### BIOGRAPHICAL AND HISTORICAL INFORMATION

John D. Paulus, Jr. (1909-1993) was a professional architect who spent a large part of his career working for the State of Missouri. He became a registered architect with the State in 1942. During that time, he was working on the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial in St. Louis. He served during World War II. After the War, Paulus became State Park Architect until 1948 when he moved to the Division of Health. He designed hospital buildings for the next ten years.

In 1958, Paulus switched agencies again. This time he would be employed as the Chief of Planning and Construction for Missouri, which falls under the Office of Administration. His work with the Division would encompass the Capitol Building as well as all other state-owned buildings and sites.
