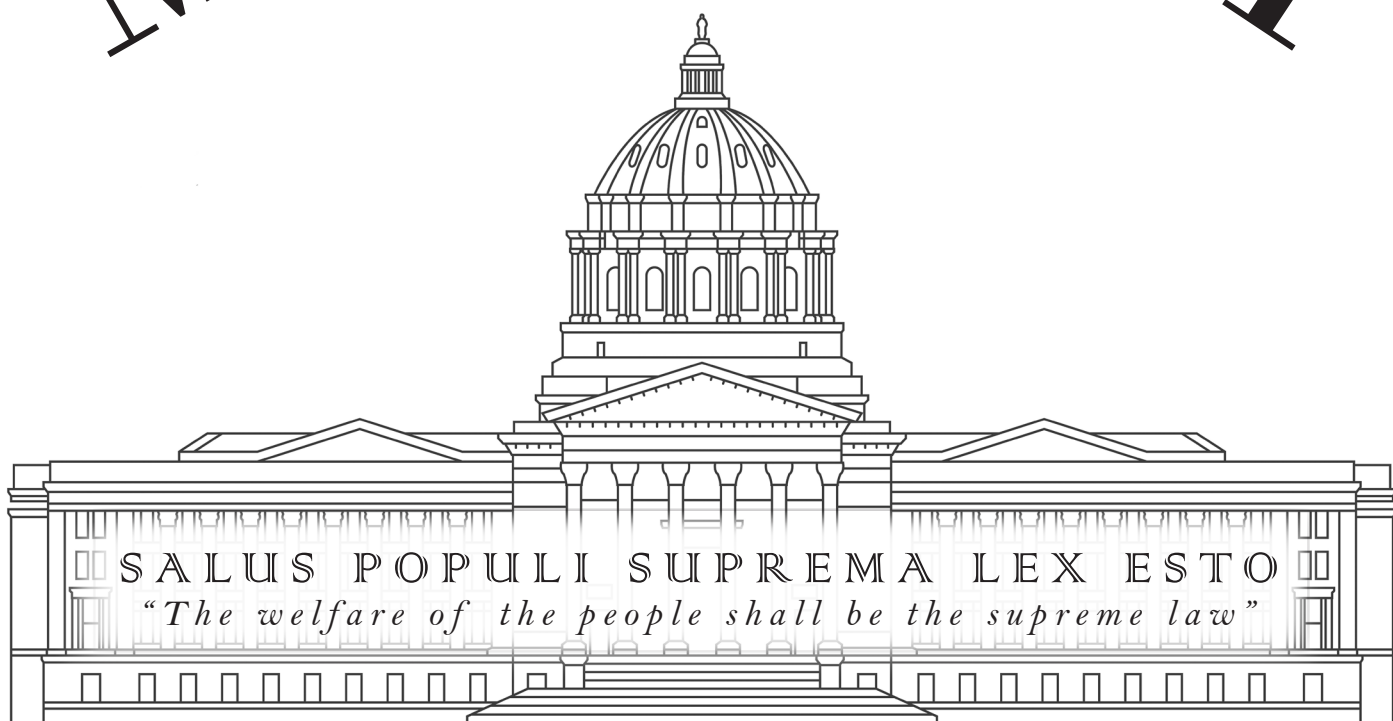

Each department of state government is assigned a title. Each agency or division in the department is assigned a division number. The agency then groups its rules into general subject matter areas called chapters and specific areas called rules. Within a rule, the first breakdown is called a section and is designated as (1). Subsection is (A) with further breakdown into paragraphs 1., subparagraphs A., parts (I), subparts (a), items I. and subitems a.

The rule is properly cited by using the full citation; for example, 3 CSR 10-4.115, NOT Rule 10-4.115.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 26-09

WHEREAS, on September 22, 2025, I declared a drought alert for 85 counties and the City of St. Louis through Executive Order 25-29; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-29 was extended by Executive Order 25-34; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 25-34 is set to expire on April 1, 2026; and

WHEREAS, Adair, Andrew, Atchison, Barry, Barton, Bollinger, Butler, Carter, Christian, Clark, Daviess, DeKalb, Douglas, Dunklin, Gentry, Grundy, Harrison, Holt, Howell, Iron, Jasper, Knox, Lawrence, Lewis, Lincoln, Linn, Livingston, Macon, Madison, Marion, McDonald, Mercer, Mississippi, New Madrid, Newton, Nodaway, Oregon, Ozark, Pemiscot, Pike, Putnam, Reynolds, Ripley, Schuyler, Scotland, Scott, Shannon, Stoddard, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Wayne, and Worth are currently experiencing at least moderate drought conditions; and

WHEREAS, additional counties may enter moderate, severe, extreme or exceptional drought according to the U.S. Drought Monitor and those counties shall also be declared in drought alert; and

WHEREAS, drought conditions remain such that the drought-response efforts described in Executive Orders 25-29 and 25-34 are necessary to support continued mitigation.

NOW THEREFORE, I, MIKE KEHOE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, by virtue and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Missouri, do hereby extend Executive Order 25-34.

I further direct that as additional counties enter moderate, severe, extreme, or exceptional drought according to the U.S. Drought Monitor, they shall be declared in Drought Alert in accordance with the Missouri Drought Mitigation and Response Plan.

This Order shall terminate on September 1, 2026, unless extended in whole or in part.

The text of proposed rules and changes will appear under this heading. A notice of proposed rulemaking is required to contain an explanation of any new rule or any change in an existing rule and the reasons therefor. This explanation is set out in the PURPOSE section of each rule. A citation of the legal authority to make rules is also required, and appears following the text of the rule, after the word "Authority."

Entirely new rules are printed without any special symbology under the heading of proposed rule. If an existing rule is to be amended or rescinded, it will have a heading of proposed amendment or proposed rescission. Rules that are proposed to be amended will have new matter printed in boldface type and matter to be deleted placed in brackets.

An important function of the *Missouri Register* is to solicit and encourage public participation in the rulemaking process. The law provides that for every proposed rule, amendment, or rescission there must be a notice that anyone may comment on the proposed action. This comment may take different forms.

If an agency is required by statute to hold a public hearing before making any new rules, then a Notice of Public Hearing will appear following the text of the rule. Hearing dates must be at least thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*. If no hearing is planned or required, the agency must give a Notice to Submit Comments. This allows anyone to file statements in support of or in opposition to the proposed action with the agency within a specified time, no less than thirty (30) days after publication of the notice in the *Missouri Register*.

An agency may hold a public hearing on a rule even though not required by law to hold one. If an agency allows comments to be received following the hearing date, the close-of-comments date will be used as the beginning day in the ninety- (90-) day count necessary for the filing of the order of rulemaking.

If an agency decides to hold a public hearing after planning not to, it must withdraw the earlier notice, file a new notice of proposed rulemaking, and schedule a hearing for a date not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of the new notice.

1 CSR 60-1.010 Registration for Prescription Drug Monitoring Program. The Joint Task Force for Prescription Drug Monitoring is amending section (3) to better conform with authorizing statute.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

5 CSR 25-100.330 General Provisions Governing Programs Authorized Under the Early Childhood Development Act. The department is amending subsection (1)(B).

PURPOSE: This amendment incorporates the May 2026 revision to the Early Childhood Development Act (ECDA) Administrative Manual to provide further clarification and address the changes made to the approved curriculum and training requirements.

(1) All programs and projects carried out by school districts under the Early Childhood Development Act (ECDA) shall be conducted in conformity with –

(B) The *Early Childhood Development Act (ECDA) Administrative Manual for Missouri Parents as Teachers Parent Education Program* contains the administrative provisions for the delivery of the state’s school district parent education

services. The *ECDA Manual* is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this rule. A copy of the *ECDA Manual* (revised [September 2022] May 2026) is published by and can be obtained from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Office of Childhood, 205 Jefferson Street, PO Box 480, Jefferson City, MO 65102-0480, and at its website at <https://dese.mo.gov/governmental-affairs/dese-administrativerules/incorporated-reference-materials>. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions.

