Initial Case Reports are submitted by healthcare providers. Records of Investigation are conducted and submitted by public health professionals. Records are submitted to the Bureau for surveillance activities and oversight. The reports can contain epidemiological, progress, and diagnostic information. Reports can contain individual identifiable healthcare information protected by 192.067 RSMo.
