Each department of state government is assigned a title. Each agency or division in the department is assigned a division number. The agency then groups its rules into general subject matter areas called chapters and specific areas called rules. Within a rule, the first breakdown is called a section and is designated as (1). Subsection is (A) with further breakdown into paragraphs 1., subparagraphs A., parts (I), subparts (a), items I. and subitems a.

The rule is properly cited by using the full citation; for example, 3 CSR 10-4.115, NOT Rule 10-4.115.

Citations of RSMo are to the *Missouri Revised Statutes* as of the date indicated.

**R**ules appearing under this heading are filed under the authority granted by section 536.025, RSMo. An emergency rule may be adopted by an agency if the agency finds that an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare, or a compelling governmental interest requires emergency action; follows procedures best calculated to assure fairness to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances; follows procedures which comply with the protections extended by the Missouri and the United States Constitutions; limits the scope of such rule to the circumstances creating an emergency and requiring emergency procedure, and at the time of or prior to the adoption of such rule files with the secretary of state the text of the rule together with the specific facts, reasons, and findings which support its conclusion that there is an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare which can be met only through the adoption of such rule and its reasons for concluding that the procedure employed is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances.

**R**ules filed as emergency rules may be effective not less than ten (10) business days after filing or at such later date as may be specified in the rule and may be terminated at any time by the state agency by filing an order with the secretary of state fixing the date of such termination, which order shall be published by the secretary of state in the Missouri Register as soon as practicable.

**A**ll emergency rules must state the period during which they are in effect, and in no case can they be in effect more than one hundred eighty (180) calendar days or thirty (30) legislative days, whichever period is longer. Emergency rules are not renewable, although an agency may at any time adopt an identical rule under the normal rulemaking procedures.

how their programs are equal to FSIS regulations to ensure their rules are "at least equal to" USDA/FSIS and in compliance with federal regulations. Therefore, an amendment to clarify the most current federal meat and poultry inspection regulations are being incorporated by reference and provide enforcement authority in Missouri. This regulation applies to approximately fifty (50) state inspected meat and poultry establishments and three hundred ninety-one (391) custom exempt plants in Missouri, which as a whole, produces millions of dollars in Missouri's economy. This emergency amendment protects the public health, safety, and/or welfare under a compelling governmental interest, which requires this emergency action. ### EMERGENCY AMENDMENT

**2 CSR 30-10.010 Inspection of Meat and Poultry.** The department is amending section (2).

**PURPOSE:** This amendment ensures that the current rule language clearly includes the most recent publication of Part 300 to end of Title 9, **Code of Federal Regulations**, for the Missouri Meat and Poultry Inspection Program to be in compliance with federal regulations and maintain "equal to" status as determined by the United States Department of Agriculture/Food Safety and Inspection Service.

**EMERGENCY STATEMENT:** This emergency amendment is necessary to serve the compelling governmental interest to inform state agencies and the public of the most current adoption of Title 9 **Code of Federal Regulations** Parts 300 to end is incorporated into state regulation. The State Meat and Poultry Inspection (MPI) programs are required to operate in a manner and with authorities that are "at least equal to" the antemortem and postmortem inspection, re-inspection, sanitation, recordkeeping, and enforcement provisions as provided for in the Federal Meat Inspection Act and the Poultry Products Inspection Act. State MPI programs must stay current with and be able to explain

## TITLE 13 – DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES Division 70 – MO HealthNet Division Chapter 15 – Hospital Program EMERGENCY AMENDMENT

**13 CSR 70-15.070 Inpatient Psychiatric Services for Individuals Under Age Twenty-One.** The division is amending sections (1), (2), and (4).

**PURPOSE:** The amendment removes language that is more stringent than the federal regulation with regards to the Certification of Need requirement. Accreditation language was also added to section (1)(C) to create consistency with the agencies able to provide accreditation listed in section (1)(D).

**EMERGENCY STATEMENT:** The MO HealthNet Division has determined that an emergency rule is necessary in order to swiftly

address process barriers impacting timely access to children's psychiatric services. Missouri is currently facing a children's behavioral health crisis which is evident by the prevalence of children boarding in hospitals and those receiving care out of state due to lack of accessible and appropriate care options in Missouri. This proposed emergency amendment seeks to remove language creating process barriers impacting timely admissions into Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF) settings by broadening who may provide the Certification of Need (CON) required for PRTF admission and creates a provision allowing for an emergent admissions process which will further reduce process delays in critical situations. Since the initial implementation of private PRTF settings in Missouri, September 2021, MO HealthNet has continued to engage collaboratively with stakeholders, providers, hospitals, and other state partners regarding the need to improve access to care settings that have the ability to divert children away from emergency departments and those positioned to provide quality step down services. This proposed emergency amendment not only broadens who may complete the Certification of Need (CON) required for admission into PRTF settings but also relaxes language which has been interpreted as more stringent than what current Federal Rule requires. As a result, the MO HealthNet Division finds a compelling governmental interest, which requires this emergency action. A proposed amendment which covers the same material, is published in this issue of the **Missouri Register**. The scope of this emergency amendment is limited to the circumstances creating the emergency and complies with the protections extended in the **Missouri and United States Constitutions**. The MO HealthNet Division believes this emergency amendment is fair to all interested persons and parties under the circumstances. This emergency amendment was filed December 16, 2025, will become December 31, 2025, and expires June 28, 2026.

(1) Pursuant to provisions of section 208.161, RSMo, MO HealthNet coverage will be afforded to eligible individuals under age twenty-one (21) for inpatient psychiatric services provided under the following conditions:

(C) In a psychiatric residential treatment facility (PRTF) that is operated as a public institution by the Missouri Department of Mental Health (DMH) and is exempt from the hospital licensing law, that is accredited by the Joint Commission, **the Council on Accreditation, The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, Det Norske Veritas (DNV) or equivalent organization**, and is certified as complying with the requirements at 42 CFR 441 subpart D and the condition of participation at 42 CFR 483 subpart G by the designated state agency for which such authority has been authorized; or

(2) Reimbursement for inpatient psychiatric services, as provided for in this rule, shall be made as follows:

(C) For private PRTF services for individuals under the age of twenty-one (21), reimbursement will be calculated as follows:

1. Effective for dates of service on or after September 29, 2021, the division will reimburse private PRTFs on a prospective per diem rate. The prospective Missouri private PRTF per diem rate was created using a wage rate model which utilized data derived from cost surveys prepared and submitted by potential PRTF providers. These cost surveys were collected February 2021 or prior. The model specifically examines potential facility, occupancy, staff to patient ratios, necessary nursing hours per patient day, direct care and behavioral health professional wage and overhead expense, and risk factors. The Missouri Prospective PRTF Rate Methodology document is incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, 615 Howerton Court, Jefferson City, MO 65109, on its website at <https://dss.mo.gov/mhd/cs/psych/pdf/mo-prtf-wage-rate-buildmodel.pdf>, October 1, 2021. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions. The per diem rate is included in the MO HealthNet Division (MHD) fee schedule, which is incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, 615 Howerton Court, Jefferson City, MO 65109, [on its website at <https://dss.mo.gov/mhd/providers/pages/cptagree.htm>,] August 13, 2021. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions; and

(4) The certifications of need for care shall be made by different teams depending on the status of the individual patients as follows:

(A) For an individual who is receiving Medicaid at the time of admission, the certification of need shall be made by an independent team of health professionals [at the time of admission. A team member cannot be employed by the admitting hospital or PRTF or be receiving payment as a consultant on a regular and frequent basis. The team must include a licensed physician who has competence in diagnosis and treatment of behavioral health disorders, preferably in child psychiatry, and has knowledge of the patient's situation and one (1) other behavioral health professional who is licensed;] that:

1. Includes a physician;
2. Has competence in diagnosis and treatment of mental illness, preferably in child psychiatry;
3. Has knowledge of the individual's situation.

(C) For an individual who undergoes an emergency admission, the certification of need shall be made by the treatment facility interdisciplinary team responsible for the individual's plan of care as specified in section (5) within fourteen (14) days after admission.

[1. All admissions to PRTFs shall be considered non-emergent. The certification of need shall be performed by an independent review team.]

EXECUTIVE ORDER  
25-38

WHEREAS, severe storm systems impacted the State of Missouri starting on March 14, 2025, resulting in damages associated with tornadoes, straight line winds, large hail, fires, heavy rains, flooding, flash flooding, and riverine flooding, resulting in loss of life as well as damage to homes, businesses, public infrastructure, and electrical transmission lines across the state; and

WHEREAS, a State of Emergency was declared on March 14, 2025, pursuant to Executive Order 25-19; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Natural Resources was temporarily granted authority to waive statutory and administrative rules or regulations to serve the interests of public safety during the period of the Emergency, pursuant to Executive Order 25-20; and

WHEREAS, Executive Orders 25-19 and 25-20 were extended by Executive Order 25-22; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-22 was extended by Executive Order 25-23; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-23 was extended by Executive Order 25-27; and

WHEREAS, portions of Executive Order 25-27 were extended by Executive Order 25-28; which will expire on October 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-28 was extended by Executive Order 25-31; and

WHEREAS, the impacts from these severe storm systems continue to cause ongoing conditions of distress and hazard to the safety, welfare, and property of the citizens of Missouri beyond the capabilities of local jurisdictions and other established agencies; and

WHEREAS, the State of Missouri will continue to be proactive where the health and safety of the citizens of Missouri are concerned; and

WHEREAS, the resources of the State of Missouri have been needed and will continue to be needed to assist affected jurisdictions and to help relieve the condition of distress and hazard to the safety and welfare of our fellow Missourians; and

WHEREAS, continuation of the provisions of sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, is required to ensure the protection of the safety and welfare of the people of Missouri.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE KEHOE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Missouri, including Chapter 44 RSMo, do hereby extend Executive Order 25-31:

This Order shall terminate on January 31, 2026, unless extended in whole or in part.