TITLE 12 – DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE
Division 40 – State Lottery
Chapter 100 – Fast Play Game

PROPOSED RULE

12 CSR 40-100.010 Fast Play Game

PURPOSE: The purpose of this rule is to define Fast Play as a game for the Missouri Lottery.

(1) The following rule shall define the game Fast Play as a game for the Missouri Lottery:

(A) A Fast Play game is an immediate print and play terminal game designed to display instant game play results generated by a host computer and printed by a lottery terminal. The system distributes outcomes based upon the probabilities within each game's prize structure;

(B) The specific game mechanics and prize structure will be published and available on the Missouri Lottery's website, MoLottery.com, one (1) week prior to the first sale of each game;

(C) The outcome is determined by the system at the point of purchase and is not determined by a scheduled drawing or by the skill or judgment of the player. A player does not pick his or her own winning numbers or symbols;

(D) Fast Play game tickets may not be canceled;

(E) The lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Fast Play game tickets;

(F) A Fast Play ticket is a bearer instrument until signed on the back by the owner(s); and

(G) All winning tickets for any Fast Play game must be claimed, as defined in lottery policy, within one hundred

eighty (180) days of purchase.

(2) Fast Play Game Validation Requirements.

(A) All the following requirements must be met for a Fast Play game ticket to be valid:

1. The ticket validation number shall be presented in its entirety and shall correspond using the computer validation file to the selected numbers displayed on the ticket for the data displayed on the ticket;

2. The ticket shall –

A. Not be altered, reconstituted, or tampered with in any manner;

B. Not be counterfeit or a duplicate of another winning ticket;

C. Have been issued by the lottery through a retailer in an authorized manner;

D. Not have been canceled or voided; and

E. Be validated in accordance with procedures for claiming and payment of prizes;

3. The ticket data shall –

A. Have been recorded in the computer gaming system; and

B. Match this computer record in every respect;

4. The ticket may not be misregistered, unregistered or unissued, or defectively printed to an extent that it cannot be processed by the lottery;

5. The ticket shall pass all other confidential security checks of the lottery;

6. The information printed on the ticket stock shall not be interpreted as providing any prize or procedure other than that authorized by the lottery for that game; and

7. The director may allow exceptions to the criteria in this rule.

(3) The director, solely at his or her option, may replace an invalid or defective ticket with a new replacement ticket. In the event that a defective ticket is purchased, the only responsibility of the lottery shall be replacement of the defective ticket with any Fast Play game currently on sale.

(4) Fast Play games offer tiered prizes and may offer a progressive jackpot with a percentage of the total jackpot amount based upon the Fast Play game ticket price. Purchases for Fast Play games that feature a progressive jackpot contribute towards a shared progressive jackpot that will increase with every ticket purchase.

(5) The Missouri Lottery may join other states and jurisdictions for the purpose of conducting joint Fast Play lottery games.

TITLE 19 – DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SENIOR SERVICES
Division 100 – Division of Cannabis Regulation
Chapter 1 – Marijuana

PROPOSED RULE

19 CSR 100-1.200 Marijuana Research Facilities

PURPOSE: Under Article XIV, Section 2, of the Missouri Constitution, the Department of Health and Senior Services has the authority to create and issue additional licenses intended to facilitate scientific research or education. This rule describes what a research license is authorized to do and the application requirements for such a license.

(1) Definitions.

(A) “Animal subject” means any animal as defined in the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. section 2132, being used as part of an approved research study.

(B) “Assent” means an affirmative agreement to participate in licensed research studies as a human subject, made by a non-emancipated human subject or human subject otherwise not legally able to provide informed consent. A failure to object should not, absent affirmative agreement, be construed as assent.

(C) “Delivery,” as used in this rule, means the movement of marijuana to human and animal subjects as part of and in compliance with a department-approved research study.

(D) “Human subject” means an individual person participating in a research study whose data or biospecimens may be collected through intervention or interaction with the individual.

(E) “Informed consent” means the legally effective knowing permission and agreement of an individual or their legally authorized representative, so situated as to be able to exercise free power of choice without undue inducement or any element of force, fraud, deceit, duress, or other form of constraint or coercion, to engage in licensed research studies as a human subject.

(F) “Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee” (IACUC) means an independent committee that oversees all research with animals. The IACUC requires researchers to give reason to their need for animals in research, ensure they select appropriate species for the research, and use of the fewest number of animals in the research to reach their desired outcome.

(G) “Institutional review board” (IRB) means a human research review committee established and approved under the provisions of Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations Part 46 or Title 42 of U.S.C. section 289, for the purpose of reviewing and monitoring research.

(H) “Non-emancipated human subject” means a human subject under the age of eighteen (18) who has not been emancipated under Missouri law.

(I) “Principal investigator” means an individual who conducts a research study or, in the event of a research study conducted by a team of individuals, is the responsible leader of that team.

(J) “Personally identifiable information” means information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual’s identity, or to contact or locate an individual, either alone or when combined with other information that is linked or linkable to a specific individual.

(K) “Public institution” means any entity established or

controlled by the federal government, a state government, or a local government or municipality, including but not limited to an institution of higher education or a public higher education research institution.

(L) “Research study” means a discrete scientific endeavor to answer a research question or a set of research questions.

(2) All activities under this rule must comply with applicable federal, state, tribal, local, and municipal laws and regulations.

(3) Marijuana research facilities, generally.

(A) A marijuana research licensee’s authority to engage in activities intended to facilitate scientific research or education related to marijuana product includes the ability to –

1. Acquire and transfer marijuana product from a cultivation or manufacturing facility;

2. Cultivate marijuana;

3. Process or manufacture marijuana product;

4. Store marijuana product on-site;

5. Transfer marijuana product to or from a marijuana testing facility or another marijuana research facility;

6. Sell or donate marijuana product to another marijuana research facility;

7. Sell or transfer marijuana seeds and clones produced from a research study to a cultivation facility with department approval;

8. Acquire and transfer marijuana seeds and plant material from entities not licensed under this chapter if doing so does not violate state or federal law;

9. Perform research on marijuana product;

10. Perform research on animal and human subjects related to the use of marijuana product;

11. Enter into contracts or agreements with a public institution or another marijuana research facility to conduct a research study;

12. Share space with a cultivation facility, manufacturing facility, or marijuana testing facility; and

13. Administer final marijuana product to animal subjects, human subjects above the age of twenty-one (21), or human subjects under the age of twenty-one (21) with a medical marijuana patient identification card, provided that the licensee has met all requirements of this chapter.

(B) A research licensee shall not sell or transfer marijuana product to a cultivation facility, manufacturing facility, or dispensary facility unless approved by the department.

(C) A research licensee’s authority to perform research on human subjects shall include the administration and delivery of marijuana product to human subjects but shall not include the sale of final marijuana product to consumers, qualifying patients, or primary caregivers.

(4) Marijuana research facility and study application process.

(A) Facility license and study applications will be considered complete if the application includes all documents required for applications by this rule.

(B) The department will receive applications for all research facility licenses and studies electronically through a department-provided, web-based application system. In the event of application system unavailability, the department will arrange to accept applications in an alternative, department-provided format and will notify the public of those arrangements through its website.

1. The department shall charge each applicant seeking a research facility license and research study approval an application fee to be submitted with the application. The department shall publish current fees, including any

adjustments, on its website.

2. Application fees are nonrefundable.

(C) The issuance of a research facility license does not authorize the research facility licensee to begin activities related to marijuana research authorized by the license. A research facility licensee will be granted final approval to operate upon passing a commencement inspection and approval of a research study.

