Abstract: Edward Kopplin was an employee of the Conservation Department who was killed on the job. This collection includes photographs he took of a flood at his hatchery, news clippings on the Department and his life and death, photographs and articles on covered bridges in Missouri, and other Conservation-related materials.

#### HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Edward Mortimer (E.M.) Kopplin (1890-1954) joined the Missouri Fish and Game Commission in 1912. Fisheries were in the family, as Kopplin's father Phillip and grandfather Thomas also worked at fish hatcheries. In June 1932, E.M. took over as superintendent of the State Fish Hatchery in Forest Park, St. Louis, succeeding his father. By the time the Conservation Commission was formed in November 1936, Kopplin had moved to the Lewis and Clark Hatchery in Rushville, MO outside of St. Joseph. He raised sunfish, crappie, bullheads, channel catfish, bass, and bluegill. Kopplin and his assistant Homer Duncan would drive up to 35,000

miles a year together delivering fish for stocking ponds and lakes throughout Missouri. On March 19, 1954 the pair were in a car accident. Kopplin, who had been driving, died of his injuries in an Atchison, Kansas hospital the next day. He was survived by his wife Johanna (Phillipson) and son E.M. Kopplin, Jr.
