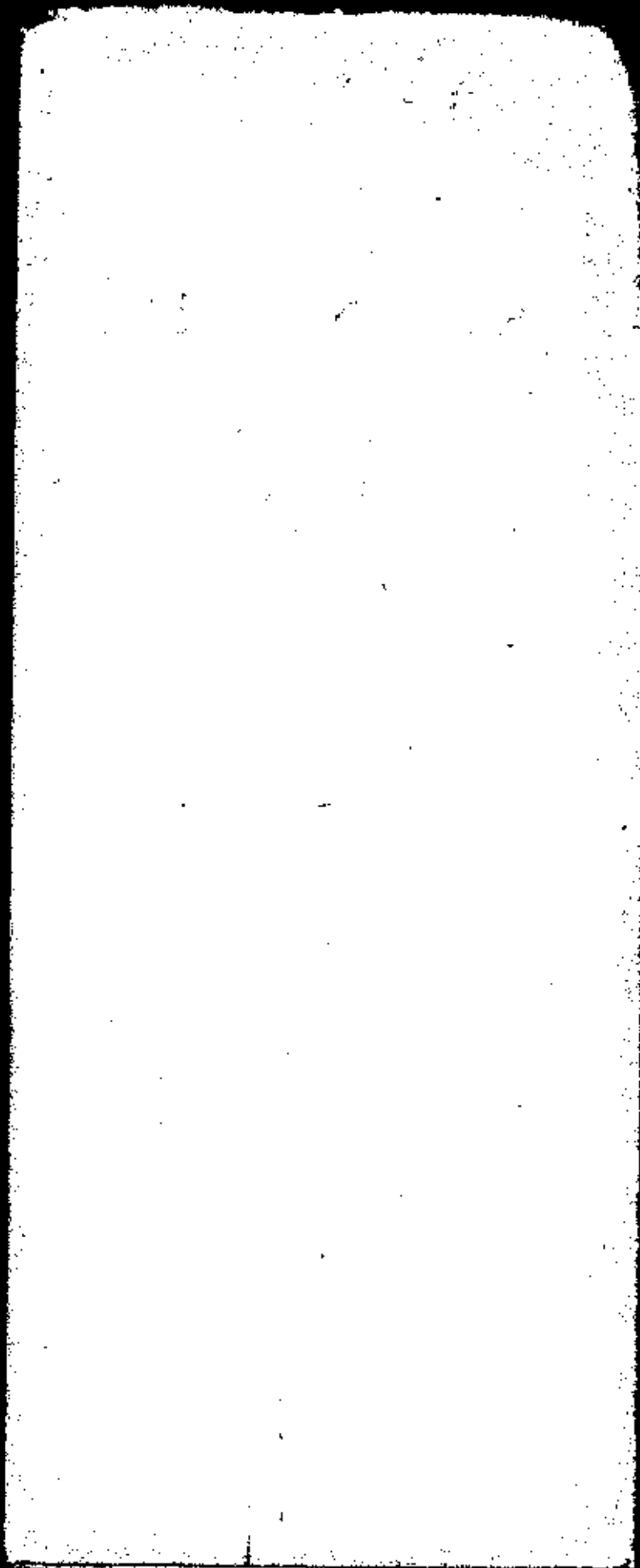



Also that we will do our duty as Surgeons and will not converse with any person upon matters that do not pertain to our duties as Surgeons and non-combatants. That upon our arrival at Indianapolis we will proceed immediately to Fort M^cHenry, Baltimore and report to Brig. Gen Morris to be sent South.

We will report our arrival at Indianapolis and at Baltimore by Telegraph to the Provost Marshal Gen. Dept of Cumberland.

