Abstract: Records (1999-2009) from the administration of Governor Matt Blunt (1970-) include correspondence, executive orders, extraditions, itineraries, legal files, pardons, photographs, press releases, proclamations, subject files, and websites.

Physical Description: Paper, photographs, DVD-Rs.

Administrative Information

Acquisition Information: Accessions 2009-0004 and 2009-0046. Despite copies of the newer retention schedule (2007) found in the transferred records, the legal counsel's memo to office staff at the end of Blunt's administration used an older retention schedule. Because of this, a large amount of records now considered permanent, especially correspondence and departmental records, created prior to a February 2008 audit were apparently destroyed.

Processing Information: Processing completed by Mary Kay Coker on October 22, 2015. Migrated DVD-Rs in October 2014 and one file (Beardk) was found to be corrupted, as noted on the DVD-R. Original disc retained. Closed/restricted DVD-Rs were given to the visual materials archivist, Amy Moorman, to be put in the vault along with preservation copies of open DVD-Rs.

Historical and Biographical Notes

Matthew "Matt" Roy Blunt was born on November 20, 1970, in Strafford, Missouri. He was raised in Greene County until he moved to Jefferson City when his father, Roy Blunt, was elected as secretary of state. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy with a degree in history and subsequently served in the US Navy.

A Republican, Matt Blunt was elected in 1998 to the Missouri House of Representatives. In 2000, he defeated Steve Gaw to become Missouri's secretary of state. After the events of September 11, 2001, he was temporarily called back into active naval service overseas but retained his office. In 2004, Blunt defeated Claire McCaskill in the gubernatorial election. He served as governor from 2005 to the beginning of 2009, choosing not to run for reelection.

Apparently, once signed, the letters were returned to the governor's office. As such, they are a third copy, as another is sent to the Secretary of the Senate.

Correspondence, 2004-2009

Extent: 26 cubic ft. (65 Hollinger boxes and 85 DVD-Rs)

Arrangement: By type and thereunder chronological

Scope and Content

This series includes gubernatorial correspondence, including agency, chief of staff (Trish Vincent), constituent, department, e-mail, elected officials, federal, general, military, interoffice memos, and requests for prosecutorial aid.

Chief of staff correspondence is mostly to and from Trish Vincent and include letters re: sunshine requests to the Attorney General and Representative Jeff Harris.

The large volume of printed-out e-mails in this collection are almost entirely the result of a sunshine request in August 2007 by the *Springfield News-Leader* and subsequent litigation that originally centered around Chief of Staff Ed Martin's emails to antiabortion groups. Eventually the issue of whether e-mails were a state record led to the termination of a deputy chief counsel, Scott Eckersley, who had counseled that the office retain all emails as a state record. The office, however, said he was terminated for misuse of a government computer. Eckersley's lawsuit over his termination was settled in 2009. The emails here include those labeled as Governor Blunt, but the emails but do not appear to be from him, only emails sent to him at the Governor's Office.

Elected official correspondence includes state and US senators and representatives mostly from Missouri, the only exception being the president (often disaster declarations) and are found in federal correspondence.

Federal correspondence includes many FEMA/disaster declaration letters, state-federal matters like river management with the Corps of Engineers, and immigration subjects.

The files labeled as general correspondence were broken into months in the original accession and have been maintained as such; they contain constituent, departmental, federal, and legislative correspondence. Some have copies of outgoing replies from the governor's office. The correspondence may be filed by date sent, date received, or date replied to (on cover letter).

Military correspondence includes sympathy letters to families of deceased military; adjutant general correspondence; and departure and arrivals of Missouri National Guard companies. Also see federal correspondence.

Requests for prosecutorial aid usually comprise two documents: (1) letters from county prosecutors requesting aid from the attorney general's office in special cases beyond their capability to prosecute, such as in murder and drug cases, and (2) copies of letters from the governor (per RSMo 27.030), directing the attorney general to grant aid.

Scope and Content

This series relates to death penalty cases. It includes an information packet prepared by the Department of Corrections for the execution of Stanley L. Hall, who died by lethal injection on March 16, 2005. This packet includes inmate history of Stanley L. Hall, circumstances of his offence, and legal chronology; history of the death penalty in Missouri; list of capital punishments current at that time; list of Missouri inmates executed since 1989; and draft scripts for state witness briefing, questions to be asked by department director prior to execution, and statement from the governor.

For Dennis Skillicorn, the sole record is a letter from State Representative Jeanette Mott Oxford asking for clemency.

See the series *Pardons* for executive clemency files for prisoners in non-capital cases. However, in the clemency denials, some capital cases are mentioned.

Denials of executive clemency include a letter listing those denied and, often, individual summaries and recommendations.

Pardons granted include a copy of the letter from the governor and either a copy or an original of the pardon. Originals are also found in the series *Pardons* from the Office of Secretary of State Commissions Division in Record Group 5.

Peter Kinder, Attorney General Jay Nixon, Secretary of State Robin Carnahan, State Auditor Claire McCaskill, State Treasurer Sarah Steelman, President Pro-Tem Michael R. Gibbons, Speaker of the House Rod Jetton, Mayor John Landwehr of Jefferson City, and Cole County Commissioners. Parade pictures also include military color guards, marching bands, Budweiser Clydesdales, military and vintage vehicles, and floats.

The DVD-Rs have many duplicate photographs of differing resolution and appear to be those released to the media for various events.
