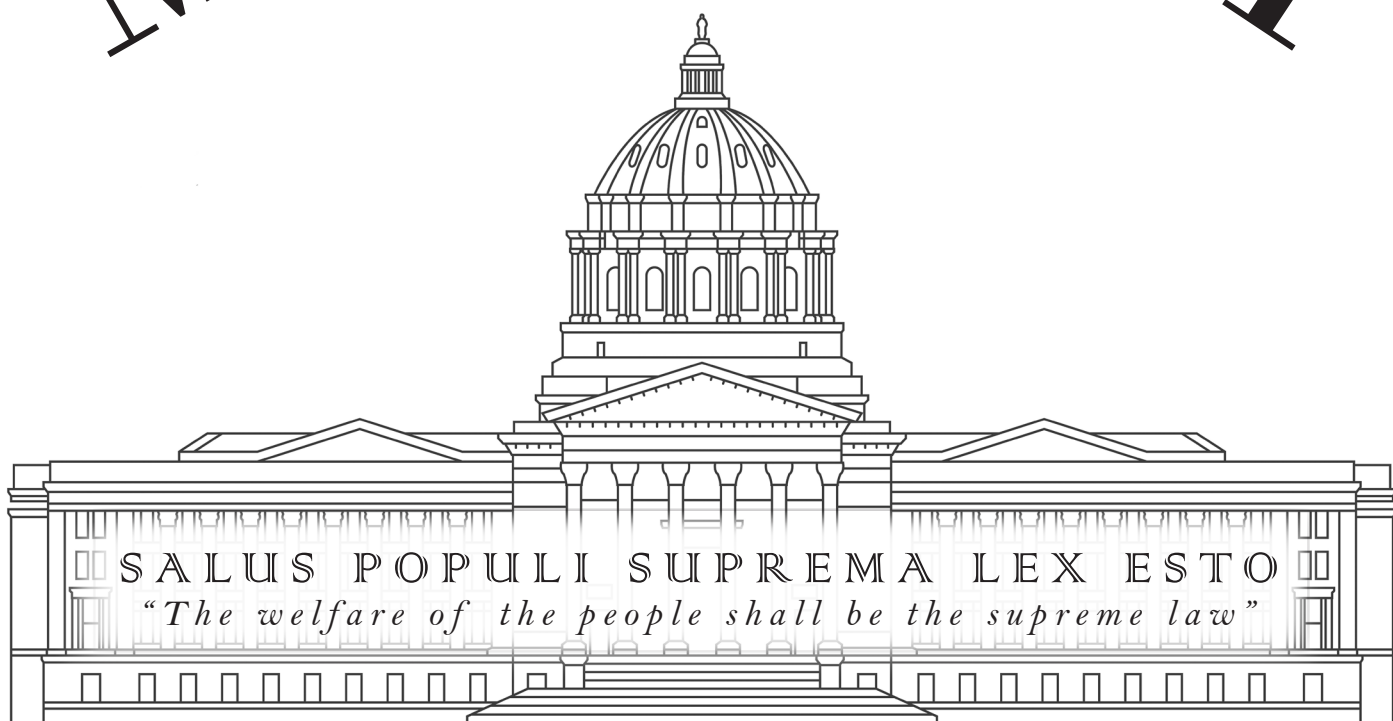

## HOW TO CITE RULES AND RSMO

### RULES

The rules are codified in the *Code of State Regulations* in this system–

and should be cited in this manner: 3 CSR 10-4.115.

Each department of state government is assigned a title. Each agency or division in the department is assigned a division number. The agency then groups its rules into general subject matter areas called chapters and specific areas called rules. Within a rule, the first breakdown is called a section and is designated as (1). Subsection is (A) with further breakdown into paragraphs 1., subparagraphs A., parts (I), subparts (a), items I. and subitems a.

The rule is properly cited by using the full citation; for example, 3 CSR 10-4.115, NOT Rule 10-4.115.

Citations of RSMo are to the *Missouri Revised Statutes* as of the date indicated.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER 26-05**

**WHEREAS**, I have been advised by the State Emergency Management Agency that the ongoing and forecast severe winter storm systems have caused, or have the potential to cause, damages associated with freezing rain, snow, sleet, and extremely low temperatures, impacting communities throughout the State of Missouri; and

**WHEREAS**, the severe winter storm systems reaching Missouri on January 23, 2026, and continuing have created a condition of distress and hazard to the safety, welfare, and property of the people of the State of Missouri beyond the capabilities of some local jurisdictions and other established agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Missouri must continue to be proactive where the health and safety of its citizens are concerned; and

**WHEREAS**, the resources of the State of Missouri continue to be needed to assist affected jurisdictions and to help relieve the condition of distress and hazard to the safety and welfare of our fellow Missourians; and

**WHEREAS**, an invocation of the provisions of sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, is required to ensure the safety and welfare of the people of Missouri and to activate the resources necessary to keep Missourians safe.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE KEHOE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI**, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Missouri, including sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, do hereby declare that a State of Emergency exists in the State of Missouri and direct the Missouri State Emergency Operations Plan activated.

I further order, pursuant to sections 41.480 and 41.690, RSMo, the Adjutant General of the State of Missouri, or his designee, to call and order into active service such portions of the organized militia as he deems necessary to aid the executive officials of Missouri, to protect life and property, and it is further directed that the Adjutant General or his designee, and through him, the commanding officer of any unit or other organization of such organized militia so called into active service take such action and employ such equipment as may be necessary in support of civilian authorities, and provide such assistance as may be authorized and directed by the Governor of this State.

I further authorize state agencies to provide assistance as needed.

This Order shall terminate on February 22, 2026, unless extended in whole or in part.