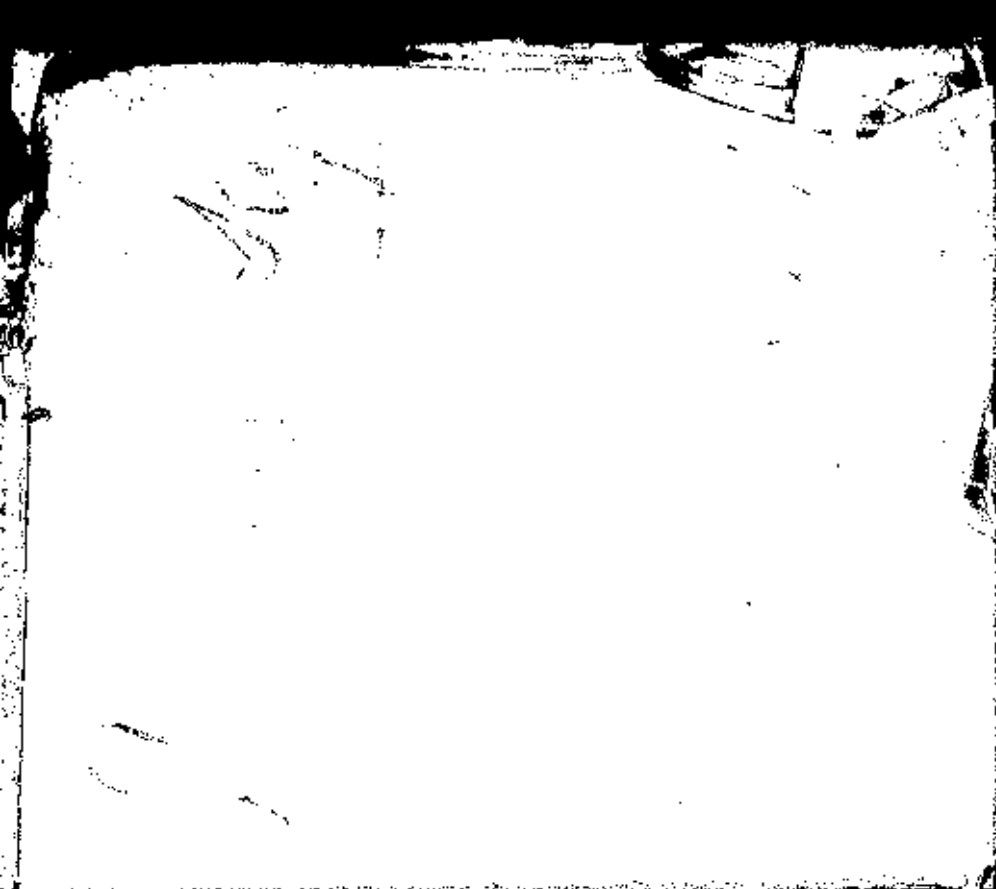

We were lying at Seymour, awaiting the Train, we had changed the cars we came there in & got into ~~But before the~~ car in which we were, had a hole in it, the two Guards were asleep, and the Sergeant was trying to kindle the fire with some meat, we were nearly frozen, and I remarked to Capt Martin, "let's get out of this, and go and warm, even if we can not escape, we may find some place to warm", we then leaped out of the car, and came to the next station, where we took the train, and came to Jeffersonville, where we bought the clothing we have on, we then came to Louisville, put up at the Commercial Hotel, ~~remained~~ there one day, then enquired for private boarding. —

Same as Lieut Chaffin, We enquired
for private boarding house, and were
referred to Mrs Rightcaps, went there
& got boarding & were arrested, we
told her that we were from Shelbyville,
I believe they thought us Buttermills.

I had not said that I was, she
then remarked that I had better
not talk treason.

Dear Sir

Yours of the 3rd inst requesting information regarding James Wells alias William Henry has been received and in reply I have to state that on the evening of the 14th August he came to my house armed, demanded money under threat of taking my life, failing to get money he robbed me of my watch and left threatening to return.

