he agency is also required to make a brief summary of the general nature and extent of comments submitted in support of or opposition to the proposed rule and a concise summary of the testimony presented at the hearing, if any, held in connection with the rulemaking, together with a concise summary of the agency's findings with respect to the merits of any such testimony or comments which are opposed in whole or in part to the proposed rule. The ninety-(90-) day period during which an agency shall file its order of rulemaking for publication in the Missouri Register begins either: 1) after the hearing on the proposed rulemaking is held; or 2) at the end of the time for submission of comments to the agency. During this period, the agency shall file with the secretary of state the order of rulemaking, either putting the proposed rule into effect, with or without further changes, or withdrawing the proposed rule.

By the authority vested in the State Milk Board under section 196.939, RSMo 2016, the board amends a rule as follows:

2 CSR 80-5.010 Inspection Fees is amended.

No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: No comments were received.

Title 3—DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION Division 10—Conservation Commission Chapter 7—Wildlife Code: Hunting: Seasons, Methods, Limits

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Conservation Commission under sections 40 and 45 of Art. IV, Mo. Const., the commission amends a rule as follows:

3 CSR 10-7.440 amended.

This rule establishes hunting seasons and limits and is exempted by

section 536.021, RSMo 2016, from the requirement for filing as a proposed amendment.

The Department of Conservation amended 3 CSR 10-7.440 by establishing seasons and limits for hunting migratory game birds and waterfowl during the 2021-2022 seasons.

3 CSR 10-7.440 Migratory Game Birds and Waterfowl: Seasons, Limits

(3) Seasons and limits are as follows:

(G) During years when the federal framework prescribes a sixty-(60) day duck season, the North Zone season will open on the Saturday nearest October 31, the Middle Zone season will open on the first Saturday in November for nine (9) days, close for five (5) days, and then re-open for fifty-one (51) days, the South Zone season will open on Thanksgiving Day for four (4) days, close through December 6, and then reopen December 7 through January 31 (as late as the federal framework allows). During years when the federal framework prescribes a forty-five- (45-) day duck season or thirty-(30-) day duck season, no season date formula will be used. A person possessing the appropriate state and federal permits may take ducks in accordance to the season lengths, bag limits, and species-specific opening and closing dates established annually by the Conservation Commission.

SUMMARY OF PUBLIC COMMENTS: Seasons and limits are exempted from the requirement of filing as a proposed amendment under section 536.021, RSMo 2016.

This amendment was filed August 27, 2021, becomes effective September 6, 2021.

Title 10—DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES Division 10—Air Conservation Commission Chapter 6—Air Quality Standards, Definitions, Sampling and Reference Methods and Air Pollution Control Regulations for the Entire State of Missouri

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on April 15, 2021 (46 MoReg 691-696). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Missouri Department of Natural Resources' Air Pollution Control Program received no comments on the proposed amendment.

Title 11—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY Division 85—Veterans Affairs Chapter 1—Veterans Affairs

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Missouri Veterans Commission under

11 CSR 85-1.060 The Missouri Veterans Health and Care Fund and Program is adopted.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on July 1, 2021 (46 MoReg 1067-1068). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rule, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: No comments were received.

Title 13—DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES Division 70—MO HealthNet Division Chapter 94—Rural Health Clinic Program

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, under sections 208.201 and 660.017, RSMo 2016, the division amends a rule as follows:

13 CSR 70-94.020 is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on May 17, 2021 (46 MoReg 863-869). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division (MHD) received four (4) comments regarding the proposed amendment.

COMMENT #1: Timothy Wolters, Citizens Memorial Hospital District commented that the removal of the federal reimbursement allowance (FRA) from reimbursable costs for the Medicaid PBRHC cost report settlement is a significant change. A change of this magnitude should not be implemented retroactively. The final rule should be modified to be effective for cost reporting periods that begin after the date the final rule is published in the *Missouri Register*.

RESPONSE: The MHD appreciates Mr. Wolter's comment but will not be making the suggested change. This amendment was discussed and agreed upon during the September 2, 2020 meeting between MHD, the Missouri Hospital Association (MHA), and several hospitals.