(D) A research facility license shall be valid for three (3) years from its date of issuance.

(E) Research facility licenses may be renewed pursuant to the renewal requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.060.

(5) Marijuana research license application requirements. Entities must obtain a license to operate a marijuana research facility in Missouri. Applications for research facility licenses shall include, at a minimum, all of the following:

(A) Name and address of the designated contact for the applicant entity;

(B) Legal name of the applicant entity, including fictitious business names. In the case the group intending to perform marijuana research is part of an entity that performs other non-marijuana related activities, such as a university, an affiliated entity that will be conducting the marijuana research shall be the applicant entity;

(C) All owners of the applicant entity, with ownership percentage, and a visual representation of the facility's ownership structure, if applicable;

(D) Proposed address of the marijuana research facility and –

1. An attestation that the proposed facility location complies with the facility location requirements of this rule;

2. An attestation that the proposed facility location complies with any facility location requirements of the local government;

3. A copy of, and a hyperlink to, all local government requirements for facility location, such as zoning requirements, if applicable. Applicable sections shall be highlighted in the copy of the regulations; and

4. An indication of whether the proposed research facility will share a space with another facility;

(E) Proposed blueprints that outline the entire facility and feature all rooms and areas clearly labeled, including purpose and square footage, camera locations, limited access areas, and access permissions;

(F) For research facilities that will be cultivating marijuana, the cultivation practice(s) (indoor, outdoor, greenhouse) used by the facility and, if using a combination of practices, the ratio of cultivation space limits for each cultivation practice;

(G) An attestation that all individuals subject to analysis for disqualifying felony offenses will submit fingerprints within two (2) weeks after the application submission for a state and federal fingerprint-based criminal background check to be conducted by the Missouri State Highway Patrol;

(H) An attestation that no individual subject to analysis for a disqualifying felony offense has a disqualifying felony offense;

(I) A written plan for documenting all individuals who will have access to the research facility and marijuana product;

(J) A brief description of the research that will be conducted;

(K) An indication of whether the applicant intends to conduct research on human and/or animal subjects;

(L) An indication of whether the applicant intends to sell seeds and clones to a cultivation facility; and

(M) A non-refundable application fee of five hundred dollars (\$500).

(6) Marijuana research license application approval and denial

process.

(A) Applicants are responsible for submitting a complete and accurate facility application as set out in this rule. However, the department may request an applicant to provide additional information or documents needed to determine eligibility for a license by sending the request to the email address of the designated contact associated with the application. If requested, the applicant will have three (3) business days from the date the email is sent to provide the requested information or documents.

(B) If the department determines an application meets all of the license eligibility requirements in this rule and Article XIV, the license will be issued.

(C) An application will be denied if –

1. The application is not complete;

2. The applicant, application, or any proposal in the application is in violation of any rule in this chapter or Article XIV;

3. The applicant provides false or misleading information in an application; or

4. The applicant fails to timely provide information or records requested by the department.

(D) Any denial shall be issued by the department in writing to the applicant and shall include the specific reasons for the denial and the process for requesting review of the department's decision.

(7) Research study application requirements.

(A) A research licensee shall not conduct any research unless all aspects of its proposed research study have been reviewed and approved by the department.

(B) A description of the research that will be conducted must be submitted to the department for review and approval prior to commencing any research study, including –

1. Abstract;

2. Study question;

3. Study rationale;

4. Study protocol, including expected sample sizes and marijuana testing methods if applicable;

5. If the licensee plans to cultivate marijuana, the amount of marijuana to be cultivated with an explanation for that amount;

6. An indication of whether the licensee plans to sell seeds and clones produced from the research study; and

7. A non-refundable study application fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).

(C) Research study submissions must be made through a department provided, web-based system.

(D) Research studies involving human subjects.

1. A marijuana research licensee shall not conduct any research involving human subjects unless all aspects of its proposed research study have been reviewed and approved or determined exempt by the department's IRB and an IRB that is registered and in good standing with the Office for Human Research Protections, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, to be the IRB of record.

2. Research study applications shall be submitted following approval or determination of exempt status by the IRB of record and prior to department IRB review. Research studies must be reviewed and approved or determined exempt by both IRBs prior to commencing any research study involving human subjects. In addition to the requirements for all research studies, the following must be submitted to the department for review and approval:

A. Electronically completed department IRB review forms;

B. After study review by the department IRB, evidence of the study's approval by the department IRB;

C. The name of the IRB of record that will review the research study to be conducted on human subjects;

D. Evidence of the study's approval or determination of exempt status by the IRB of record;

E. Disclosures of any actual or apparent conflicts of interest between any applicant or agent and any member of the department IRB or IRB of record;

F. Attestation that a licensed physician in good standing will monitor human subjects participating in the study;

G. The name and license number of the licensed physician(s) monitoring the human subjects;

H. The name and curriculum vitae of the principal investigator;

I. A plan for obtaining a waiver of consent from both IRBs or informed consent from –

(I) All human subjects that are eighteen (18) years of age or older or are emancipated minors participating in a research study; and

(II) At least one (1) legal representative for each non-emancipated human subject and for each human subject who is otherwise not capable of understanding the information provided and making an informed decision; and

J. A plan for obtaining assent from all non-emancipated human subjects participating in a research study.

(E) Research studies involving animals.

1. A marijuana research facility shall not conduct any research involving animal subjects as defined in the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. section 2132, unless the marijuana research facility is registered with the U.S. Department of Agriculture pursuant to the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. sections 2131, et seq.

2. Research study applications shall be submitted following approval by an IACUC that is registered and in good standing with the National Institutes of Health Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare and prior to commencing any research study involving animal subjects. In addition to the requirements for all research studies, the following must be submitted to the department for review and approval:

A. The name of the IACUC that will review the research study to be conducted on animals;

B. Disclosures of any actual or apparent conflicts of interest between any applicant or agent and any member of the IACUC;

C. Attestation that a licensed veterinary doctor in good standing will monitor animal subjects participating in the study;

D. The name and license number of the licensed veterinary doctor(s) monitoring the animals subjects; and

E. The name and curriculum vitae of the principal investigator.

(8) Research study application approval and denial process.

(A) Marijuana research licensees are responsible for submitting a complete and accurate research study application as set out in this rule. However, the department may request a licensee to provide additional information or documents needed to determine eligibility for a study by sending the request to the email address of the designated contact associated with the licensee. If requested, the licensee will have three (3) business days from the date the email is sent to provide the requested information or documents.

(B) The department will communicate in writing to the licensee whether the submission is complete.

1. If deemed complete, the research study will be approved

or denied.

(C) If the department determines an application meets all of the research study requirements in this rule and Article XIV, the study will be approved.

(D) Once a research study has been approved, the licensee will receive a research study identification number.

(E) A research study application will be denied if –

1. The application is not complete;

2. The research licensee, study application, or any proposal in the study application is in violation of any rule in this chapter or Article XIV;

3. The licensee provides false or misleading information in an application; or

4. The licensee fails to timely provide information or records requested by the department.

(F) Any denial shall be issued by the department in writing to the licensee and shall include the specific reasons for the denial.

(9) Research facility and licensee requirements. Research facilities and licensees shall comply with the following:

(A) Research licensees and applicants have a continuing duty to provide the department with up-to-date contact information, including the individual who shall be the designated contact for all department communications. Licensees and applicants are deemed to have received all communications and notifications from the department on the date the department sends an email to the email address of the designated contact for the licensee or applicant;

(B) The designated contact for a research license application must be the research facility's principal investigator;

(C) 19 CSR 100-1.020 shall apply to research licenses;

(D) A research licensee must follow complaints, inspections, and investigations requirements pursuant to 19 CSR 100-1.030, unless otherwise stated.

