HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Text copied directly from Finding Aid 003.42:

“Forrest Smith was born on February 14, 1886 near Hardin in Ray County to James P. and Lillie Hill Smith. He received his secondary education at Woodson Institute in Richmond, Missouri. Upon graduation from Westminster College in Fulton, Smith taught school and served as principal of the Richmond Grammar School. He married Mildred Williams on October 12, 1915 and they raised two daughters.

“A Democrat, Smith began his political career in 1910 as deputy assessor for Ray County. He was elected as Ray County Clerk in 1913 and held that position for eight years. From 1921 to 1925, Smith operated a jewelry business in Richmond. Appointed by Governor Samuel Baker to the Missouri Tax Commission in 1925, Smith served until 1932 when he was elected to state auditor. He left the Office of the State Auditor to successfully campaign for the 1948 gubernatorial election.

“On January 10, 1949, Forrest Smith was sworn in as the 42nd Governor of Missouri. Erroneous innuendoes of organized mob influence affected his relationship with the Democratic Party and impacted his ability to accomplish anything of substance with the Missouri General Assembly. In 1951, the Governor signed into law the Municipal Land Clearance for Redevelopment Act which expanded and improved public infrastructure.

“Smith completed his sole term and retired from public service in 1953. A dormitory on the University of Missouri campus was constructed in 1961 and named in his honor as was Forrest Lake, the centerpiece of Thousand Hills State Park in Adair County. He died March 8, 1962 in Gulfport, Mississippi and is interred in Ray County in the Sunny Slope Cemetery in Richmond.”