In company with four of my neighbors I tracked him that night a distance of twenty miles into Trimble Co found him shortly after day concealed in a hay loft from which he fired on us almost before we were aware of his presence, wounding me very severely in the neck the ball ranging down into my shoulder where it still remains disabling me permanently, at the same time he shot another citizen of this county Granville Cobble by name the ball taking effect in the abdomen, from the effect of this wound Mr Cobble has not yet recovered entirely and his life was despaired of for weeks. All this occurred on the morning of the 15th August as can be substantiated by numerous witnesses - On the evening of the 14th August (as I am informed and believe) before he came to my house he robbed Daniel Carpenter of this county of a horse, which he was riding at the time we caught up with him - the robbery at my house can be proved by myself & wife, the shooting by the following parties who were present Gran Cobble, J E Cooke Milton Jenkins Wm Violet and myself - all of which is respectfully submitted by yours Resptly D. I have the honor to report that in compliance with special orders of the 17th inst. I proceeded to Hancock Co. Ky and made diligent search for the purpose of obtaining facts and evidence in relation to the murder of one Thos. Hale a citizen of said Co. on the 5th of April last. It was also made my duty to ascertain if evidence could be procured to implicate one Harvey Wells charged with being a guerrilla as one of the murderers.

I ascertained in the first place that Thos. Hale was not murdered on the 5th of April last, but that he was murdered some time in the spring of 1863 by a party of guerrillas composed in part of the following named persons - to wit - Jos. Carter, Jo. Harrison Newton and a man by the name of Mills. I was told the man Mills said to have been of the party, was, or had been at home in that Co. within the last six or seven weeks. Of that fact, together with the given names, I shall be able to give in the course of 10th three or 4th days positive information.

Do Huff of Pellville Ky. will be able to identify Mills as one of the party, as they came to his father and made him take the oath not to attend upon any of the sick or wounded.

The man ~~Miller~~ referred to in connection with Huff is not a resident of Hancock Co. neither has been for two years past. His name is not H. B. but William Miller and is living at or near Booneville

Marriott Co. Ind. I am informed he will be an important witness in the case. Mrs. M. S. Bonner of the same place in Ind. will be important as the whole party were at her house but a few minutes before they murdered Heale and told her they were going there for that purpose.

Amos Corley of Hancock Co Ky, will be important as the party were at his house and shot and wounded him about an hour before they murdered Heale.

William Heale son of Thos Heale - deceased, was present when his father was killed, lives in Hancock Co Ky. - Geo. W. Bonner of same Co. -

I am ^{also} credibly informed that Jo Carter, the foremost and most bloodthirsty of the party that killed Heale is living near Whitesville Davis Co. Ky. joining Hancock Co.

Col. Johnson who is in command of a detachment at Samburg in said Co. is now in the city -

In relation to the murder of Heale, the lapse of time renders the recollection of some quite indistinct and many are afraid to have it known that they will give any information about the transaction.

The Co. at present, is wholly under the control of the rebels, I have elicited the above facts through much care and exertion.

Dear Sir my self & my son Edwin Miller have just received notice to appear before a military commission in the City of Louisville forthwith to give evidence in the case of the United States vs Harve Wells, and I do hope that your Honor will not for a moment believe that we treat your order with contempt when I honestly state to you ^{the reasons} of our non attendance as relates to my self I am too old and infirm to leave home being all most 78 years of age and I am afflicted with a distressing cough which makes it necessary for me to keep close to my room in inclement weather

my affidavit was once taken in regard to Wells case and I suppose it is among some of the papers in the military department in Louisville & if that is found you will have all the material fact that I know about wells with regard to my son he knows nothing that could have any influence in wells case he not having recognized Wells when he was at my ^{house} ~~with~~ with a party of guerrillas which arrested me and pursued me and he informs ^{me} that he has not seen Wells at any time since.