1. If the department determines that a research licensee is not in compliance with the department's regulations or a department-approved research study, the department may, without prior notice of violation, impose penalties, including, but not limited to –

A. Suspending the research study;

B. Placing an administrative hold on marijuana product; and

C. Suspending the research license.

2. If there is a credible and imminent threat to public safety, the department may order the licensed research facility to immediately suspend all or part of the operations, including placing an administrative hold on marijuana product, until the threat has been eliminated. An imminent threat to public safety includes, but is not limited to –

A. A dangerous condition at the facility that is likely to harm employees or the public;

B. A credible report, such as from law enforcement, that diversion or inversion of marijuana product is occurring at the licensed facility;

C. A credible report that a research facility is transferring marijuana product to a licensed facility without department approval; and

D. A credible report that a research facility's practices are not following IRB or IACUC approved protocols;

(E) No research facility shall be owned, in whole or in part, by an individual with a disqualifying felony offense or who is prohibited by law or rule from having ownership interest in the license;

(F) Employees; contractors; owners exercising a controlling

influence over any research license's management, policies, or decision-making; and volunteers of a marijuana research facility must comply with the facility employment requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.070 and may not have a disqualifying felony offense. In addition to these employment requirements –

1. An individual performing maintenance work (such as plumbing) or other similar work not related to research, testing, transporting, growing, manufacturing, administering, or dispensing marijuana product at the research facility for no more than fourteen (14) days in a calendar year is not required to be screened for a disqualifying felony offense. The licensee is responsible for supervising such individuals while they are in the facility;

2. Licensees performing research studies involving human subjects must –

A. Designate a licensed physician in good standing that will monitor human subjects; and

B. Designate a principal investigator with at least five (5) years of experience in human subject research;

3. Licensees performing research studies involving animal subjects must –

A. Designate a licensed veterinary doctor in good standing that will monitor animal subjects; and

B. Designate a principal investigator with at least five (5) years of experience in animal subject research;

(G) A research licensee shall maintain records of employee training for at least five (5) years. A research licensee must ensure all of its facility employees, contractors, owners, and volunteers who are required to obtain a department-issued agent identification card adhere to all training requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.080, as well as the following:

1. If the facility agents are performing research studies involving human subjects, they must complete Good Clinical Practice training at least every three (3) years; and

2. If the facility agents are performing research studies involving animal subject, they must complete IACUC training at least every three (3) years;

(H) Research licenses and licensees must comply with the facility security requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.090;

(I) Research licenses and licensees must comply with the licensing, location, general operations, and signage requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.100 unless otherwise stated.

1. Consumption of marijuana product on the licensed premises, including in any approved transport vehicles, is prohibited except as specifically authorized within the context of a department-approved human or animal subject research study.

2. Licensees performing research studies involving human subjects must be in compliance with the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 set forth in Title 42 of the *Code of Federal Regulations*, Part 493.

3. Licensees performing research studies involving animal subjects must follow standards of handling, care, treatment, and transportation of animal subjects in Title 9 of the *Code of Federal Regulations*, Subchapter A;

(J) A research licensee must comply with the marijuana facility business change and notification and reporting requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.100 unless otherwise stated. In addition to these requirements –

1. A research licensee shall notify the department in writing of any changes in intent to conduct research on human or animals subjects;

2. A research licensee shall submit to the department a report at least annually, beginning one (1) year from receiving approval to operate, detailing the status of any ongoing and/or completed research studies in the previous year. Additionally,

a research licensee shall provide such report or documents at the request of the department within seven (7) days of the department issuing the request unless additional time is requested and granted;

3. A research licensee shall maintain and provide upon request of the department a written schedule for disposal of marijuana product after it has concluded research on that item;

4. A research licensee must send the department a copy of any report or notification they send to the IRB of record within twenty-four (24) hours of notifying the IRB of record;

5. A research licensee must send the department a copy of any report or notification they send to IACUC within twenty-four (24) hours of notifying IACUC;

6. A research licensee shall notify the department in writing of any changes to the principal investigator within twenty-four (24) hours of the change; and

7. The administrative and processing fees for business change applications will be the following:

A. Five hundred dollars (\$500) to transfer their license to a different entity;

B. One thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1250) to make any changes that would result in an individual or entity, other than a publicly traded company, becoming an owner of the licensed entity who was not previously an owner;

C. One thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1250) to make any change that would result in a publicly traded company becoming an owner; and

D. Five hundred dollars (\$500) to change the licensee's facility location;

(K) Research licensees may not perform mandatory testing of marijuana product as specified in 19 CSR 100-1.110.

1. Marijuana product shall not be administered to any human subject or animal subject as part of a research study until the marijuana product has been tested by a marijuana testing licensee pursuant to the provisions of 19 CSR 100-1.110, and the research licensee has received verification from the marijuana testing licensee that the marijuana product has passed mandatory testing.

A. Acceptable limits and deviation from the mean for each analyte in a marijuana product's cannabinoid profile shall follow values in protocols approved by an IRB or IACUC in each department-approved research study.

2. A marijuana testing facility that is owned by an entity or entities under substantially common control, ownership, or management as a research facility may not perform mandatory testing on marijuana product as part of a research study involving human or animal subjects at that research facility;

(L) Research licensees must comply with the following packaging and labeling requirements:

1. All marijuana product shall be produced, packaged, and labeled in a manner that protects public health and is not attractive to children.

A. No marijuana product may be manufactured, packaged, or labeled in a false or misleading manner, such as by inaccurately representing product ingredients.

B. Product packaging and design.

(I) For all marijuana product to be administered to human or animal subjects, packaging shall be constructed from FDA-approved food contact substances. Where marijuana product is packaged in a series of containers, the container closest to the product, including methods of administration or wrappers, must be compliant with this requirement, unless the department approves application of this rule to a different container in the series.

(II) All marijuana product packaging, apart from the universal symbol, may only utilize –

(a) Black or white colors and may not use logos or symbols;

(b) Text indicating side effects and behavioral effects of usage; and

(c) A label required by this rule.

(III) Marijuana product packaging must be in compliance with applicable local, state, and federal requirements.

C. Labeling. Except as specifically identified herein, labeling requirements apply to containers, wrappers, packages, and methods of administration that contain marijuana product. The labels required herein are not required on the paper for prerolls.

(I) All marijuana product shall be clearly and conspicuously labeled with “Marijuana” as well as a prominently displayed universal symbol in red and white print that consists of the following:

(a) A diamond containing the letters “THC”;

(b) The letter “M” located under the “THC” within the diamond; and

(c) For infused products, the intended or estimated milligrams of total THC content displayed under the universal symbol on the package, provided it is within $\pm 10.0\%$ of the actual number of milligrams of THC from the mandatory testing results that are in the package and listed on the label.

