## Financial Report Required

This is a reminder that state law requires political subdivisions, which includes public libraries, to file a financial report with the State Auditor's Office each year ([RSMo Section 105.145](#) and [15 CSR 40-3.030](#)). This report is due no later than six months after the end of a library's fiscal year for both audited and unaudited financial reports. Reports may be sent by email to [localgovernment@auditor.mo.gov](mailto:localgovernment@auditor.mo.gov). It is acceptable to send any financial report that satisfies the minimum requirements of the CSR. More information about the required report is at [Political Subdivision Financial Reports](#).