## EXECUTIVE ORDER 26-06

WHEREAS, severe storm systems impacted the State of Missouri starting on March 14, 2025, resulting in damages associated with tornadoes, straight line winds, large hail, fires, heavy rains, flooding, flash flooding, and riverine flooding, resulting in loss of life as well as damage to homes, businesses, public infrastructure, and electrical transmission lines across the state; and

WHEREAS, a State of Emergency was declared on March 14, 2025, pursuant to Executive Order 25-19; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Natural Resources was temporarily granted authority to waive statutory and administrative rules or regulations to serve the interests of public safety during the period of the Emergency, pursuant to Executive Order 25-20; and

WHEREAS, Executive Orders 25-19 and 25-20 were extended by Executive Order 25-22; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-22 was extended by Executive Order 25-23; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-23 was extended by Executive Order 25-27; and

WHEREAS, portions of Executive Order 25-27 were extended by Executive Order 25-28; which will expire on October 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-28 was extended by Executive Order 25-31; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-31 was extended by Executive Order 25-38; and

WHEREAS, the impacts from these severe storm systems continue to cause ongoing conditions of distress and hazard to the safety, welfare, and property of the citizens of Missouri beyond the capabilities of local jurisdictions and other established agencies; and

WHEREAS, the State of Missouri will continue to be proactive where the health and safety of the citizens of Missouri are concerned; and

WHEREAS, the resources of the State of Missouri have been needed and will continue to be needed to assist affected jurisdictions and to help relieve the condition of distress and hazard to the safety and welfare of our fellow Missourians; and

WHEREAS, continuation of the provisions of sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, is required to ensure the protection of the safety and welfare of the people of Missouri.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE KEHOE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Missouri, including Chapter 44 RSMo, do hereby extend Executive Order 25-38:

This Order shall terminate on February 28, 2026, unless extended in whole or in part.

The text of proposed rules and changes will appear under this heading. A notice of proposed rulemaking is required to contain an explanation of any new rule or any change in an existing rule and the reasons therefor. This explanation is set out in the PURPOSE section of each rule. A citation of the legal authority to make rules is also required, and appears following the text of the rule, after the word "Authority."

Entirely new rules are printed without any special symbology under the heading of proposed rule. If an existing rule is to be amended or rescinded, it will have a heading of proposed amendment or proposed rescission. Rules that are proposed to be amended will have new matter printed in boldface type and matter to be deleted placed in brackets.

An important function of the *Missouri Register* is to solicit and encourage public participation in the rulemaking process. The law provides that for every proposed rule, amendment, or rescission there must be a notice that anyone may comment on the proposed action. This comment may take different forms.

If an agency is required by statute to hold a public hearing before making any new rules, then a Notice of Public Hearing will appear following the text of the rule. Hearing dates must be at least thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*. If no hearing is planned or required, the agency must give a Notice to Submit Comments. This allows anyone to file statements in support of or in opposition to the proposed action with the agency within a specified time, no less than thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*.

An agency may hold a public hearing on a rule even though not required by law to hold one. If an agency allows comments to be received following the hearing date, the close-of-comments date will be used as the beginning day in the ninety- (90-) day count necessary for the filing of the order of rulemaking.

If an agency decides to hold a public hearing after planning not to, it must withdraw the earlier notice, file a new notice of proposed rulemaking, and schedule a hearing for a date not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of the new notice.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT**

**5 CSR 20-300.110 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, Part B.** The board is amending subsection (2)(D) and the incorporation by reference materials.

*PURPOSE: This amendment updates the materials incorporated by reference. To view the changes to the reference materials, please see <https://dese.mo.gov/special-education/compliance/state-plan-special-education>.*

(2) The content of this state plan for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part B (revised [September/December 2025]), which is hereby incorporated by reference

and made a part of this rule, meets the federal statute and Missouri's compliance in the following areas. A copy of the IDEA, Part B, is published by and can be obtained from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Office of Special Education, 205 Jefferson Street, PO Box 480, Jefferson City, MO 65102-0480, and at its website at <https://dese.mo.gov/governmental-affairs/dese-administrative-rules/incorporated-reference-materials>. **PROPOSED AMENDMENT**

**16 CSR 10-3.010 Payment of Funds to the Retirement System.** The Public School Retirement System is amending section (3).

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies that school districts are required to report a salary when the salary is earned by a member, not when it is paid to the member.*

(3) Employers of persons included in the retirement system shall withhold from each salary payment issued to such persons during the school year in which the services are rendered an amount which is the percent of salary rate required by the contribution rate then in effect; and employers shall transmit

to the board of trustees, not later than ten (10) days after the last day of each calendar month of the school year, twice the amount withheld during the month. **Salary shall be reported for the school year when the salary is earned, not when the salary is paid.**

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT

**16 CSR 10-4.005 Requirements for Membership.** The Public School Retirement System is adding a new section (8).

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies that any Department of Elementary and Secondary Education issued teaching certificate that is inactive is valid for Public School Retirement System membership eligibility and further clarifies that any Department of Elementary and Secondary Education issued teaching certificate that was expired on or after August 28, 2003, is not expired for Public School Retirement System eligibility and is considered inactive with listed exceptions.*

**(8) The possession of a valid Department of Elementary and Secondary Education- (DESE-) issued certificate is one (1) of the requirements for Public School Retirement System (PSRS) membership. An inactive certificate is valid for PSRS membership eligibility. A certificate that expired on or after August 28, 2003, is valid for PSRS membership eligibility except for Provisional (two- (2-) year, non-renewable); Temporary Authorization (one- (1-) year, renewable); Career Education Temporary (one- (1-) year, renewable); Voc I, Voc II and Voc III (two- (2-) year, five- (5-) year and ten- (10-) year certificates); and Visiting Scholar (one- (1-) year, renewable).**

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT

**16 CSR 10-4.014 Reinstatement and Credit Purchases.** The Public School Retirement System is deleting sections (7) and (12), amending section (16), and renumbering as necessary.