(II) The marijuana product container closest to the product shall bear a template label provided by the department that displays only the following information, in the following order, from top to bottom and left to right:

(a) All active and other ingredients, which shall not include groupings of ingredients that obscure the actual ingredients and shall include solvents used in the manufacturing process. Components of natural and artificial flavorings for ingestible marijuana products may be grouped, such as “lime flavoring,” “natural banana flavoring,” or “artificial strawberry flavoring”;

(b) Servings and doses per package for human subjects;

(c) A “best if used by” date;

(d) The license number of the licensed entity from which the final marijuana product originated;

(e) The license number of the research facility;

(f) The department-issued research study identification number;

(g) The marijuana testing licensee where the final marijuana product passed mandatory testing;

(h) The state-wide track and trace system tag number associated with the mandatory testing results for the final marijuana product;

(i) The exact total weight of the marijuana included in the package –

I. For dried, unprocessed marijuana, concentrates, prerolls, and infused prerolls, weight shall be listed in grams; and

II. For infused products other than infused prerolls, weight shall be listed by milligrams of delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol;

(j) The exact delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol ($\Delta 9$ -THC), delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinolic acid ($\Delta 9$ -THCA), cannabidiol (CBD), cannabidiolic acid (CBDA), cannabinol (CBN), tetrahydrocannabivarin (THCV), cannabidivarin (CBDV), and delta-8-tetrahydrocannabinol ($\Delta 8$ -THC) per serving/dose, listed in milligrams –

I. The label may list the cannabinoid

percent (%) per package values, including total delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol ($\Delta 9$ -THC) and total cannabidiol (CBD), if tested during mandatory testing;

(k) Results of terpene analysis, if tested during mandatory testing;

(l) Instructions for use;

(m) Estimated length of time the serving or dosage will have an effect;

(n) The following warning – “Cognitive and physical impairment may result from the use of marijuana. Keep out of reach of children”;

(o) The statement “Not For Sale or Distribution”;

(p) The statement “For Research Purposes Only”;

(q) If the marijuana product is not intended for consumption by human subjects, the statement “Not For Human Consumption”;

(r) The name and contact information for the principal investigator leading the research study;

2. Final marijuana product shall not be packaged in a manner that exceeds three (3) ounces of dried, unprocessed marijuana, or its equivalent;

3. Product packaging may not be designed in a manner such that the required elements for packaging and labeling are easily removed or separated from the package, such as placing required information on part of the package that must be removed in order to access the product; and

4. Any violation of this subsection shall be punishable by an appropriate and proportional department sanction, up to and including an administrative penalty of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for each product/packaging category in which a requirement is violated;

(M) Research licensees must comply with the inventory control and seed-to-sale tracking requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.130;

(N) Research licensees must comply with the transportation and storage requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.140 unless otherwise stated.

1. Research licensees may only deliver up to six (6) ounces of dried, unprocessed marijuana, or its equivalent, per human subject, in a thirty- (30-) day period.

2. At the time of delivery, licensees must –

A. For human subjects under the age of twenty-one (21), require production of the subject’s qualifying patient identification card and the subject’s primary caregiver’s primary caregiver identification card, if applicable;

B. Require production of a valid (not expired) government-issued photo ID confirming the identity and age of the human subject if the human subject is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

C. Require production of a valid (not expired) government photo ID confirming the identity of the parent or legal guardian of all non-emancipated human subjects;

D. Require production of a valid government identification confirming the identity of the human subject if the human subject is a non-emancipated human subject; and

E. Record the delivery of product in the state-wide track and trace system;

(O) Research licensees must comply with the marijuana waste disposal requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.150 unless otherwise stated;

(P) Research licensees that cultivate marijuana must comply with the cultivation facility requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.160 unless otherwise stated.

1. Each research facility utilizing any combination of indoor, outdoor, or greenhouse cultivation practices will be limited to no more than thirty thousand (30,000) square feet of

flowering plant canopy space;

(Q) Research licensees that manufacture marijuana product must comply with the manufacturing facility requirements in 19 CSR 100-1.170;

(R) If a research licensee is operating in a shared space with a cultivation, manufacturing, marijuana testing, or other research licensee, the research licensee must ensure that –

1. Unless the research licensee’s marijuana product is being voluntarily tested by the marijuana testing licensee as part of an approved research study, all marijuana product owned by the research licensee shall be physically segregated from product owned or controlled by the cultivation, manufacturing, marijuana testing, or other research licensee’s marijuana product; and

2. Research activities maintain physical segregation from the activities of the cultivation, manufacturing, or marijuana testing licensee; and

(S) No electronic equipment utilized by a research licensee shall collect a research participant’s personally identifiable information for use outside of the research study unless the subject has provided informed consent to the release of their personally identifiable information.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

20 CSR 2220-7.080 Pharmacist License Renewal and Continuing Pharmacy Education. The board is amending sections (3), (4), (7), and (12).

PURPOSE: This amendment broadens and clarifies authorized continuing education courses and clarifies continuing education delinquent fees.

(3) Continuing Education Course Approval.

(A) Except as otherwise provided herein, continuing education shall only be granted for a post-graduate course that is related to the practice of pharmacy and that is –

1. Approved by the Accreditation Council for Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) for **pharmacist** continuing education;

2. Offered by a state, federal, or local governmental or regulatory agency and approved by the board; *[or]*

3. Related to the practice of pharmacy, as approved by the board*[/];*

4. Approved by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) for physician continuing education or the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) for nurse continuing education. ACCME and ANCC approved programs do not have to be pre-approved by the board, provided the total combined credit for ACCME and ANCC programs is limited to twelve (12) hours per renewal period;

5. Accepted by another state board of pharmacy for pharmacist continuing education, with the exception of state specific courses. ACCME and ANCC credits shall be governed by paragraph (3)(A)4.; or

6. Training to obtain a healthcare provider level cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or basic life support (BLS) certification issued by the American Heart Association, the American Red Cross, or an equivalent organization, provided credits shall be limited to two (2) hours per renewal period.

(4) Non-ACPE Approved Programs. *[Programs]* **Except as otherwise provided in this rule, programs** that are not ACPE approved must be approved by the board prior to being taken as a continuing education course. To be eligible for approval, a program shall provide for evaluation methods or examinations to assure satisfactory completion by participants. Additionally, the person(s) who is to instruct or who is responsible for the delivery or content of the program shall be qualified in the subject matter by education or experience.

(7) Licensees may obtain four (4) hours (0.4 CEU) of continuing education by attending a complete open session of a board meeting at which disciplinary hearings are scheduled, subject to the following:

(A) The licensee must sign in with the executive director or designee of the board before the meeting *[day]* begins;

(12) The board may audit a licensee to assess the authenticity and validity of continuing education hours submitted for relicensure. Failure to provide proof of completion of the

required continuing education credits when requested to do so by the board shall be considered a violation.

(B) The following continuing education delinquent fees are applicable:

1. Less than *[one (1) hour]* **two (2) hours** missing, one hundred dollars (\$100);

2. Two (2) to ten (10) hours missing, five hundred dollars (\$ 500);

3. Eleven (11) to fifteen (15) hours missing, seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750); or

4. Sixteen (16) or more hours missing, one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

AUTHORITY: sections 338.020, 338.060, and 338.070, RSMo 2016, and section 338.140, RSMo Supp. [2019] 2025. Original rule filed Jan. 10, 2013, effective Aug. 30, 2013. Amended: Filed May 6, 2019, effective Nov. 30, 2019. Amended: Filed April 1, 2026.

The following general estimations were used to calculate private fiscal costs:

1. The proposed amendment corrects a technical rule error and clarifies the delinquency fee applicable to pharmacists with at least one (1) but less than two (2) delinquent continuing education (CE) hours during the pharmacist biennial renewal period.
2. Based on 2022 and 2024 pharmacist audit totals, the Board estimates approximately forty (40) pharmacists will be non-compliant and assessed the \$100 delinquent fee each biennial renewal period.
3. Significantly, the amended fee is only applicable to non-compliant pharmacists. No fee would be assessed for pharmacists who have completed required CE within the renewal timeframe.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Conservation Commission under

sections 40 and 45 of Art. IV, Mo. Const., the commission adopts a rule as follows:

3 CSR 10-4.200 is adopted.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the Missouri Register on January 15, 2026 (51 MoReg 60-61). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the Code of State Regulations.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Conservation Commission received comments from twenty-nine (29) individuals and one (1) staff on the proposed rule.

COMMENT #1: The commission received comments from eight (8) individuals who voiced general support for the proposed rule.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individuals who provided input.

