N. B.—Every item of information should be carefully supplied. AGE should be stated EXACTLY. PHYSICIANS should state CAUSE OF DEATH in plain terms, so that it may be properly classified. Exact statement of OCCUPATION is very important.

The first part of the paper discusses the general theory of the firm, focusing on the role of the entrepreneur and the importance of capital structure. It examines how the entrepreneur's personal characteristics and the firm's financial structure influence its performance and growth. The second part of the paper presents empirical evidence on the relationship between capital structure and firm performance, using data from a large sample of firms. The paper concludes by discussing the implications of these findings for policy and practice.
