### Scope and Content

Dewey Short (1898-1979) was a Republican Congressman from Galena, Stone County, Missouri. He had a long-lived career at the Congressional level, which spanned 1929 to 1958. This series contains photographs and documents related to Short that were obtained by the donor from an estate sale in Southern Missouri.