**T**he text of proposed rules and changes will appear under this heading. A notice of proposed rulemaking is required to contain an explanation of any new rule or any change in an existing rule and the reasons therefor. This explanation is set out in the PURPOSE section of each rule. A citation of the legal authority to make rules is also required, and appears following the text of the rule, after the word "Authority."

**E**ntirely new rules are printed without any special symbology under the heading of proposed rule. If an existing rule is to be amended or rescinded, it will have a heading of proposed amendment or proposed rescission. Rules that are proposed to be amended will have new matter printed in boldface type and matter to be deleted placed in brackets.

**A**n important function of the *Missouri Register* is to solicit and encourage public participation in the rulemaking process. The law provides that for every proposed rule, amendment, or rescission there must be a notice that anyone may comment on the proposed action. This comment may take different forms.

**I**f an agency is required by statute to hold a public hearing before making any new rules, then a Notice of Public Hearing will appear following the text of the rule. Hearing dates must be at least thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*. If no hearing is planned or required, the agency must give a Notice to Submit Comments. This allows anyone to file statements in support of or in opposition to the proposed action with the agency within a specified time, no less than thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*.

**A**n agency may hold a public hearing on a rule even though not required by law to hold one. If an agency allows comments to be received following the hearing date, the close-of-comments date will be used as the beginning day in the ninety- (90-) day count necessary for the filing of the order of rulemaking.

**I**f an agency decides to hold a public hearing after planning not to, it must withdraw the earlier notice, file a new notice of proposed rulemaking, and schedule a hearing for a date not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of the new notice.

**Division 30 – State Tax Commission**  
**Chapter 4 – Agricultural Land Productive Values**

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT**

**12 CSR 30-4.010 Agricultural Land Productive Values.** The commission is posting the entire rule.

**PURPOSE:** This amendment complies with the requirement of section 137.021, RSMo, to publish a range of productive values for agricultural and horticultural land for the ensuing tax year.

(1) Agricultural Land Grades and Values. The following are definitions of agricultural land grades and the productive values of each:

(A) Grade #1. This is prime agricultural land. Condition of soils is highly favorable with no limitations that restrict their use. Soils are deep, nearly level (zero to two percent (0-2%) slope) or gently sloping with low erosion hazard and not subject to damaging overflow. Soils that are consistently wet and poorly drained are not placed in Grade #1. They are easily worked and produce dependable crop yields with ordinary management practices to maintain productivity – both soil fertility and soil structure. They are adapted to a wide variety of crops and suited for intensive cropping. Use value: one thousand thirty-five dollars (\$1,035);

(B) Grade #2. These soils are less desirable in one (1) or more respects than Grade #1 and require careful soil management, including some conservation practices on upland to prevent deterioration. This grade has a wide range of soils and minimum slopes (mostly zero to five percent (0-5%)) that result in less choice of either crops or management practices. Primarily bottomland and best upland soils. Limitations –

1. Low to moderate susceptibility to erosion;
2. Rare damaging overflows (once in five to ten (5-10)

years); and

3. Wetness correctable by drainage. Use value: eight hundred fifty dollars (\$850);

(C) Grade #3. Soils have more restrictions than Grade #2. They require good management for best results. Conservation practices are generally more difficult to apply and maintain. Primarily good upland and some bottomland with medium productivity. Limitations –

1. Gentle slope (two to seven percent (2–7%));
2. Moderate susceptibility to erosion;
3. Occasional damaging overflow (once in three to five (3–5) years) of Grades #1 and #2 bottomland; and
4. Some bottomland soils have slow permeability, poor drainage, or both. Use value: six hundred forty-five dollars (\$645);

(D) Grade #4. Soils have moderate limitations to cropping that generally require good conservation practices. Crop rotation normally includes some small grain (for example, wheat or oats), hay, or both. Soils have moderately rolling slopes and show evidence of serious erosion. Limitations –

1. Moderate slope (four to ten percent (4–10%));
2. Grade #1 bottomland subject to frequent damaging flooding (more often than once in two (2) years), or Grades #2 and #3 bottomland subject to occasional damaging flooding (once every three to five (3–5) years);
3. Poor drainage in some cases; and
4. Shallow soils, possibly with claypan or hardpan. Use value: four hundred five dollars (\$405);

(E) Grade #5. Soils are not suited to continuous cultivation. Crop rotations contain increasing proportions of small grain (for example, wheat or oats), hay, or both. Upland soils have moderate to steep slopes and require conservation practices. Limitations –

1. Moderate to steep slopes (eight to twenty percent (8–20%));
2. Grades #2 and #3 bottomland subject to frequent damaging flooding (more than once in two (2) years) and Grade #4 bottomland subject to occasional damaging flooding; and
3. Serious drainage problems for some soils. Use value: one hundred *[and]* ninety-one dollars (\$191);

(F) Grade #6. Soils are generally unsuited for cultivation and are limited largely to pasture and sparse woodland. Limitations –

1. Moderate to steep slopes (eight to twenty percent (8–20%));
2. Severe erosion hazards present;
3. Grades #3 and #4 bottomland subject to frequent damaging flooding (more than once in two (2) years), and Grade #5 bottomland subject to occasional damaging flooding (once every three to five (3–5) years); and
4. Intensive management required for crops. Use value: one hundred *[and]* forty-seven dollars (\$147);

(G) Grade #7. These soils are generally unsuited for cultivation and may have other severe limitations for grazing and forestry that cannot be corrected. Limitations –

1. Very steep slopes (over fifteen percent (15%));
2. Severe erosion potential;
3. Grades #5 and #6 bottomland subject to frequent damaging flooding (more than once in two (2) years);
4. Intensive management required to achieve grass or timber productions; and
5. Very shallow topsoil. Use value: seventy-three dollars (\$73);

(H) Grade #8. Land capable of only limited production of plant growth. It may be extremely dry, rough, steep, stony, sandy, wet, or severely eroded. Includes rivers, running

branches, dry creek, and swamp areas. The lands do provide areas of benefit for wildlife or recreational purposes. Use value: thirty dollars (\$30); and

(I) Definitions. The following are definitions of flooding for purposes of this rule:

1. Damaging flooding. A damaging flood is one that limits or affects crop production in one (1) or more of the following ways:

- A. Erosion of the soil;
- B. Reduced yields due to plant damage caused by standing or flowing water;
- C. Reduced crop selection due to extended delays in planting and harvesting; and
- D. Soil damage caused by sand and rock being deposited on the land by flood waters;

2. Frequent damaging flooding. Flooding of bottomlands that is so frequent that normal row cropping is affected (reduces row crop selection); and

3. Occasional damaging flooding. Flooding of bottomland that is so infrequent that producing normal row crops is not compromised in most years.

(2) Forest Land and Horticultural Land. The following prescribes the treatment of forest land and horticultural land:

(A) Forest land, whose cover is predominantly trees and other woody vegetation, should not be assigned to a land classification grade based on its productivity for agricultural crops. Forest land of two (2) or more acres in area, which if cleared and used for agricultural crops, would fall into land *[g]* Grades #1–#5 should be placed in land *[g]* Grade #6; or if land would fall into land *[g]* Grades #6 or #7 should be placed in land *[g]* Grade #7. Forest land may or may not be in use for timber production, wildlife management, hunting, other outdoor recreation, or similar uses; and

(B) Land utilized for the production of horticultural crops should be assigned to a land classification grade based on productivity of the land if used for agricultural crops. Horticultural crops include fruits, ornamental trees and shrubs, flowers, vegetables, nuts, Christmas trees, and similar crops which are produced in orchards, nurseries, gardens, or cleared fields.

## Chapter 2 – General Scope of Medical Service Coverage

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT

**13 CSR 70-2.100 Title XIX Procedure of Exception to Medical Care Services Limitations.** MO HealthNet Division is amending sections (1), (2), and (3).

*PURPOSE: This amendment updates outdated terminology and document material incorporated by reference.*

(1) Under the requirements of this rule, the MO HealthNet Division (**MHD**) may approve and authorize payment for the provision to a Medicaid-eligible recipient of an essential medical service or item that would otherwise exceed the benefit limitations of the medical assistance program. An administrative exception may be made on a case-by-case basis to limitations and restrictions. The director of the [**DMS**] **MHD** will have the final authority to approve payment on a request made to the exception process. These decisions will be made with appropriate medical or pharmaceutical advice and consultation.

