FY17 REAL Program Budget

On July 6, the Governor announced withholds of funds for the FY17 budget, which began July 1. While the REAL Program originally saw a \$750,000 increase in appropriation from the FY2016 amount of \$2,000,000, this increase was withheld in total returning the available budget at this time to \$2,000,000. The State Library and MOREnet worked together to make adjustments to the FY17 REAL Program that accommodated reduced funds without losing priority services. This includes funding of a special bandwidth upgrade project, REAL Program subsidies to remain at their full amount, statewide access to HeritageQuest and, with assistance from MOREnet, the continuation of the EBSCO and Learning Express Library online resources. Note withheld funds may be released later in the fiscal year, depending on the status of state revenues.