my recollection is that it was on the 4th April 1863 that these soldiers were at my house and on the next morning we heard of the murder of Thomas Hale

of Hancock County perpetrated by the same party
that Wells was with on the day before
When those fellows left my House they went to a Stone
some 600 yards from my House the owner of which
is named Lewis J. Bannion ^{of Law} Wells put on a new
coat in the Stone and wore it off Bannion told
me he sold such coats at \$18.00 Wells said nothing
about price or pay he also rode off a fine Bay
Horse the property of Bannion (I should have said
I followed them to the Stone for such was the fact)
I have now told you in a desultory manner
I believe all that I know in Wells' case
all of which I respectfully submit for your
consideration

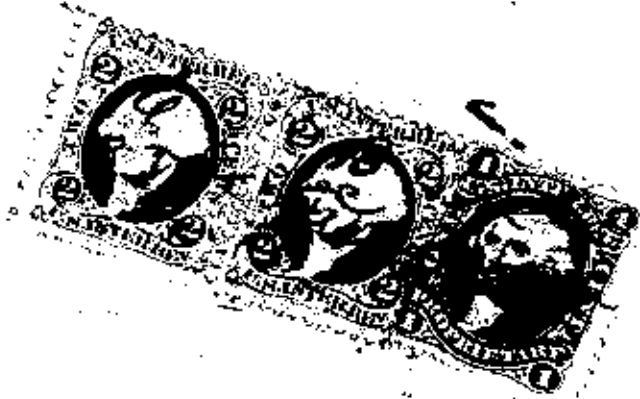

Mrs Rebecca Walters states that on or about the 18th day of Jan'y 1865 a party of men came to her house about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Hodgenville on the Shepherdsville Road she does not know who they were but they were reported and generally believed to be Capt. Lovell and his men. Some four or five of them came into affiant's house, and asked who lived there. Affiant replied Walters - the widow Walters - some one of them said interrogatively - Polk's mother? affiant said yes - they then ~~said~~ asked where the \$300 was that Polk left there - ^{found} asked them when Polk was they answered at Hodgenville. Affiant asked what they were going to do with him, they said they wanted this \$300 to give Polk part of it, ^{and let him go -} and if affiant did not give it to them they would burn her house. Affiant told them Polk had left no money there; they then went to searching and found $\$9.\frac{00}{100}$ all the money affiant had. ^{she} said they would burn the house if they did not get the \$300 affiant told them they would have to burn for there was no ^{more} money there, they had got all she had. They then commenced a search of drawers trunks and boxes and went up stairs and took a pair of her son Jacob's pants, a saddle blanket a pair of stockings a pair of spurs & some other little articles; they went out and left first taking a valuable mare & saddle ^{blanket} from her nephew Robt. W. Marshall. This was about 8 or 9 days after the arrest of Polk

Watters in Hodgenville and ^{she says} that he

had sold it. He asked him what he had done
with that smaller sized Celts pistol, he replied that
he had sold it too; the Captain then ordered his men
to search him; they found a silver driver and a
pocket book and took the money out of the pocket
book and gave the book back to him. Middleton
had previously told affiant he had \$21.75 cts in
his pocket book and affiant supposed they
took about that much from him. Capt Jewell then
told him if he would get the pistols & bring them
back to the house where they were by 3 o'clock
next day he would let him go; he told him
that if he could find them he would do so. That he
had handed ^{over} them to Cipel down on Youngs creek.
Jewell then said he could go ^{if he would get the pistols home then} ~~then~~ & could say and
that his life was at stake then told him to get
upon the wagon; he got up and we drove off

I have the honor to transmit herewith the proceedings of a Military Commission which convened at Columbus Ky., pursuant to orders from these Head Quarters, and of which Colonel Wm F. Shaw, 14th Iowa Inf. Vols., is President, in the cases of the following named persons, to wit:

John W. Richardson, Captain in the
Confederate Army

R. H. Mayo, Captain in the Confederate Army

These parties are found guilty of a serious violation of the Laws and Usages of war, and their cases come within the terms of General Order No. 50 from Head Quarters Department of the Tennessee, Major General Grant commanding, which directs "the most rigorous penalties" to be inflicted in such cases.