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies that a member must have five (5) years of credible service and be vested in order to purchase Social Security covered employment service credit and to delete obsolete or duplicate provisions.*

*[(7) “Public college” as that phrase is used in section 169.056.3, RSMo, and “private college” as that phrase is used in section 169.056.9, RSMo, shall include junior colleges and community colleges either inside or outside of Missouri. “Private school, college, or university” as that phrase is used in section 169.056.9, RSMo, shall not include trade schools.]*

*[(8)](7) The following provisions shall apply to the purchase of creditable service under section 105.691, RSMo:*

*(A) A member may elect to purchase creditable service under section 105.691, RSMo, only if the member had previously acquired creditable service in a retirement plan defined in that section for the employment to which the election applies; except that if the service did not meet the membership requirements of the employer’s retirement plan or the employer had no such retirement plan at the time the service was rendered, but the service would otherwise have met the membership requirements of this system as in effect when the election is made, the member shall be eligible to purchase such creditable service. The creditable service allowable shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 105.691, RSMo, and the rules of the board of trustees; and*

*(B) A member who does not complete payment in full on an application to purchase creditable service under section 105.691, RSMo, within the time limit prescribed by law may reapply to purchase creditable service for that same period of employment. The member may apply within the limits of the law to purchase creditable service for any other period of employment for which application to purchase creditable service was not previously made.*

*[(9)](8) The purchase of creditable service pursuant to section 169.577, RSMo, shall be administered as follows:*

*(A) Any member will be considered “within five (5) years of being eligible to retire with a retirement allowance” if that person would be eligible to begin receiving a full or reduced*

retirement allowance from the public school retirement system, by virtue of accrual of five (5) or fewer years of creditable service or the passage of five (5) or fewer calendar years;

(B) The salary used in calculating the cost of creditable service purchased pursuant to section 169.577, RSMo, is not “compensation payable to a member” as that phrase is used in section 169.010(8), RSMo, and shall not be used in determining final average salary;

(C) Credit purchased shall be used for all purposes except vesting;

(D) The cost of the purchase shall be calculated pursuant to the provisions of 16 CSR 10-4.012;

(E) A purchase shall be made in increments of at least one-one-hundred thousandth (0.00001) year and may not exceed five-tenths (0.5) year; and

(F) If the total payments made prior to termination of membership with the retirement system are insufficient to purchase all the credit for which the member applied, proportional credit shall be allowed based upon the ratio between the amount due for the entire period for which election to purchase was made and the total amount of the payments applied to reduce the principal amount due in increments of one-one-hundred thousandth (0.00001) year. The amount of partial payments not used to purchase credit or pay interest shall be refunded.

[(10)](9) A member electing to purchase membership service credit for service in the armed forces shall receive one (1) year of credit for each twelve- (12-) month period of such service. For any such period of service in the armed forces of less than twelve (12) months, the member shall receive proportional credit computed to the nearest one-one-hundred thousandth (0.00001) of a year[;], provided that, if the member entered on active duty in the armed forces no later than the date on which the member’s services were to have begun under an employment agreement with a district included in the retirement system and if the total period of active military service that year would have entitled the member to a year of creditable service had that service been rendered in that position with the district, the member shall be entitled to purchase a full year of membership service credit for the period of service. No more than one (1) year of membership service credit shall be allowed for service in the armed forces or for a combination of service in the armed forces and actual service in a district included in the retirement system, for any one (1) school year.

[(11)](10) Unless otherwise required by law, membership service credit purchased under the laws governing the retirement system cannot be used to establish eligibility for benefits under sections 169.010 to 169.141, RSMo, but such purchased credit may be used in computing the value of any benefits to which a member would otherwise qualify under those sections.

[(12)] *The salary used in calculating the cost of creditable service purchased is not compensation payable to a member as that phrase is used in section 169.010(8), RSMo, and shall not be used in determining final average salary.*

[(13)](11) Unless a different amount is required by law, members must have accrued at least one (1) year of membership service credit for employment in a position covered by the retirement system in order to apply to purchase service credit.

[(14)](12) Unless otherwise required by law, if the total payments made within the time allowed to purchase credit is insufficient to purchase all the credit for which the member applied, proportional credit shall be allowed based on the ratio between the amount due for the entire period for which the member applied and the total amount of the payments applied to reduce the principal amount due.

[(15)](13) Members electing to reinstate or purchase credit may make payments in any amount and at any time during the period allowed for payment.

[(16)](14) A purchase of credit for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.056.11, RSMo, shall be allowed only in a manner consistent with Title 26 of the *United States Code* and, in addition, shall be governed by the following provisions:

(A) The member must have five (5) years of creditable service **and be vested** with the retirement system prior to purchasing credit for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.056.11, RSMo;

(B) The retirement system shall allow the purchase of no more than five (5) years of credit for “nonqualified service” as that term is defined in section 415 of Title 26 of the *United States Code* if doing so would jeopardize the tax qualified status of the retirement system pursuant to the *Internal Revenue Code* and the retirement system determines that the provisions of section 415(n) of Title 26 of the *United States Code* apply to the purchase of such member’s purchase;

(C) The member must supply evidence satisfactory to the retirement system that the member is eligible to purchase credit for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.056.11, RSMo;

(D) The member must submit to the retirement system a detailed statement of the member’s employment history created by the Social Security Administration in a format satisfactory to the retirement system; and

(E) The retirement system shall determine the amount of credit that may be purchased for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.056.11, RSMo, based on the information provided pursuant to this section of this rule.

**16 CSR 10-4.020 Prior Service Credit.** This rule set forth the procedures for qualifying prior service credit before July 1, 1946, as provided for in section 169.050, RSMo.

