

#### Reference Services for YOU: Missouri's Native Plants

With spring in full swing, help patrons discover their green thumb by visiting nearby nurseries and greenhouses for plants native to Missouri.

The Missouri Department of Agriculture's <u>Nursery Grower and Dealer</u> search can help patrons find local plant growers, sellers, and dealers. This database allows users to filter by county, business type, or specific plants to brighten their garden.

For patrons who would like to refresh their gardens or landscaping but are unsure what to plant, Missouri offers a diverse range of native flowers, shrubs, and trees. Research these amazing native plants with the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) <u>Landscaping</u> for Nature resources. Find helpful information on native plants best suited for shade, sun, wildlife, or even <u>rain gardens</u>. The State Forest Nursery offers Missouri residents a variety of tree and shrub <u>seedlings for purchase</u> (ending April 15), so order soon!

Patrons can also use the MDC <u>Field Guide</u> to learn more about the plants and animals in their yard or community. Search by name, species type, or other characteristics like whether they are edible or poisonous. This field guide can also help patrons identify invasive species and learn how to prevent their spread.




