

**Missouri State Library
Technology Mini Grants
Awarded December 2020**

Barry-Lawrence Regional Library- \$18,000

This project will replace 20 public use computers, 20 monitors and 2 staff laptops.

Boonslick Regional Library-\$17,515

Eight early literacy stations will be purchased and placed in four branches (two at each branch).

Brookfield Public Library-\$9,685

The library network will be upgraded with this grant. Seven PC's with monitors, barcode scanners, and the Wi-Fi system will be replaced.

Camden County Library-\$4,860

To aid in the mitigation of the spread of COVID 20, barcode scanners will be replaced to minimize contact with staff. Staff netbooks and the director's desktop computer and monitor will also be replaced.

Carrollton Public Library-\$7,762

This project is replacing patron and staff PCs and associated software, receipt printers, barcode scanner, printers and adding security cameras.

Carter County Library-\$10,780

Carter County Library will add handicap accessible workstations and replace six computers.

Caruthersville Public Library-\$3,424

This project will implement a backup system for the server, install a printer with Wi-Fi capabilities, and purchase two laptops for patron use.

Cedar County Library-\$7,068

Replace five of the existing patron computers at El Dorado Springs and two circulation computers that are malfunctioning and at end of life.

Christian County Library-\$18,000

Christian County Library will purchase 20 dedicated "Technology Literacy & Learning" classroom laptops to be shared as needed amongst the Nixa, Ozark, Clever, and Sparta Community Branches of the Christian County Library. The distribution can be adapted based on class size and demand by location, but each branch will have five available unless being used elsewhere.

Dade County Library-\$6,554

This project will replace four staff computers, a computer and card catalog monitor, related software and add a charging and storage cabinet for Chromebooks, tablets and similar devices.

Daniel Boone Regional Library-\$18,000

DBRL is seeking LSTA funds to purchase new self-checkout stations for the Southern Boone county (Ashland) and Callaway county (Fulton) public library locations, and will purchase a new machine for the Holts Summit location

Dunklin County Library-\$15,317

This project will replace 20 computers operating with Windows 7 operating systems and will replace two printers.

Keller Public Library-\$4,264

Keller Public Library intends to replace an obsolete firewall and three computers with monitors.

Kirkwood Public Library-\$17,817

This project will replace four aging self-checkout machines at the Kirkwood Public Library.

Little Dixie Regional Library-\$16,528

Little Dixie Regional Libraries (LDRL) will replace two aged and obsolete microfilm machines (and related software) one at the Moberly branch and one at the Paris branch. Four new flatbed scanners and two new computers will be purchased to run the microfilm readers.

Neosho-Newton County Library-\$6,229

This project will be replacing the main IT computer, staff circulation computer and four public computers.

North Kansas City Public Library-\$10,137

The North Kansas City Public library (NKCPL) is requesting funding to purchase eight Access Points, eight Thermal Receipt Printers and fifteen Linear/Area-Imaging Scanners. These items will support improved library services and patron experiences.

Polk County Library-\$8,464

The two goals of this project are to provide a mobile lab of 20 Chromebooks available for checkout to patrons and provide a quality laptop for dedicated use by the Library Children's Specialist.

Poplar Bluff Municipal Library-\$12,515

The library will purchase and install six public access computers, a public print-release kiosk, and a self-service multifunction printer with attached coin-op for its new library branch.

Springfield-Greene County Library-\$13,263

The Springfield-Greene County Library District's Laptops for In-Library Checkout project will provide 15 laptops for our patrons distributed amongst ten branches.

St. Louis County Library-\$5,325

St. Louis County Library will pilot the use of portable projectors to use in backyards to project movies, TV shows and other digital programming for an audience.

University City Public Library-\$16,459

UCPL would like to purchase 10 laptop computers for its computer lab (replacing the end-of-life machines), 16 new early literacy LaunchPads for its Youth Services department, and replace 6 staff computers. Additionally, UCPL would like to purchase a one-year subscription to Restream, an online service that allows Zoom meetings to stream to multiple social media platforms, which will help patrons participate in programming and meetings of the Library's Board of Trustees.