*PURPOSE: This rule is being rescinded as it is obsolete as it applies to service credit prior to July 1, 1946.*

*AUTHORITY: section 169.020, RSMo Supp. 1990. Original rule filed Dec. 19, 1975, effective Jan. 1, 1976. Rescinded: Filed Feb. 2, 2026.*

*PUBLIC COST: This proposed rescission will not cost state agencies or political subdivisions more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate.*

**16 CSR 10-5.010 Service Retirement.** The Public School Retirement System is amending sections (1) and (6).

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies the first day a member may file an application for service retirement and when the filed application becomes void and to extend the end date to 2030 for retired teachers to substitute teach on a part-time or temporary substitute basis without a discontinuance of their retirement allowance as provided in House Bill Nos. 296 and 438, 103rd General Assembly (2025), and to clarify when retired teachers are allowed to do this substitute teaching.*

(1) A member qualifying for service retirement shall file a written application with the board of trustees on a form provided by the board before s/he can become eligible to receive retirement allowance payments. **The application for service retirement must be filed no earlier than one (1) year (twelve (12) months) before the effective retirement date of the member. An incomplete application is void after six (6) months of being filed with the board of trustees.**

(6) Part-time employment is any employment which is less than full-time. Temporary-substitute employment is any employment either in a position held by a regularly employed person who is temporarily absent or in a position which is temporarily vacant.

(C) Effective July 1, 2022, and until June 30, [2025] 2030, pursuant to section 168.036.6, RSMo, and notwithstanding any other provisions to the contrary, any person retired and

currently receiving a retirement benefit under sections 169.010 to 169.141, RSMo, other than for disability, may be employed to substitute teach on a part-time or temporary substitute basis by an employer included in the retirement system and for such work may exceed five hundred fifty (550) hours in any one (1) school year and may earn an amount in excess of the compensation limit set forth in subsection (6)(A) of this rule and section 169.560, RSMo, without a discontinuance of the retiree's retirement allowance. This section shall also apply to work performed by PSRS retirees, other than disability retirees, who are employed to substitute teach by third parties or as independent contractors for employers included in the retirement system. For purposes of administering this section as applicable to PSRS retirees, to substitute teach shall mean to instruct or guide the studies of students in a teaching position which requires a DESE-issued certificate in place of a regularly employed teacher who is temporarily unavailable. For community colleges, to substitute teach shall mean to instruct or guide the studies of students in a teaching position certified by the executive officer of the institution pursuant to section 169.140, RSMo, in place of a regularly employed teacher who is temporarily unavailable. *[A regularly employed teacher is considered temporarily unavailable when the teacher's position is unfilled due to the absence of the regular or former teacher for twelve (12) months or less.]*

**16 CSR 10-5.020 Disability Retirement.** The Public School Retirement System is amending sections (1), (6), and (9) and adding a new section (13).

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies the timing to file an application for disability retirement, the termination of employment requirements for disability retirement, that disability retirees may work after retirement if they meet certain requirements and that such retirees will not pay contributions on these earnings or receive service credit for working after retirement, and that disability retirement for any retiree whose is 60 years of age or older is considered a service retirement.*

(1) A member claiming disability retirement must file an application for retirement with the board of trustees on a form provided by the board. **The application for disability retirement must be filed no later than one (1) year (twelve (12) months) after the member becomes disabled.**

(6) The earliest date on which disability retirement may become effective is the first day of the calendar month following the calendar month in which the services of the member are terminated, or the first day of the month following the month in which the claim is approved, whichever is later[;], except that the earliest date on which disability retirement may become effective for a member retiring after receiving credit for a year of membership service shall be July 1, the first day of the school year following the termination of services. Termination from employment covered by the retirement system prior to the effective date of disability retirement is required to be eligible for a disability retirement benefit. **A member shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if the member is employed in any capacity by an employer covered by the retirement system or by a third party or independent contractor if such member is performing work in a district included in the retirement system as a temporary or long-term substitute teacher or in any position that would normally require that person to be duly certificated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education within one (1) month after his or her effective date of retirement. A member shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if, prior to receipt of his or her first benefit payment, the member reaches an agreement, whether written or unwritten, for future employment in any capacity by an employer covered by the retirement system. A member also shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if, prior to receipt of his or her first benefit payment, the member reaches an agreement, whether written or unwritten, for future employment with a third party or independent contractor if such member is performing work in a district included in the retirement system as a temporary or long-term substitute teacher or in any position that would normally require that person to be duly certificated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. The member shall be required to repay any benefit payments paid if it is determined that the member did not terminate employment covered by the retirement system.**

(9) Any member who is receiving a disability retirement allowance from the retirement system and who has not attained age sixty (60) may not be employed for any employer the compensation for which employment would constitute a livelihood[,] and continue to receive the disability retirement allowance. **Such member working for an employer covered by the retirement system shall not contribute on such earnings and shall earn no service credit for such employment.** The board of trustees will determine that a member who has been approved for disability retirement and is receiving a disability retirement allowance is earning a livelihood for any given year when, not including the member's disability retirement allowance, the member earns more than twelve (12) times the Substantial Gainful Activity monthly limit for non-blind Social Security Disability Insurance recipients for that year. Income is earned for purposes of this section when it is received as a result of wages including bonuses, commissions, severance pay, or is net earnings from self-employment. Investment income, pensions, capital gains, legal settlements or judgments, rental income that is not a

part of self-employment (e.g., someone who is in the business of renting property), support or alimony payments, and inheritances are some examples of unearned income which would not count toward the earnings limit. The recipient of disability retirement benefits who has not attained age sixty (60) shall be required to submit an annual verification of income and may be required to submit tax returns, W-2 forms, paystubs, and other forms of documentation as evidence of continued eligibility for disability retirement.