I am of opinion that these cases should be promptly and severely punished, - the sentence imposed by the Commission being confirmed by the Commanding General in the field - and I have been instructed by my immediate superior officers to act in such cases. - But as I do not desire to take any action in these and similar cases in which I will not be sustained by the General-in-Chief, I have approved the proceedings in the cases mentioned, and respectfully forward them to your office for final action.

the Laws and Usages of War -

All regularly organized bodies of the enemy having been driven from those parts of Kentucky and Tennessee west of the Tennessee River; and from all of Mississippi, west of the Mississippi Central Railroads; and it being to the interest of those districts not to invite the presence of armed bodies of men among them it is announced that the most rigorous penalties will hereafter be inflicted upon the following classes of persons to wit: All irregular bodies of Cavalry not mustered and paid by the Confederate Authorities; all persons engaged in Conscripting, enforcing the Conscriptum, or in apprehending deserters, whether regular or irregular all citizens encouraging or aiding the same; and all persons detected in firing upon unarmed transports

It is not contemplated that this order shall
effect the treatment due to prisoners of war,
captured within the districts named where
they are members of legally organized com-
panies, and where their acts are in accord-
ance with the usages of civilized warfare,

Capt Goodwin has shown me your letter touching the release of citizen prisoners from the Military Prison here, by my order; It seems that some two or three of these prisoners were improperly discharged, having been placed there by orders from Dept. Hd. Qrs. It was not intended to release any prisoner, against whom there were serious charges, nor any who were placed in Prison, by order of Dept. Hd. Qrs. Capt Elkin was instructed to this effect, and I am sure he endeavored to carry out faithfully these instructions. It was understood and is fact is generally true, that Capt Goodwin exercised no control over citizen prisoners confined in this Prison, hence Capt Elkin thought it unnecessary to consult him on the subject; yet he was advised by me

to do so. He was directed to use every precaution, and he did call on Col. Spalding, and look at the records of his office, & inquired of the prison keeper, as to the nature of the charges against each prisoner - He assured me there was nothing any where to be found, indicating that Bradman & Pugh, or any of the rest should not have been discharged - He discharged twenty eight who were suffering intensely, and some deaths of them I really believe were not guilty of the slightest offence, having been by inadvertence, or other misconduct arrested; Old men over seventy years of age, & several women were confined without charges, & for months. If the authorities had not utterly lost sight of them, there seemed at least no hope of investigation of their cases - One woman, whose husband was a Federal Soldier, was arrested & taken from a sucking babe, & placed in prison, & found by Capt. Elkin, with the milk running from her breasts, her offence being that Quirrees had stoped at her residence, against her will, as she insisted, & forced her to cook for them - A neighboring woman, who happened to be present, was also arrested and imprisoned

ed. with her. The arrest was made by Genl Gillum's
troops, & ordered the women to be tried at once
by the military commission, & Genl Gillum was
informed of the fact, but no charges were pre-
sented. Many other of these cases was as hard
as this.

No protest from Capt Goodwin was
necessary to prevent the discharge of any
prisoner information from any source, that
one had been confined there, by orders from Dpat,
Ad Lt, to be detained until further order, had
been amply sufficient to prevent his discharge.
The error was inadvertent, & such as would
not be likely to occur again. It was thought
the necessary means to guard against it had
been adopted.

Col. I am in communication of the 31st ult. making inquiry as to whether the prisoners released by Major Genl. Rowan was within my knowledge & was this day rec^d -

I beg leave to respectfully reply that the transactions with the prisoners above spoken of was entirely unknown to me until the whole matter had transpired. and I received the report of disposition which I forwarded you without delay.

I was informed by the Fort Prov. Marshal. Lt. Col. Spalding that an order to send all citizen prisoners to Dept. Lt. Col. had been directed to him. (Which is special order No. 23 in the report forwarded) I told Lt. Col. Spalding that the prisoners placed in confinement by command of Major Genl.