(2) Requirements for consideration and provision of a service as an exception to the normal limitations of Medicaid coverage are as follows:

(B) All third-party resource benefits must be exhausted before the [**Medicaid**] **MO HealthNet** program will pay for any treatment or service;

(D) Any medical, surgical, or diagnostic service requested which is provided by a physician must be listed in the most recent publication of the [*Physicians' Current Procedural Terminology*] CPT Professional Edition code book, which is incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by The American Medical Association (AMA), 330 North Wabash, Chicago, Illinois 60611, October 25, 2024. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions;

(E) Any individual for whom an exception request is made must be eligible for [**Medicaid**] **MO HealthNet** coverage on the date(s) the item or services are provided, or in the case of retroactive eligibility, approval can be granted if requested;

(F) The provider of the service must be an enrolled provider in the [**Medicaid**] **MO HealthNet** program on the date(s) the item or services are provided;

(G) The item or services for which an exception is requested must be of a type and nature which falls within the broad scope of a medical discipline included in the [**Medicaid**] **MO HealthNet** program and which does not represent a departure from the accepted standards and precepts of good medical practice;

(H) Requests must be made and approval granted before the requested item or services are provided, or not more than one (1) state working day following the provision of the service. Retroactive approval of coverage may be granted in cases in which the recipient's eligibility for [**Medicaid**] **MO HealthNet** coverage is established;

(I) All requests for exception consideration must be initiated by the attending physician, the resident, intern, extern, nurse clinician, nurse practitioner, or RN acting in the physician's behalf for an eligible recipient and must be submitted as prescribed in policy of the [**DMS**] **MHD**;

(K) All exception requests must represent cost-effective utilization of [**Medicaid**] **MHD** funds. When an exception item or service is presented as an alternative, lesser level-of-care

than the level otherwise necessary, the exception must be less program costly; and

(L) Reimbursement of services and items approved under this exception procedure shall be made in accordance with the [*Medicaid-established*] **MO HealthNet** fee schedules or rates for the same or comparable services. For those services for which no [*Medicaid-established*] **MO HealthNet** fee schedule or rate is applicable, reimbursement will be determined by the state agency considering costs and charges.

(3) Consideration under this rule shall not be applicable to requests for services under the following circumstances such as, but not limited to:—

(A) Services that would be provided by individuals whose specialty is not covered by the [*Medicaid*] **MO HealthNet** program;

(F) Waiver of [*Medicaid*] **MO HealthNet** program requirements for documentation, applicable to services requiring a second surgical opinion, voluntary sterilization, hysterectomies, or legal abortions;

(G) Failure to obtain prior authorization as required for a service otherwise covered by [*Medicaid*] **MO HealthNet**;

(I) Previous denial by the [*Medicaid state agency*] **MHD** of a request for exception consideration where the current request fails to present information of significance in overcoming the deficiency upon which the original request was denied;

(J) Requests for additional reimbursement for items or services otherwise covered by the [*Medicaid*] **MO HealthNet** program;

(K) [*Medicaid*] **MO HealthNet** waiver services; and

## TITLE 13 – DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES Division 70 – MO HealthNet Division Chapter 6 – Emergency Ambulance Program

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT

**13 CSR 70-6.020 Ground Emergency Medical Transportation Uncompensated Cost Reimbursement Program.** The MO HealthNet Division is amending sections (1) – (4).

**PURPOSE:** This amendment adds clarifying language to the Ground Emergency Medical Transportation Uncompensated Cost Reimbursement Program (GEMT) regulation for eligible ambulance providers.

(1) Scope and Definitions.

(B) Definitions.

1. Cost objective means a function or category of service for which costs are incurred.

2. Direct cost means [*in accordance with 2 CFR 200.413, direct costs are*] those costs that –

A. **Meet the direct costs definition in accordance with 2 CFR 200.413:**

[A.] (I) Can be identified specifically with a particular final cost objective, such as a federal award, or other internally or externally funded activity; or

[B.] (II) Can be directly assigned to such activities relatively easily with a high degree of accuracy[.]; and

B. **The direct costs allocated between emergency medical response (EMR) and non-emergency medical response (non-EMR) based on a statistical allocation do not meet the definition of direct costs, but are included under direct allocated costs (see definition below). Estimates are not allowed.**

3. Direct allocated costs means costs that cannot be directly assigned to EMR services or non-EMR services relatively easily with a high degree of accuracy. Examples of direct allocated costs include personnel who perform EMR and non-EMR services and overhead departments who perform EMR and non-EMR services.

4. Dry run means a run that does not result in a transport or delivery of on-site Medicaid covered services. Covered services are defined by Medicaid per 13 CSR 70-6.010.

[3.] 5. Eligible GEMT provider means a provider who is eligible to receive reconciled cost reimbursement under this program because it meets the following requirements continuously during the claiming period:

- A. Provides GEMT services to MHD participants;
- B. Is enrolled as an MHD provider for the period being claimed; and
- C. Is owned, operated, or contracted by the state or a political subdivision of the state.

[4.] 6. Emergency [M]edical [R]esponse (EMR) means a cost objective that includes all expenditures for GEMT services.

7. **Federal financial participation (FFP) means the portion of medical assistance expenditures for emergency medical services that are paid or reimbursed by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services in accordance with the state plan for medical assistance.**

[5.] 8. GEMT services means both the act of transporting an individual from any point of origin to the nearest medical facility capable of meeting the emergency medical needs of the patient, as well as the advanced, limited advanced, and basic life support services provided to an individual by eligible GEMT providers before or during the act of transportation. As of January 1, 2020, GEMT services also include advanced, limited advanced, and basic life support services provided to an individual who is released on the scene without transportation by ambulance to a medical facility. Advanced, limited-advanced, or basic life support services provided to an individual who is released on the scene without transportation by ambulance to a medical facility prior to January 1, 2020, shall not be considered GEMT services. A *dry run [that does not result in a transport or delivery of on-site advanced, limited advanced, or basic life support services]* shall not be considered

a transport for purposes of GEMT services. GEMT services exclude all air services.

[6.] 9. Indirect cost means those costs that are incurred by a supporting organization or related party which are not directly accounted for as costs for EMR services, non-EMR services or [shared] direct allocated costs. Examples of indirect costs include overhead costs (i.e., accounting, human resources, etc.) incurred by a city, county, or other local government agency or special district that benefit the eligible GEMT provider, but the eligible GEMT provider has not been charged for those costs. The identification of [shared] direct allocated costs does not preclude an eligible GEMT provider from also incurring indirect costs, and it is appropriate in certain cases for the uncompensated Medicaid costs to include both [shared] direct allocated costs and indirect costs.

[7.] 10. MHD participant means a patient enrolled in fee-for-service Missouri Medicaid.

[8.] 11. Non-Emergency [M]edical [R]esponse (non-EMR) means a cost objective that includes expenditures for non-medical emergency services, such as fire suppression not including medical services, and non-emergency ancillary services, such as fire prevention and fire permit issuance that are performed in the absence of an emergency in order to support preparedness, mitigate the need for emergency response, or lessen the severity of an emergency that might occur. **Expenditures assigned to this cost objective are not allowable for determining the cost of emergency transportation.**

[9.] 12. Reconciled cost reimbursement means a payment to eligible GEMT providers up to the uncompensated Medicaid costs associated with GEMT services for MHD participants.

[10. Shared costs means costs that cannot be directly assigned to EMR services or non-EMR services relatively easily with a high degree of accuracy. Examples of shared costs include personnel who perform EMR and non-EMR services and overhead departments who perform EMR and non-EMR services.]

[11.] 13. Shift means a standard period of time assigned for a complete cycle of work, as set by each eligible GEMT provider. The number of hours in a shift may vary among providers but will be consistent for each individual provider.

[12.] 14. Service period means July 1 through June 30 of each Missouri State fiscal year.

[13.] 15. Transport means GEMT services that are provided by eligible GEMT providers to individuals, regardless of whether the service was billed or paid. Medicaid transports includes GEMT services for Medicaid managed care, Medicaid crossover, and Medicaid fee for service patients. Other payer program transports shall be GEMT services provided to patients with payer sources other than Medicaid. Transportation services that do not involve *an emergency or which are non-medical emergencies shall not be included as Transports. GEMT services that are denied as not medically necessary shall not be included as transports*] the act of transporting an individual to the nearest medical facility capable of meeting the emergency medical needs of a patient shall not be included as transports.

[14.] 16. Uncompensated Medicaid costs means the cost of GEMT services for MHD participants that exceeds the reimbursement received from, but not limited to, Medicaid, patients, and enhanced supplemental payments received from the ambulance service reimbursement allowance under 13 CSR 70-3.200. Cost excludes Medicaid managed care and dual-eligible Medicaid [T]transports.

[15.] 17. Dual-eligible Medicaid transport means any transport where Medicaid is not the primary payor due to

other coverage including Medicare or other private insurance. These costs will not be reimbursed in the GEMT supplemental program.

(2) Participation and Enrollment Requirements.

(D) **To participate in the GEMT program, an eligible provider shall complete and execute the following forms and return them to MHD or its vendor.** An eligible GEMT provider must complete and submit to MHD the following forms, which are incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, September 22, 2021, and may be downloaded from <https://dss.mo.gov/mhd/providers/gemt.htm>, obtained by emailing a written request to Ask.GEMT@dss.mo.gov, or acquired in-person at 615 Howerton Court, Jefferson City, MO 65109. This rule does not include any subsequent amendments or additions:

1. GEMT Program Provider Agreement for the MO HealthNet Division Ground Emergency Medical Transportation (GEMT) Uncompensated Cost Reimbursement Program;
2. Electronic Funds Transfer Authorization Agreement;
3. Intergovernmental Transfer of Public Funds Agreement; and
4. Administration Fee Agreement.

