Encourage Students' Love of Reading Through Accessible Literature -

As school swings into full gear, ensure your students and patrons with disabilities have access to reading and other resources through Wolfner Talking Book and Braille Library. Students and adults who cannot use standard print material due to visual, physical and/or reading disabilities are eligible for services through Wolfner, such as large-print, braille and audiobooks, accessible STEM kits, print or braille games and youth programs. Eligible students can fill out this application as an individual with a signature from a certifying authority. This doesn't need

to come from a doctor but can be signed by a nurse, therapist, social worker, librarian, educator and more. If schools have eligible students, they can also register for or resume Wolfner library services for their students at school by completing the school application if registering for the first time or completing the Annual Student Listing form if resuming services. Make sure your eligible students apply as individuals first before registering your school. Send your individual or school applications to Wolfner by mail, FAX or email any time during the year.



Reference Services for YOU: POW/MIA Recognition -

On Sept. 20, National POW/MIA Recognition Day is observed to remember those who were prisoners of war (POW) and those missing in action (MIA). Patrons with families personally touched by these sacrifices or who are interested in the work to account for missing personnel will find inspiration in the mission of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA).

Since its inception, the DPAA works to provide accounting for American military and civilian missing personnel to their families. The DPAA investigates, recovers, identifies and returns missing personnel from World War II through the Gulf Wars, such as the USS Oklahoma **Identification Project** where the DPAA identified 362 of the 394 sailors and marines unaccounted from the sinking of the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. The DPAA tools listed below provide detailed information on successful recoveries and current missing members.

- · Search Our Missing: The DPAA profiles and map of missing individuals are searchable by name, state, conflict and branch of service.
- Recently Accounted For: The Recently Accounted For records are searchable by name, conflict, branch of service and location. Personnel case profiles include information on the missing service member, recovery, and service members that may be associated with the loss.

Directors and branch managers are able to sign up for a State Library card from the guide, and are encouraged to borrow items for themselves or any of their library's staff.



- 6. The **Texas County Library System Cabool Branch** collaborates with the Missouri Department of Conservation to loan fishing gear to patrons (July 23).



Technology Mini-Grant · Deadline: October 1 ·