COMMENT #2: Kim Duggan, Missouri Hospital Association commented that the removal of the FRA from reimbursable costs for Medicaid provider-based rural health clinics would penalize hospitals retroactively with significant reimbursement cuts. Cuts of this magnitude can lead to adjustments in operations and even elimination of staff positions.

RESPONSE: The MHD appreciates Ms. Duggan's comment but will not be making the suggested change. This amendment was discussed and agreed upon during the September 2, 2020 meeting between MHD, MHA, and several hospitals.

COMMENT #3: Christina Jenks, MO HealthNet Division commented that a new subsection (1)(C) needs to be added to clarify language regarding the payment procedure.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The MHD has added subsection (1)(C) to add clarifying payment procedure language.

COMMENT #4: Christina Jenks, MO HealthNet Division commented that a change needs to be made to subparagraph (7)(A)2.A. to add clarifying language regarding the payment procedure.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The MHD has updated subparagraph (7)(A)2.A. to add clarifying payment procedure language. This revised language does not affect the fiscal impact of this amendment.

13 CSR 70-94.020 Provider-Based Rural Health Clinic

(1) General Principles.

(C) The Medicaid charges used to determine the cost, and the payments used to determine the final settlement, will be the charges and payments extracted from the Medicaid paid claims history for reimbursable services paid on a percentage basis.

(7) Final Settlement Calculations.

(A) For cost reports with a FY ending in 2021 and forward, the final settlement is calculated as follows:

1. The audited Medicaid cost report that includes each PBRHC's fiscal year shall be used to calculate the final settlement, in order that the PBRHC's net reimbursement shall equal reasonable costs as described in this section;

2. Fee-for-Service Section.

A. The division takes the PBRHC's allowable Medicaid charges from services paid on a percentage basis multiplied by the PBRHC's cost-to-charge ratio to determine the PBRHC's cost. From this cost, the PBRHC claims payments are subtracted. The difference is either an overpayment or an underpayment;

3. Managed Care Section.

A. The division uses the PBRHC Form from the Medicaid Supplemental Packet, which is filed with the hospital cost report, and associated detail for the PBRHC facility to determine charges. These charges are multiplied by the PBRHC's cost-to-charge ratio to determine the PBRHC's cost. From this cost, the PBRHC payments associated with above charges are subtracted. If applicable then subtract any interim payments paid prior to the final settlement. The difference is either an overpayment or an underpayment; and

4. Final Settlement Amount.

A. The division adds together the overpayment or underpayment from the FFS Section and the Managed Care Section and then subtracts any advanced settlement payments, if applicable, to come up with a total overpayment or underpayment which will be the final settlement amount.

STATEMENT OF ACTUAL COST

5 CSR 20-100.230 Virtual Instruction Program

The original estimated public cost for this proposed amendment was published in the Missouri Register on February 15, 2019 (44 MoReg 678-679). The public cost stated in the proposed amendment was less than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate. A public fiscal note that contradicted the public cost statement was filed with the proposed amendment but it was inadvertently not published with the proposed amendment. The public cost noted in that fiscal note was eight hundred seventy-two thousand dollars (\$872,000). The cost to state agencies and political subdivisions (school districts and charter schools) has exceeded the cost estimate by more than ten percent (10%). Therefore, pursuant to section 536.200.3, RSMo 2016, it is necessary to publish the cost estimate together with the actual cost for the first full fiscal year. The estimated cost was eight hundred seventy-two thousand dollars (\$872,000) and, at the end of the first full fiscal year, the actual cost to state agencies and political subdivisions was thirteen million six hundred fifty-one thousand six hundred seventy-three dollars (\$13,651,673). The difference between the estimate and the actual cost was due primarily to a significantly greater number of virtual courses taken during the COVID-19 pandemic. The original estimate was for two thousand (2,000) students, each taking one (1) course. Actual course enrollment data indicates that four thousand three hundred twenty-one (4,321) students enrolled in twenty-seven thousand two hundred fifty-six courses (27,256). The actual cost per course was within two point four percent (2.4%) of the estimate.