(3) Interim Payments and Cost Settlement Process.

(C) MHD will audit and reconcile the as-filed cost reports within one (1) year of receipt of the as-filed cost reports, unless MHD determines that additional time is needed, not to exceed three (3) years from receipt of the as-filed cost reports. To audit and reconcile the as-filed cost reports, MHD will use paid claims data for the service period generated from the Medicaid Managed Information Systems (MMIS) and eligible GEMT provider records. MHD will make adjustments to the as-filed cost report based on the audit and reconciliation and send the provider its preliminary findings [*within sixty (60) days of initiating the audit and reconciliation process and/* after receiving all relevant data from providers. The provider will be given [*sixty (60)*] **fourteen (14)** days to respond to MHD's preliminary findings, unless an extension is granted by MHD. MHD's final audit and reconciliation decision will be issued [*within sixty (60) days after receipt of MHD's preliminary findings*]. **Cost report will be deemed final once MHD issues a final determination letter and final adjusted cost report.** If at the end of the final audit and reconciliation it is determined that the interim payment made to the eligible GEMT provider exceeded the provider's uncompensated Medicaid costs associated with GEMT services, the provider shall return the excess amount associated with the federal share to MHD and MHD will return the amount to the federal government pursuant to 42 CFR 433.316. If at the end of the final reconciliation it is determined that the interim payment made to the eligible GEMT provider was lower than the provider's uncompensated Medicaid costs associated with GEMT services, the eligible GEMT provider shall make an additional intergovernmental transfer to MHD in an amount equivalent to the nonfederal share of the underpayment, and MHD will then make an additional payment to the eligible GEMT provider of the full underpayment amount. MHD shall recoup funds paid out under section 208.1030, RSMo, and this regulation upon a disallowance of [*federal financial participation (FFP)*] for those funds. The recoupment will follow the process outlined in 13 CSR 70-3.030(6).

(E) Each provider's per-transport cost rate is determined on the CMS-approved cost reports by adding the provider's allowable direct, [*shared*] direct allocated, and indirect costs

of providing GEMT services divided by the total number of transports provided for the applicable service period.

(4) Cost Report Requirements.

(A) To receive reconciled cost reimbursement under the GEMT program, each eligible GEMT provider must submit an annual cost report to MHD. **Providers shall provide any supporting documentation to substantiate information provided on the cost report as requested by MHD or its contractor.** The cost report form and the cost report instructions are incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, 615 Howerton Court, Jefferson City, MO 65109, and available at <https://dss.mo.gov/mhd/providers/gemt.htm>, or by emailing a written request to Ask.GEMT@dss.mo.gov, September 22, 2021. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions.

(D) All costs reported must be in accordance with the following:

1. Allowable and unallowable costs.

A. Reconciled cost reimbursement is available only for allowable costs incurred for GEMT services rendered to MHD participants based on the provider's financial data reported on the cost report.

B. Computation of allowable costs and their allocation methodology must be determined in accordance with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Provider Reimbursement Manual (CMS Pub. 15-1), 2 CFR Part 200, and 42 CFR Part 413, except as expressly modified herein.

(I) Part 200 of Title 2, Code of Federal Regulations, is incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Office of the Federal Register, 800 North Capitol Street NW, Suite 700, Washington, D.C. 20408, and available at <https://dssruletracker.mo.gov/dss-proposed-rules/welcome.action>, January 1, 2021. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions.

(II) Part 413 of Title 42, Code of Federal Regulations, is incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Office of the Federal Register, 800 North Capitol Street NW, Suite 700, Washington, D.C. 20408, and available at <https://dssruletracker.mo.gov/dss-proposed-rules/welcome.action>, October 1, 2020. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions.

(III) The Provider Reimbursement Manual – Part 1 (CMS Pub. 15-1) is incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule as published by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, 7500 Security Boulevard, Baltimore, MD 21244, and available at <https://www.cms.gov/Regulations-and-Guidance/Guidance/Manuals/Paper-Based-Manuals-Items/CMS021929>, September 22, 2021. A copy is available at the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, 615 Howerton Court, Jefferson City, MO 65109. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions.

C. Costs which are considered unallowable include expenditures, such as bad debts, contributions and donations, entertainment including alcoholic beverages, fundraising costs, lobbying, legal judgments, and fines or penalties, which 2 CFR Part 200 does not permit to be charged to federal programs. If unallowable costs are not easily identifiable from allowable costs, the associated revenues received for providing the unallowable services will be offset against allowable cost. Additionally, for the purposes of Medicaid cost identification for the GEMT program, expenditures attributed to the nonemergency medical response cost objective are not costs incurred for GEMT services.

D. Amounts required to be paid pursuant to the

ambulance service reimbursement allowance (AFRA) under 13 CSR 70-3.200, excluding administrative fees and pooling fees, are allowable for GEMT services. Pooling payments received from participation in the ambulance service reimbursement allowance program shall reduce the ambulance service reimbursement allowance amount reported as allowable by the provider.

E. Administrative costs incurred for reimbursing MHD for costs associated with implementing the GEMT program must be excluded from the cost report.

F. Eligible GEMT providers routinely use contract billing service providers to assist with the administrative functions of billing and collecting on patient accounts. Payments to contract billing service providers are an allowable administrative cost. Fee arrangements based on hourly rates, fixed amounts, percentage of collection, or other methods are all considered allowable for computing uncompensated Medicaid costs, however, all payments to contract billing service providers must not exceed fair market value; and

2. Direct and ~~l~~indirect *[C]*costs.

A. All direct costs must be reasonable and necessary and must be supported by documentation from which the costs incurred by the provider can be readily discerned and verified with reasonable certainty. Such documentation shall be subject to review by MHD.

B. Eligible GEMT providers that do not provide fire services would not have *[shared]* direct allocated costs and the cost report would reflect only EMR direct costs. Eligible GEMT providers that do not provide fire services but provide training (of non-employees) or nonemergency medical transportation services (e.g., non-emergency transportation between medical facilities or patient homes) shall include the costs of such services in their EMR direct costs, but shall offset those costs by any reimbursement received for such services up to the amount of costs for such services.

C. There is no universal rule for classifying certain costs as either direct cost or *[shared]* direct allocated cost under every accounting system. A cost may be direct cost with respect to some specific service or cost objective, but *[shared]* direct allocated cost with respect to the federal award or other final cost objective. Therefore, it is essential that each item of cost incurred for the same purpose be treated consistently in like circumstances as a direct cost or a *[shared]* direct allocated cost in order to avoid possible double-charging of federal awards. For example, any cost incurred by an eligible GEMT provider which includes both costs incurred applicable to non-EMR services as well as GEMT services must in their entirety be consistently classified as direct or *[shared]* direct allocated costs.

D. Direct costs for providing GEMT services include only the unallocated payroll costs for the shifts in which personnel dedicate one hundred percent (100%) of their time to providing GEMT services, medical equipment and supplies, and other costs directly related to the delivery of GEMT services, such as first-line supervision, materials and supplies, professional and contracted services, capital outlay, travel, and training. These costs must be in compliance with federal Medicaid non-institutional reimbursement policy and are directly attributable to the provision of the GEMT services. **Directly assigned costs must be supported by auditable records, such as general ledger detail and should be assigned as part of the normal ongoing accounting process.**

E. *[Shared]* Direct allocated costs for EMR and non-EMR services shall be allocated based on a reasonable method in accordance with the guidelines in 2 CFR Part 200. **The allocation statistic should identify and exclude costs**

associated with any personnel who is not considered a licensed or certified emergency medical technician and/or did not perform Medicaid covered services at an emergency site. If the allocation statistic is not supported by a time study or other adequate documentation to demonstrate dispatched personnel were performing Medicaid covered services at the emergency site, then at a minimum, the cost associated with personnel not on the treating or transporting ambulance should be identified and removed. This would include the removal of all fire apparatus personnel dispatched to an emergency scene. The cost report shall allow the provider to use any reasonable method allowed in the Centers for Medicare *[and]* Medicaid Services (CMS) Provider Reimbursement Manual (CMS Pub. 15-1), 2 CFR Part 200, and 42 CFR Part 413, an example of reasonable methods include, among others:

- (I) Square footage allocations for capital cost;
- (II) Depreciation cost for capital cost; or
- (III) Time studies for salaries and benefits.

F. When providing allocation information, statistics from the *[shared]* direct allocated costs should not be included in the calculations for allocation between EMR and non-EMR services.

