### HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Hazel Palmer (1903-2002) was a nationally-known women's advocate and professional lawyer. Palmer attended National University in Washington, DC where she received her bachelor of law degree in 1932. While attending the University she served as president of the Cy Pres Club, a women's student organization. Upon graduation, she moved back to Sedalia where she was admitted as a member of the Missouri Bar Association in December 1932. She joined her father's law practice (former US Rep. John W. Palmer), which was re-named Palmer & Palmer

in her honor. She quickly became president of the Women's Republican Club of Pettis County in July 1933, secretary for the Business and Professional Women's Club (BPWC), and was appointed assistant prosecuting attorney of Pettis County in March 1937. She served for twelve years as the Pettis County Collector of Revenue. She regularly had local and state speaking engagements. In July 1937, she became president of the local BPWC. In May 1940, she moved up to state legislation chairwoman for the state BPWC, second vice president in April 1941, first vice president in April 1942, and finally state president in April 1944. She repeated this pattern at the national level and ultimately in May 1956 she was unanimously elected National Federation President of the BPWC.

In 1954, Palmer traveled abroad as an officer of the National Federation of BPWC to Europe where she and others led the "Crusade for Freedom Tour to inspect Radio Free Europe's broadcasting facilities behind the Iron Curtain." (Independent Woman, August 1956 Vol. 35 No. 8 p. 26)

"In [August] 1969, she was appointed by President Nixon as one of twenty women in the U.S. to serve on the Citizen's Advisory [Council] on the Status of Women. She was elected in 1960-1964 as a delegate to the Republican National Convention. In 1958, she was the first woman to win a major party nomination for U.S. Senator in Missouri. A staunch Republican, Miss Palmer handily defeated three men [in the primaries] to run against Sen. Stuart Symington." (quoted from her obituary (see "Related Materials" below)) Palmer lost to Symington with a vote of 393,847 to 480,083.

Palmer continued to practice law well into her 80s. Eventually, she did retire and moved from Sedalia to Moberly, MO where she passed away at the age of 98 on April 10, 2002.