COMMENT #2: The commission received comments from one (1) individual who voiced support for the proposal to remove the CWD Management Zone designation, and opposition to the prohibition on the placement of feed and minerals for deer.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individual who provided input. CWD can spread through direct contact between deer. The placement of feed and mineral increase the likelihood of direct contact. No changes have been made as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #3: The commission received comments from eleven (11) individuals who voiced general opposition to the proposed rule.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individuals who provided input.

COMMENT #4: The commission received comments from four (4) individuals who voiced opposition to the proposed rule, and whose specific comments were in opposition to the prohibition on the placement of feed and minerals for deer.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individuals who provided input. CWD can spread through direct contact between deer. The placement of feed and mineral increase the likelihood of direct contact. No changes have been made as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #5: The commission received comments from five (5) individuals who voiced general opposition to the proposed rule; however, specific comments were not related to the proposal.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individuals who provided input.

COMMENT #6: Department of Conservation staff recognized the need to more clearly describe what constitutes a designated county with respect to proximity to a confirmed Chronic Wasting Disease-positive test result and recommend a revision to section (1) to improve clarity.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The commission agrees and makes the recommended changes.

3 CSR 10-4.200 Chronic Wasting Disease

(1) The placement of grain, salt products, minerals, and

other consumable natural and manufactured products is prohibited in designated counties. Designated counties are those within ten (10) miles of a confirmed Chronic Wasting Disease-positive test result for any cervid. A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on January 15, 2026 (51 MoReg 63). No changes have been made to the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Conservation Commission received comments from ten (10) individuals and one (1) organization on the proposed amendment.

COMMENT #1: The commission received comments from two (2) individuals who voiced general support for proposed changes to this rule.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individuals who provided input.

COMMENT #2: The commission received comments from one (1) individual who voiced general opposition to proposed changes to this rule.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individual who provided input.

COMMENT #3: The commission received comments from one (1) individual who voiced general opposition to proposed changes to this rule; however, specific comments were not related to the proposal.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individual who provided input.

COMMENT #4: The commission received comments from five (5) individuals who voiced opposition to proposed changes to this rule, and who stated increasing the minimum acreage requirement to be able to obtain no-cost Chronic Wasting Disease Management Permits is detrimental to CWD management efforts.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individuals who provided input. Although CWD Management Permits allow harvest of additional deer in CWD Core Areas to help manage CWD, harvest of deer on properties less than 20 acres in size represents a relatively small percentage of deer harvested using these permits. During the 2024 deer season, approximately 40% of properties enrolled to receive CWD Management Permits were less than 20 acres in size but resulted in only approximately 8% of deer harvested using these permits. As such, increasing the minimum acreage requirement from five (5) acres to twenty (20) acres will not have a significant effect on the number of deer harvested but will greatly reduce workload associated with administering the program. No changes have been made as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #5: The commission received comments from one (1) individual who voiced opposition to proposed changes to this rule, and who stated no-cost Chronic Wasting Disease Management Permits should be available to nonresidents.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the individual who provided input. CWD Management Permits are available to both resident and nonresident hunters. A valid resident, nonresident, or landowner Firearms Any-Deer Hunting Permit, Firearms Antlerless Deer Hunting Permit, Archer's Hunting Permit, or Archery Antlerless Deer Hunting Permit is required as a prerequisite to obtain a CWD Management Permit. No changes have been made as a result of this comment.

COMMENT #6: The commission received comments from one (1) organization that voiced opposition to proposed changes to this rule, stating the acreage requirement for no-cost Chronic Wasting Disease Management Permits should remain at five (5) acres to allow small landowners to actively manage deer on their property.

RESPONSE: The commission thanks the organization who provided input. Although CWD Management Permits allow harvest of additional deer in CWD Core Areas to help manage CWD, harvest of deer on properties less than 20 acres in size represents a relatively small percentage of deer harvested on these permits. During the 2024 deer season, approximately 40% of properties enrolled to receive CWD Management Permits were less than 20 acres in size but resulted in only approximately 8% of deer harvested using these permits. As such, increasing the minimum acreage requirement from five (5) to twenty (20) acres will not have a significant effect on the number of deer harvested but will greatly reduce workload associated with administering the program. The statewide bag limit allows hunters to harvest two antlered bucks in Missouri. Archery antlerless permits can be purchased in any number, and hunters may harvest up to four (4) antlerless deer using a firearm in most Missouri counties. As such, liberal bag limits in most Missouri counties provide abundant opportunities to harvest deer even for hunters that do not qualify to receive CWD Management Permits. No changes have been made as a result of this comment.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Conservation Commission under sections 40 and 45 of Art. IV, Mo. Const., the commission amends a rule as follows:

3 CSR 10-7.440 is amended.

This rule establishes hunting seasons and limits for migratory game birds and waterfowl and is exempted by section 536.012, RSMo 2016, from the requirement for filing as a proposed amendment. The Department of Conservation amended 3 CSR 10-7.440 by establishing seasons and limits for hunting migratory game birds and waterfowl during the 2026-2027 seasons.

3 CSR 10-7.440 Migratory Game Birds and Waterfowl: Seasons, Limits

(1) Migratory game birds and waterfowl may be taken, possessed, transported, and stored only as provided in federal regulations and this Code.

(2) The head or one (1) fully feathered wing must remain attached to all waterfowl while being transported from the field to one's home or a commercial preservation facility.

(3) Seasons and limits are as follows:

(A) Mourning doves, Eurasian collared-doves, and white-winged doves may be taken from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset from September 1 through November 29.

Limits: fifteen (15) doves daily in the aggregate; forty-five (45) in possession;

(B) Sora and Virginia rails may be taken from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset from September 1 through November 9. Limits: twenty-five (25) rails daily in the aggregate; seventy-five (75) in possession;

(C) Woodcock may be taken from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset from October 18 through December 1. Limits: three (3) woodcock daily; nine (9) in possession;

(D) Wilson's snipe may be taken from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset from September 1 through December 16. Limits: eight (8) snipe daily; twenty-four (24) in possession;

(E) Blue-winged, green-winged, and cinnamon teal may be taken from sunrise to sunset from September 12 through September 20. Limits: six (6) teal daily in the aggregate; eighteen (18) in possession;

(F) Waterfowl Zones: The North Zone shall be that portion of Missouri north of a line running west from the Illinois border at Lock and Dam 25 to Sandy Slough Road East; west on Sandy Slough Road East to Sandy Slough Road North; west on Sandy Slough Road North to Lincoln County Hwy. N; west on Lincoln County Hwy. N to Mo. Hwy. 79; south on Mo. Hwy. 79 to Mo. Hwy. 47; west on Mo. Hwy. 47 to I-70; west on I-70 to U.S. Hwy. 63; north on U.S. Hwy. 63 to U.S. Hwy. 24; west on U.S. Hwy. 24 to Mo. Hwy. 10; west on Mo. Hwy. 10 to U.S. Hwy. 69; north on U.S. Hwy. 69 to Mo. Hwy. 116; west on Mo. Hwy. 116 to U.S. Hwy. 59; south on U.S. Hwy. 59 to the Kansas border. The South Zone shall be that portion of Missouri south of a line running west from the Illinois border on Mo. Hwy. 74 to Mo. Hwy. 25; south on Mo. Hwy. 25 to U.S. Hwy. 62; west on U.S. Hwy. 62 to Mo. Hwy. 53; north on Mo. Hwy. 53 to Mo. Hwy. 51; north on Mo. Hwy. 51 to U.S. Hwy. 60; west on U.S. Hwy. 60 to Mo. Hwy. 21; north on Mo. Hwy. 21 to Mo. Hwy. 72; west on Mo. Hwy. 72 to Mo. Hwy. 32; west on Mo. Hwy. 32 to U.S. Hwy. 65; north on U.S. Hwy. 65 to U.S. Hwy. 54; west on U.S. Hwy. 54 to the Kansas border. The Middle Zone shall be the remainder of Missouri not included in other zones;