G. Pursuant to 2 CFR Part 200, indirect costs are determined in accordance to one (1) of the following options:

(I) Eligible GEMT providers that receive more than thirty-five million dollars (\$35,000,000) in direct federal awards must either have a Cost Allocation Plan (CAP) or a cognizant agency approved indirect rate agreement in place with its federal cognizant agency to identify indirect cost. If the provider does not have a CAP or an indirect rate agreement in place with its federal cognizant agency and it would like to claim indirect cost in association with a non-institutional service, it must obtain one (1) or the other before it can claim any indirect cost;

(II) Eligible GEMT providers that receive less than thirty-five million dollars (\$35,000,000) of direct federal awards are required to develop and maintain an indirect rate proposal for purposes of audit. In the absence of an indirect rate proposal, providers may use methods originating from a CAP to identify its indirect cost. If the provider does not have an indirect rate proposal on file or a CAP in place and it would like to claim indirect cost in association with a non-institutional service, it must secure one (1) or the other before it can claim any indirect cost;

(III) Eligible GEMT providers which receive no direct federal funding can use any of the following previously established methodologies to identify indirect cost:

- (a) A CAP with its local government;
- (b) An indirect rate negotiated with its local government; or
- (c) Direct identification through use of a cost report; and

(IV) If the GEMT provider never established any of the above methodologies, it may do so, or it may elect to use the ten percent (10%) *de minimis* rate to identify its indirect cost.

**13 CSR 70-15.070 Inpatient Psychiatric Services for Individuals Under Age Twenty-One.** The division is amending sections (1), (2), and (4).

**PURPOSE:** This amendment removes language that is more stringent than the federal regulation with regard to the certification of need requirement. Accreditation language was also added to subsection (1)(C) to create consistency with the agencies able to provide accreditation listed in subsection (1)(D).

(1) Pursuant to provisions of section 208.161, RSMo, MO HealthNet coverage will be afforded to eligible individuals under age twenty-one (21) for inpatient psychiatric services provided under the following conditions:

(C) In a psychiatric residential treatment facility (PRTF) that is operated as a public institution by the Missouri Department of Mental Health (DMH) and is exempt from the hospital licensing law, that is accredited by the Joint Commission, the Council on Accreditation, The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, Det Norske Veritas (DNV) or equivalent organization, and is certified as complying with the requirements at 42 CFR 441 subpart D and the condition of participation at 42 CFR 483 subpart G by the designated state agency for which such authority has been authorized; or

(2) Reimbursement for inpatient psychiatric services, as provided for in this rule, shall be made as follows:

(C) For private PRTF services for individuals under the age of twenty-one (21), reimbursement will be calculated as follows:

1. Effective for dates of service on or after September 29, 2021, the division will reimburse private PRTFs on a prospective per diem rate. The prospective Missouri private PRTF per diem rate was created using a wage rate model which utilized data derived from cost surveys prepared and submitted by potential PRTF providers. These cost surveys were collected February 2021 or prior. The model specifically examines potential facility, occupancy, staff to patient ratios, necessary nursing hours per patient day, direct care and behavioral health professional wage and overhead expense, and risk factors. (4) The certifications of need for care shall be made by different teams depending on the status of the individual patients as follows:

(A) For an individual who is receiving Medicaid at the time of admission, the certification of need shall be made by an independent team of health professionals [at the time of admission. A team member cannot be employed by the admitting hospital or PRTF or be receiving payment as a consultant on a regular and frequent basis. The team must include a licensed physician who has competence in diagnosis and treatment of behavioral health disorders, preferably in child psychiatry, and has knowledge of the patient's situation and one (1) other behavioral health professional who is licensed;] that –

1. Includes a physician;

2. Has competence in diagnosis and treatment of mental illness, preferably in child psychiatry; and

3. Has knowledge of the individual's situation;

(C) For an individual who undergoes an emergency admission, the certification of need shall be made by the treatment facility interdisciplinary team responsible for the individual's plan of care as specified in section (5) within fourteen (14) days after admission.

[1. All admissions to PRTFs shall be considered non-emergent. The certification of need shall be performed by an independent review team.]

(2) Apprentice funeral director – an individual who is being trained as a funeral director in a Missouri licensed funeral establishment under the **personal** supervision of a Missouri licensed funeral director in the “practice of funeral directing,” the business of preparing, otherwise than by embalming, for the burial, disposal, or transportation out of this state of, and the directing and supervising of the burial or disposal of, dead human bodies or engaging in the general control, supervision, or management of the operations of a Missouri licensed funeral establishment and has met the requirements for registration pursuant to **section 333.042, RSMo, and 20 CSR 2120-2.060.**

*[(15) Embalmer examination—an examination consisting of the following:*

(A) *National Board Funeral Service Arts examination developed and furnished by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, Inc., or other equivalent nationally accredited agency approved by the board which develops examinations for licensure of individuals in the death care profession;*

(B) *National Board Funeral Service Science examination developed and furnished by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, Inc., or designee of the board; and*

(C) *Missouri Law examination.]*

*[(16)](15) Entombment – the placing of a dead body in a tomb.*

*[(17) Executive director—executive secretary of the board.]*

*[(18)](16) Function – the purpose for which a funeral establishment may be used as set forth in these rules.*

*[(19)](17) Funeral ceremony – a religious service or other rite or memorial ceremony for a decedent.*

*[(20)](18) Funeral director – an individual holding a funeral director license issued by the board.*

*[(21) Funeral director examination—an examination consisting of the following:*

(A) *National Board Funeral Service Arts examination developed and furnished by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, Inc., or other equivalent nationally accredited agency approved by the board which develops examinations for licensure of individuals in the death care profession; and*

(B) *Missouri Law examination.]*

*[(22)](19) Funeral director-in-charge – an individual licensed as a funeral director by the board responsible for the general management and supervision of a Missouri licensed funeral establishment in the state of Missouri. Each Missouri licensed funeral establishment shall have a Missouri licensed funeral director designated as the funeral director-in-charge. A funeral director limited may serve as funeral director-in-charge of a funeral establishment which is licensed for only cremation including transportation of dead human bodies to and from*

the funeral establishment.

*[(23)](20) Funeral [D]director [L]limited – allows a person to work only in a funeral establishment which is licensed for [only] cremation [including transportation of dead human bodies to and from the funeral establishment].*

*[(24)](21) Funeral establishment – a building, place, or premises licensed by the board devoted to or used in the care and preparation for burial, cremation, or transportation of the human dead and includes every building, place, or premises maintained for that purpose or held out to the public by advertising or otherwise to be used for that purpose.*

*[(25)](22) Funeral service – any service performed in connection with the care of a dead human body from the time of death until final disposition including, but not limited to:—*

(A) Removal;

(B) Entering into contractual agreements for the provision of funeral services;

(C) Arranging, planning, conducting, and/or supervising visitations and funeral ceremonies;

(D) Interment;

(E) Cremation;

(F) Disinterment;

(G) Burial; and

(H) Entombment.

*[(26)](23) Independent [F]financial [A]advisor – an investment advisor retained pursuant to section 436.440.6, RSMo.*

*[(27)](24) Interment – burial of dead human remains in the ground, a tomb, a mausoleum, or other place where dead human remains are interred.*

*[(28)](25) Person – any individual, partnership, corporation, cooperative, association, or other entity.*

*[(29)](26) Preparation room – refers to the room in a Missouri licensed funeral establishment where dead human bodies are embalmed, bathed, and/or prepared for final disposition.*

*[(30) Reciprocity examination—consists of the Missouri Law Examination.]*

*[(31)](27) Register log – a written record or log maintained in a Missouri licensed funeral establishment available at all times in full view for a board inspector.*

*[(32)](28) Urn – any receptacle into which the cremated remains are placed for other than transportation or short-term storage.*

**PROPOSED RULE**

**20 CSR 2120-2.010 Embalmer's Registration and Apprenticeship**

**PURPOSE:** *This rule establishes the procedures to be used to secure an embalmer's license.*

(1) Every person desiring to enter the profession of embalming dead human bodies within Missouri, and who is enrolled in an accredited institution of mortuary science, shall complete a practicum as required by the accredited institution of mortuary science education.

(2) For every person desiring to enter the profession of embalming dead human bodies within Missouri, the board may conduct a criminal history background check through the Missouri State Highway Patrol. Applicants shall submit to the board the applicable fee for the criminal history background check as determined by the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

(3) After registration with the board as a practicum student in an accredited institution of mortuary science education, the student may assist in a Missouri-licensed funeral establishment preparation room only under the direct supervision of a Missouri-licensed embalmer and may assist in the direction of funerals only under the direct supervision of a Missouri-licensed funeral director. Each person desiring to be a practicum student shall register with the board as a practicum student on the form provided by the board in accordance with the requirements of the accredited institution of mortuary science prior to beginning the practicum. Applications shall be accompanied by the applicable fee.

(4) During the period of the practicum, the certificate of registration issued to the practicum student shall be displayed, at all times, in a conspicuous location accessible to the public at each funeral establishment where the practicum student is working.

(5) The practicum student registration authorizes the registrant to engage in the practice of embalming only at the Missouri-licensed funeral establishment(s) designated on the certificate of registration and only under the direct supervision of a Missouri-licensed embalmer. The practicum student may assist in the practice of funeral directing only under the direct supervision of a Missouri-licensed funeral director and only at the Missouri-licensed funeral establishment(s) designated on the certificate of registration. If during the course of the practicum, the practicum student wishes to work at a Missouri-licensed funeral establishment other than as designated on the certificate of registration, the practicum student shall notify the board in writing of the name, location, and Missouri-licensed funeral establishment license number of the new Missouri-licensed funeral establishment within ten (10) days of the change.

