### Reference Services for YOU: State Budget Tracking

It is time for Missouri's budget-planning process to begin for the next fiscal year. Below are several resources to assist patrons with tracking current budget work throughout the process and reviewing past budgets.

- <u>House Operating Budget Process</u>: Track the budget as it moves through the legislative process.
- <u>Missouri Budget Explorer</u>: Transparency tool to track departmental budget summaries, performance measures, priorities, and other budget summaries.
- Missouri Accountability Portal (MAP): View how tax dollars are spent with departmental expenditures and revenues, state employee pay, budget restrictions, tax credits, federal grants, and more.

- <u>State of Missouri Daily Spending</u>: Daily activity and cash balance from the General Revenue Fund by the Office of the Missouri State Auditor.
- <u>Show-Me Checkbook:</u> Financial data transparency portal from the Office of the Treasurer utilizing historical budget information.
- <u>Appropriation Activity Reports</u>: Comparative analyses of revenues to expenditures, and appropriations to expenditures from the Office of Administration.

### Digital Imaging Grant • Deadline: February 15, 2023 •

The Digital Imaging Grant opened for applications on December 30, 2022 that are due on or before February 15, 2023. Interested libraries must have a Letter of Intent submitted to Digitization Consultant Matt Butler, on or before January 1, 2023. Digital Imaging grants provide funding for eligible libraries and their partners in the cultural heritage community to carry out projects involving the selection, digital

#### Spotlight on Literacy Grant • Deadline: January 31, 2023

Spotlight on Literacy (SLT) grants provide funds to create new or enhance current efforts to serve patrons of all ages through programs that support an educated and informed citizenry. Projects must identify a single target audience, as well as a literacy area to address such as early literacy, digital literacy, STEM literacy, health literacy, financial literacy, civic literacy, career literacy, etc. The SLT grant opened in mid-December in the online grant management system, with

#### Educational Presenter Grant · Deadline: Ongoing

This open-call grant is a combination of the previously offered Author Visit Grant and the Bicentennial Programs Grant, and will replace the two separate grants. Libraries can apply to bring an author or educational presentation to their community. This application is open to Missouri public libraries certified to receive FY22 state aid, Missouri school libraries publicly supported and publicly controlled, and Missouri academic libraries supported publicly or privately.

These grants support creation of digital collections at institutions while at the same time adding expanded access to those collections via the Missouri Digital Heritage database and website. applications being due by January 31, 2023. The minimum to request will be \$2,500, the maximum \$15,000, with up to \$110,000 being available for this grant round.
