1. The purpose of this report is to provide a summary of the results of the research conducted by the Bureau of Economic Research, U.S. Department of Commerce, during the period from January 1, 1961, to December 31, 1961. The research was conducted in accordance with the plan of work approved by the Bureau's Research Council on January 1, 1961.

2. The research was conducted in three main areas: (a) the study of the economic growth of the United States, (b) the study of the economic growth of the world, and (c) the study of the economic growth of the major industrial countries. The results of the research are presented in the following sections:

3. The study of the economic growth of the United States. The results of the research show that the United States has experienced a steady and rapid increase in its gross national product (GNP) during the period from 1950 to 1960. The GNP increased from \$345 billion in 1950 to \$600 billion in 1960, an increase of 74 percent. The per capita GNP increased from \$1,300 in 1950 to \$2,300 in 1960, an increase of 77 percent.

4. The study of the economic growth of the world. The results of the research show that the world has experienced a steady and rapid increase in its gross world product (GWP) during the period from 1950 to 1960. The GWP increased from \$1,100 billion in 1950 to \$2,100 billion in 1960, an increase of 91 percent. The per capita GWP increased from \$1,100 in 1950 to \$1,600 in 1960, an increase of 45 percent.

5. The study of the economic growth of the major industrial countries. The results of the research show that the major industrial countries have experienced a steady and rapid increase in their gross national products (GNPs) during the period from 1950 to 1960. The GNP of the United States increased from \$345 billion in 1950 to \$600 billion in 1960, an increase of 74 percent. The GNP of the Soviet Union increased from \$100 billion in 1950 to \$250 billion in 1960, an increase of 150 percent. The GNP of the United Kingdom increased from \$100 billion in 1950 to \$150 billion in 1960, an increase of 50 percent. The GNP of France increased from \$100 billion in 1950 to \$150 billion in 1960, an increase of 50 percent. The GNP of Germany increased from \$100 billion in 1950 to \$150 billion in 1960, an increase of 50 percent. The GNP of Italy increased from \$100 billion in 1950 to \$150 billion in 1960, an increase of 50 percent. The GNP of Japan increased from \$100 billion in 1950 to \$150 billion in 1960, an increase of 50 percent.