(6) Upon successful completion of the practicum, the practicum student registration shall become null and void. A practicum shall be deemed successfully completed when the practicum student has achieved a passing grade on the practicum from the institution of mortuary science at which the practicum student is enrolled.

(7) Prior to August 28, 2025, applicants for initial licensure for embalmer shall have graduated from an accredited mortuary science education program accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education, any successor organization, or other accrediting entity as approved by the board, successfully completed the National Board Examination–Sciences, National Board Examination–Arts, and the Missouri Law examination administered by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards. Applicants must have completed a twelve- (12-) month apprenticeship program under the

supervision of a licensed embalmer of this state, demonstrated devotion of at least thirty (30) hours, on average, per week as an apprentice embalmer. Additionally, the applicant must demonstrate the successful embalming of a minimum of twenty-five (25) dead human bodies.

(8) On or after August 28, 2025, applicants for initial licensure for embalmer shall have successfully graduated from an accredited funeral service program accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education, any successor organization, or other accrediting entity as approved by the board, successfully completed the National Board Examination—Sciences and the Missouri Law examination administered by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, any successor organization, or other organization approved by the board and complete an embalmer apprenticeship as required in section 333.041, RSMo.

(9) The applicant shall demonstrate graduation from an accredited funeral service education program by submitting official transcripts.

(10) The applicant shall submit proof of having successfully completed the National Board Examination—Sciences. Prior to completion of the period of apprenticeship, the apprentice embalmer shall successfully complete the Missouri Law examination. The Missouri Law examination covers knowledge of state and federal statutes and rules governing the practice of embalming and funeral directing. Applicants will be deemed eligible to take the Missouri Law examination upon issuance of the Embalmer Apprentice Registration. An applicant is exempt from the requirements of the Missouri Law examination if the applicant has successfully completed the Missouri Law exam for another license within the jurisdiction of the board.

(11) The applicant shall provide to the board, on the application approved by the board or through the Division of Professional Registration online licensing system a completed application for embalmer apprenticeship.

(A) The name(s) of the Missouri-licensed embalmer(s) under whom the applicant will serve. Each supervisor must be licensed with and approved by the board. Any change in supervisor shall also be registered and approved within ten (10) business days after the change has been made.

(B) The name(s), location(s), and license number(s) of the licensed funeral establishment(s) where the apprentice is serving as an apprentice. If the apprentice embalmer begins work at any other licensed funeral establishment during the period of apprenticeship, the apprentice embalmer shall notify the board, on the form provided by the board, within ten (10) business days after the change has been made.

(C) Pay appropriate registration fees and must successfully complete a Missouri State Highway Patrol criminal background check.

(12) The embalmer apprentice shall, prior to licensure as embalmer, complete the following:

(A) A qualifying embalmer's apprentice program as directed by the board for no less than six (6) months and personally embalmed at least twenty-five (25) dead human bodies under the supervision of a Missouri-licensed embalmer. The first twelve (12) embalmings shall be conducted under the direct supervision of the licensed embalmer.

1. Direct supervision shall mean supervision in which the licensed embalmer is physically present with the apprentice embalmer and the dead body at the beginning of the

embalming process and available for consultation within one (1) hour for the remainder of the embalming process;

(B) Participation as an embalmer apprentice for a minimum of seven hundred eighty (780) hours, an average of thirty (30) hours weekly, within the six (6) month apprentice period. The licensed embalmer supervisor shall attest to the completion of the required embalmings.

1. If an embalmer supervisor is unwilling or unable to attest to the completion of the embalmer apprenticeship, the applicant may request the board review the apprenticeship records and make a determination as to the completion of the apprenticeship.

(13) During the period of the apprenticeship, the certificate of registration issued to the apprentice shall be displayed, at all times, in a conspicuous location accessible to the public at each funeral establishment where the apprentice is working.

(14) Transition (Embalmer Apprentice Waiver).

(A) Prior to August 28, 2025, embalmer apprentice registrants were required to complete twelve (12) months of apprenticeship.

(B) Effective August 28, 2025, those apprentice registrants currently enrolled in the twelve- (12-) month apprenticeship may request, in writing, that the board allow a transition from the twelve- (12-) month apprenticeship program to the six- (6-) month apprenticeship. Existing time and cases completed in the current apprenticeship will count toward the six- (6-) month requirement.

(15) An Affidavit of Practical Work form provided by the board, signed by both the apprentice and the supervisor(s) attesting the applicant has successfully completed the embalming of twenty-five (25) dead human bodies and completed the required seven hundred eighty (780) hours, average of thirty (30) hours weekly, during the six- (6-) month apprenticeship shall be submitted to the board at the time of completion of the apprenticeship period. Applicants may be subject to a criminal background check at the time of licensure.

(16) After satisfactory completion of these requirements, an embalmer's license shall be issued to an apprentice embalmer registrant upon payment of the applicable fee and subject to the provisions of section 333.330, RSMo.

(17) An applicant shall meet the requirements of the board for licensure within five (5) years of his/her graduation from an accredited funeral service education program. If the applicant fails to meet the requirements of the board within the required time, a new application and applicable fees will be required. No previous apprenticeship will be considered for a new application. However, the successful examination results of the National Board Examination or designee of the board will be accepted.

(18) A Missouri-licensed embalmer may engage in the practice of embalming in the state of Missouri only in Missouri-licensed funeral establishments. Each embalmer shall inform the board in writing of each funeral establishment name(s), location(s), and license number(s) where the embalmer is performing embalming.

(19) A Missouri-licensed embalmer has the ongoing obligation to keep the board informed if the licensee has been finally adjudicated or found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or *nolo contendere*, in a criminal prosecution under the laws of

any state or of the United States, whether or not a sentence was imposed. This information shall be provided to the board within thirty (30) days of being finally adjudicated or found guilty.

(20) Should an individual desire to obtain a Missouri embalmer's license after his/her license has become void under section 333.081.3, RSMo, the individual shall be required to make application and shall be required to complete an apprenticeship consisting of six (6) months with a required seven hundred eighty (780) hours, average of thirty (30) hours weekly during which time s/he shall be required to embalm at least twelve (12) dead human bodies under the direct supervision of a Missouri-licensed embalmer. The applicant shall be required to pay the current applicable apprenticeship and application fees to obtain a new embalmer's license under this section. No previous apprenticeship or application will be considered for a new application under this section. However, the successful examination results of the National Board Examination-Science and the Missouri Law examination will be accepted.

(21) All certificates, registrations, and licenses, or duplicate copies thereof, issued by the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors shall be displayed at all times in a conspicuous location accessible to the public in each office or place of business where they work, for inspection by any duly authorized agent of the board.

(D) Evidence sufficient to the board that the applicant has achieved a **passing** score *[of seventy-five percent (75%) or better]* on the National Board *[Funeral Service Arts] Examination* *[and]–Arts if applying for a funeral director's license or* the National Board *[Funeral Service Science] Examination* *[provided by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, Inc., or designee of the board, if applying for an embalmer license or an embalmer and funeral director license; or]–Sciences if applying for an embalmer's license;*

*[E] Evidence sufficient to the board that the applicant has achieved a score of seventy-five percent (75%) or better on the National Board Funeral Service Arts Examination provided by the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, Inc., or designee of the board, if applying for only a*

*funeral director license; and]*

*[(F)](E) The reciprocity applicant will be required to successfully complete the [reciprocity] Missouri Law examination [with a score of seventy-five percent (75%) or better within twenty-four (24) months after the board's receipt of the reciprocity application]. If an applicant by reciprocity has received either an embalmer or funeral director license from the board for which the [reciprocity] Missouri Law examination [is] was required, that applicant will be exempt from taking the [reciprocity] Missouri Law examination for the second license [if the original Missouri license remains in active status];*

*[(G)](F) A completed application for licensure for reciprocity provided by the board; and*

*[(H)](G) Payment of applicable fees including the fee charged by the Missouri State Highway Patrol for a criminal history background check, as required by the board.*

*[(3) If the reciprocity applicant holds a license as an embalmer or funeral director in another state or territory with requirements less than those of this state, they may seek licensure in this state by meeting the following requirements of the board:*

*(A) An official certification from another state or territory which verifies that the licensee holds a valid, unrevoked, and unexpired funeral director or embalmer license in the other state or territory;*

*(B) A copy of his/her original funeral director or embalmer license from the other state or territory in which the applicant is licensed;*

*(C) Proof of his/her educational and professional qualifications;*

*(D) The reciprocity applicant will be required to successfully complete the reciprocity examination with a score of seventy-five percent (75%) or better within twenty-four (24) months after the board's receipt of the reciprocity application. If an applicant by reciprocity has received either an embalmer or funeral director license from the board for which the reciprocity examination is required, that applicant will be exempt from taking the reciprocity examination for the second license if the original Missouri license remains in active status;*

*(E) A completed application for licensure for reciprocity provided by the board; and*

*(F) Payment of applicable fees including the fee charged by the Missouri State Highway Patrol for a criminal history background check, as required by the board.]*

**(3) Applicants eligible to apply for a reciprocal license as an embalmer or funeral director pursuant to section 324.009, RSMo, shall provide –**

*(A) A certificate of state endorsement from the examining board of the state or territory in which the applicant holds his/her license showing the grade rating upon which his/her license was granted, a statement whether the reciprocity applicant has ever been subject to discipline or if there are any complaints pending against the reciprocity applicant, and a recommendation for licensure in Missouri;*

*(B) The reciprocity applicant will be required to successfully complete the Missouri Law examination. If an applicant by reciprocity has received either an embalmer or funeral director license from the board for which the Missouri Law examination was required, that applicant will be exempt from taking the Missouri Law examination;*

*(C) A completed application for licensure for reciprocity provided by the board; and*

*(D) Payment of applicable fees including the fee charged by the Missouri State Highway Patrol for a criminal history background check, as required by the board.*

**(5) Applications for reciprocity licensure shall be completed and received by the board at least thirty (30) days prior to the date the candidate plans to sit for the Missouri Law examination and shall be accompanied by the applicable fee. **20 CSR 2120-2.060 Funeral Directing**

*PURPOSE: This rule outlines the provisions for the practice of funeral directing.*

(1) Every person who desires to enter the profession of funeral directing in Missouri and who is not entitled to a license by reciprocity under section 333.051 or 324.009, RSMo, shall pay applicable fees and shall complete an application for a funeral director license through the Division of Professional Registration online licensing system or on an approved application form.