**(13) When a disability retiree reaches the age of sixty (60), the retiree's retirement will be considered a service retirement rather than a disability retirement and the applicable service retirement regulations shall apply.**

*(B) If the member was in a position which required Social Security contributions to be withheld from the salary payments in the 1956-57 school year, the calculation must be made on the basis of an employee with Social Security coverage.*

(2) If the member was inactive at the time House Bill 34 became effective and the last teaching services prior to the inactive status did not require the withholding of Social Security contributions, when the member returns to teaching the following will prevail:

(A) If the member's employment does not require withholding of contributions for Social Security, all services will be valued under the full formula; and

(B) If the member's employment requires the withholding of contributions for Social Security, the previous services will be valued under the full formula and services after July 1, 1957, under the formula used with Social Security coverage.

(3) If the member was inactive at the time House Bill 34 became effective and the last teaching services prior to the inactive status required the withholding of Social Security contributions, when the member returns to teaching the following will prevail:

(A) If employment requires withholding of contributions for Social Security, all services will be valued under the formula used with Social Security coverage; and

(B) If employment does not require withholding of contributions for Social Security, all services will be valued under the full formula.]

[(4)](1)The monthly benefit for those applicants for retirement beginning January 1, 1976, who have taught in systems where full contributions are required and also where two-thirds (2/3) contributions are required shall be the sum obtained by applying the average monthly salary for the best [five (5)] **three (3)** years of teaching service while a member of the retirement system times the appropriate formula provided in section 169.070, RSMo, for each year or fraction of a year of service in a district where full contributions are required, and that obtained by applying the same final average salary times the same formula times two-thirds (2/3) for every year or fraction of a year in which the member contributed at two-thirds (2/3) the rate, provided a member with service in a system covered by Old Age Survivor's Insurance (OASI) prior to July 1, 1961, made the retroactive payment in accordance with [subdivision] **section** 169.070.10, RSMo. This section of this rule applies only to the teacher system.

The election must be made in writing and filed with the board of trustees prior to July 1, 1985, and will be irrevocable after that date. If the election is not made prior to July 1, 1985, the person shall establish membership in and contribute to The Public School Retirement System of Missouri for services rendered in that position after June 30, 1985, as long as s/he remains eligible for membership under section 169.010(16), RSMo.

(4) Any person whose employment is full-time as defined by The Public School Retirement System of Missouri and is thus eligible as of July 1, 1995, for coverage under The Public School Retirement System of Missouri, and which employment prior to July 1, 1995, required membership in The Public Education Employee Retirement System of Missouri, may make an irrevocable election for continued membership under The Public Education Employee Retirement System for the duration of employment in the same position with the same employer if the election is made in writing and filed with the board of trustees by September 30, 1995. If the election is not filed by that date, the employee shall participate as of July 1, 1995, in The Public School Retirement System of Missouri because of that employment as long as the person remains eligible for membership under section 169.010(16), RSMo.]

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies that a member must have five (5) years of credible service and be vested in order to purchase Social Security covered employment service credit and deletes obsolete or duplicative provisions.*

*[(14)](14) “Public college” as that phrase is used in section 169.655.3, RSMo, and “private college” as that phrase is used in section 169.655.9, RSMo, shall include junior colleges and community colleges either inside or outside of Missouri. “Private school, college, or university” as that phrase is used in section 169.655.9, RSMo, shall not include trade schools.]*

*[(15)](14) The following provisions shall apply to the purchase of creditable service under section 105.691, RSMo:*

*(A) A member may elect to purchase creditable service under section 105.691, RSMo, only if the member had previously acquired creditable service in a retirement plan defined in that section for the employment to which the election applies[;], except that if the service did not meet the membership requirements of the employer’s retirement plan or the employer had no such retirement plan at the time the service was rendered, but the service would otherwise have met the membership requirements of this system as in effect when the election is made, the member shall be eligible to purchase such creditable service. The creditable service allowable shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 105.691, RSMo, and the rules of the board of trustees; and*

*(B) A member who does not complete payment in full on an application to purchase creditable service under section 105.691, RSMo, within the time limit prescribed by law may reapply to purchase creditable service for that same period of employment. The member may apply within the limits of the law to purchase creditable service for any other period of employment for which application to purchase creditable service was not previously made.*

*[(16)](15) Unless otherwise required by law, membership service credit purchased under the laws governing the retirement system cannot be used to establish eligibility for benefits under sections 169.600 to 169.715, RSMo, but such purchased credit may be used in computing the value of any benefits to which a member would otherwise qualify under those sections.*

*[(17)](16) Unless a different amount is required by law, members must have accrued at least one (1) year of membership service credit for employment in a position covered by the retirement system in order to apply to purchase service credit.*

*[(18)](17) The salary used in calculating the cost of creditable service purchased is not compensation payable to a member as that phrase is used in section 169.600(7), RSMo, and shall not be used in determining final average salary.]*

*[(19)](17) Unless otherwise required by law, if the total payments made within the time allowed to purchase credit is*

insufficient to purchase all the credit for which the member applied, proportional credit shall be allowed based on the ratio between the amount due for the entire period for which the member applied and the total amount of the payments applied to reduce the principal amount due.

*[(20)](18) A member electing to purchase membership service credit for service in the armed forces may purchase one (1) year of credit for each twelve- (12-) month period of such service. For any such period of service in the armed forces of less than twelve (12) months, the member shall receive proportional credit computed to the nearest one-one-hundred thousandth (0.00001) of a year[;], provided that if the member entered active duty in the armed forces no later than the date on which the member’s services were to have begun under an employment agreement with a district included in the retirement system, and if the total period of active military service that year would have entitled the member to a year of creditable service had that service been rendered with the district, the member shall be eligible to purchase a full year of credit. No more than one (1) year of membership service credit shall be allowed for service in the armed forces or for a combination of service in the armed forces and actual service in a district included in the retirement system, for any one (1) school year.*

*[(21)](19) The following provisions apply with respect to a purchase of credit for maternity or paternity leave pursuant to section 169.655, RSMo:*

*(A) A period of leave shall be considered maternity or paternity leave for which membership service credit may be purchased if –*

