Executive orders from Missouri's governors shape and reflect the history of our state. They include vital information for the citizens of Missouri about emergency declarations, task force recommendations, department reorganizations, and more.

Part of the Reference Services' core mission is to make state government documents easily available to the public, which includes providing online access to digital Executive Orders from 1980 to the present. The text of these orders is formatted to be fully searchable by keywords such as the governor's name, a specific agency, a task force, or topic to find relevant orders.

A selection of Executive Orders of interest:

- 23-01: Orders the commencement of Missourians Aging with Dignity Initiative.
- <u>11-14</u>: Activates state militia in response to May 22, 2011 Joplin tornado.

Technology Mini Grant • Deadline: October 1

The 2023–24 Technology Mini Grant will open mid-August with applications being due by Oct. 1, 2023. The maximum available per library system grant request is \$22,000. Please review the grant eligibility requirements and eligible costs in the award guidance and remember to print the award guidance for your grant file. Eligible costs are more limited than in prior to Missouri public libraries certified to receive FY23 state aid, Missouri school libraries publicly supported and publicly controlled, and Missouri academic libraries supported publicly or privately.