Thomas, could not be released excepting
through orders from the same source.
And that I had no power to issue such
orders without specific direction: that
the men who were placed in prison
by such orders were those against
whom various complaints had been
made and at least in one case a
person was on special duty in search
of evidence.

This was all I could do and I
supposed it was enough, but the report
you then of above thoughts were different.

The report you desire, of names
of those confined by command of Major
Smit Thomas will be forwarded you
in a few days, as soon as it can
possibly be made out.

I am satisfied that the action
taken was without the specific consent
of Major Smit Thomas and that he
would not have permitted it had
he had previous knowledge of the

to approach your Excellency with this
Petition whose contents demand nothing
but Justice at the hands of our authorities.
In No. 4 Cotton Press Prison, 3^d District, is
with the Confederate Prisoners placed a man
who never bore arms against the United States
and who never did in any way contrary
to the laws of our country.

G. W. Sisare, Prisoner of war at said Press,
was a resident of the town of Blinton
La, lived there until February 1864, at
which time he came into Federal lines,
went to Port Hudson, reporting himself
to the Col. of the 110th Ill. Cavalry and was
sent by him to New Orleans, not a prisoner
of war, but a refugee from Rebel lines,
seeking protection within limits of the Federal.
Several times I have been at Col. Kilborn's
Office making this very self same statement,
but was always refused, yes, Col. Kilborn
declared Sisare an "outlaw", having no
right whatever, there being no such thing
as Justice to be done to him; I might
even go to the General, move Heaven and

2)
and earth but I could not possibly release
Eisner.

To move heaven and earth I shall
leave to the superior Being, but with His help
I shall try to move your Excellency's noble
heart to that effect, that at least a Trial
may be given to oft mentioned Prisoner
who calls for the Col. of the 118th Cavalry
he being his only witness.

Exchange is near at hand, and if my
petition would not be granted, Eisner would
have the fate of so many, as to be forced into
Rebel service, so strengthening against
his own will and conscience the ruining
foes of earth's best country.

I expect of this, General, and I am
most confident, after mature considera-
tion, and after the longed for trial
you will not fail to grant what I
requested; the release of an unjust im-
prisoned man.

In answer to enquiries this day received from your Assistant I would respectfully remark that,

Col. J. N. Kingfield was paroled by me Sept. 1st 1863, by order of the Provost Marshal General, to the limits of this city, to report once each week in person.

No afterwards received from you at your Office No. 6 by Carondelet a second parole, bearing date Sept. 23rd 1863. I was never officially notified of this second parole, there is however a duplicate copy of same on file at the Provost Marshal's Office.

Sent. Col. Geo. W. Guess was paroled by Sent. J. P. Higgins to go to Texas. I was never officially notified of this parole, but have understood it was granted by order of Gen. Banks. Col. Guess,

had about the time a parole to the limits of
the City of New Orleans' and as the new parole
was granted by Lieut Higgins I presume the Lieut's
records will show the date of the Col's departure.

Lieut R. A. Orillion was sent by
Capt. Albert Stearns Provost Sheriff, to the St. James
Hospital, July 23rd 1863. Shortly after I relieved
Capt. Stearns as Prov. Sheriff (Aug. 5th 1863) I was
unofficially notified by Dr. Homans Surgeon in
charge of the St. James Hospital - that by order
of Dr. R. H. Alexander, he had paroled Lieuts
Orillion and Erwin to private residences - but
that he had not noted down the direction they went.

I was successful in finding Lieut Erwin, but
could never ascertain the 'private residence' of
Lieut Orillion. The facts in the case of
this officer were only reported to Genl. Boyer also at
a later date to Lieut Higgins. I would further
remark that I learned last week from reliable authority
that Col. J. H. Kingsfield was dangerously sick at
Livingston, La.

