HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Quoted from the MDH splash page:

“Camp Crowder was a military installation named in honor of Major General Enoch H. Crowder, provost marshal of the United States during World War I and author of the 1917 Selective Service Act. The camp, located near Neosho, Missouri, was established in 1941. By 1942, the first soldiers arrived at the Signal Corps Replacement Training Center at Camp Crowder and

were trained in forty different military communications specialties involving radio, radar, and telephone operation and maintenance. Aside from the Signal-Corps training, the post trained medical-corps soldiers and ground-force troops, and also established an Officer Candidate Preparatory School, the first school of its kind in any army installation. The camp had a bakery, ordnance motor repair shops, a large laundry and warehouses for supplies. A large prisoner of war camp existed within Camp Crowder. The mostly German POWs worked within the larger camp, learning trade skills such as butchering, auto mechanics, baking, and laundering.”

The clippings include stories behind the images and range from simple captions to whole essays. The images depict camp life of soldiers, officers, visitors, and German Prisoners of War. Celebrities Cary Grant and Benny Goodman are among the more notable visitors, as is soon-to-be President Harry S Truman.

Scope and Content

This series contains documents related to Camp Crowder. The first is a booklet that once belonged to Clara Morgenthaler who worked at Camp Crowder in the 1940s. The inside cover is signed by many individuals wishing her well, presumably when she left the Camp. The booklet itself includes valuable information on the construction of Camp Crowder and its day-to-day operations. It features many photographs and cartoons illustrated by Don Mayes. The booklet has not been digitized, nor has Pylman's discharge. The wallet card and newspaper clipping are on the Z Drive.