- 1. The leave was unpaid;*
- 2. The leave related to a natural birth or legal adoption;*
- 3. The member was employed in a position covered by The Public Education Employee Retirement System at the time the leave relating to the initial natural birth or legal adoption began;*
- 4. The member provides written confirmation that the leave was maternity or paternity leave;*
- 5. The member provides a copy of a birth certificate, certification of adoption, or physician’s certification which indicates that the event occurred within a reasonable time before or after the period of maternity or paternity leave began; and*
- 6. The member returns to employment in a position covered by The Public Education Employee Retirement System;*

*(B) The maternity or paternity leave for which membership service credit may be purchased shall terminate upon the member’s return to covered employment and may not exceed one (1) year for each natural birth or legal adoption; and*

*(C) A member may elect to purchase some or all of the period of maternity or paternity leave for which the member is eligible.*

*(C) A member may elect to purchase some or all of the period of maternity or paternity leave for which the member is eligible.*

*[(22)](20) A purchase of credit for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.655.11, RSMo, shall be allowed only in a manner consistent with Title 26 of the *United States Code* and, in addition, shall be governed by the following provisions:*

*(A) The member must have five (5) years of creditable service and be vested with the retirement system prior to purchasing credit for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.655.11, RSMo;*

*(B) The retirement system shall allow the purchase of no more than five (5) years of credit for “nonqualified service” as that term is defined in section 415 of Title 26 of the *United**

*States Code* if doing so would jeopardize the tax qualified status of the retirement system pursuant to the *Internal Revenue Code* and the retirement system determines that the provisions of section 415(n) of Title 26 of the *United States Code* apply to the purchase of such member's purchase;

(C) The member must supply evidence satisfactory to the retirement system that the member is eligible to purchase credit for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.655.11, RSMo;

(D) The member must submit to the retirement system a detailed statement of the member's employment history created by the Social Security Administration in a format satisfactory to the retirement system; and

(E) The retirement system shall determine the amount of credit that may be purchased for Social Security covered employment pursuant to section 169.655.11, RSMo, based on the information provided pursuant to this section of this rule.

(1) **A member qualifying for service retirement shall file a written application with the board of trustees on a form provided by the board before s/he can become eligible to receive retirement allowance payments. The application for service retirement must be filed no earlier than one (1) year (twelve (12) months) before the effective retirement date of the member. An incomplete application is void after six (6) months of being filed with the board of trustees.** The earliest date on which retirement may become effective is the first day of the calendar month following the calendar month in which the services of the member are terminated, or the first day of the calendar month following the filing of the application for retirement, whichever is later[;], except that the earliest date on which retirement may become effective for a member who receives a year of membership service credit for the final school year in which the member serves shall be July 1 next following the member's last day of service. The member must complete any changes to the application by the close of business on the day the member's first monthly benefit is paid by the Public Education Employee Retirement System of Missouri. Termination from employment covered by the retirement system prior to the effective date of retirement is required to be eligible for a retirement benefit. A member shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if the member is employed in any capacity by an employer covered by the retirement system within one (1) month after his or her effective date of retirement. Effective July 1, 2016, a member shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if, prior to receipt of his or her first benefit payment, the member reaches an agreement, whether written or unwritten, for future employment in any capacity by an employer covered by the retirement system. The member shall be required to repay any benefit payments paid if it is determined that the member did not terminate employment covered by the retirement system.

**16 CSR 10-6.070 Disability Retirement.** The Public School Retirement System is amending sections (1), (6), and (9), and adding new section (13).

*PURPOSE: This amendment clarifies the timing to file an application for disability retirement, the termination of employment requirements for disability retirement, that disability retirees may work after retirement if they meet certain requirements and that such retirees will not pay contributions on these earnings or receive service credit for working after retirement, and that disability retirement for any retiree who is sixty (60) years of age or older is considered a service retirement.*

(1) A member claiming disability retirement must file an application for retirement with the board of trustees on a form provided by the board. **The application for disability retirement must be filed no later than one (1) year (twelve (12) months) after the member becomes disabled.**

(6) The earliest date on which disability retirement may become effective is the first day of the calendar month following the calendar month in which the services of the member are terminated, or the first day of the month following the month in which the claim is approved, whichever is later[;], except that the earliest date on which disability retirement may become effective for a member retiring after receiving credit for a year of membership service shall be July 1, the first day of the school year following the termination of services. Termination from employment covered by the retirement system prior to the effective date of disability retirement is required to be eligible for a disability retirement benefit. **A member shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if the member is employed in any capacity by an employer covered by the retirement system or by a third party or independent contractor if such member is performing work in a district included in the retirement system as a temporary or long-term substitute teacher or in any position that would normally require that person to be duly certificated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education within one (1) month after his or her effective**

**date of retirement. A member shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if, prior to receipt of his or her first benefit payment, the member reaches an agreement, whether written or unwritten, for future employment in any capacity by an employer covered by the retirement system. A member also shall not be deemed to have terminated employment if, prior to receipt of his or her first benefit payment, the member reaches an agreement, whether written or unwritten, for future employment with a third party or independent contractor if such member is performing work in a district included in the retirement system as a temporary or long-term substitute teacher or in any position that would normally require that person to be duly certificated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. The member shall be required to repay any benefit payments paid if it is determined that the member did not terminate employment covered by the retirement system.**

(9) Any member who is receiving a disability retirement allowance from the retirement system and who has not attained age sixty (60) may not be employed for any employer the compensation for which employment would constitute a livelihood[,] and continue to receive the disability retirement allowance. **Such member working for an employer covered by the retirement system shall not contribute on such earnings and shall earn no service credit for such employment.** The board of trustees will determine that a member who has been approved for disability retirement and is receiving a disability retirement allowance is earning a livelihood for any given year when, not including the member's disability retirement allowance, the member earns more than twelve (12) times the Substantial Gainful Activity monthly limit for non-blind Social Security Disability Insurance recipients for that year. Income is earned for purposes of this section when it is received as a result of wages including bonuses, commissions, severance pay, or is net earnings from self-employment. Investment income, pensions, capital gains, legal settlements or judgments, rental income that is not a part of self-employment (e.g., someone who is in the business of renting property), support or alimony payments, and inheritances are some examples of unearned income which would not count toward the earnings limit. The recipient of disability retirement benefits who has not attained age sixty (60) shall be required to submit an annual verification of income and may be required to submit tax returns, W-2 forms, paystubs, and other forms of documentation as evidence of continued eligibility for disability retirement.