(2) Education Applicants.

(A) Provide official transcripts and documentation demonstrating the applicant is a graduate of an institute of mortuary science accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education or any successor organization, or other organization approved by the board, and successful completion of the National Board Examination–Arts and the Missouri Law examination or proof of being a licensed Missouri embalmer.

(B) Applicants shall also submit documents listed in section (4).

(3) Apprenticeship Applicants.

(A) As an alternative to the requirements of section (2), applicants may register for and provide proof of successful completion of a board-approved apprenticeship program. Applicants completing an apprenticeship shall provide an Affidavit of Practical Work completed during the apprenticeship period and the Attestation for Licensure application upon completion of an apprenticeship. To successfully complete a board-approved apprenticeship program, the applicant must register with the board and complete an apprenticeship program in one of the following:

1. Within a twenty-four- (24) month period:

A. Complete a twelve- (12-) month apprenticeship program during which the apprentice shall arrange and conduct ten (10) funeral services under the personal supervision of a Missouri licensed funeral director in an establishment licensed for care and preparation of the dead human body; and

B. Participate as a funeral director apprenticeship for a minimum of seven hundred eighty (780) hours, average of fifteen (15) hours weekly, within the twelve- (12-) month apprenticeship; and

C. Successfully complete the National Board Examination–Arts and the Missouri Law examination administered by the International Conference of Funeral

Service Examining Boards, any successor organization, or other organization approved by the board; or

2. Within a thirty-six- (36-) month period –

A. Complete an eighteen- (18-) month apprenticeship program during which the apprentice shall arrange and conduct twenty-five (25) funeral services under the personal supervision of a Missouri-licensed funeral director in an establishment licensed for care and preparation of the dead human body;

B. Participate as a funeral director apprentice for a minimum of one thousand one hundred seventy (1,170) hours, average of fifteen (15) hours weekly, within the eighteen- (18-) month apprenticeship; and

C. Successfully complete the Missouri Law examination.

(B) Applicants shall also submit documents listed in section (4).

(C) Personal supervision means supervision in which the licensed funeral director is physically present for the apprentice's first five (5) funeral services. The licensed supervisor may be available within one (1) hour for consultation for the remaining cases.

(D) After successful registration with the board, an apprentice will be eligible to sit for required examinations with the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, any successor organization, or other organization approved by the board.

(E) If a funeral director supervisor is unwilling or unable to attest to the completion of the funeral director apprenticeship, the applicant may request the board review the apprenticeship records and make a determination as to the completion of the apprenticeship.

(4) As part of the application processes in sections (2) and (3), applicants shall provide to the board the following:

(A) Proof of being at least eighteen (18) years of age;

(B) Proof of possession of a high school diploma or equivalent, as determined by the board;

(C) Applicants must submit to a criminal history background check as provided to the board by the Missouri Highway Patrol. Applicants shall submit applicable fees to the board as determined by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. Apprenticeship applicants must submit to a criminal background check at the time of registration and upon application for licensure; and

(D) Any other information the board may require.

(5) Any licensed funeral director who has not previously sat for the National Board Examination–Arts may, at his or her election and upon written request to the board, sit for the examination once the board has deemed eligibility with the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards, any successor organization, or other organization approved by the board.

(6) Transition.

(A) Effective August 28, 2025, those apprentice registrants currently enrolled in the twenty-four- (24-) month pathway apprenticeship program may request to transition to the thirty-six- (36-) month pathway. Requests must be submitted to the board in writing. Existing time and cases completed in the current apprenticeship will count toward the requirements of the thirty-six- (36-) month apprentice pathway.

(7) Upon registration and payment in full of all applicable fees, the board shall issue the apprentice funeral director applicant a funeral director apprentice registration. This registration

authorizes the apprentice registrant to engage in the practice of funeral directing under the supervision of a Missouri-licensed funeral director. The funeral director apprentice registration, or a copy thereof, shall be displayed at all times in a conspicuous location accessible to the public at each establishment where the apprentice is working.

(8) The funeral director apprentice registration authorizes the registrant to engage in the practice of funeral directing only during the apprenticeship period. Once the apprenticeship is successfully completed, as defined in this rule, the funeral director apprentice registration shall become null and void. Any Missouri licensed funeral director who allows a former apprentice who has completed his/her apprenticeship to engage in the practice of funeral directing before that apprentice is fully licensed shall be subject to discipline for misconduct under section 333.121.2, RSMo.

(9) The funeral director apprenticeship is not intended as a long-term method of practicing as a funeral director in the absence of progress toward licensure. An apprentice shall not be allowed to register with the board for more than two (2) apprenticeship periods unless otherwise approved by the board for good cause.

(10) The funeral director apprenticeship shall be served under the personal supervision of a Missouri-licensed funeral director in a Missouri-licensed funeral establishment. If the funeral director apprentice changes funeral establishments or there is a change to the licensed funeral director supervisor during the course of the apprenticeship, the apprentice shall notify the board, through the online licensing system or on a form prescribed by the board, of the changes to the funeral establishment locations where the apprenticeship is being served or with the funeral director supervisors. The board must be notified within ten (10) business days after the change(s) have been made.

(11) An applicant shall be exempt from the requirement of successful completion of the Missouri Law examination if the applicant has successfully completed the Missouri Law examination for another Missouri license within the jurisdiction of the board.

(12) Any funeral director or funeral establishment that allows an unlicensed person to make at-need arrangements for the transportation or removal and transport of a dead human body for or on behalf of the funeral director and/or the funeral establishment shall supervise the unlicensed person and shall be responsible for the conduct of the unlicensed person. This section shall not be construed to allow any unlicensed person to perform any other act for which a license is required by Chapter 333, RSMo.

(13) A Missouri-licensed funeral director shall be present and personally shall supervise or conduct each funeral ceremony conducted by or from a Missouri-licensed funeral establishment. A violation of this section will be considered misconduct in the practice of funeral directing.

(14) A Missouri-licensed funeral director shall be present and personally shall supervise any disinterment, interment, entombment, or cremation as defined in 20 CSR 2120-1.040 conducted by a Missouri-licensed funeral establishment. However, nothing in this rule shall be interpreted as requiring the presence of a Missouri-licensed funeral director if the

person(s) having the right to control the incidents of the burial request otherwise. If the disinterment does not require legal notification to the county coroner or medical examiner, a funeral director's presence may not be required. A violation of this section shall be deemed misconduct in the practice of funeral directing.

(A) Once the body has been delivered to a cemetery for the purpose of interment or to a crematory for the purpose of cremation and after any funeral ceremonies have been completed, the Missouri-licensed funeral director is not required to stay with the body.

(B) Nothing in this rule shall be interpreted as requiring the Missouri-licensed funeral director to leave the cemetery before disposition is complete. Furthermore, nothing in this rule shall be interpreted as relieving the Missouri-licensed funeral director of any responsibilities he/she has under his/her contract with the person(s) having the right to control the incidents of burial.

(15) A funeral director or funeral establishment licensed in another state that enters the state of Missouri solely for the purpose of transporting a dead human body through Missouri to another state, country, or territory shall not be deemed to be in the practice of funeral directing or required to obtain a license from the board. This regulation does not exempt any person or entity from complying with any applicable statutes or regulations governing the transportation of dead human bodies including but not limited to Chapters 193 and 194, RSMo.

(16) A Missouri-licensed funeral establishment or funeral director shall not allow an unlicensed person to make the following at-need arrangements with the person having the right to control the incidents of disposition:

(A) Arrangements for final disposition, supervision of visitation and memorial ceremony, grave attendance, cremation, entering into a contractual relationship for performance of any other funeral services; and

(B) Embalming, cremation, care, or preparation.

(17) The taking of preliminary information by an unlicensed person will not be construed as the making of at-need funeral arrangements under this rule.

(18) No temporary Missouri funeral director license authorized under section 333.042, RSMo, will be issued until the board has been advised as to the location of the Missouri-licensed funeral establishment at which the temporary funeral director's license will be used. The holder of the temporary license shall be authorized to work only at the Missouri-licensed funeral establishment(s) where the deceased and/or disabled Missouri licensed funeral director was authorized to work and only when there is no other licensed funeral director available to discharge the director's duties. Violation of this rule will be deemed unauthorized practice of funeral directing.

