Historical and Biographical Notes

Whiteman Air Force Base in Johnson County, Missouri, opened in 1942 as the Sedalia Glider Base. The Base was used as a training site for Douglas C-46, Douglas C-47 and Waco CG-4A glider pilots and paratroopers through multiple units of Troop Carrier Command. Its name soon changed to Sedalia Army Air Field (SAAF), and at its peak during World War II, the Base could house up to 7,500 men and women.

Following the close of World War II, the Air Field was placed on standby status and managed by the War Assets Administration as surplus property. Missourians lobbied for its reopening, which occurred in 1952. The new United States Air Force (est. 1947) and Strategic Air Command (SAC) (est. 1946) were assigned to the site now known as Sedalia Air Force Base. In October, "SAC's Finest" 340th Bombardment Wing was activated.

Now entering the Cold War era, Sedalia Air Force Base was renamed Whiteman Air Force Base in honor of 2nd Lt. George A. Whiteman, who was a Missourian killed on December 7, 1941 during the attack on Pearl Harbor. From 1958-1961, SAC maintained the Boeing B-47 Stratojet with its distinctive swept wings and the Boeing KC-97 Stratofreighter refueling tanker at Whiteman, always on alert against possible Soviet strikes.

In June 1961, SAC and the Air Force changed Whiteman's mission from a bomber site to the United States's fourth Minuteman intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) site, home of the 351st Strategic Missile Wing. With its headquarters at Whiteman, approximately 150 missile silos were constructed across Missouri.

Whiteman Air Force Base was affected by the SMART II Treaty when the Cold War came to a close, which promised the removal of roughly two-thirds of America's ICBMs. The Minuteman II missiles went off alert in late 1991 and between then and 1995, the warheads were removed and nearly all the empty silos were imploded. Whiteman became home to a new technology: the B-2 Spirit "Stealth" Bomber. The Base would once again be a bomber site, hearkening back to its days with the B-47.

The B-2 Spirit program is the purview of the 509th Bomb Wing, which is supported by the 509th Operations Group, Maintenance Group, Medical Group, Missouri Support Group and Bomb Wing Staff Agencies. Various other Air Force units also operate at Whiteman: the 442nd Fighter Wing, the Training Support Squadron (Det. 12), 72nd Test and Evaluation Squadron, 325th Weapons Squadron and Air Force Office of Special Investigations (Det. 811). Lastly, the Air National Guard's 131st Bomb Wing and the U.S. Army's 1-135th Assault Helicopter Battalion take up tenancy at Whiteman.
