Also, photographs of people, places and events in Missouri history (c1917-c2010) as well as publications related to the Civilian Conservation Corps and forestry.

### Historical and Biographical Notes

#### Historical:

The Missouri Game and Fish Department is the predecessor agency to the current Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) and Missouri State Parks. It operated as a state agency in

various forms from 1877 to 1936 when the MDC was formed by initiative petition. At that time, the state park system was separated and functioned as the State Parks Board. In 1974, the State Parks Board was subsumed by the new Department of Natural Resources where it remains today.

#### Biographical:

William Elwood Rogers, known as W.E. Rogers, (1891-1961) worked for the United States Forest Service as a forestry technician in the early 1930s. He was stationed in Missouri and, through the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), made improvements to many Missouri state parks.

In a 1942 Callaway County Circuit Court case, Rogers described his career prior to 1936 as an Assistant Forester in the U.S. Forest Service working as a CCC forest inspector. He oversaw eight CCC camps in southeast Missouri and 21 camps in north Missouri. He also supervised two tree nurseries and inspected machinery in Tennessee and Arkansas. He later joined the Soil Erosion Department and worked in Ellington, Missouri.

Rogers married Ruth Lenore Sizer in 1921 and together they raised four children. He is buried in the I.O.O.F. Cemetery in Monett, Lawrence County, Missouri with his wife. (NOTE: Some official documents spell his middle name with two Ls (Ellwood). Some official documents give his year of birth as 1892.)

## Missouri Game and Fish Department Films, 1930-2021

*Extent:* 3 reels; 426 GB; 0.22 cubic ft.

*Arrangement:* Chronological.

### Scope and Content

The Missouri Game and Fish Department (aka Missouri Game and Fish Commission) was formed in 1919 from prior iterations of state game and fish bodies that got their start in Missouri in 1877. The Department bought a 35mm motion picture film camera and released their first film, *Outdoor Life History of Missouri*, in 1930. Several other films were made on 35mm and 16mm in the early 1930s. The films were shown to thousands of people a year and loaned out through the Department's film library. This series contains three reels of film representing four 1931 Game and Fish Department films as described below.

The films were formerly in the possession of U.S. Forest Service employee W.E. Rogers who worked for a time in Missouri. Rogers's granddaughter Melissa Naylor Applegate donated the original films and digital conversions to the Archives in 2022. ## Research Materials, 1893-1991

*Extent:* 0.28 cubic ft.

*Arrangement:* Chronological with undated materials at end.

### Scope and Content

The documents in this series were either used by W.E. Rogers in his research as a forester or relate to his personal life. The personal documents were photocopied from the donor's bound family history book written by Ruth Lenore Rogers (W.E. Rogers's daughter) in 1991 and loaned to the Archives for copying.

Several of the forestry and CCC publications were used in the early 1940s by Rogers's daughters Ruth and Kathleen to practice their drawing skills. Pencil, ink, pastel wax crayon, charcoal and watercolor illustrations of female figures appear frequently on the backs of the pages in both *Agricultural News Letter* issues and both *Orientation – Project Work* publications.