**(13) When a disability retiree reaches the age of sixty (60), the retiree's retirement will be considered a service retirement rather than a disability retirement and the applicable service retirement regulations shall apply.**

(11) Prior to allowing any person who has been hired in a full-time, part-time, or temporary position to have contact with any residents, the facility shall, or in the case of temporary employees hired through or contracted for an employment agency, the employment agency shall, prior to sending a temporary employee to a provider[;]–

(A) Request a criminal background check for the person, as provided in section 43.540, RSMo. Each facility must maintain in its record documents verification that the background checks were requested and the nature of the response received for each such request. II

1. The facility must ensure that any applicant or person hired or retained who discloses prior to the receipt of the criminal background check that he or she has been [convicted of, pled] found guilty [or pled nolo contendere to] in this state or any other state or has been found guilty of a crime, which if committed in Missouri would be a class A or B felony violation of Chapter 565, 566, or 569, RSMo, or any violation of subsection 198.070.3, RSMo, or of section 568.020, RSMo, will not have contact with residents. I/II

2. Upon receipt of the criminal background check, the facility must ensure that if the criminal background check indicates that the person hired or retained by the facility has been [convicted of, pled] found guilty [or pled nolo contendere to] in this state or any other state or has been found guilty of

a crime, which if committed in Missouri would be a class A or B felony violation of Chapter 565, 566, or 569, RSMo, or any violation of subsection 198.070.3, RSMo, or of section 568.020, RSMo, the person will not have contact with residents unless the facility obtains verification from the department that a good cause waiver has been granted and maintains a copy of the verification in the individual’s personnel file; I/II

(B) Make an inquiry to the department, whether the person is listed on the employee disqualification list as provided in section [660.315] 192.2490, RSMo. The inquiry may be made [via Internet] at [www.dhss.mo.gov/EDL/] www.health.mo.gov/safety/edl; II/III

(C) If the person has registered with the department’s Family Care Safety Registry (FCSR), the facility may utilize the Registry in order to meet the requirements of subsections [(1)](11) (A) and (11)(B) of this rule. The FCSR is available [via Internet] at [www.dhss.mo.gov/EDL/] www.health.mo.gov/safety/fcsr; and II/III

(13) The facility must develop and implement written policies and procedures which require that persons hired for any position which is to have contact with any [patient or] resident have been informed of their responsibility to disclose their prior criminal history to the facility as required by section [660.317.5]192.2495, RSMo. The facility must also develop and implement policies and procedures which ensure that the facility does not knowingly hire, after August 28, 1997, any person who has or may have contact with a [patient or] resident[,] who has been [convicted of, plead] found guilty [or nolo contendere to,] in this state or any other state[,] or has been found guilty of [any] a crime, which if committed in Missouri would be a class A or B felony violation of Chapter 565, 566, or 569, RSMo, or any violation of subsection [3 of section] 198.070.3, RSMo, or of section 568.020, RSMo. II/III

(21) The administrator/manager shall maintain on the premises an individual personnel record on each facility employee, which shall include the following:

(E) Documentation of experience and education including, for positions requiring licensure or certification, documentation evidencing competency for the position held, which includes copies of current licenses, transcripts when applicable, or for those individuals requiring certification, such as level I medication aides (LIMA), certified nurse aides, certified medication technicians (CMT), and insulin administration aides; printing the Web Registry search results page available at [www.dhss.mo.gov/cnaregistry] www.health.mo.gov/cnaregistry shall meet the requirements of the employer’s check regarding valid certification[;];

(G) The results of background checks required by section [660.317] 192.2495, RSMo[;], and a copy of any good cause waiver granted by the department, if applicable;

[(I)] Written statement signed by a licensed physician or physician’s designee indicating the person can work in a long-term care facility and indicating any limitations[;]

[(J)](I) Documentation of the employee’s [tubercilin] tuberculin screening status;

[(K)](I) Documentation of what the employee was instructed on during orientation training; and

[(L)](K) Reason for termination if the employee was terminated due to abuse or neglect of a resident, residents’ rights issues, or resident injury. III

(3) Acceptable supervised licensed social work experience has the following characteristics:

(A) Allowable supervision –

1. A minimum of two (2) hours every two (2) weeks of individual face-to-face supervision by the supervisor;

2. However, individual face-to-face supervision may be consolidated for up to four (4) weeks for a total of four (4) hours of individual face-to-face supervision per four- (4-) week period. These hours shall be included in the total number of supervised hours required in subsection (3)(B) **and exclude clinical work, unless the clinical work is completed under part-time employment.** Fifty percent (50%) of supervision per month may be group supervision;

3. For the purpose of this rule, group supervision may consist of at least two (2) and no more than six (6) supervisees; and

4. The use of electronic communications is acceptable for meeting supervision requirements of this rule only if the ethical standards for confidentiality are maintained and communication is verbally and visually interactive between the supervisor and the supervisee;

(B) The minimum acceptable supervised experience shall be three thousand (3,000) hours obtained in no less than twenty-four (24) and no more than forty-eight (48) consecutive calendar months. The forty-eight- (48-) month time frame may include periods of unemployment and/or part-time employment **or leave deemed appropriate by the committee.** The total time frame is calculated in consecutive months, not the employment within that period. Supervised experience toward the three thousand (3,000) required hours which is not within a consecutive forty-eight- (48-) month period is not eligible for submission toward licensure; and

**(6) Supervisees seeking an exception in the acceptance of the supervised experience requirements shall submit a written request to the committee, which will be considered at the discretion of the committee on a case-by-case basis.**

This rule is substantially outdated and also contradicts current statutes. The Missouri Supreme Court has identified this rule as deficient for failing to accommodate the federal regulation concerning what the amendment refers to as relief extensions. Therefore, the rule must be amended. No changes have been made to the rule as a result of this comment.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 1, 2025 (50 MoReg 1348-1349). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Missouri Health Facilities Review Committee (committee) received five (5) public comments on the proposed amendment.