(G) During years when the federal framework prescribes a sixty- (60-) day duck season, the North Zone season will open on the last Saturday in October, the Middle Zone season will open on the Saturday nearest November 6 until the Monday nearest December 15, close on the Monday nearest December 15 for five (5) days, and then reopen for the remaining days, the South Zone season will open on Thanksgiving Day for four (4) days, close through December 6, and then reopen December 7 through January 31 (as late as the federal framework allows). During years when the federal framework prescribes a forty-five- (45-) day duck season or thirty- (30-) day duck season, no season date formula will be used. A person possessing the appropriate state and federal permits may take ducks in accordance to the season lengths, bag limits, and species-specific opening and closing dates established annually by the Conservation Commission;

(H) Ducks and coots may be taken from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset as follows:

1. Ducks and coots may be taken from October 31 through December 29 in the North Zone; from November 7 through December 13 and December 19 through January 10 in the Middle Zone; and from November 26 through November 29 and December 7 through January 31 in the South Zone; and

2. Duck and coot limits are as follows: The daily bag limit of ducks is six (6) and may include no more than four (4) mallards (no more than two (2) of which may be female), three (3) wood ducks, two (2) redheads, two (2) hooded mergansers, three (3) pintail, one (1) mottled duck, two (2) canvasback, and two (2) black ducks. The possession limit is eighteen (18), including no

more than twelve (12) mallards (no more than six (6) of which may be female), nine (9) wood ducks, six (6) redheads, six (6) hooded mergansers, three (3) pintails, three (3) mottled ducks, six (6) canvasbacks, and six (6) black ducks. The daily limit of scaup is two (2) and a possession limit for scaup is six (6) in the North Zone from October 31 through December 14, in the Middle Zone November 7 through December 13 and December 19 through December 26, and in the South Zone November 26 through November 29 and December 7 through January 16. The daily limit of scaup is one (1) and a possession limit for scaup is three (3) in the North Zone December 15 through December 29, in the Middle Zone December 27 through January 10 and in the South Zone January 17 through January 31. The daily limit of coots is fifteen (15) and the possession limit for coots is forty-five (45);

(I) Geese may be taken from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset as follows:

1. Blue, snow, and Ross's geese may be taken from November 11 through February 6 statewide;

2. White-fronted geese may be taken from November 11 through February 6 statewide;

3. Canada geese and brant may be taken from October 3 through October 11 and from November 11 through February 6 statewide; and

4. Goose limits are as follows: The daily bag limit is three (3) Canada geese and brant in aggregate, twenty (20) blue, snow, or Ross's geese, and two (2) white-fronted geese, statewide. The possession limit is nine (9) Canada geese and brant in aggregate and six (6) white-fronted geese. There is no possession limit for blue, snow, and Ross's geese;

(J) Ducks, geese, brant, and coots may be taken by youth hunters fifteen (15) years of age or younger from October 24 through October 25 in the North Zone; from October 31 through November 1 in the Middle Zone; and from November 21 through November 22 in the South Zone. The daily and possession limits for ducks, geese, and coots are the same as during the regular duck, goose, and coot hunting seasons. Any person fifteen (15) years or younger may participate in the youth waterfowl hunting days without permit provided they are in the immediate presence of an adult eighteen (18) years of age or older. If the youth hunter does not possess a hunter education certificate card, the adult must be properly licensed (i.e., must meet any permit requirements that allow small game hunting) and have in their possession a valid hunter education certificate card unless they were born before January 1, 1967. The adult may not hunt ducks but may participate in other seasons that are open on the special youth days;

(K) Shells possessed or used while hunting waterfowl and coots statewide, and for other wildlife as designated by posting on public areas, must be loaded with material approved as nontoxic by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service;

(L) Electronically activated mechanical calls may be used and possessed to pursue and take waterfowl and coots. Such calls shall not be capable of producing recorded or electronically amplified bird calls or sounds or electronically amplified imitations of bird calls or sounds;

(M) Persons who possess a valid Conservation Order permit may chase, pursue, and take blue, snow, and Ross's geese from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to one-half (1/2) hour after sunset from February 7 through April 30. Any other regulation notwithstanding, methods for the taking of blue, snow, and Ross's geese include using shotguns capable of holding more than three (3) shells, and with the use or aid of recorded or electrically amplified bird calls or sounds, or recorded or electrically amplified imitations of bird calls or sounds, including electronically activated calls. An exception to the

above permit requirement includes any person fifteen (15) years of age or younger, provided either 1) the person is in the immediate presence of a properly licensed adult (must possess a Conservation Order permit) who is eighteen (18) years of age or older and has in their possession a valid hunter education certificate card, or was born before January 1, 1967, or 2) the person possesses a valid hunter education certificate card. A daily bag limit will not be in effect February 7 through April 30 (See 3 CSR 10-5.436 and 3 CSR 10-5.567 for Conservation Order Permit requirements); and

(N) Migratory game birds, to include only doves, ducks, mergansers, and coots, may be taken by hunters with birds of prey as follows (See 3 CSR 10-9.442 for additional provisions about falconry including season lengths and limits for wildlife other than migratory game birds. See 3 CSR 10-9.440 for falconry permit requirements):

1. Doves may be taken from September 1 through December 16 from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset. Daily limit: three (3) doves; possession limit: nine (9) doves, except that any waterfowl taken by falconers must be included within these limits; and

2. Ducks, mergansers, and coots may be taken from sunrise to sunset from September 12 through September 20 statewide, and from one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise to sunset as follows: in the North Zone, October 24 through October 25, October 31 through December 29, and February 11 through March 10; in the Middle Zone, October 31 through November 1, November 7 through December 13, December 19 through January 10, and February 11 through March 10; and, in the South Zone, November 21 through November 22, November 26 through November 29, December 7 through January 31, and February 11 through March 10. Daily limit: three (3) birds singly or in the aggregate, including doves; possession limit: nine (9) birds singly or in the aggregate, including doves.

This amendment was filed March 27, 2026, becomes effective **May 15, 2026.**

3 CSR 10-7.705 Elk: Hunting Season

(1) The elk hunting season is comprised of two (2) portions within Carter, Shannon, and Reynolds counties.

(A) Archery portion: October 17 through 25, 2026; use archery methods only to take elk in open counties; firearms may not be possessed except any person may carry concealable firearms, as defined in Chapter 571, RSMo, on or about his/her person while hunting. Firearms possessed under this exception may not be used to take wildlife while archery hunting.

(B) Firearms portion: December 12 through 20, 2026; use any legal elk hunting method to take elk in open counties.

This amendment was filed March 27, 2026, becomes effective **April 15, 2026.**

This rule establishes the season limits for elk and is exempted by section 536.021, RSMo 2016, from the requirements for filing as a proposed amendment. The Department of Conservation amended 3 CSR 10-7.710 by establishing 2026 elk harvest limits.

3 CSR 10-7.710 Elk: Application and Draw Process

(1) Missouri residents, as defined in 3 CSR 10-5.220, may apply for elk hunting permits.

(A) Quotas for elk hunting permits are established annually by the Conservation Commission. For the 2026 season, five (5) Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permits and zero (0) Resident Antlerless Elk Hunting Permits will be awarded. At least ten (10) percent of the Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permit quota and ten (10) percent of the Resident Antlerless Elk Hunting Permit quota will be awarded annually to approved resident landowners, as defined in 3 CSR 10-20.805, whose qualifying property is in Carter, Reynolds, or Shannon counties. If the number of qualifying landowner applicants is less than the percentage of the permits allocated for landowners, that portion of the quota not issued to a qualifying landowner will be reallocated to other applicants.

