the names of the sureties they propose. I am informed that these names are responsible. I believe the sureties offered by Mr Russell are worth over \$30,000. I know these parties.

I also beg leave to ask your attention to the enclosed Surgeon's Certificate as to the health & physical condition of Mr. Russell. From information I have from Mr. Dolbee, a good and loyal citizen of Alton, I infer that Mr. Russell cannot probably live through the winter in prison. The Surgeon says; "his enlargement or release I deem essential to his recovery." Mr. Dolbee writes me;

"Judge Powell must be worth at least \$30,000. Mr. Russell would be willing to report monthly or weekly. As for his fighting days - they are past - except fighting the "King of Terrors."

I feel entirely sure that the Government would be amply protected against any possible harm

that Mr Russell could do, if he were disposed to do any. And it does seem that humanity dictates his release - his family are suffering, and he, it is evident, is gradually dying.

I believe myself, as a true friend of this government, and as one who has suffered deeply from rebels, that it would receive no detriment from him even if he were released unconditionally.

I pray you General, let John H. Russell be paroled & put under as heavy bonds as the public interest may seem to require.

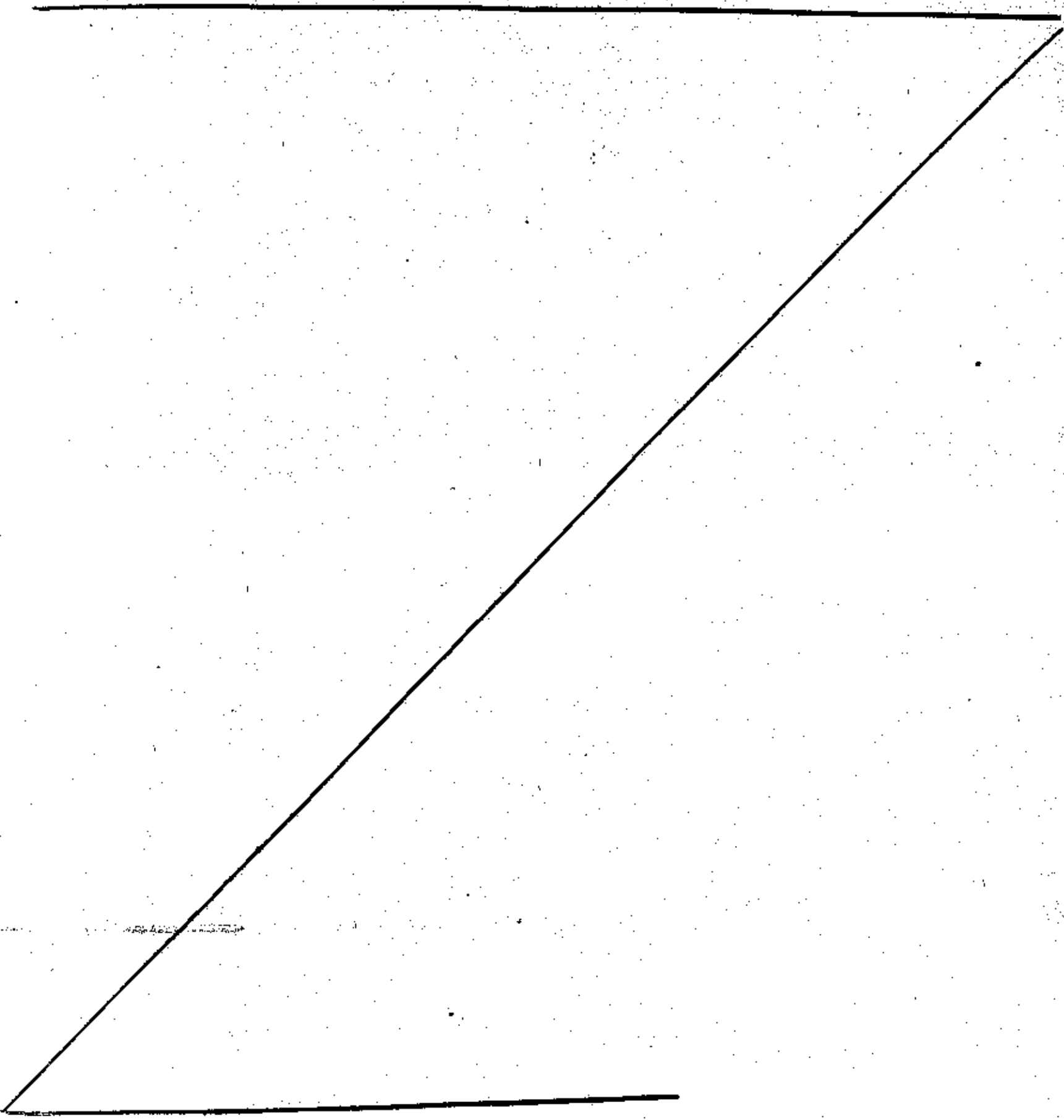

I send you, by
Capt. J. L. Vance, four Rebel prisoners viz
Floyd Bickers, Charles Bickers, Benjamin
Miller and Nelson Cantley. The two Bickers
and Cantley are charged with having intended
to have joined the Rebel army. They had got
together at the house of one Simon ^{on Sunday night,} ~~Deas~~, with the
expressed intention of starting for the Southern
army the next morning, but were arrested by
Lieut. Bell before they had risen from their beds.
They have all been volunteers in the Rebel army.
The following is their own statements as each gave
it to me:

Benjamin Miller: Lives on Spruce Fork of Coal River. Was
with Floyd. Was at the battles of Carnifax Ferry
and Cross Lanes. Was in the service about 3 months
Left him in Oct 1861. Came home on "sick leave". Have
not been back since.

