HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Historical:

Preparation for the St. Louis World's Fair began in January 1899 when St. Louis was chosen as the next city after Chicago to host a world's fair. Former Gov. David R. Francis was elected Chairman of the Executive Committee planning the fair. Other Committee members from Missouri were John Perry (Kansas City), E. W. Stephens (Columbia) and Howard Elliott (St. Louis). Soon Walter B. Stevens would become Secretary and his name appears on many of the St. Louis World's Fair documents. The theme of the Fair was to be the 100th anniversary of the Louisiana Purchase and a goal of Winter 1903 was set for the Louisiana Purchase Exposition opening. Eventually, the opening was shifted to April 1904. The Fair remained open until December 1, 1904.

George Kessler was the Fair's primary designer and his plan required approximately 1,200 acres of land and water in the area that would later become Forest Park and Washington University in St. Louis. Architects included Isaac S. Taylor, Emmanuel Louis Masqueray, Paul J. Pelz and many others.

Participants from all over the country and the world were recruited to design and build exhibits and buildings representing their native lands and cultures. Forty-three (of 45) states built exhibit space as well as 50 countries. Native peoples from across the world were brought to St. Louis where they would be required to appear in their native clothing and accouterments for the attendees to observe. Overall, almost 20 million people attended the Louisiana Purchase Exposition.

Biographical:

John Joseph Schwob was born July 12, 1880 in Indiana to parents Joseph and Susanna "Susan" (Bender) Schwob. Sometime between 1900 and 1904, Schwob moved to St. Louis. He worked professionally as a barber and a mechanic and received three U.S. patents for improvements to elevators between 1904 and 1905. He married Wilhelmina Appelbaum on June 16, 1908. Together, they had three children. John J. Schwob died November 11, 1943, and is buried in Resurrection Cemetery in St. Louis. Schwob's granddaughter Regina Einig loaned his 1904 World's Fair photographs to the Archives for digitizing in 2021.

Scope and Content

These original 5" x 4" glass plates were loaned to the Archives for digitization, after which the original plates were returned to the donor. This collection consists of 600 dpi .tif scans of the plates. Contents relate to buildings and other features of the St. Louis 1904 World's Fair, formally called the Louisiana Purchase Exposition. There is one outlying photograph presumed to be later (1910-1912) of the St. Louis waterfront.

All the glass plates exhibited silver mirroring on the reverse and some were further deteriorated. Twenty-eight plates were already numbered with yellow slips of paper, some of which included a brief title. All other plates were unnumbered and unidentified. During processing, the unnumbered plates were assigned numbers and best attempts to identify the contents were made.
