Historical and Biographical Notes

The 140th Infantry National Guard was officially organized on June 27, 1898. The next month, the unit went into service in the Spanish-American War. During World War I, the 140th

participated in the battles of Alsace, Lorraine, and Meuse-Argonne. The regiment stayed stateside during World War II. The 140th Infantry is part of the 35th Division.

The band of the 140th Infantry was organized in 1915 by E.O. Brown and was at first called the Third District Mechanics Band, aka “Frisco Band.” Six years later, they officially became the band of the 140th Infantry National Guard and played at the Missouri State Fair.

Oscar Thomas Honey (1886-1964) was born in Salem, Missouri on September 20, 1886 to Thomas and Angie (Kell) Honey. He married Besse Emogene Halbert of Licking, Missouri, on February 12, 1908. The couple had three sons. Later, Honey married Hattie E. Haubold in May 1923. Honey was a trumpet player who got his professional start in 1916 with the Sells-Floto Circus Band after he was seen performing in St. Louis. The Sells-Floto boasted two famous members, namely Karl L. King and John Phillip Sousa, and Honey remained friends with them for a lifetime. He received his musical education at the Renauldo Conservatory of Music in St. Louis, the Ludwig College of Music, also in St. Louis, and the University of Kansas City.

Honey enlisted in the Missouri National Guard for the first time on June 14, 1913. He was Chief Musician for the 6th Regiment Infantry Band Company. He mustered out on September 24, 1914. On October 28, 1921, he re-enlisted as a 2nd Lieutenant and was assigned to the Missouri National Guard 140th Infantry Service Company. On June 3, 1923, Honey was promoted to 1st Lieutenant. Lt. O.T. Honey replaced Warrant Officer John L. Metz as bandleader, Metz having served in that position from October 1917 until May 1923.

Honey ran for mayor of Chaffee, MO in 1932 and won. He remained mayor until December 1940 when he was activated into federal service with the National Guard. Lt. Honey was quickly promoted to Captain in May 1942 and to Major in November 1942. In that year, Honey was transferred to Spokane, WA to serve as Assistant Adjutant and then Civilian Personnel Officer at the Army Air Depot. He came back to Chaffee, MO in 1944.

Following World War II, Honey returned to civilian life, but continued to bring music to Southeast Missouri. He would be conductor of the Chaffee High School Band and several others until his retirement in 1953. Honey died in St. Louis in 1964.

Scope and Content

Short films on the 140th MNG Infantry band filmed by and for O.T. Honey. The film reel is a compilation of six short vignettes, detailed below. Series also contains one VHS tape made from the original film in 1988 by Bill Crass Productions. Crass added a soundtrack to the VHS, which is not original to the 16mm film.

The films offer a glimpse into National Guard life in Missouri in the 1930s. Scenes include the band performing and practicing and soldiers setting up tents, going to the mess hall and simply “messaging” around. All six shorts are silent and one is in color. The clips are primarily in Missouri, with a brief scene at Camp Robinson, Arkansas in Short #4 and the whole of the sixth short was filmed in Tiptonville, Tennessee.

The accession paperwork included descriptions of the first four shorts, which are reprinted below. In October 2023, the Archives had George Blood, LP convert the VHS tape into digital .MP4 and .MOV formats (the 16mm film is too degraded to convert and is essentially lost).
