


REALM Project: Public Health Crisis Management Playbook for Archives, Libraries, and Museums

The REALM Public Health Crisis Management Playbook for Archives, Libraries, and Museums offers a set of guiding processes, resources, and tools to aid cultural heritage institutions when planning for, navigating through, and recovering from a significant public health emergency. This resource can help archive, library, or museum staff who are part of a crisis management planning or communications team. This playbook, available online and as a downloadable PDF document, covers the following topics: crisis leadership, facilities and

operations, crisis decision-making and risk management, resource networks, and resources for more information.

to Missouri public libraries certified to receive FY22 State Aid, Missouri school libraries publicly supported and publicly controlled, and Missouri academic libraries supported publicly or privately.
