

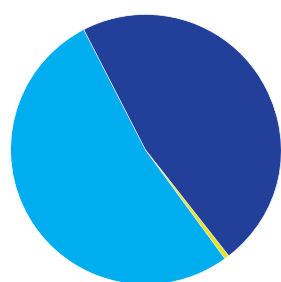

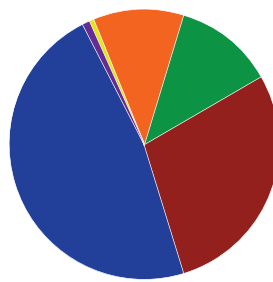
\$3.3 MILLION ALLOTMENT

LIBRARY SERVICES AND TECHNOLOGY ACT FUNDS IN MISSOURI

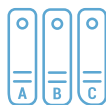
Of the \$ \$3,359,329 in LSTA funds that Missouri was awarded in FY2023, \$1,585,449 was awarded to local libraries as competitive grants and \$1,755,898 was used to support projects for all libraries across the state.

SUMMER READING

136 library districts offered a total of 8,197 summer-reading programs with 235,056 in attendance.



RESOURCE SHARING

126 public libraries used the Statewide Courier Service to share 1,185,374 items, expanding access to library materials.

14,885 library staff members participated in 1,120 training opportunities, which helped improve library services throughout Missouri.