We The undersigned prisoners of war confined in this prison, would most respectfully solicit a parole to go home to our families and believing that you have the power of granting or refusing the same, we offer this our application for your consideration, hoping that you may decide agreeable to our wishes - We are but few in number and all belong, and were captured east of the Mississippi River, within a few miles of Baton Rouge, near our places of residence - We were all captured early in the fall and have been prisoners here through the winter. We are heartily tired of the war, and as our families require, if possible, our immediate presence and attention to provide them with the necessaries of life, we would be glad to have the privilege of returning to them at once - In case you should be so generous as to grant us the asked for parole, we all promise strictly, upon oath to adhere to each and all of its requirements - and should ~~and~~ any of us even be known to violate the same on any ^(Swear) whatever, we are perfectly

willing that you, or whatever U. S. Military Authority
are in Command at this time we so violate any
of its requirements, to be punished to the full extent
of military law, even though it be with the death.

In case you consent to grant us said
parole we will obligate ourselves, if requisite,
to report to The Provost Marshal of Baton Rouge
as often as you may deem necessary - per week
or per month - and if found in Armes, or other-
wise known to violate our parole, until we
shall have been pronounced exchanged, in
a legal manner, and by the proper authorities
of exchange, we expect no better fate than
to be dealt with to the fullest extent of law in
all such cases provided -

General:

The undersigned for himself and in behalf of Surgeon J. L. Estorge - Asst. Surg. J. D. Griffin and Asst. Surg. Thompson, in the Confederate States Army respectfully represent that the misfortunes of war have placed them in the hands of the United States Army as prisoners of war, and in consideration of the following facts occurring under my own observation and while serving with the 2nd La Cavalry, at that time occupying the town of New Iberia on the Lake, to wit:

When that place came into possession of the Confederate forces, the 2nd La Cavalry being in front captured Asst. Surg. Hubbard, his Hospital of sick and their attendants. By order of Lieut Col Blair he was allowed the full liberty of the town and country and when his patients were sufficiently recovered, they were all passed through our lines without any parole or restriction of

any kind, and therefore we trust that we
will be permitted to rejoin our commands or
if circumstances forbid this, that we be paroled
to return home, or have the parole of the city
of New Orleans.

Colonel.

We the undersigned officers U. S. A. prisoners of war, have the honor most respectfully to call your attention to the condition of the commissariat of this prison, and to beg that steps be taken to remedy the existing evils. The issue of meat is generally about two (2 oz) ounces, and most often of a quality that utterly forbids the eating - a solid slice of fat, of the consistency of lard, rancid and spoiled, or beef of the same quality. This is occasionally varied by a dish of warm water, called "soup", with a few peas or a little rice floating upon its surface. If this were the policy of the U. S. Govt or its design so to sustain prisoners, we should not complain. We only ask to be treated as soldiers and officers, and are content to bear unarmouringly the fate of war. But we are assured, and for proof of same would refer to the officers of the 77 Illinois Regt, that the Govt allows us the same rations as its own soldiers (with the solitary exception of coffee and sugar) and that in no single day have we ever rec'd them in full. The case is even harder with the private soldiers many of whom are absolutely suffering under the pangs of hunger. In some instances officers and men have been authorized to procure a little coffee, when pronounced necessary for their health by the Surgeon. That even is now denied them by a "peremptory" order

from Lieut Wood, forbidding any more coffee to be made in the
cook-shop, unless by his permission - which is tantamount
to a total prohibition - He exercises the same control over little
delicacies that are sent for the sick, and the result is but
little of the kind ever leaves his quarters -

The authorities are
kind enough to permit the sale of fruit &c to the prisoners -
and this helps greatly in the absence of food; in fact some
live entirely upon apples, oranges, peccans etc. But would
it not be more considerate to allow the sale of something
substantial and wholesome? Our irregular hours of drawing
rations sometimes at 8 Am, sometimes at 11 Am compel
many to consume many quantities of this trash, and the
result cannot fail ultimately to fill up the hospitals.

