Library Development Team Update

The Missouri State Library is pleased to welcome Jennifer France to the Library Development team as the new Technology and Resource Sharing Consultant. Jennifer will work with the REAL Program for internet access; Show Me the World, in which catalog records of Missouri public libraries are loaded into OCLC's WorldCat to facilitate access through interlibrary loan; Missouri Evergreen, a consortium of libraries using an open-sourced shared library system; and technology grants; and provide consultant services regarding technology and resource sharing opportunities for Missouri's libraries.

Jennifer has a Masters of Library Science degree from the University of South Carolina. She joins the team from the College of Charleston and American College of the Building Arts in Charleston, SC, where she served as Librarian. Administrative Rule Amendment Proposed

The Missouri State Library has proposed an amendment to the 15 CSR 30-200.10 Administrative Rules regarding State and Federal grants to allow libraries to submit required paperwork to the State Library via faxed or scanned documents. This will reduce postal costs and should speed up the submission process.

Anyone may file a statement in support of or in opposition to this proposed amended rule with the Missouri Secretary of State's Office, State Library, PO Box 387, Kirkpatrick Information Center, 600 West Main, Jefferson City, MO 65102. 

WorldCat Discovery Connects People to Libraries

The Missouri State Library's WorldCat Discovery subscription supports reference, discovery, resource sharing and genealogical research needs of libraries across the state. Through WorldCat

Discovery, people in Missouri can find the many types of materials provided by their local libraries – from print books and DVDs to online articles and eBooks – and in libraries across the state, the country and around the world. They can also request items not available in their local library from other libraries in OCLC’s global resource sharing network.

WorldCat Discovery helps reach people who increasingly use smartphones, tablets, laptops and desktop computers to find and access library resources. The user interface adjusts automatically to the device a person is using. There is no need for apps or different URLs for the interface to display appropriately.