(B) To be eligible for the Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permit(s) or the Resident Antlerless Elk Hunting Permit(s) awarded to approved resident landowners, an application must have been submitted to and have been approved by the department as described in 3 CSR 10-7.412 prior to applying for a Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permit or a Resident Antlerless Elk Hunting Permit.

(C) Permit Draw.

1. The application period will be from May 1-31 annually and results will be available by July 1 annually.

2. Application fee for Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permit: ten dollars (\$10).

3. Application fee for Resident Antlerless Elk Hunting Permit: ten dollars (\$10).

4. Only one (1) application per elk hunting permit type is allowed per year.

5. Only one (1) person is allowed per application.

6. Only one (1) elk hunting permit may be awarded to a person per year. Antlered elk hunting permits will be awarded before antlerless elk hunting permits.

7. Persons drawn for a Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permit will not be eligible to apply for that permit again for ten (10) years. Persons drawn for a Resident Antlerless Elk Hunting Permit will not be eligible to apply for that permit again for five (5) years.

8. Permits are nontransferable.

This amendment was filed March 27, 2026, becomes effective April 15, 2026.

Chapter 7 – Wildlife Code: Hunting: Seasons,

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By authority vested in the Conservation Commission under sections 40 and 45 of Art. IV, Mo. Const., the commission amends a rule as follows:

3 CSR 10-7.900 is amended.

This rule establishes the season limits for black bear hunting and is exempted by section 536.021, RSMo 2016, from the requirements for filing as a proposed amendment. The Department of Conservation amended 3 CSR 10-7.900 by establishing 2026 black bear season quotas.

3 CSR 10-7.900 Black Bear Hunting Season: General Provisions

(6) Black Bear Management Zone-specific harvest quotas are established annually by the Conservation Commission. Harvest quotas for the 2026 black bear season will be set as follows:

(A) Bear Management Zone 1: thirty (30) black bears;

(B) Bear Management Zone 2: twenty two (22) black bears; and

(C) Bear Management Zone 3: eight (8) black bears.

This amendment was filed March 27, 2026, becomes effective April 15, 2026.

Chapter 7 – Wildlife Code: Hunting: Seasons,
Methods, Limits**

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By authority vested in the Conservation Commission under sections 40 and 45 of Art. IV, Mo. Const., the commission amends a rule as follows:

3 CSR 10-7.905 is amended.

This rule establishes the season limits for bear and is exempted by section 536.021, RSMo 2016, from the requirements for filing as a proposed amendment. The Department of Conservation amended 3 CSR 10-7.905 by establishing 2026 black bear season quotas.

3 CSR 10-7.905 Black Bear Hunting Season: Application and Draw Process

(1) Missouri residents, as defined in 3 CSR 10-5.220, may apply for black bear hunting permits.

(A) Bear Management Zone-specific permit quotas for black bear hunting permits are established annually by the Conservation Commission. At least ten (10) percent of the Resident Black Bear Hunting Permit Black Bear Management Zone-specific permit quota will be awarded annually to approved resident landowners, as defined in 3 CSR 10-20.805, whose qualifying property is in the specific Black Bear Management Zone for which they are applying. If the number of qualifying landowner applicants is less than the percentage of the permits allocated for landowners, that portion of the quota not issued to a qualifying landowner will be reallocated to other applicants. Permit quotas for the 2026 black bear season will be set as follows:

1. Bear Management Zone 1: one thousand (1,000) Resident

Black Bear Hunting Permits.

2. Bear Management Zone 2: seven hundred fifty (750) Resident Black Bear Hunting Permits.

3. Bear Management Zone 3: two hundred fifty (250) Resident Black Bear Hunting Permits.

(B) To be eligible for the Resident Black Bear Hunting Permit(s) awarded to approved resident landowners, an application must have been submitted to and have been approved by the department as described in 3 CSR 10-7.412 prior to applying for a Resident Black Bear Hunting Permit.

(C) Permit Draw.

1. The application period will be from May 1-31 annually and results will be available by July 1 annually.

2. Application fee for Resident Black Bear Hunting Permit: ten dollars (\$10).

3. Only one (1) application is allowed per year.

4. Only one (1) person is allowed per application.

5. Permits are nontransferable.

This amendment was filed March 27, 2026, becomes effective April 15, 2026.

TITLE 6 – DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Division 10 – Commissioner of Higher Education

Chapter 5 – Regulation of Proprietary Schools

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Commissioner of Higher Education under section 173.005, RSMo Supp. 2025, the commissioner amends a rule as follows:

6 CSR 10-5.010 Certification of Proprietary Schools is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on January 15, 2026 (51 MoReg 71-78). No changes have been made to the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: No comments were received.

TITLE 20 – DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND INSURANCE

Division 2150 – State Board of Registration for

the Healing Arts

Chapter 2 – Licensing of Physicians and Surgeons

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts under section 334.125, RSMo 2016, the board amends a rule as follows:

20 CSR 2150-2.125 Continuing Medical Education is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on December 15, 2025 (50 MoReg 1849-1850). No changes have been made to the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: Twenty-two (22) comments were received by the board during the rule's public comment period.

COMMENT #1: Commenters included the Missouri Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons (MAOPS), the Missouri State Medical Association (MSMA), the St. Louis Metropolitan Medical Society, many physicians, a state representative, and a member of the public. All comments expressed opposition to the proposed rulemaking to mandate a nutrition-specific continuing medical education (CME) requirement for physicians. Commenters emphasized that nutrition education is already covered in medical school, residency, and ongoing practice, making an additional requirement redundant. Many argued that CME should remain self-directed and relevant to a physician's specialty, noting that nutrition may not apply to all areas of practice. Concerns were raised about increased administrative and financial burdens, time away from patient care, and the lack of evidence or cost-benefit analysis demonstrating improved health outcomes. Several comments also questioned whether the board should mandate specific CME topics, as this would depart from its historical practice and could create unnecessary regulation without clear benefit.

RESPONSE: The present regulation requires a physician to complete fifty (50) hours of CME over two (2) years and does not specify that any of these CME hours must focus on a particular topic. The amended rule requires that, over the course of the required fifty (50) hours of CME, a total of one (1) hour must address the topic of the health benefits of nutrition. The rule does not require that an entire or separate one- (1-) hour course be devoted to nutrition; rather, the one (1) hour on nutrition may be a component or aspect of multiple courses, including those focused on a physician's specialty.

Although nutrition is part of medical education (and often required in secondary school and undergraduate education), the science of nutrition is not static. Regularly updating a physician's knowledge of this topic is neither trivial nor unimportant for patient care. The rule does not require physicians to be experts or specialists in nutrition or to go beyond their personal specialty or scope of practice, but it does help physicians be better informed about the health benefits of nutrition, which in turn helps them counsel, educate, and advise Missouri patients. Missouri residents rely on physicians for accurate and current information that affects their health, including nutrition.

Including nutrition in a physician's CME is part of Missouri's ongoing annual applications for federal Rural Health Transformation Program (RHT) funding, which will invest in rural healthcare services to improve access, quality, and outcomes, and demonstrates Missouri's commitment to strengthening rural health. On December 29, 2025, Missouri secured \$216 million of this federal funding in the first year. No changes have been made to the rule as a result of the comments.

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Construction Transient Employer Listing

The following is a list of all construction contractors performing work on construction projects in Missouri who are known by the Department of Revenue to be transient employers pursuant to Section 285.230, RSMo. This list is provided as a guideline to assist public bodies with their responsibilities under this section that states, "any county, city, town, village or any other political subdivision which requires a building permit for a person to perform certain construction projects shall require a transient employer to show proof that the employer has been issued a tax clearance and has filed a financial assurance instrument as required by Section 285.230 before such entity issues a building permit to the transient employer."
