Historical and Biographical Notes

Quoted from Finding Aid RG3.36 by Sharon Brock:

"Samuel Aaron Baker was born on November 7, 1874 in Patterson, Wayne County to Mary Amanda McGhee Baker. His father, also Samuel Aaron Baker, was a physician who died before Baker's birth. Baker contributed to the family coffers on a full-time basis and attended Mill Spring School periodically. He worked his way through Southeast Missouri State Teachers College in Cape Girardeau and in 1887 earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Pedagogy (Education). He later earned another Bachelor's degree from Missouri Wesleyan College in Cameron, Clinton County. On June 1, 1904, Baker married Nelle Rose Tuckley in Jefferson City, Cole County. The couple had one daughter.

"Baker's career in educational administration began in 1897 when he was appointed superintendent of public schools in Piedmont, Wayne County. He also served as principal at Jefferson City High School (1899-1905) and Joplin High School (1905-1910) and was superintendent of Richmond, Cay County public schools from 1910 to 1913. Baker returned to Jefferson City in 1913 as superintendent of schools. He served as Missouri Superintendent of Schools from 1918 to 1922.

"Baker gained the Republican nomination for governor in 1924 and defeated Arthur W. Nelson. He was sworn in as Missouri's 36th governor on January 12, 1925. During the first year of his administration, the State Board of Agriculture was given control over the Department of Forestry and the state park system was expanded. (Sam A. Baker State Park in Wayne County is named for him and dedicated in 1955.) In 1926, Missouri voters approved the workmen's compensation referendum. The departments of labor and industrial inspection were combined in 1927, the crippled children service began at the University of Missouri hospital in Columbia, the state board of chiropractic examiners was established, and the native bluebird was adopted as the state bird.

"On January 14, 1929, Baker returned to private life in Jefferson City. He served as president of the Missouri State Teachers Association and vice president of the National Education Association. Baker suffered a series of paralytic strokes from which he died on September 16, 1933 in Jefferson City. He is interred in Riverview Cemetery, Jefferson City, Missouri."
