LAST CALL - State Aid Certification Forms Due

In order to be certified for state aid, a public library must complete and submit the following three forms by July 31, 2016:

1. State Aid Application
2. List of Trustees
3. Certification of Compliance

All of the forms are linked on the [Certifications and Document Filing Schedule](#) page of the Missouri State Library's website. Due to the recent change to the 15 CSR 30-200.10 Administrative Rules regarding state and federal grants, these forms may now be submitted by email, fax or mail. Notarization is no longer required.
