HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

John L. Morrison (1829-1902) was appointed Warden of the Missouri State Penitentiary in 1889 by Governor Francis. His wife was Eliza Thompson (1833-1917), and she is the individual who wrote the letter in this collection. John was "born in Fayette, Howard County, Mo., August 7, 1829, and educated in the schools of his native county; he never knew any military service, but held the civil offices of sheriff and collector from 1867 to 1870; he is a farmer and married; Mr. Morrison is a son of the late Hon. Alfred W. Morrison, who was State Treasurer of Missouri

from 1851 to 1860." (quoted from the Official Manual of the State of Missouri 1891-1892, p. 351)

Eliza and John had a daughter named Sadie who shows up in the letter. Sadie married John F. Shafroth and the couple eventually moved to Denver, Colorado. Shafroth is mentioned in the letter as well. Eliza died at her daughter's home in Denver and was removed to Fayette, MO for burial.