COMMENT #1: Richard W. Hill of Lashly & Baer, P.C., opposes section (5), stating the inclusion of renovation, modernization,

and conversion is an inappropriate expansion of the term “construction” as utilized by the legislature. Moreover, the removal of the phrase “not licensed as a hospital” violates the statutory intent of the word construction, as there can be no construction of a new hospital within a hospital that has already been constructed. The proposed regulation removes any meaning of the word “construction” and, contrary to the plain legislative intent, converts the effective meaning of the statutory language to “establishment of a newly licensed hospital, regardless of whether construction is involved.” If the legislature intended to require review for the establishment of any newly licensed hospital, it would have simply utilized exact same language in other parts of section 197.366, RSMo, that does exactly that. The legislature chose not to do so. As such, the proposed rule is an inappropriate expansion that violates the CON statute and is void pursuant to black letter Missouri administrative law and section 536.014, RSMo.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The committee has removed the amendment from this section. After consideration of Mr. Hill’s comment, the committee determined that additional time is required to further review the amendment prior to any further action.

COMMENT #2: John Mohart, MD and Chief Operating Officer for Mercy, opposes section (14), stating that preparing full, new CON applications for equipment replacement projects that were previously approved under \$1M increases workload and puts the communities we serve at risk of losing equipment that has been relied on for years.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The committee has amended the language in section (14) to remove the requirements of replacement equipment that projects must currently hold prior CON approval and replacement equipment without prior CON approval must submit a CON application for new equipment. Providers may continue to use the expedited CON application to replace equipment instead of filing a new equipment CON application, which significantly decreases the workload for the providers.

COMMENT #3: Richard W. Hill of Lashly & Baer, P.C., opposes section (14), stating the second sentence violates section 197.305(9)(f), RSMo, and applicants with equipment replacement projects without prior CON approval generally have provided services to the relevant community with the existing equipment for a long period of time before requiring a replacement. Requiring a full, new equipment application for these types of projects puts the community at risk of losing the services of the relevant piece of equipment. Mr. Hill also references section 197.305(9)(f), RSMo, which refers to services not offered within a twelve- (12-) month period; the proposed language should reflect equipment not operated in over twelve (12) months versus six (6) months.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The committee has amended the language in section (14) to remove the requirements of replacement equipment projects that must currently hold prior CON approval and replacement equipment without prior CON approval must submit a CON application for new equipment. Providers may continue to use the expedited CON application to replace equipment instead of filing a new equipment CON application, which significantly decreases the workload for the providers. Additionally, the committee concurs that proposed language should reflect equipment not operated in over twelve (12) months should file a new CON application and has made that change. This will reflect the same time constraint as section 197.305(9)(f), RSMo.

COMMENT #4: Gregory Bratcher of BJC HealthCare supports requiring major medical equipment proposed for replacement to be operational within the last six months in section (14). However, also requiring any machine without a previous CON to be reviewed as if it had never existed does not advance this cause. It puts the committee in the awkward position of pretending that existing medical equipment does not exist. That would be the effect of this clause in the proposed rule: *“Equipment to be replaced that does not currently hold a valid CON must submit a CON application for new equipment if costing one (1) million dollars or more.”* Mr. Bratcher suggests removing that clause from the rule and changing the verbiage to *“Applicants seeking to replace major medical equipment shall provide a sworn affidavit that attests that the equipment being replaced is owned or leased by the applicant, is physically at the location specified on the “Applicant Identification and Certification” form, and has been operational at that same site within the past six months.”*

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The committee has amended the language in section (14) to remove the requirements of replacement equipment projects that must currently hold prior CON approval and replacement equipment without prior CON approval must submit a CON application for new equipment. Providers may continue to use the expedited CON application to replace equipment instead of filing a new equipment CON application, which significantly decreases the workload for the providers. The committee thanks Mr. Bratcher for his suggestion of requiring replacement equipment applications to provide a sworn affidavit and will consider that requirement in future rulemaking.

COMMENT #5: Gregory Bratcher of BJC HealthCare suggests in section (19) adding *“The relicensed facility must remain solely at the address that was on record at the expiration of the original license.”*

RESPONSE: The committee thanks Mr. Bratcher for his suggested language addition and will consider the language in future rulemaking. No changes were made to the rule as a result of this comment.

Otherwise, questions pertinent to a replacement decision would not be addressed. Questions like these would not be part of the CON application: Describe the effect the replacement unit would have on quality of care; Document if the existing equipment is in constant need of repair; Describe the technological advances provided by the new unit. The comment submitted pertains to 19 CSR 60-50.430(2)(C)4. and CON form MO 580-2506 within this rule and replacement equipment without prior CON approval.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The committee concurs and will keep the existing language in paragraph (2)(C)4. and will amend form MO 580-2506 to keep Divider IV pertaining to equipment replacement projects without prior CON approval.

COMMENT #4: Alison Dorge, CON Program Coordinator for the department, commented that the effective date on the bottom of forms MO 580-2501 and MO 580-2504 are incorrect and should reflect 03/2026 revisions since the form is being updated with changes as submitted in the proposed rulemaking. Form MO 580-2506 should revert back to the original form dated 11/2022.
