#### HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

This is a photo album of unknown origin, meaning that the original creator is not known. Its photographs cover roughly 1895-1905, the first 17 of which are of the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair. The album was disbound at some point and each page is now in a protective Mylar sleeve. The photographs are glued to the dark gray construction paper pages.

### **Scope and Content**

This 25-page photo album has been disbound. The photographs are silver prints ranging in size from about one square inch to 5"x8". There are 69 prints in the album, most of which are not labeled. Additionally, there are two 8½"x11" copy prints of Missouri's second Capitol Building. Topics include the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair (aka Louisiana Purchase Exposition), outdoors, family groups, ice-skating and the railroad tie industry.

All images have been digitized and are available as 400dpi TIFs on Manuscript DVD #4 in the Reference Room.