We have every confidence in your sense of justice

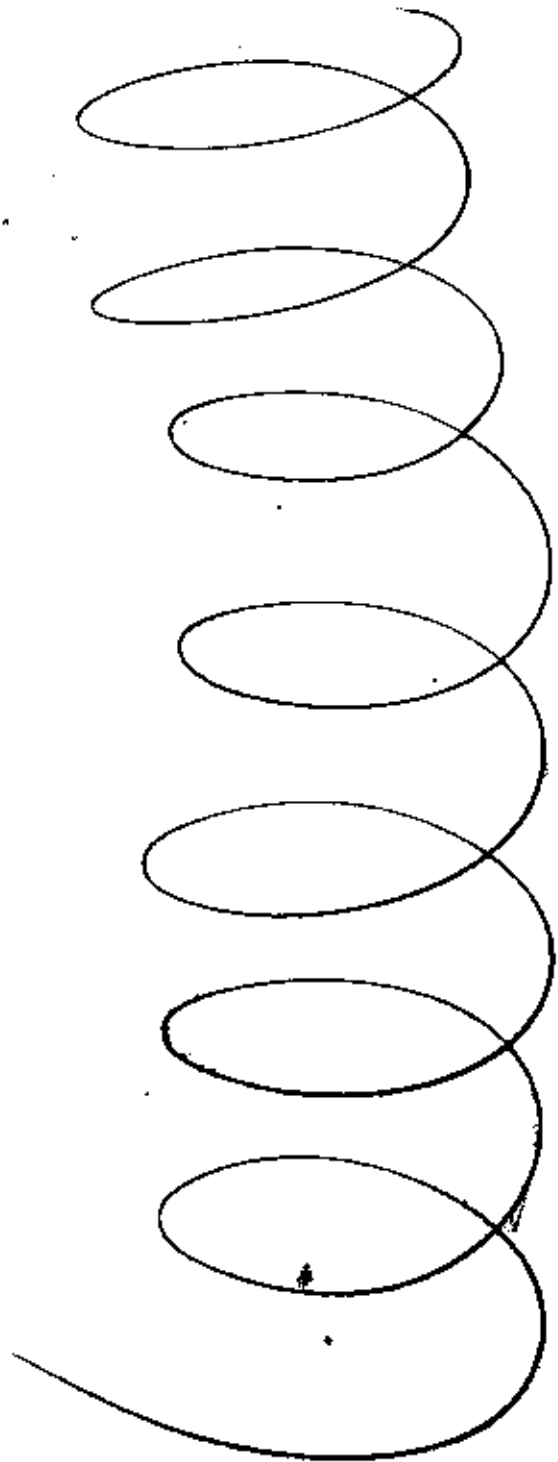

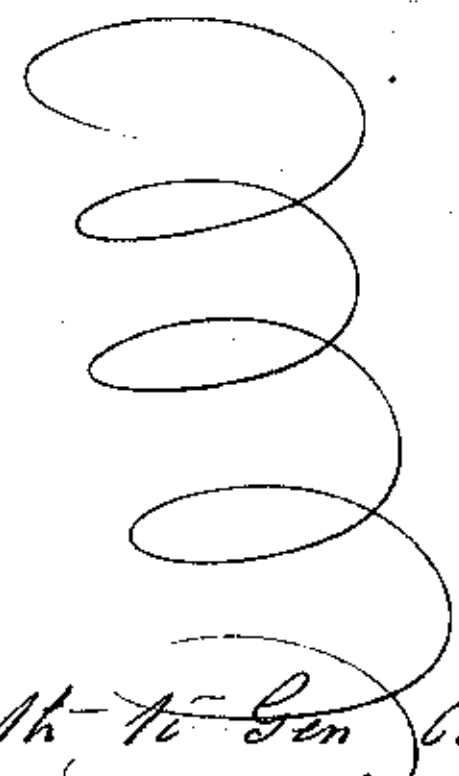
