Scope and Content

On the Road to '76: Hannibal, Missouri:

This film was presented to the Missouri State Archives in 1976 by Peter M. Herford, Director of Affiliate Liaison of CBS News. A second copy was presented to the Governor. The short 3-minute 45-second film features Hannibal, Missouri and in particular local boys Steve and Stan Ehrhardt. CBS filmed in July 1975, and the episode was to have aired in August 1975 as a vignette during CBS's *Evening News* with Walter Cronkite. Rights remain with CBS News. The Archives does not have a digital copy of this film.

Sources of Country Music:

Follows muralist Thomas Hart Benton as he paints "Sources of Country Music," which hangs in the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville, TN. Filmmakers were filming up until two days before Benton's death in January 1975. The Archives does not have a digital copy of this film.

Daisy Cook Remembers:

From Worldcat: "One of America's foremost primitive painters, Missouri-born Daisy Cook, 75, shows a collection of her works painted from memories of her childhood. The film provides an insight into rural life at the turn of the century and the creative potential of a senior citizen's hobby. Daisy was 65 when she taught herself to paint."