Charles Bickers. Lives on Little Coal River. Was with Floyd.
Was at the battles of Carnifax Ferry, Cross Lanes and

Fort Donelson. Left him some time in March 1862.

Deserted.

Wilson Bantley. Lives on Spruce Fork of Coal River. Was with Floyd at the battles of Carnifax Ferry and Cross Lanes. Was out about 5 months. Left on 13th of Oct. 1861. Came home on "sick leave" and have not been back since.

Floyd Vickers. Lives on Spruce Fork of Coal River. Was with Floyd at Carnifax Ferry and Cross Lanes. Deserted some time in Oct. 1861. Here all members of Capt. James M^cShary's Co. 36 Va. Reg^t. Commanded by Col. John M^cCauslin.

It is probable that Miller did not intend to rejoin the army, but it can be proven by him that the others did intend to do so, as Mr Isaac Vance (the man who gave me the information which led to their arrest), told me that it was from this Miller that he learned their whereabouts and intentions. This, I am perfectly satisfied is the case, as Vance is a staunch, reliable Union man.

The guards stationed at or near the Bridge over Sandy Creek, about half a mile north of Home Station I. M. R. R. brought in last night about half past 8 or two prisoners. On an examination held by me this morning, I ascertained that their names were R. Stafford and Charles Skyles both prisoners of war, who according to their own witness escaped from the prison in Chicago.

I ordered them to be brought under escort to your Head-Quarters but on their way, they tried to escape and consequently were shot. This about a mile and a half from this military Post. Sgt. Charles Hatzle commanded the escort.

In accordance with instructions from Post Head Quarters I have the honor to submit the following statements concerning the stabbing of Patrick Toole Co. "C" 15th Tenn. by Samuel C. Turner Co. "D" 27th Tenn., from the effects of which wound, Toole died on the 19th of March 1865.

Benjamin Muse Co. "M" 11th N. Carolina Cavalry, states that on the 17th March 1865 there was near four or five hundred Tennessee Prisoners in front of the Express Office, Prisoners Square, waiting to sign the Parole Roll for Exchange.

Samuel C. Turner Co. "D" 27th Tenn. was in the crowd, he heard him, and Patrick Toole Co. "C" 15th Tenn. have some words in which "Toole" called "Turner" a damned liar, and a son of a b—ch, Turner immediately struck him with his knife, stabbing him in the abdomen, from the effects of which wound, "Toole" died in three or four days.

George C. Cox Co. "G" 5th Confederate, states that on the 17th March 1865 he was standing in front of the Express Office waiting to sign the Parole Rolls for exchange, while standing there, he heard some words pass between "Turner" and "Toole" in which Toole called

"Turner" a damned liar and a son of a b— ch, Turner
instantly stabbed him with his knife in the abdomen.

Edward Gransom Co. "C" 8th Texas, states, that he
was at the Express Office at the time the Tennesseans were
signing the Parole Rolls for exchange, he saw "Turner"
strike "Bool" with his knife, stabbing him in the abdo-
men, and had since heard that he died from the
effects of the wound in four, or five days.

James S. Dighton Co. "K" 5th Tenn; states that he was
present at the time Samuel C. Turner Co. "D" 27th Tenn.
stabbed Patrick Bool Co. "B" 15th Tenn, he saw
"Turner" stab "Bool", and had since heard that "Bool"
died in three or four days.

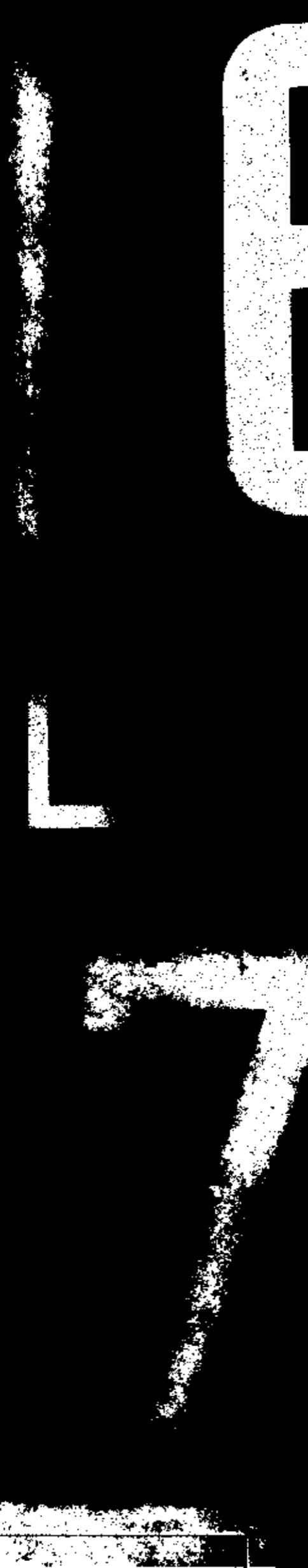
