Historical and Biographical Notes

Bob F. Griffin was born on August 15, 1935 in Braymer, Missouri. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the University of Missouri – Columbia in 1957 and a Doctor of Jurisprudence in Law in 1959. In 1957, he married Linda Charlotte Kemper, and they had two children, Julie and Jeffrey. After completing his degrees, Griffin served as a member of the Judge Advocate Generals' Department in the United States Air Force. He was deployed to Iceland and received an honorable discharge as a Captain in 1962. In 1963, he was elected Prosecuting Attorney in Clinton County, an office he held until being elected to the House of Representatives.

Griffin, a Democrat, was first elected to the Missouri House of Representatives in 1970 for District 85, District 10 in 1972, and District 6 in 1992. Griffin was elected Speaker Pro Tem for the 79th and 80th General Assemblies. He was then elected Speaker of the House from the 81st to the 88th General Assemblies. During his tenure, he oversaw major legislation such as the Excellence in Education Act, the Outstanding Schools Act, and the Linked Deposit Loan Program. Other major issues included HIV/AIDS, welfare reform, family courts, and "Bright Flight" scholarships. In March 1995, Representative Sandra Kauffman, a Republican, honored Griffin with the president's award from the Women Legislators of Missouri caucus for his promotion of women legislators during his time in the House.

In January 1996, Griffin resigned from office amidst a federal grand jury investigation into corruption allegations. Griffin and codefendants Cathryn Simmons, a political consultant, Michael Fisher, former Greater Kansas City AFL-CIO president, and Steven Hurst, a lobbyist, were charged by the grand jury on 26 counts of racketeering (RICO), bribery, and mail fraud. The allegations were that the group worked together to steer business to Simmons and shared in the profits.

There were five schemes alleged:

1. that Simmons paid Griffin \$10,000 to secure a contract to advocate for the 1992 Motor Fuel Tax Bill;
2. that Simmons paid Griffin's son, Jeffrey, \$5,000 as an indirect bribe for a 1993 highway bond bill;
3. that Simmons paid Griffin \$10,000 to remove Representative Bill Skaggs from the Health Facilities Review Committee in 1993;
4. that Simmons paid Griffin \$41,000 for help with health care reform legislation in 1994;
5. that Simmons paid \$91,000 to a former Clay County commissioner, Richard Moore, to vote in favor of a landfill in 1993.

The federal investigation was prompted by Griffin's representation of Public Issue Management (PIM) and Simmons (its president) in negotiations with Sahara Gaming Corp. Simmons also helped lobby for another casino project by Becker Gaming. She was not registered as a lobbyist, even after being urged to do so by Michael Lazaroff who represented a coalition of casino companies at the time. Griffin was alleged to have

personal interest in the casino projects around Kansas City and attempted to get Simmons hired as a consultant by both. Before the trial began, U.S. District Judge Fernando Gaitan Jr. stepped down over questions of his impartiality. Gaitan had been approached to invest in a casino and was friends with a witness who was going to testify about lobbyist payments. Gaitan had rejected federal prosecutors request to admit gambling related evidence, but his replacement, Judge Dean Whipple, allowed it in limited capacity. None of the charges were related to the proposed casino projects or gambling. Prosecutors were attempting to show wider racketeering activity with Moore's testimony and testimony about a 1994 campaign for a constitutional amendment to approve games of chance.

Hurst was acquitted of all charges. All were acquitted on the charge of removing Skaggs from the Health Facilities Review Committee due to witness testimony that his removal had also been requested by a Kansas City hospital. Simmons was acquitted of the bribery count involving Griffin's son, Jeffrey. In June 1997, Simmons and Fisher were convicted of racketeering, bribery, and mail fraud.

Of the nine charges against Griffin, he was acquitted on three charges, but the jury was unable to come to a decision on the remaining six. Simmons and Fisher agreed to testify against Griffin before his second trial, at which point Griffin plead guilty to two counts of accepting a \$5,000 bribe from Simmons for the 1992 Motor Fuel Tax Bill. The other four charges against Griffin were dismissed. Griffin pled guilty to bribery and mail fraud charges on August 11, 1997.

On December 4th, Griffin was sentenced to 48 months in prison, a \$7,500 fine, and a \$100 special penalty assessment. The United State Court of Appeals (Eighth Circuit) rejected Griffin's argument that his payments to Simmons were a gratuity not a bribe, finding quid pro quo was established, and denied his request for a reduced sentence. Simmons was sentenced to 50 months, and Fisher was sentenced to 39 months. Simmons and Fisher were also ordered to forfeit \$366,000 for the racketeering charge.

In January 2001, President Clinton commuted Griffin's sentence so he could take care of his wife, Linda, who had cancer and suffered a stroke in 1998. She died on December 21, 2018. Three years later, Griffin's son Jeffrey passed away, and Griffin died shortly after on July 7, 2021.

Correspondence to Democrats in the House often includes messaging strategies for issues and campaign materials.

Of note is a letter from Bob Griffin to House members, dated January 12, 1995, concerning the federal grand jury investigation into his records (Box 44, Folder 3). There is also an apology letter for his DWI (Box 43, Folder 5).