(19) The business and practice of funeral directing may be conducted only from a fixed place or establishment which has been licensed by the board.

(20) Limited Funeral Director License.

(A) A person holding a limited license shall only be allowed to work in a funeral establishment that is licensed to conduct cremations (Function B). A person holding a limited funeral director license may perform duties related to cremation. They may not make funeral arrangements or conduct services

for which a funeral director's license is required.

(B) Every person desiring a limited license shall make application through the Division of Professional Registration online licensing system or submit a paper application providing the following to the board:

1. Proof of being at least eighteen (18) years of age;
2. Proof of possession of a high school diploma or equivalent, as determined by the board;
3. Successful completion of the Missouri Law examination;
4. Payment of applicable fees and satisfactorily complete a Missouri Highway Patrol criminal background check;
5. Any other information the board may require.

(C) Every limited licensee shall provide the board with the name, location, and license number of each funeral establishment, licensed for cremation, where he/she is employed.

(D) If a limited licensee desires to obtain a full funeral director's license, the licensee shall be required to complete the requirements necessary for licensure in section 333.042, RSMo.

(21) All certificates, registrations, and licenses, or duplicate copies thereof, issued by the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors shall be displayed at all times in a conspicuous location accessible to the public in each office(s) or place(s) of business where they work, for inspection by any duly authorized agent of the board.

(22) Should an individual desire to obtain a Missouri funeral director's license after his/her license has become void under section 333.081.3, RSMo, the individual shall be required to make new application and pay all applicable fees to the board. No previous apprenticeship or application will be considered for the new application. However, the board shall accept the successful completion of the National Board Examination-Arts examination for new application and the successful completion of the Missouri Law examination if successfully completed for another license under the jurisdiction of the board.

(23) A Missouri-licensed funeral director may engage in the practice of funeral directing in the state of Missouri only in Missouri licensed funeral establishments. Each Missouri licensed funeral director shall inform the board in writing, in a timely manner, of each Missouri-licensed funeral establishment name(s), location(s), and license number(s) where the Missouri licensed funeral director is engaged in funeral directing.

(24) A Missouri-licensed funeral director has the ongoing obligation to keep the board informed if the licensee has been finally adjudicated or found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or *nolo contendere*, in a criminal prosecution under the laws of any state or of the United States, whether or not sentence was imposed. This information shall be provided to the board within thirty (30) days of being finally adjudicated or found guilty.

(25) Person Deemed to be Engaged in the Practice of Funeral Directing.

(A) No person shall be deemed by the board to be engaged in the practice of funeral directing or to be operating a funeral establishment if the person prepares, arranges, or carries out the burial of the dead human body of a member of one's own family or next of kin as provided by section 194.119, RSMo, provided that the activity is not conducted as a business or for business purposes.

(B) The board shall not deem a person to be engaged in the practice of funeral directing or to be operating a funeral establishment if the person prepares, arranges, or carries out the burial of a dead human body pursuant to the religious beliefs, tenets, or practices of a religious group, sect, or organization, provided that the activity is not conducted as a business or for business purposes.

2. The amount of the policy or balance on account at the time the preneed contract was sold; and

3. An attestation from the seller that since these accounts are funded by insurance, the seller has no ability to confirm the existence or amount of the policies or accounts; **and**

*[(E) If the license is suspended the applicant must file the annual report and renewal and pay the delinquent fee established by the board before the license is issued; and]*

*[(F)](E) If the license is not current, the licensee shall not act as a preneed seller in any capacity, such as maintaining an active trust account or paying providers for fulfilled preneed contracts.*

(3) For providers –

(A) Each preneed provider shall file a completed *[annual report] renewal* on or before October 31 each year. If the license is not renewed by this date the license shall expire; **and**

(4) For preneed agents –

(5) *[The holders of expired Missouri licenses for preneed providers, preneed sellers, and registrations for agents which are not renewed will be notified that their licenses or registrations have expired.] Missouri-licensed preneed sellers are required to ensure preneed agents selling preneed contracts under their license hold an active license. The holder of an expired license or registration may reinstate the license or registration within two (2) years of the renewal date after the proper forms have been completed and applicable fees have been paid. SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The public comment period ended October 31, 2025, and the commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendment on November 5, 2025. The commission received four (4) written comments and four (4) comments at the hearing. All the comments were generally in support of the proposed amendment with a few suggested changes.

COMMENT #1: J. Scott Stacey on behalf of the staff of the commission filed written comments and commented at the hearing in support of the proposed amendment. Staff noted that the proposed amendments were necessary as a result of Senate Bill No. 4 (truly agreed to and finally passed on March 13, 2025, signed by Governor Kehoe on April 9, 2025, and effective August 28, 2025). Initially in their written comments, staff suggested the deletion of a portion of paragraph (14)

(F)4. and all of subsection (14)(G) because those amendments had been inadvertently left out of the proposed amendment. However, in their hearing comments, staff withdrew those proposed changes since they were not published for comment. At the hearing, staff also responded to the comments of others as stated below.

RESPONSE: The commission agrees that these portions of the rule should not be deleted in this rulemaking since the deletion was not published for comment. The commission will consider these proposed changes for future amendments to this rule. No changes were made as a result of these comments.

COMMENT #2: Anna Kathryn Martin filed written comments and, along with Geoff Marke, commented at the hearing on behalf of the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC). OPC recommended removal of the portion of the rule that discusses utilities conducting income audits or move that to the section regarding "Payment Agreements"; changing the reference to one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the federal poverty level to sixty percent (60%) of the state median income to align with section 660.100, RSMo; removing the portions of the rule in paragraph (14)(F)4. and subsection (14)(G) as originally proposed by staff; and revising the rule so that it includes the hot weather portion of section 393.108, RSMo, thus making this the "Extreme Temperature Maintenance of Service" rule. Additionally, OPC suggested a few minor edits to make the language of the rule consistent and remove outdated language. Staff stated it supported the minor edits of OPC but was opposed to the other edits because they were major changes to the rule that had not been published for comment. RESPONSE: The commission agrees with staff and will not make the major unpublished changes that OPC suggests. The commission will also not make the minor language changes in subsections (3)(A) and (3)(D) that OPC suggests because the relevant subsections were not published in the commission's notice of rulemaking. The other nonsubstantive changes suggested by OPC were either already made in the proposed amendment as published or were unnecessary.

COMMENT #3: John Coffman filed written comments and commented at the hearing on behalf of Consumers Council of Missouri (CCM). CCM generally supported the proposed amendment but recommended the time of day be removed from the rule in section (5). CCM fears that by having the time of day in the rule, the hours between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. will not be considered when assessing the cold temperatures forecasted. Staff commented that it disagreed with removing the time from the rule because that language is in the statute. David Yonce on behalf of Spire Missouri Inc. also responded at the hearing to CCM's comment regarding the times in the rule. Spire assured the commission that as a utility, it read the statute and the rule as meaning that the times of day noted were the time period within which the utilities must check the forecast for the entire following seventy-two (72) hours. Spire stated that if any forecast for the following seventy-two (72) hours was above or below the temperatures set out in the statute, then disconnection was prohibited. Spire indicated that it did not read the requirement in the way CCM was suggesting. CCM also commented about concerns with the National Weather Service term of "heat index" if the commission were to add a hot weather rule to the rule as proposed by OPC.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks CCM for their comments.

However, because the proposed amendment language mirrors the statutory language, and because the utilities correctly interpret that language to ensure customers are not disconnected for the full seventy-two (72) hour period, the commission finds no change to the proposed amendment is necessary.

COMMENT #4: David Yonce commented at the hearing on behalf of Spire Missouri Inc. Spire explained how it interprets the requirement that customers not be disconnected when temperatures drop below specific temperature during the entire seventy-two (72) hour period.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks Spire for its comments and explanation. No changes were made as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #5: Roger W. Steiner on behalf of Evergy Missouri Metro and Evergy Missouri West (collectively referred to as "Evergy") made a written comment. Evergy commented that it was generally supportive of the proposed amendment. Evergy recommended one change to clarify what is meant by "adjacent service area" in section (7). Evergy suggested that if the commission intends to provide requirements for customers who move to a service area of an affiliated utility, the commission change the language to "service area of an affiliate."

RESPONSE: The commission thanks Evergy for its comments and explanation. However, the commission does not find that clarification is necessary and no change was made as a result of this comment.

Pursuant to section 537.610, RSMo, regarding the Sovereign Immunity Limits for Missouri Public Entities, the Director of the Department of Commerce and Insurance is required to calculate the new limit on awards for liability.

Using the Implicit Price Deflator (IPD) for Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE), as required by section 537.610, RSMo, the two new Sovereign Immunity Limits effective January 1, 2026, were established by the following calculations:

Index Based on 2017 Dollars  
Third Quarter 2024 IPD Index 123.731  
Third Quarter 2025 IPD Index 127.281

New 2026 Limit = 2025 Limit x (2025 Index/2024 Index)

For all claims arising out of a single accident or occurrence:  
$$\$3,547,658 = \$3,448,710 \times (127.281/123.731)$$

For any one person in a single accident or occurrence:  
$$\$532,148 = \$517,306 \times (127.281/123.731)$$
