State Aid Certification Forms Due

In order to be certified for state aid, a public library must complete and submit the following three forms by July 31, 2016:

1. State Aid Application
2. List of Trustees
3. Certification of Compliance

All of the forms are linked on the [Certifications and Document Filing Schedule](#) page of the Missouri State Library's website. Due to the recent change to the 15 CSR 30-200.10 Administrative Rules regarding state and federal grants, these forms may now be submitted by email, fax or mail.

Enrollment in TumbleDeluxe Continues

In April 2016, the Missouri State Library announced the availability of TumbleBookLibrary Deluxe (TumbleDeluxe) to public libraries in Missouri eligible to receive State Aid. The basic TumbleDeluxe subscription provides in-library and remote access to a collection of 550 animated, talking picture books for children in preschool through grade 3.

- REAL Program members are already enrolled in TumbleDeluxe and should be contacted shortly by a TumbleBook staff person with password information and a customized, encrypted link to add to the library's website.
- If they have not already done so, public libraries that are NOT a member of the REAL Program are asked to complete the [TumbleBook Survey](#) to start the process. Questions about the survey may be directed to [Jeanne Sullivan](#) or [MOREnet Technical Support](#).
- Templates for banners, icons, buttons and bookmarks to help promote TumbleDeluxe are available in the TumbleAdmin portion of the TumbleBookLibrary website. Libraries will need their unique password to access these resources.

New Digital Collections in Missouri Digital Heritage

Two new collections are now available on the Missouri Digital Heritage website. The [Charles Lindbergh Collection](#), contributed by the Museum of Missouri Military History, contains military and related records from Charles Lindbergh's time in the Missouri National Guard, as well as correspondence, news clippings and articles pertaining to Lindbergh's life and his solo Atlantic flight. The [Lexington Wharfage Register Collection](#), contributed by the Battle of Lexington State Historic Site, contains a bound volume with accounts for steamboats passing through the trading hub of Lexington, MO from 1855-1869.
