HISTORICAL, SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTES

The Missouri Volunteer regiments were organized and enrolled under the supervision of the United States military authorities. The Missouri Volunteers were accepted into federal service, beginning in the summer of 1861. Missouri Volunteer units often served outside the state of Missouri.

Regimental returns are paperwork created by various batteries, regiments and battalions and submitted to the Adjutant General. These records are the kind of bureaucratic paperwork on which the Army marched. Due to the chaotic nature of the Civil War in Missouri, the lack of reliable postal service, and poor record keeping in the field, these records are very incomplete.

The Scope and Content Note for individual regiments contains information on organization, disbanding, transfers and consolidations. Also noted are exceptional records of interest.

Company D Correspondence-Post Civil War includes a letter dated May 30, 1875 from Herman Flock requesting assistance in entering a soldiers' home in Dayton, Ohio. The letter recounts his service in Missouri regiments during the Civil War, and service at Fort Sill and in the Utah Expedition after the war. The letter is in German with an English translation.

Regimental Correspondence – Miscellaneous contains a letter from Franz Sigel on the loss of the regiment's flag at Wilson's Creek.
